ABSTRACT

A total of 712 students graduated from the seven institutions in the New Hampshire Post-Secondary Vocational-Technical Education System in 1975. In spite of the high unemployment rate in the State, 70 percent, or 495 of the eligible graduates were employed full-time by September 30, 1975; 3 percent were employed part-time, 12 percent were continuing their education full-time, and only 9 percent were still seeking employment. Of all graduates employed full-time, 91 percent have remained in New Hampshire, 88 percent commute to work from their home towns, and 92 percent are employed in their major or related field of study. Average entry job salaries by job categories remained stable, showing no significant change from 1974. This is consistent with the general economic outlook. It is estimated that all graduates employed full-time will have a total gross earning power in excess of \$3,750,000 during their first year of employment. Data are tabulated for each of the seven institutions, according to program of study, and a list of representative companies employing 1975 graduates is provided. (Author/NHM)

ANNUAL PLACEMENT SUMMARY

This report is the Placement Summary of the 1975 graduates of the New Hampshire Post-Secondary Vocational-Technical Education System. The New Hampshire Technical Institute and the New Hampshire Vocational-Technical Colleges are public institutions supported by state funds, student tuition and fees, federal grants, and other miscellaneous revenues.

The Post-Secondary Education System administered by the Post-Secondary Education Division of the New Hampshire Department of Education has six Vocational-Technical Colleges, located in Berlin, Claremont, Laconia, Manchester, Nashua and Portsmouth, and the New Hampshire Technical Institute in Concord. These seven institutions offer occupational education opportunities to prepare graduates for direct employment in business, industry, service or professions.

A total of 712 students graduated from these seven institutions in 1975. The graduates were awarded a two-year associate degree, or a one-year diploma. All of the programs at the Institute and the Colleges are offered using a blend of study, laboratory and/or work experiences.

The New Hampshire Technical Institute and the six Vocational-Technical Colleges differ somewhat from each other both in the level and the programs of occupational education offered. The New Hampshire Technical Institute in Concord offers programs to prepare graduates for semi-professional employment, and offers the Associate of Science degree and the one-year Diploma. The New Hampshire Vocational-Technical Colleges at Berlin, Claremont, Laconia, Manchester, Nashua and Portsmouth offer the Associate in Applied Science degree and the one-year diploma. The programs at the Colleges are designed to prepare graduates for skilled and technical employment. Thus, although

there may be some overlap in program level and area in the Institute/College System, not all of the occupational education programs available in the System are offered in all of the institutions.

The Institute/College System had full-time day students graduated from 33 different occupational programs for the 1974-75 academic year. Although the primary thrust of the System's efforts is directed to occupational education leading to direct job placement, there were 82 students graduating in 1975 who chose to follow up on their initial college success by enrolling full time in a number of colleges and universities (Table I).

The data for this report was collected on September 30, 1975. On this date the unemployment rate for the State of New Hampshire was nearly double that of late September of 1974. The September 30, 1975, unemployment rate was 5.9%, up from 2.9% on September 30, 1974. The unemployment rates in the cities in which the Institute/College System is located were as follows: Berlin 6.1%; Claremont 3.9%; Concord 5.0%; Laconia 7.1%; Manchester 6.2%; Nashua 5.7% and Portsmouth 5.4%.

Job placements reported as of September 30, 1975, demonstrate a good employment picture for graduates of the System in spite of the high unemployment rate in the State. Vocational-Technical graduates from the Institute/College System reported a large number of jobs obtained as a result of contacts between graduates and potential employers. These contacts are often arranged and fostered by the placement service provided at each institution. On September 30, 1975, there were 514 job placements reported for students graduated in 1975. Of the 712 eligible graduates, 70% or 495 were employed full time by September 30, 1975.

Strong competition for entry-level job has been reported by the students through the Institute/College Placement Offices. In spite of both strong competition for jobs and the high unemployment rate, only 9% of the

graduates were still seeking employment as of September 30. At the same time, many four-year colleges are reporting that their graduates are having severe problems obtaining desirable work. About one-third of the male and two-thirds of the female graduates of four-year colleges have had to accept positions unrelated to their college majors. In contrast to this, the Institute/College System can report that 92% of its employed graduates are now working full time in jobs related to their major. This contrast clearly points out that the placement record of the Institute/College System is excellent. It also points out that the potential employer is very interested in the two-year college graduate who is prepared for entry-level employment in skilled and semi-professional occupations (Table I).

Analysis of Table I indicates that only 9% of the 1975 graduates are still seeking employment. Discounting the 2% whose status is unknown, 89% of the graduates were in effect satisfactorily placed as of September 30, 1975. This recognizes the fact that full-time employment was not the immediate goal of every Institute/College graduate; goals such as marriage, additional schooling and military service all affected the need and search for employment.

Additionally, Table I provides the opportunity to evaluate the placement activity on a percentage basis. Of every 100 graduates, 70 were employed full-time; 3 were employed part-time; 12 were going to continue college full-time; 3 were going into military service; 9 were still seeking employment; 3 were not seeking employment; and finally, 2 did not respond to the survey and their status at present is unknown.

Highly significant, in reviewing the data, is the fact that 92% of the employed graduates are working in their major or a related field of study. Only 8% are working in a field different from their area of study (Table VI).

The graduates of the Institute/College System have always shown a decided preference to work and live in New Hampshire and commute to the job from home if at all possible. The Institute/College System, which is largely supported by State revenue, is thus able to return to the State a human resource that will help the State's economy and the local communities in which the graduates live and work. Of all the graduates accepting full-time employment, 91% accepted jobs in the State (Table VII), and 88% indicated they commute to the job from the town listed as their residence when they entered their college or institute program (Table VIII).

The significance of the number of placements in job situations near the graduate's home was reported to be between 78% at Concord and 100% at Portsmouth (Table VIII). Employment near home was sought after by many graduates. New Hampshire gains by continued placement of our trained young graduates within state boundaries. This is an established trend - it appears to be a definite pattern. It demonstrates the fact that students are interested in attending a college within commuting distance of their home, after which they seek out employment near their home.

Salary data for the 1975 graduating class is listed on Table IX. Average entry job salaries by job categories were nearly the same as in 1974. It is estimated that all graduates employed full-time will have a total gross dollar earning power of nearly \$3,750,000 during their first year of employment.

Table X lists the business, industries, and health organizations which had representatives interview graduates. The list is long and impressive in terms of the diversity of business; industrial and health firms listed and also in terms of its wide geographic distribution. It is also indicative of the interest that business and industry and health organizations have in Institute/College graduates.

NEW HAMPSHIRE TECHNICAL INSTITUTE - CONCORD

The New Hampshire Technical Institute graduated 174 seniors, 106 of these accepted full-time employment as of September 30, 1975. Of these, 96% (Table VII) are employed within the State and 78% (Table VIII) are able to commute to work from the community they listed as their place of residence when they entered the Institute.

Although Institute programs are designed to prepare students for immediate employment upon graduation, some graduates have always indicated a desire to continue their education on a full-time basis. This year, 31 graduates, approximately 18% of the class, have indicated they will continue in full-time educational programs. (Table II)

The average annual starting salary for graduates employed full-time by program is as follows: Mechanical Engineering Technology, \$8,823; Electrical Engineering Technology, \$7,974; Architectural Engineering Technology, \$8,000; Data Processing, \$7,651; Dental Hygiene, \$9,880; Associate Degree Nursing, \$8,543; Dental Assistant, \$5,350; X-Ray, \$7,028. (Table IX)

The entry job titles, listed by graduates in Table III indicate employment consistent with the educational goals and objectives of the New Hampshire Technical Institute.

NEW HAMPSHIRE VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL COLLEGES
BERLINGHAM, CLAREMONT, LACONIA, MANCHESTER, NASHUA, PORTSMOUTH

The New Hampshire Vocational-Technical Colleges had 538 graduates in 1975. As of September 30, 1975, 389 of these graduates had accepted full-time employment, 90% (349) of these are employed within the State and 91% (354) are able to commute to work from the community they listed as their place of residence when they entered college.

This year, 51 Vocational-Technical College graduates, approximately 9.5% of the class, plan to continue their education on a full-time basis (Table IV). This pattern is a well established trend and indicates the preference of the graduates to seek employment. There is an upturn indicated this year in those entering the military service; i.e., 7 in 1973, 2 in 1974, and 19 in 1975.

The entry job titles, listed by graduates in Table V again indicates employment consistent with the educational goals and objectives of the New Hampshire Vocational-Technical Colleges.

Graduates of the Technical Institute and Vocational-Technical Colleges entered the field for which they were prepared to an extent that demonstrates the value of the system to the student, industry and the State. The educational purpose of the system is being fulfilled. Once again, the 92% who entered their major or related field reveal a statistic which is difficult to match nationally.

FIELD OF EMPLOYMENT

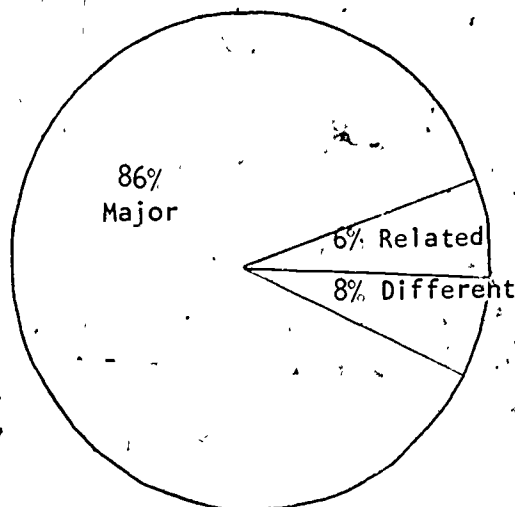
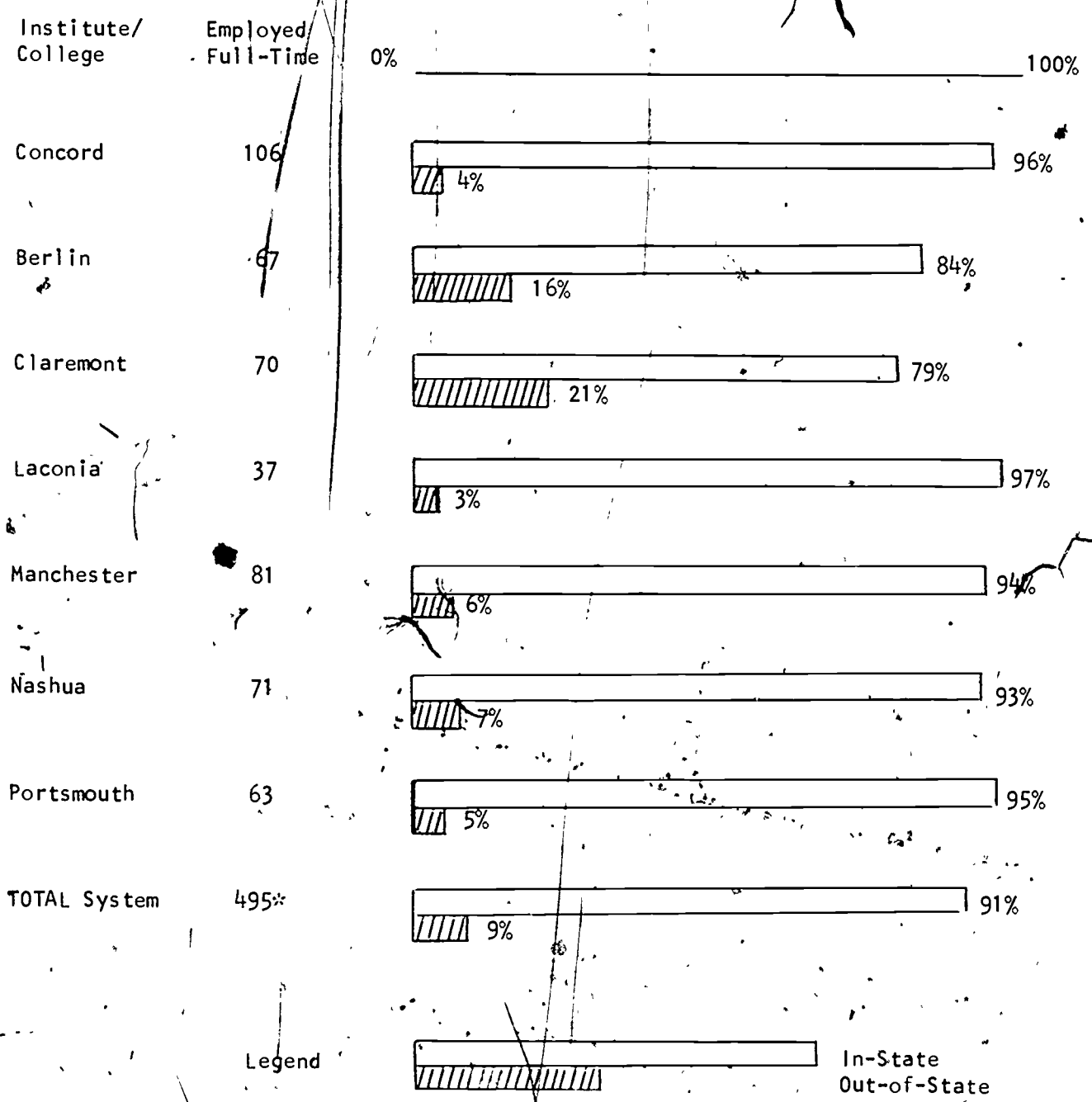

In-State, Out-of-State Status of Technical Institute and Vocational-Technical College Graduates Employed Full-Time



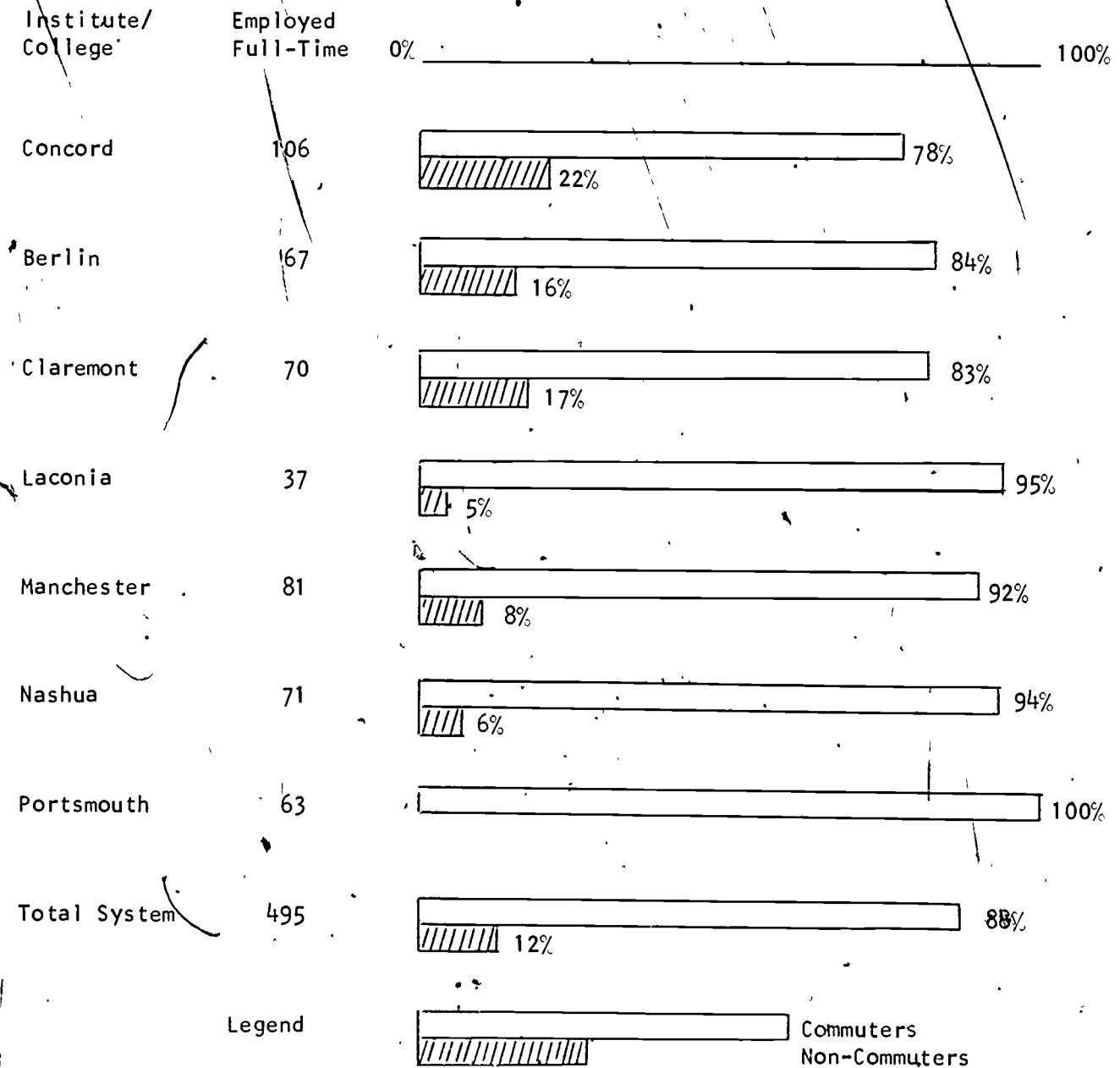

The Legislature of the State of New Hampshire established the New Hampshire Technical Institute and the New Hampshire Vocational-Technical Colleges so that they could develop skilled workers and technologists as valuable resource to improve and bolster the State's economy. Since the Institute/College System has been established, evidence has shown that this has indeed occurred. This year 91% of the 1975 graduates employed full-time are at work within the State of New Hampshire. The 9% who work out of state are generally employed in northern New England. Many who work out of state continue to live in New Hampshire.
