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ABSTRACT

This report covers the status of school food services in 152 cities with populations of 100,000 and over for fiscal year 1972. It consists of six sections: general information on all schools, schools in the national school lunch program, schools with other and no food service, schools in low income areas, schools in the school breakfast program, and schools in the special milk program. Numbers of schools and of children are shown by elementary and secondary grades and by a combination of both. Private schools are not included in this survey nor in comparison data for the previous year. In comparison with 1971, the total number of schools included in the survey shows a gain of 2.1 percent while the number of schools in low income areas over the same period shows 0.4 percent. The number of schools in the National School Lunch Program shows a 6.5 percent increase, and the total number of schools with lunch programs shows an increase of 5.5 percent. Another reported positive change is reflected in the 20 percent decrease in the number of schools with no food service. The total number of schools in the breakfast program increased by 22.8 percent with the special milk program experiencing the smallest percentage increase of any of the programs. Of the 5,139 schools identified as low income only 5.4 percent do not have food service. Availability of the National School Lunch program for elementary schools was 88.6 percent 92.6 percent for secondary schools, and 95.5 percent for children in low income areas. (Author/AM)

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URBAN SCHOOL FEEDING SURVEY

INTRODUCTION

The annual Urban School Feeding Survey is a collection of data on school food service operations in cities with populations of 100,000 or over. The data are based on March 1972 reports from 152 United States cities.

Private schools in cities where USDA's Regional Office operated Child Nutrition Programs are not included in this survey nor in comparison data for last year.

In comparison with 1971, the total number of schools included in the survey increased by 283, a gain of 2.1%, while the number of schools in low income areas over the same period increased by 23, or 0.4%. Average daily attendance (ADA) for all schools for the period increased by 139,559, or 1.5%, but showed a decrease of 54,137, or 1.5%, for schools in low income areas.

The number of schools in the National School Lunch Program increased by 718 from last year, a 6.5% increase, while the number of schools with other food service reflected a 20.5% decrease. Overall, the total number of schools with lunch programs increased by 633 over 1971 while the total number of schools surveyed increased by only 283. This is a 5.5% increase and reflects positively on our efforts to expand our Child Nutrition Programs and reach an ever-increasing number of children.

The relative proportion of the various programs as a function of total schools has changed from 1971 to 1972 as shown in Chart I and Table I.

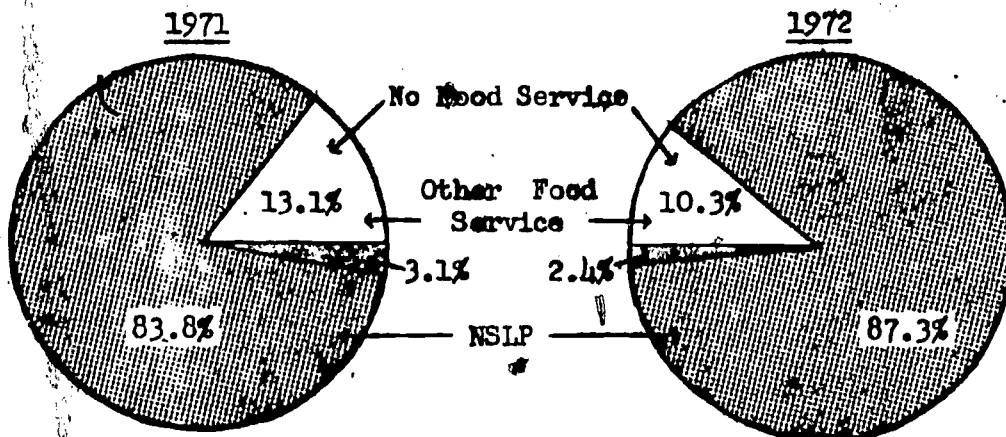


Chart I -- Comparison of Food Service Programs, 1971 with 1972

Another positive change concerns the number of schools with no food service. This figure decreased by 350, or 20.2%

The number of schools participating in the School Breakfast Program showed a substantial increase over the 1971 figure. The total number of schools in the program increased by 22.8% while ADA and average daily participation reflected increases of 23.4% and 14.7%, respectively.

The Special Milk Program experienced the smallest percentage increase of any of the programs enumerated on above. Total schools participating increased by only 1.5% from 1971 which is comparatively less in quantitative terms than the 2.1% increase in total schools included in the survey. At the same time, ADA for these schools increased by 0.4%, but the average number of half pints served daily decreased by 28.6%.

Of the 5,139 schools identified as low income in these cities, only 279, or 5.4%, do not have food service.

AVAILABILITY AND UTILIZATION OF PROGRAMS

The 1972 Urban School Survey indicates that 90.2% of the school children in cities of 100,000 or over had the National School Lunch Program in their schools. For elementary schools the availability was 88.6%, which was somewhat lower than the 92.6% for secondary schools. The ratio of NSLP average daily attendance to total average daily attendance by region is shown in Chart II.

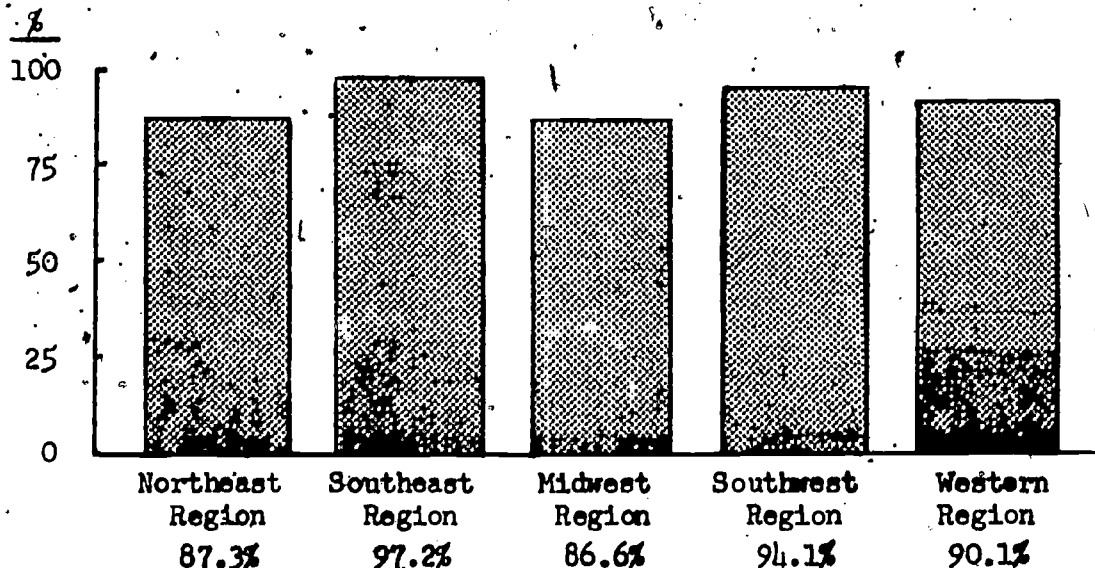


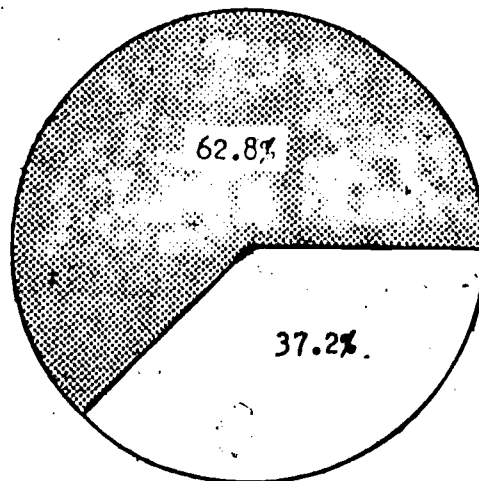
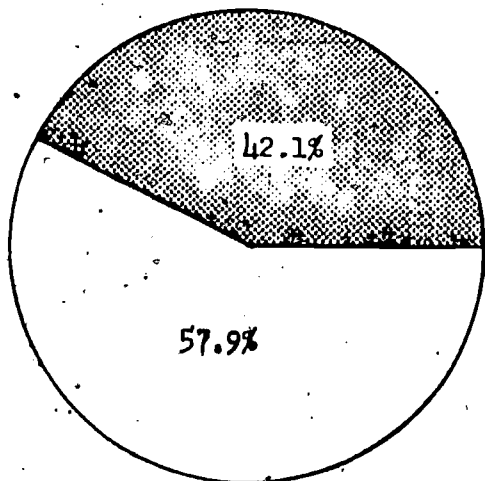
Chart II -- Average Daily Attendance in NSLP Schools as a Percentage of Total Average Daily Attendance.

Children attending schools in low income areas were more likely to have the National School Lunch Program in their schools than other children. Somewhat over one-third of the children attended schools in low income areas. The National School Lunch Program was offered in schools attended by 95.5% of these children. Children attending low income area schools having NSLP were more likely to participate in the program than children attending other NSLP schools. The report shows that 49.2% of the children in all schools having the program were reached, while in schools in low income areas having NSLP, 60.5% of the children received lunches. Chart III depicts this difference with respect to elementary and secondary schools.

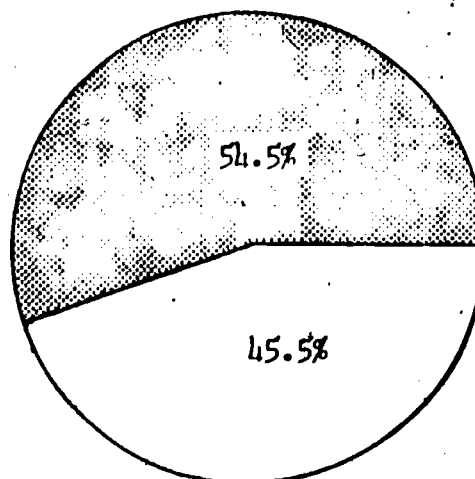
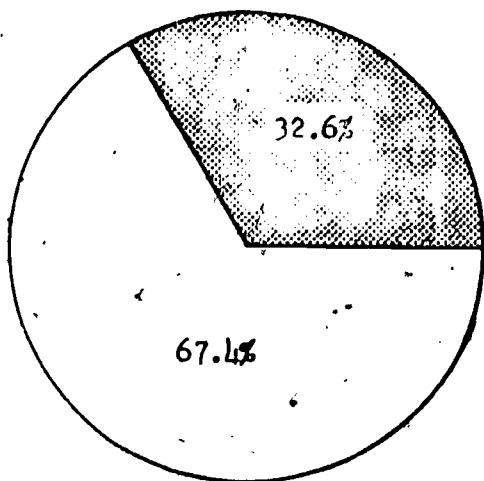
In schools in low income areas having NSLP, 78.0% of the meals were served free or at a reduced price while 56.5% of the meals served in all schools were free or reduced price. This may partially explain the difference between total NSLP schools and NSLP schools in low income areas in participation since children who pay for their lunches frequently have a choice of a type A lunch or of a la carte service.

There was substantial variation among the regions in the usage of the lunch program by children attending NSLP schools as Chart IV indicates.

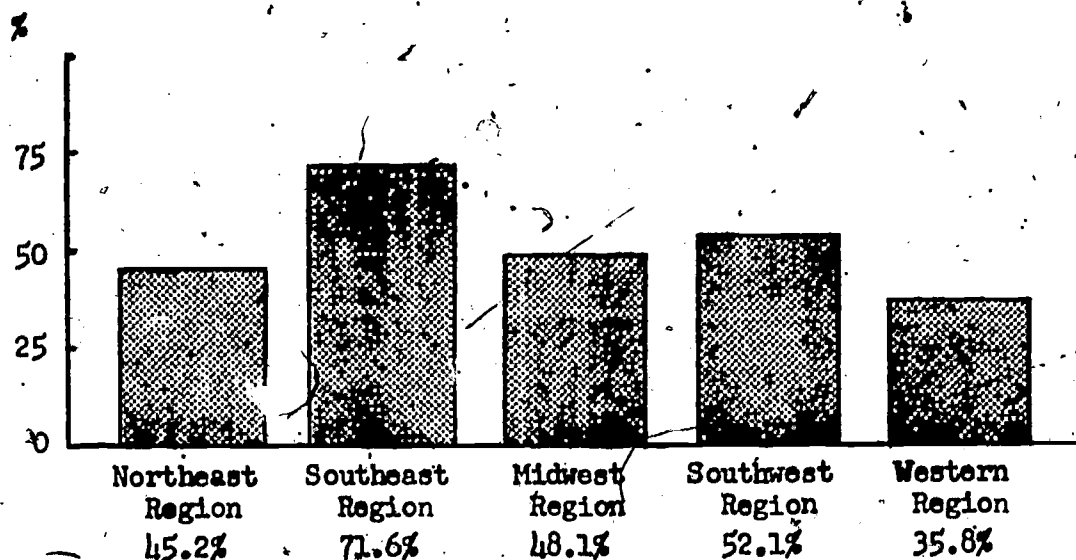


Chart IV -- Average Daily Lunches as a Percentage of Average Daily Attendance in NSLP Schools.

The Southeast region not only had the highest rate of availability as shown by Chart II, but also had the highest rate of participation by children attending NSLP schools as shown by Chart IV.

The School Breakfast (SBP) was available to 14.7% of the children covered by the report. The rate for elementary schools was twice that for secondary schools -- 18.5% compared with 9.0%. Children attending elementary schools offering the program were nearly three times as likely to take advantage of it as were children attending secondary schools with SBP. This is illustrated in Chart V. Overall, 28.7% of the children attending SBP schools were benefiting from the program.

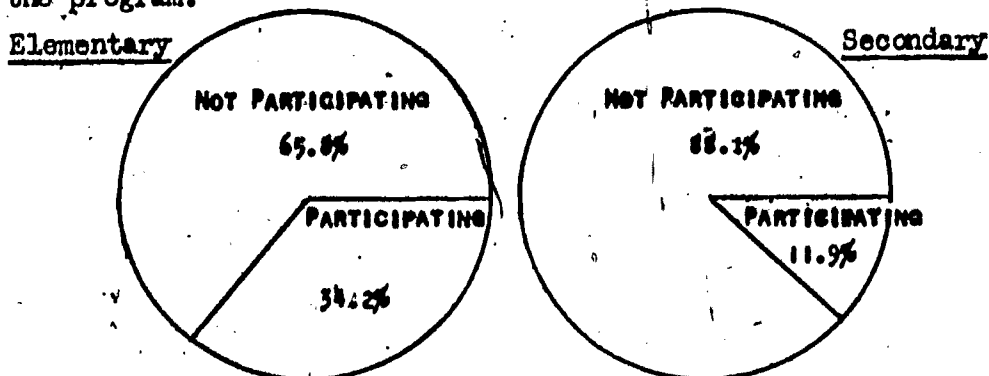


Chart V -- Average Daily Breakfasts as a Percentage of Average Daily Attendance in School Breakfast Program Schools

The Special Milk Program was available to 79.4% of the children attending schools covered by the survey. There was no significant difference between children attending elementary and secondary schools as far as availability of the Special Milk Program was concerned.

Schools attended by 3.5% of the children did not offer NSLP but did offer another lunch service. In such schools, 49.2% of the children used the program. This is exactly the same participation rate as for NSLP schools. There was a difference between elementary and secondary schools however. In elementary schools, children attending NSLP schools were more likely to eat a school lunch. In secondary schools, children attending schools offering another lunch program were more likely to use it than were the children attending NSLP secondary schools.

Chart VI shows that most children covered by the 1972 urban survey had some lunch program available to them.

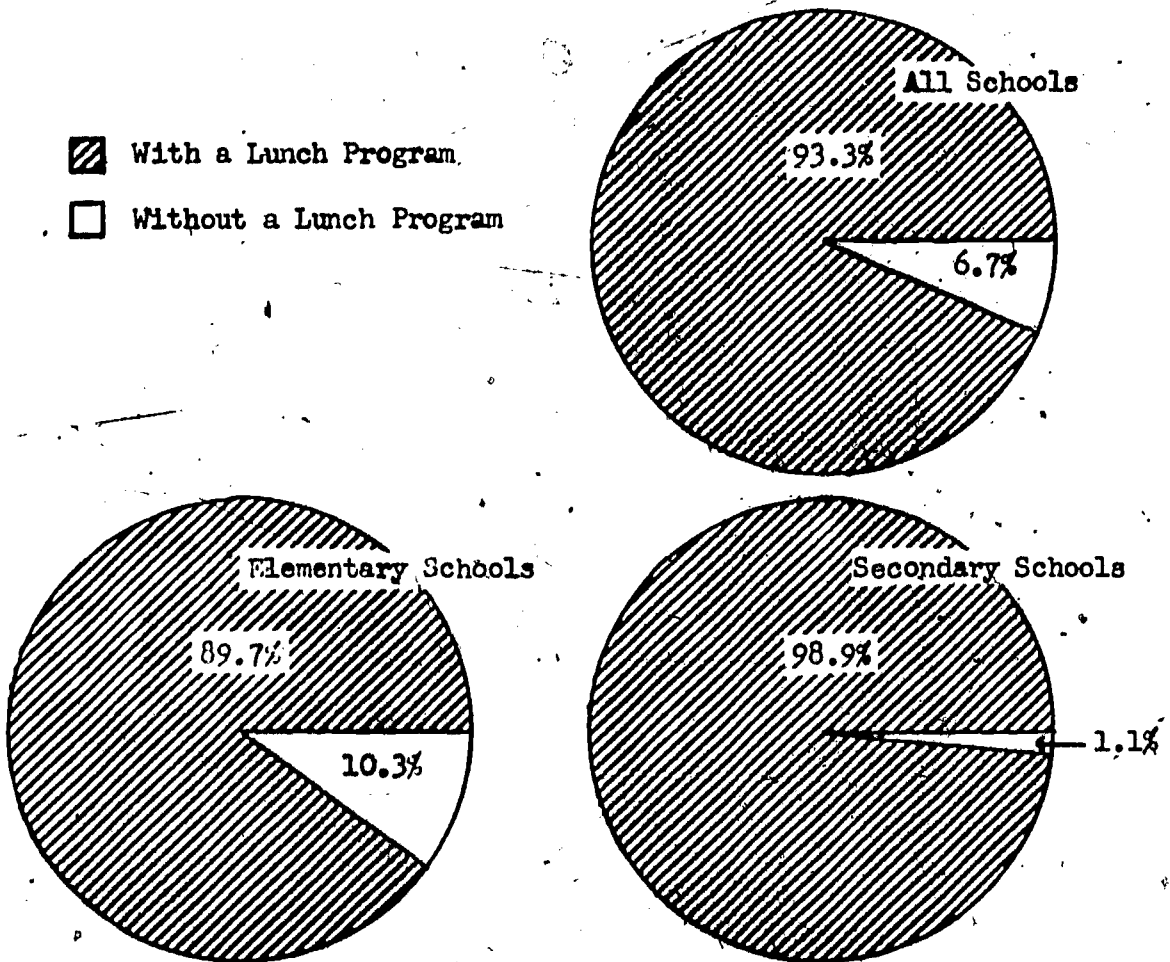


Chart VI -- Children Attending Schools with a Lunch Program

Virtually all children attending secondary schools could take advantage of a school lunch service if they wished. In elementary schools, however, more than one child in 10 attended a school not offering a lunch program.

Most of the children attending schools not offering a lunch program were in the Northeast and Midwest regions (Chart VII). With the exception of two schools in Hollywood, Florida, all schools in the Southeast region were reported as offering some kind of a lunch service.

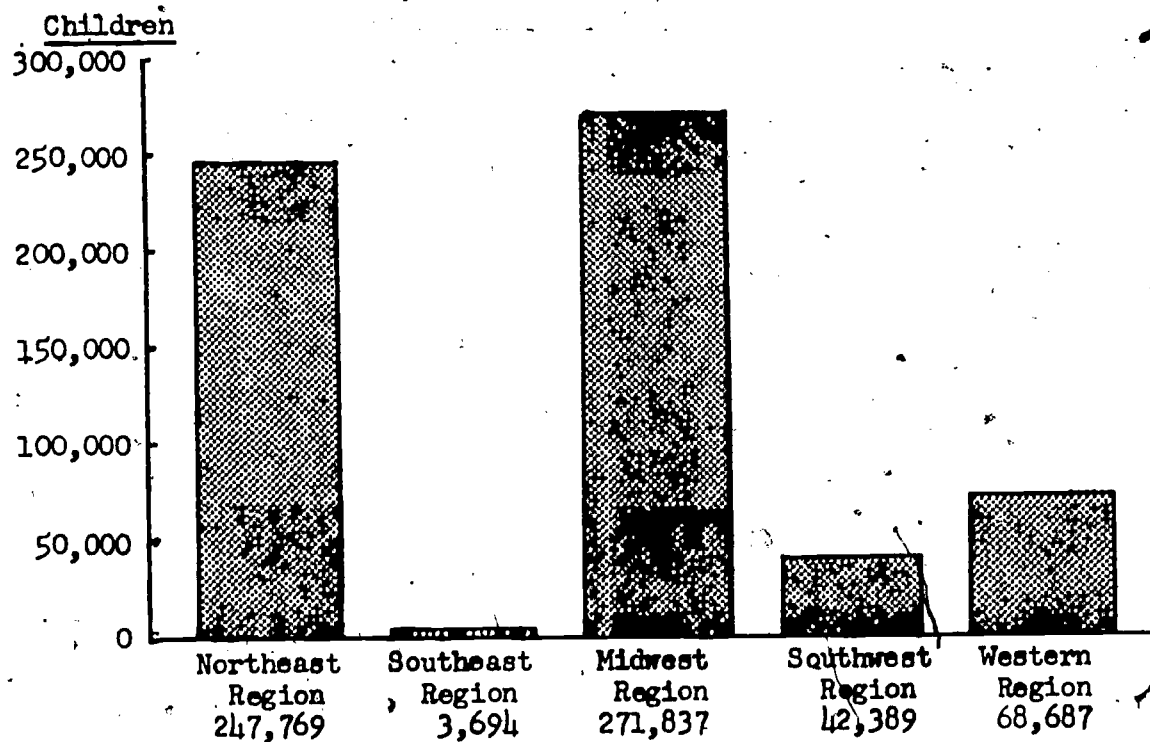


Chart VII -- Children Attending Schools Without a Lunch Program
