ABSTRACT

A bibliography of 114 books and 32 professional journals and periodicals found most useful to community services and continuing education (CS/CE) professionals working in higher education institutions in Maryland is presented. Books are listed alphabetically, and the subject category in which the contributor found the reference most useful is indicated. A summary grid identifies the books under 14 subject categories (administration/management, adult education methods, adult psychology/learning theory, community development services, current issues, evaluation, general adult education reference, group dynamics/leadership, organizational development, philosophy/history of adult and continuing education, professional and staff development, program development, research, and residential adult education). Persons contributing the reference materials are listed. It is stated that the bibliography will provide a valuable entry point into the literature relevant to the CS/CE field, but it is not meant to be exhaustive or comprehensive. (LH)

Enclosed are the results of the Bibliographic Survey of Resources for Community Services and Continuing Education (CS/CE). This survey is a result of the work of the Bibliography Task Force sponsored by the Maryland Project to Strengthen Community Services and Continuing Education which is partially funded by the Maryland State Agency for Title I, Program IMPACT.

The bibliographic materials that are included were gathered from CS/CE professionals working in higher education institutions within the state of Maryland. A survey was conducted in which these professionals were asked to submit the five bibliographic references that they felt have been the most useful to them in strengthening their skills and knowledge as practitioners in the field of community services and continuing education. Included in this packet of information are the following:

1. An alphabetical listing of all the resources indicating the subject categories in which the contributor found the reference to be most useful.
2. A grid designed to facilitate the identification of references in a certain subject category. This grid summarizes the references according to those broad subject categories in which the 36 contributors found the references to be most useful.
3. An alphabetical list of the professional journals and periodicals that the contributors felt were most helpful to them in their professional development.
4. A list of those persons who contributed reference materials.

The bibliographic references cited by those responding to the survey cover a wide variety of subject areas related to the CS/CE field and provide information on both practical and theoretical levels. The Task Force is hopeful that the bibliography resulting from this survey will provide a valuable entry point into the literature relevant to the CS/CE field. It is meant to serve as a guide primarily to those individuals within this area who are interested in what other professionals in this field read and refer to in their day-to-day activities. This bibliography is not meant to be exhaustive or comprehensive; but, instead, is meant to serve as a compendium of the "favorite" bibliographic materials of those professionals responding to this survey.
