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ABSTRACT This report covers the status of school food services in 152 cities with populations of 100,000 and over for fiscal year 1973. It consists of six sections: general information on all schools, schools in the national school lunch program, schools with other and no food service, schools in low income areas, schools in the school breakfast program, and schools in the special milk program. Numbers of schools and of children are shown by elementary and secondary grades and by a combination of both. A 44.5 percent gain in the number of schools included in this survey is accounted for by the inclusion of many private schools which were not reported during the previous years. Since the report does not specifically separate public schools from private schools for the two years, comparisons between 1972 and 1973 are not made. Although the large increase in the number of schools not offering a food service program to their students may be attributed to the inclusion in the tabulation for 1973 of many private schools which do not have food service, the total number of children with access to a lunch program increased from 1972 to 1973. Over 77 percent elementary school children, 86.7 percent secondary, and 88.5 percent children in low income area schools have access to the National Schools Lunch Program. Higher participation rate in low income area schools is accounted for by the fact that most of the lunches are served free or at a reduced price. (Author/AM)

URBAN SCHOOL FEEDING SURVEY

INTRODUCTION

The annual Urban School Feeding Survey is a collection of data on school food service operations in cities with populations of 100,000 persons and over. The data in this survey come from reports submitted by 152 United States cities and are based on school food service activity during the month of March 1973.

There were 19,485 schools included in this year's survey, an increase of 6,004 schools from the March 1972 tabulation. This 44.5% gain in the number of schools is accounted for this year by the inclusion of many private schools which were not reported during the previous year. Since the report does not specifically separate public schools from private schools for the two years, it was not feasible to make comparisons between 1972 and 1973. However, Chart I does show the relative proportion of various food service programs as a function of total average daily attendance for both 1972 and 1973. The large increase in the number of schools not offering a food service program to their students may be attributed to the inclusion in the tabulation for 1973 of many private schools which have no food service. It should be noted, however, that the total number of children with access to a lunch program did increase from 1972 to 1973.

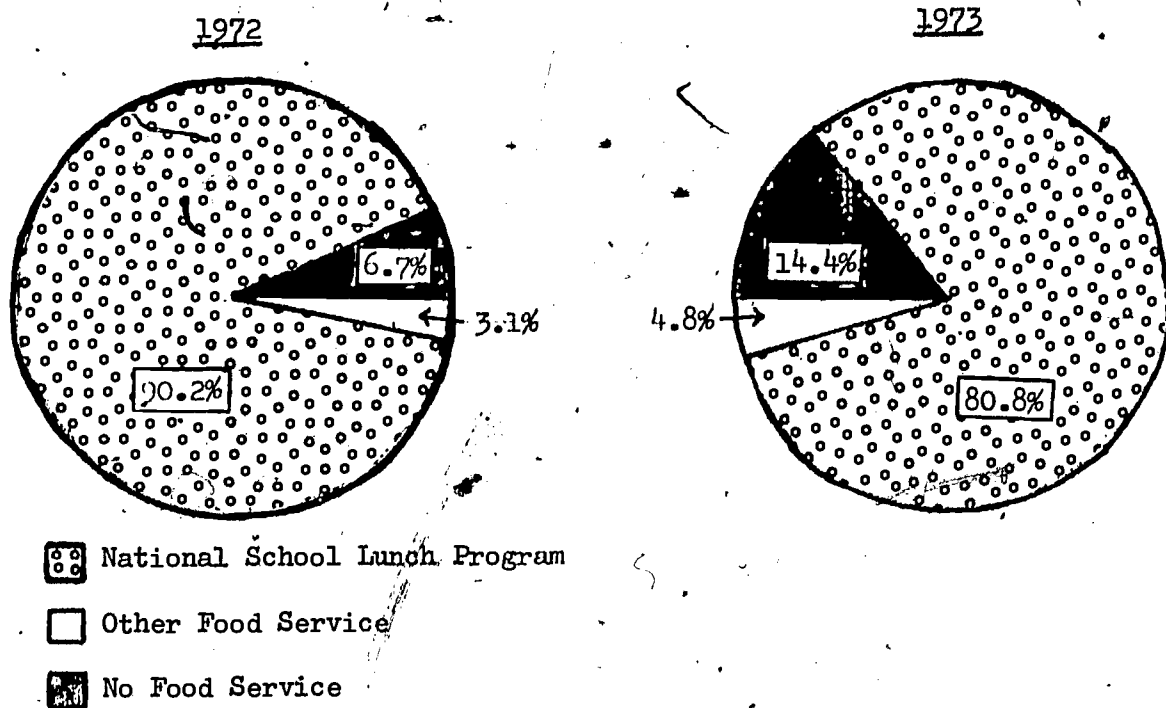


Chart I - Average Daily Attendance as a Percentage of Total Attendance, by Type of Food Service for 1972 and 1973

Availability and Utilization of Programs

The Urban School Feeding Survey for 1973 shows that lunch programs were available to 85.6% of the school children in cities with populations of 100,000 persons or over. The National School Lunch Program (NSLP) was offered to over 80.8% of the school children in these cities. Over 77.0% of the elementary school children had access to the NSLP as compared to 86.7% of the children in secondary schools. National School Lunch Program availability varied by region as shown in Chart II.

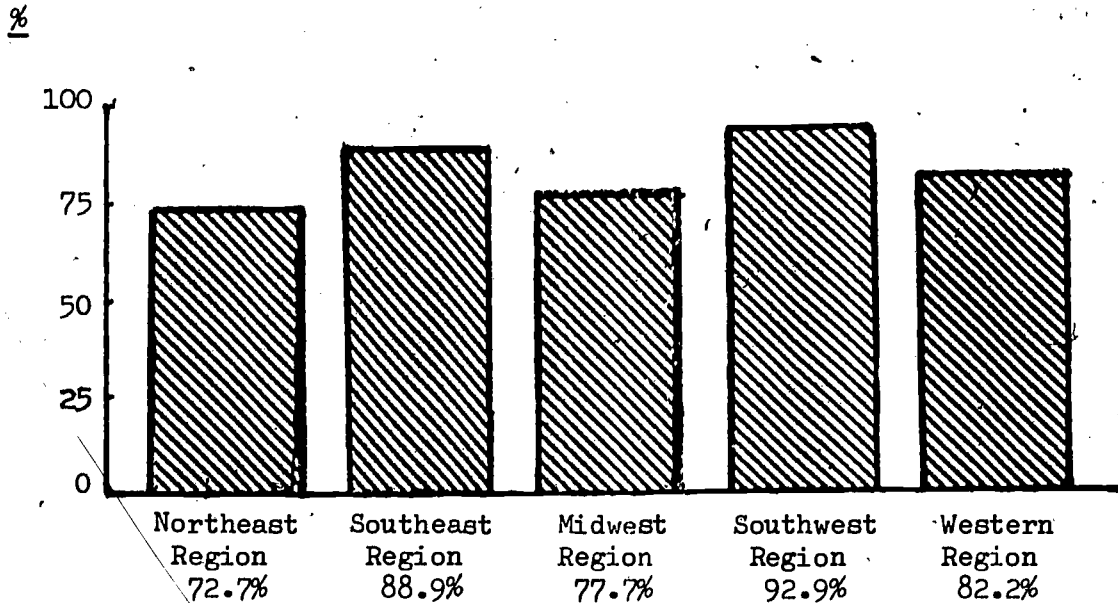


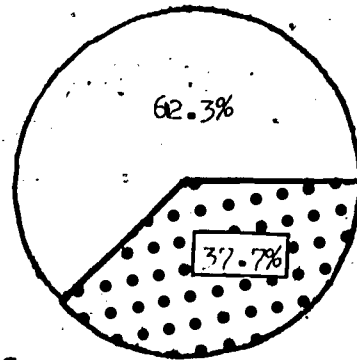
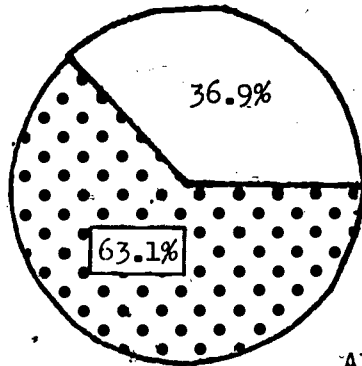
Chart II. - Average Daily Attendance in NSLP Schools as a Percentage of Average Daily Attendance in Total Schools

Almost one-third of the children in the survey this year attended schools located in low income areas of their cities. The National School Lunch Program was offered by 84.1% of the schools in low income areas as compared to 65.3% of the schools in other areas. The NSLP was available to 88.5% of the children in low income area schools, while 77.0% of the children in other areas had access to the NSLP. Besides being more likely to have the NSLP in their schools, children in low income areas also participated in the lunch program at a higher rate than other children. The survey indicates that 61.8% of the children in low income area schools received lunches in the NSLP as opposed to 47.1% of the children in other NSLP schools. Chart III depicts this difference with respect to elementary and secondary NSLP schools.

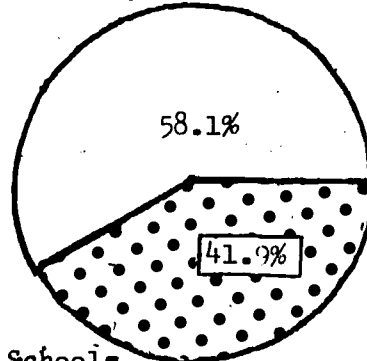
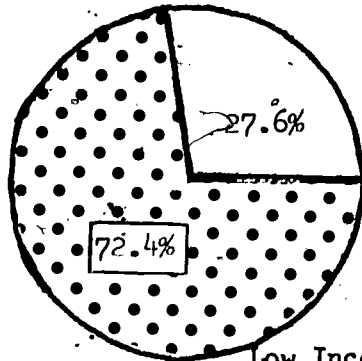
One reason for the higher NSLP participation rate in low income area schools than other schools may be that most of the lunches were served free or at a reduced price to the students. Low income area NSLP schools served 76.0% of their lunches free or at a reduced price, while other schools served 45.5% free or reduced price lunches.

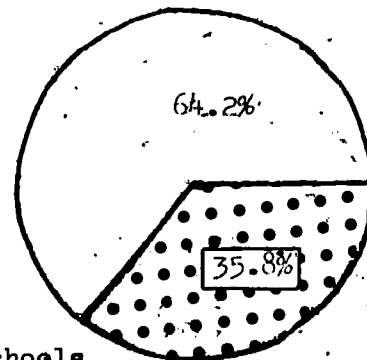
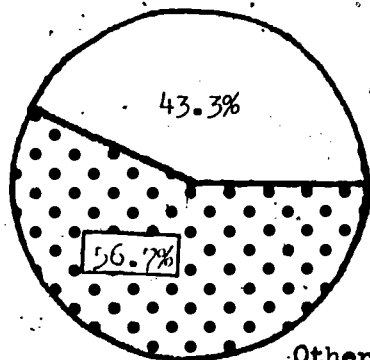
Secondary Schools

The rate of children participating in the National School Lunch Program was 52.4% for all NSLP schools. The rate varied by region among NSLP schools as shown in Chart IV.

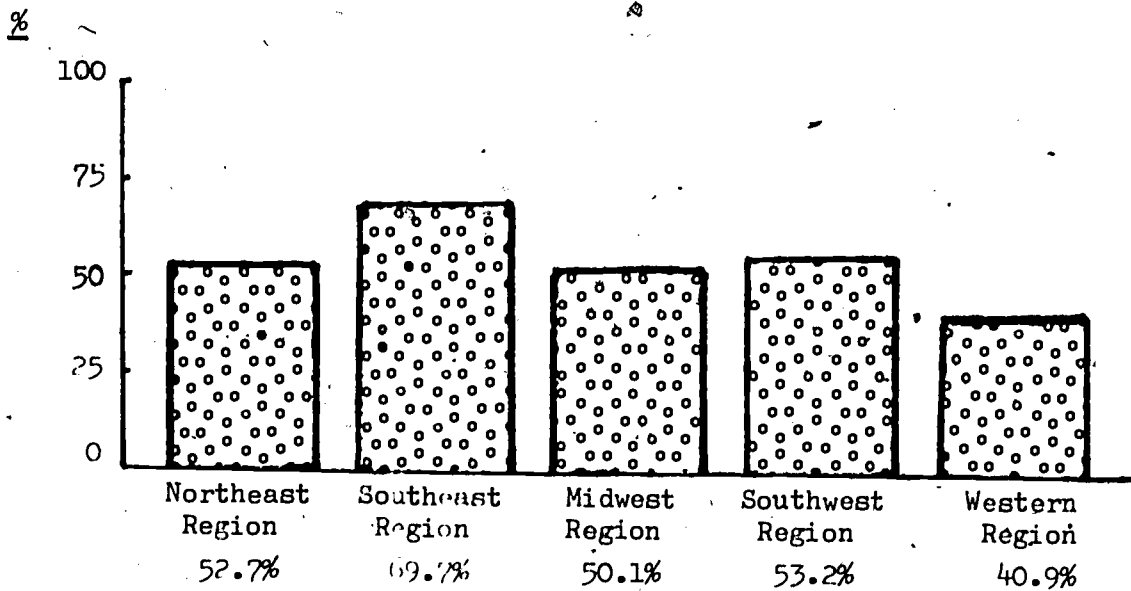


Chart IV -- Average Daily Lunches as a Percentage of Average Daily Attendance in NSLP Schools

The School Breakfast Program (SBP) was offered in schools attended by 15.4% of the children covered by the survey. The SBP was available to 18.0% of the elementary school children and 11.5% of the secondary school children. Almost 30.2% of the children with access to the SBP were participating on a regular basis, with elementary school children participating at more than twice the rate of secondary school children as shown by Chart V.

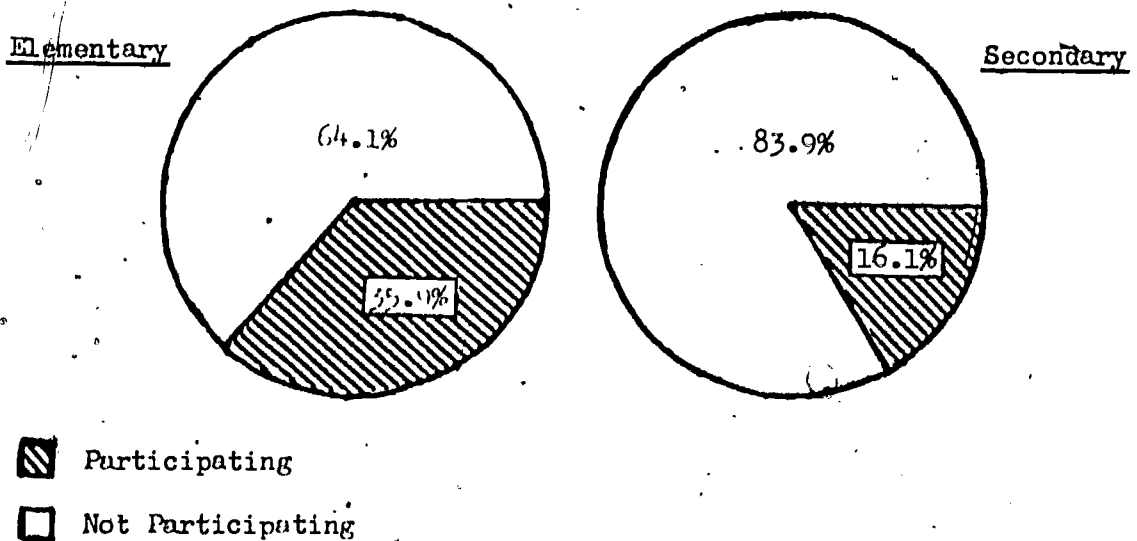


Chart V -- Average Daily Breakfasts as a Percentage of Average Daily Attendance in School Breakfast Program Schools

The Special Milk Program was made available to over 75.0% of the children attending surveyed schools. The program was equally accessible to children attending both elementary and secondary schools.

Some 1,293 schools surveyed offered lunch service other than the National School Lunch Program to their students. These schools were attended by 4.8% of the total children surveyed. In these schools 53.8% of the children participated in the lunch service as compared to a participation rate of 52.4% in NSLP schools. The only real difference between elementary and secondary schools was in the rate of participation by students in the two types of lunch service. In elementary schools, children attending NSLP schools showed a higher rate of participation than did children participating in lunch programs in other schools. In secondary schools the situation was reversed with children attending schools with non-NSLP lunch programs participating at a higher rate than children in NSLP schools. This may be due to the large number of a la carte lunch programs in secondary schools. Most of the children attending the surveyed schools had some type of a lunch program available to them. Chart VI shows the breakdown between elementary and secondary schools for children with access to a lunch program.

- Without a Lunch Program

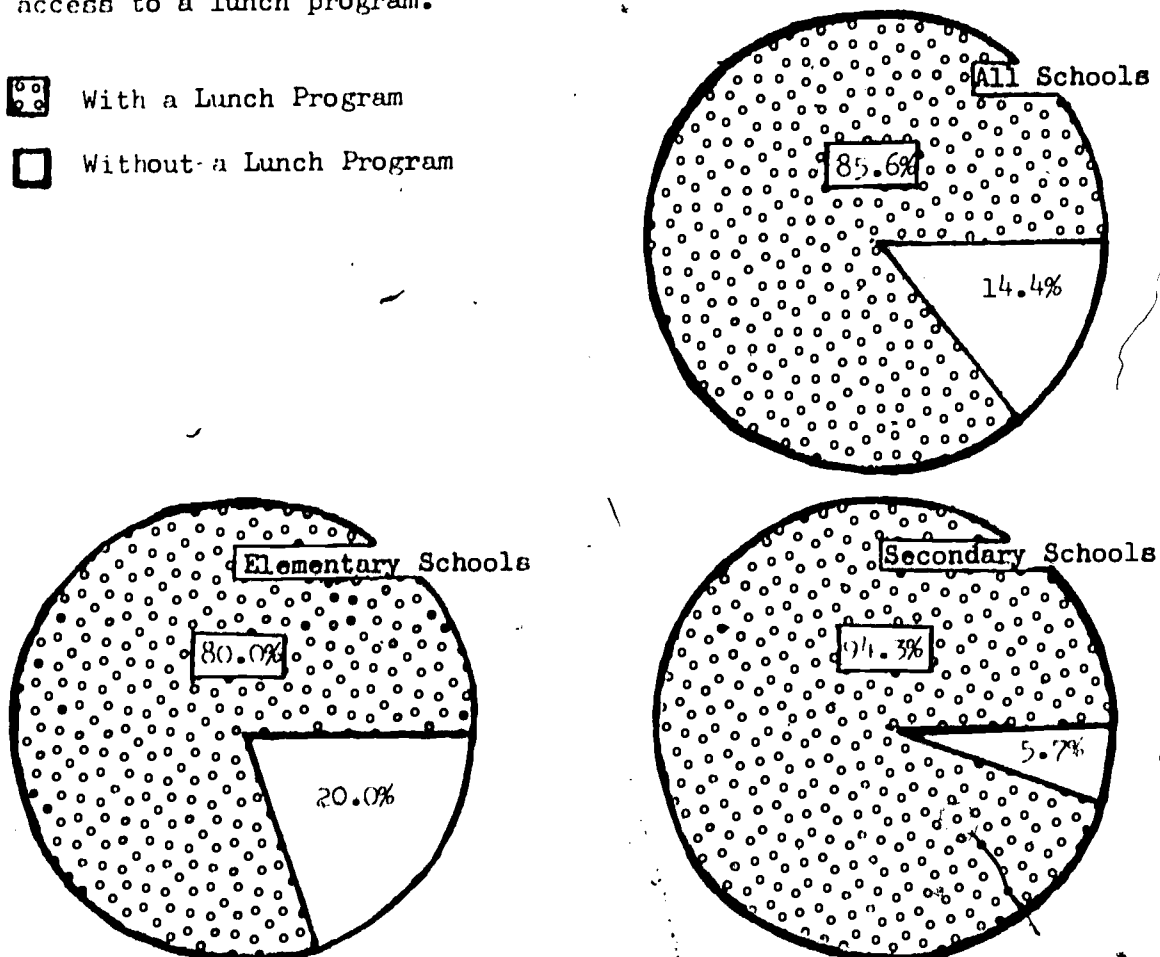


Chart VI -- Children Attending Schools With a Lunch Program

As Chart VI illustrates, 94.3% of the secondary school students had access to a lunch program of some kind in their schools. In elementary schools however, only 80.0% of the students had a lunch program available to them. This may be due to the half-day sessions in many elementary schools.

Most of the children attending schools which did not offer a lunch program were located in the Northeast and Midwest areas of the country as shown in Chart VII.

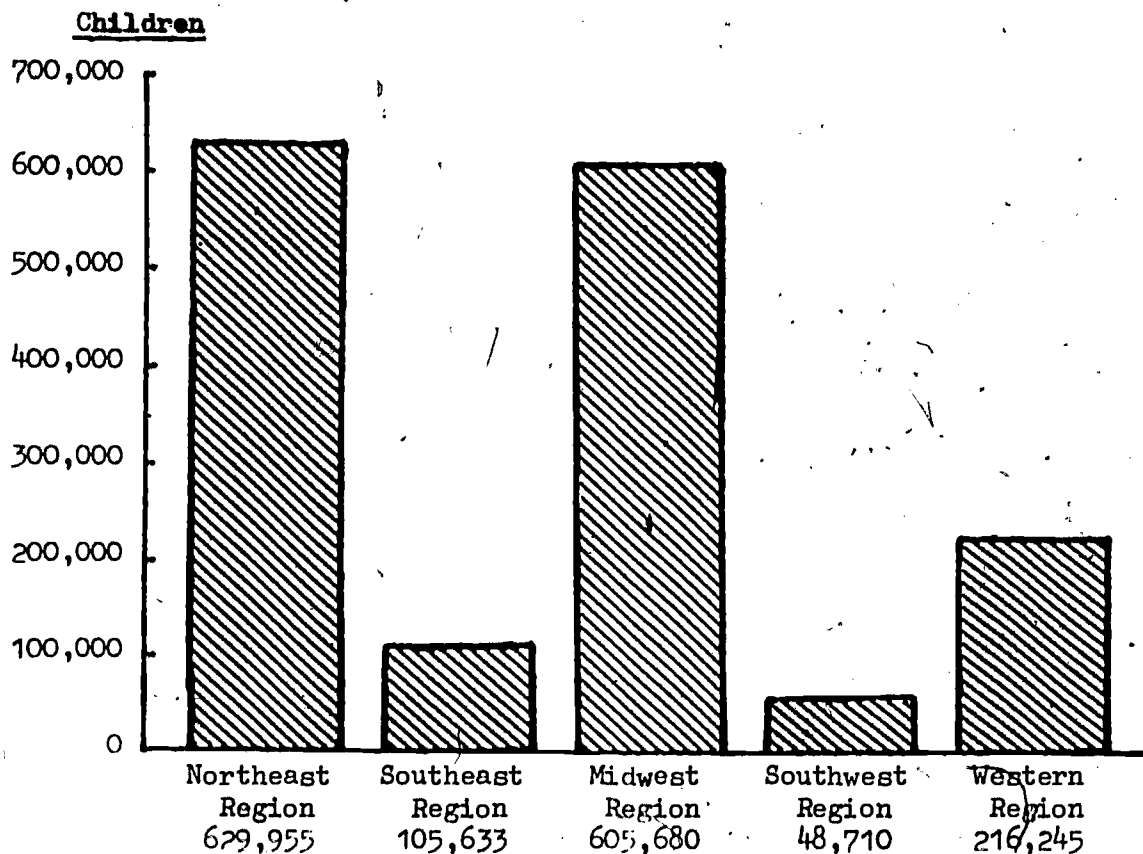


Chart VII -- Children Attending Schools Without a Lunch Program
