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ABSTRACT

The catalogue annotates all materials which are available for loan from the Career Services and Industrial Arts Instructional Materials Laboratory in the Vocational Education and Community Colleges Division of the Alabama State Department of Education. Section 1 annotates listings for over 200 books, on career education and career guidance. Section 2 lists 69 titles of books contained in two series of works designed to describe all the major career options open to young people. Section 3 lists for grades 1-12 several hundred units of study in careers for the various subject fields developed by teachers in Alabama and Cobb County, Georgia. Section 4 cites nearly 100 books which cover the various industrial arts subjects. Section 5 lists three special need books and one series of 45 academic skills titles. Section 6 cites approximately 70 position papers and monographs which deal with various aspects of career education. Section 7 lists 11 career education journals. Section 8 describes 15 career films and one series of 44 films on specific occupations. Section 9 lists approximately 40 career filmstrips. Section 10 describes 32 multi-media kits, and section 11 describes five slide kits. (JR)

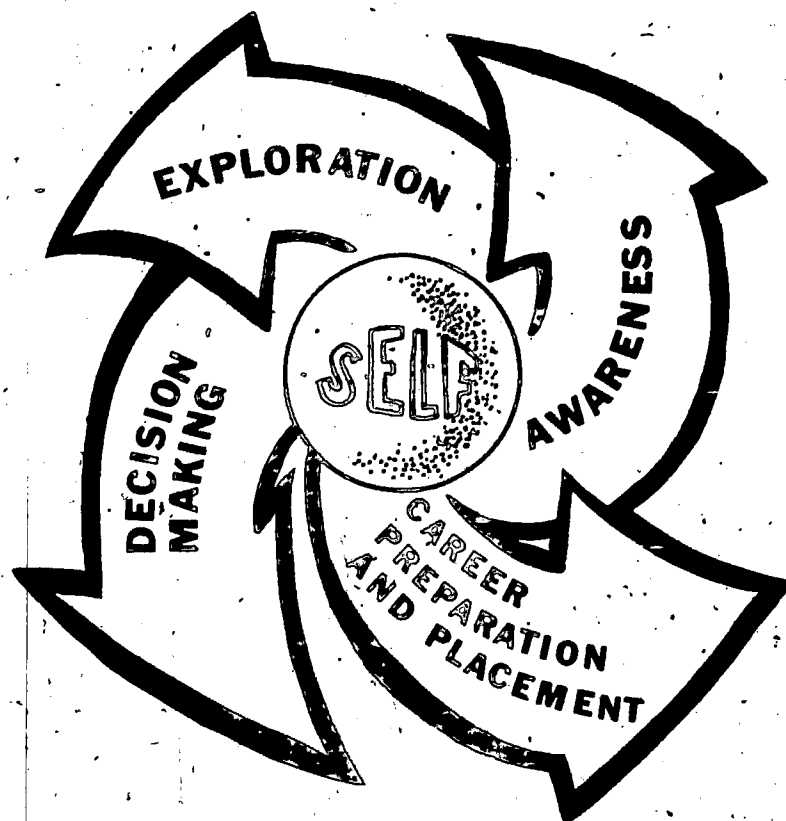

FOREWARD

In March 1972 an interdivisional State Department of Education committee was appointed by the State Superintendent of Education to develop plans for the implementation of Career Education in Alabama. The committee realized that if the concepts inherent in the words "career education" were fused into the total school curriculum the result would be relevant instruction for all pupils in all grade levels. This committee representing every division of the State Department of Education developed the following position statement on career education:

Career education is a comprehensive educational approach to the preparation of the citizenry for living as fulfilled human beings in a predominately technical, specialized society.

Career education should begin in grade one or earlier and continue throughout the productive life of the individual.

The concept of developmental career education dictates the necessity for a total educational program which is relevant to the world of work in elementary students, exploratory experiences for junior high students, and for senior high students, knowledges and skills necessary to pursue further education or to become employed.

It is not conceived to replace or be in addition to any educational programs in existence. It is intended, however, to make educational subject matter more meaningful and relevant to an individual through restructuring and focusing concepts around a career development theme.

From the inception of career education in Alabama, until September of 1974, activities concerning implementation were coordinated through an Appalachian Career Education staff. Under the auspices of the Vocational Education and Community Colleges Division of the Alabama State Department of Education.

In October, 1974 a new unit dubbed Career Services and Industrial Arts was assigned direct responsibility at the state level for program development and supervision of Vocational Guidance and Placement (now termed Career Guidance), Special Needs Education, Industrial Arts and divisional activities related to Career Education. These areas are drawn together under one umbrella in an effort to coordinate and make more effective the contribution of each to the overall program. Career Guidance is a fundamental component of career education and it has many of the same goals and objectives. Industrial Arts is a necessary component to complete exploratory experiences.

INTRODUCTION

A Career Services and Industrial Arts Instructional Materials Laboratory has been established in the Vocational Education and Community Colleges Division of the Alabama State Department of Education. This Laboratory is to serve as a vehicle for teachers (pre-school through post-secondary) incorporating career education, career guidance and industrial arts into their curriculum.

This catalogue lists and describes all materials which are on a loan basis. Materials consist of films, filmstrips, cassettes, slides, records, posters, books, monographs, position papers, games, student workbooks, teacher units, and instructional kits. The following code has been developed for utilization of all materials.
