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ABSTRACT

The status of school food services in 152 cities with populations of 100,000 and over for fiscal year 1975 is covered in this report. It consists of six sections: general information on all schools, schools in the national school lunch program, schools with other and no food services, schools in low income areas, schools in the school breakfast program, and schools in the special milk program. Numbers of schools and of children are shown by elementary and secondary grades and by a combination of both. The total number of children with access to a lunch program is 95.3 percent. A decrease of 5,921 schools from the 1974 figures is the result of private schools not being included in the present survey. Almost 92.6 percent of the elementary school children, and 96.5 percent of the secondary school children have access to the National School Lunch Program. The School Breakfast Program is available to 32.3 percent of the elementary school children and 21.4 percent of the secondary school children. Elementary school children participate at a much higher rate than secondary school children. The Special Milk Program is about equally accessible to children attending both elementary and secondary schools. (Author/AM)

INTRODUCTION

The Annual Urban Public School Feeding Survey is a collection of data pertaining to public school food service operations in cities with populations of 100,000 persons and over. The data in this survey come from reports submitted by 152 United States cities and are based on school food service activity during the month of March 1975.

There were 13,722 public schools included in this year's survey, a decrease of 5,921 schools from the March 1974 tabulation. Most of the decrease was the result of private schools not being included in the 1975 survey. Chart I shows the relative proportion of various food service programs as a function of total average daily attendance in public schools for 1975.





Chart I - Total Average Daily Attendance by Type of Food Service for 1975



Availability and Utilization of Programs

The Urban Public-School Feeding Survey for 1975 shows that lunch programs were available to 95.3% of the children attending public schools in cities with populations of 100,000 or over. The National School Lunch Program (NSLP) was offered to 94.2% of the school children in these cities. Almost 92.6% of the elementary school children had access to the NSLP as compared to 96.5% of the children in secondary schools. National School Lunch Program availability varied by region as shown in Chart II.




Chart II - Average Daily Attendance in NSLP Public Schools as a Percentage of Average Daily Attendance in Total Public Schools by Region.

The rate of children attending public schools and participating in the National School Lunch Program was 56.0% for all NSLP Schools. The rate varied by region among NSLP Schools as shown in Chart III.




Chart III - Average Daily Lunches as a Percentage of Average Daily Attendance in NSLP Public Schools, by Region.

The School Breakfast Program (SBP) was offered in public schools attended by 27.7% of the children covered by the survey. The SBP was available to 32.3% of the elementary school children and 21.4% of the secondary school children. Over 23.1% of the children with access to the SBP were participating on a regular basis. The elementary school children participated at a much higher rate than secondary school children, as shown in Chart IV.




Chart IV - Average Daily Breakfasts as a Percentage of Average Daily Attendance in School Breakfast Program Public Schools.

The Special Milk Program was made available to over 87.6% of the children attending surveyed schools. The program was about equally accessible to children attending both elementary (88.3%) and secondary (86.7%) schools.

Only 87 public schools surveyed offered their students a lunch service other than the National School Lunch Program. These schools were attended by 1.1% of the total children in the survey. Chart V shows the breakdown between elementary and secondary schools for children with access to a lunch program.




Chart V — Children Attending Public Schools with and without a Lunch Program.

As Chart V illustrates, some 98.9% of the secondary school students had access to a lunch program of some kind in their schools. In elementary schools however, 92.7% of the students had a lunch program available to them. This may be due, in part, to the half-day sessions in many elementary schools.

Some 422,352 children attended public schools without a lunch service. Most of the children attending schools which did not offer a lunch program were located in the Northeast and Midwest areas of the country, as shown in Chart VI.




Chart VI — Children Attending Public Schools without a Lunch Program as a percentage of Total Average Daily Attendance, by Region.
