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ABSTRACT

Prepared as a backup resource document to the three-volume study of the socioeconomic characteristics of the ethnic minorities, this report presents data on the socioeconomic characteristics of the ethnic minorities in each of the 10 HEW regions. Data on over 20 major economic and social indices were accumulated for the major subgroups in each region. Available data are presented in comparison with data on the characteristics of the total population, Blacks, and the Spanish speaking population in that region. Tabular data for each region indicate: (1) from which states (and in some cases, cities) the available regional data have been drawn; (2) the percentage of the region's total subgroup population represented by the detailed information; (3) the percentage of that subgroup's national population living in the region; and (4) the percentage of the region's total population, all races included, each subgroup represents. In some cases, the characteristics of a subgroup population are based on a single state, even a single city, if that were the only data available. When no detailed data on a particular subgroup are available, only summary data on the subgroup population are provided. (NQ)

Introduction

As a backup resource document to the three volume study of the socio-economic characteristics of the ethnic minorities which was prepared by Urban Associates, Inc. we have developed data on the socio-economic characteristics of the ethnic minorities in each of the ten HEW regions. The data were developed with a view to providing program staff in the ten Regional Offices with data which would help them to identify the key issues and problems affecting ethnic minorities in their region which might impact on the agencies' allocation of resources, program development, and program monitoring and evaluation and other related activities. We trust that Regional Offices will conduct the necessary analysis of these data, and be able to make use of them in the manner which was originally intended or in other ways which seem appropriate to them.

Selection of Data

Data on over 20 major economic and social indices were accumulated to the degree possible, for the major subgroups in each region. The available data are presented in comparison with data on the characteristics of the total population, Blacks, and Spanish Speaking population in that region.

In most cases, information on the characteristics of a subgroup's entire regional population, beyond total number was not available. Taking Region II as an example, detailed socio-economic data on the two states in this region, New York and New Jersey, were available on the total population (all races and ethnic backgrounds), Blacks, Spanish Speaking, and Puerto Ricans. But for each of the Asian subgroups and the Indians, beyond the total number of each in New York and New Jersey, the only detailed data available are for the State of New York.

The tables containing the data for each region indicate from which states (and in some cases, cities) the available regional data have been drawn. The tables also indicate the percentage of the total subgroup population in the region that the detailed information being analyzed represents, as well as the percentage of that subgroup's national population living in the region. Finally, the tables indicate what percentage of the region's total population, all races included, each subgroup represents. In some cases, the characteristics of a subgroup population are based on a single state, even a single city, if that were the only data available.

In some regions, no detailed data on a particular subgroup are available at all. In these cases, summary data on the subgroup population are all that is provided. In Region VI, for example, no socio-economic data are available on any of the three Asian subgroups.
