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ABSTRACT

The number of unemployed persons at some time during calendar year 1974 totaled 18.3 million which is nearly four million above the 1973 level. The number of persons who worked reached 101.7 million. The proportion of the population who work varies widely by age, and the pattern for men differs from that for women. Over this period, the rate for black women with work experience decreased while that for white women increased. Among men, a higher proportion of whites than of blacks worked during 1974. The total number of unemployed during 1974 was about three and one-half times the annual average. The increase in unemployment in 1974 was sharper for men than for women, but the proportion of the work force with unemployment during the year continued to be higher for women. Although the proportion of the work force with unemployment rose over the year in every age group, the rise was greater for persons under 25 and lowest among persons over 45. Descriptions of basic labor force concepts, sample design, estimating methods, and reliability of the estimates are given in a section called Explanatory Notes. Twenty-five supplementary tables are presented. (Author/EC)

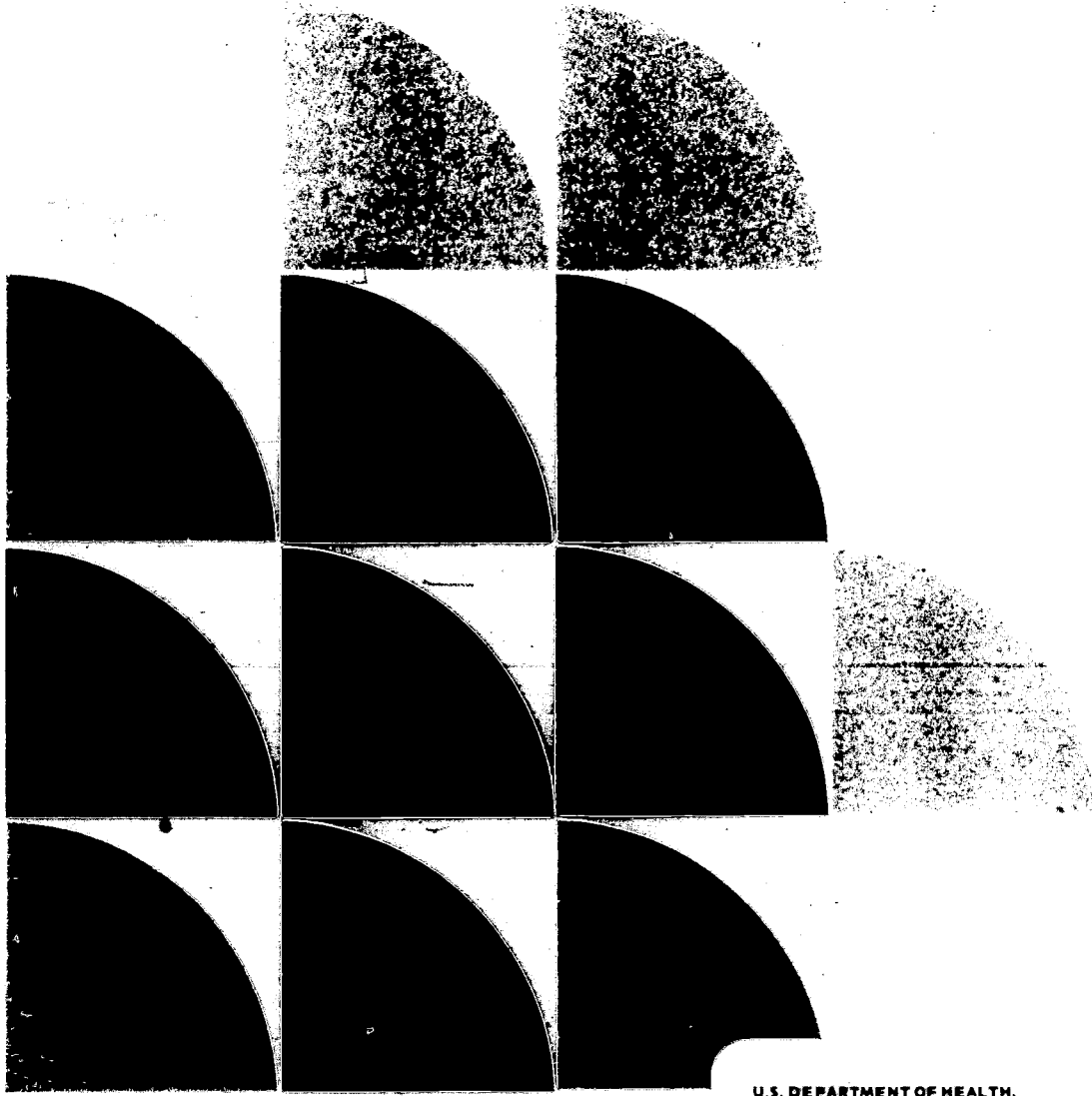

Work experience of the population in 1974

THE NUMBER OF PERSONS with unemployment at some time during calendar year 1974 totaled 18.3 million, nearly 4 million above the 1973 level.¹ (See table 1.) Included in the total were 2.1 million persons who looked for work at least 1 week but did not find any during the year. Among all persons in the work force for any part of the year, the proportion of those with 1 week or more of unemployment was 17.6 percent, the highest in more than a decade. Comparable percentages in the 1958 and 1961 recession years were 17.9 and 18.4 percent, respectively. The proportions of workers having some unemployment were highest among those under age 25 and lowest among those 45 and over. As in past years, a higher proportion of the black² than of the white work force was unemployed at some time during 1974. (See table 2.)

The total number of persons with any unemployment during 1974 was about 3½ times the annual average of unemployment. This was consistent with the ratios prevailing in the past which have generally ranged between 3 to 1 and 4 to 1.

The number of persons who experienced long-duration unemployment—15 weeks or more—during 1974 was 5.6 million as compared with 4.3 million in 1973. This measure totals all the spells of unemployment during the year. About one-third of the workers unemployed in 1974 had more than one spell.

Persons who worked

The number of persons who worked at some time during the year reached 101.7 million in 1974. (See table 3.) Women accounted for about two-thirds of the 1.5 million over-the-year rise in the number of persons with work experience, and the proportion of all women who worked reached a post-World War II high of 54 percent. The increase in the

number of workers among both men and women was concentrated in the age group of 20 to 34 years, reflecting the rise of population that resulted from the large number of births during the late 1940's and early 1950's.

The proportions of the population who work vary widely by age and the pattern for men differs from that for women. Among men, in 1974, the proportion reached a peak of 96 percent at ages 25 to 44 and dropped quite sharply after age 61, when many became eligible for retirement. (See table 4.) Among women, the highest proportions were in ages 18 to 24, around 75 percent, and then declined in each subsequent age group.

A greater proportion of black than of white women usually work at some time during the year. In recent years, however, the difference between the two rates has narrowed sharply, falling from 9 percentage points in 1967 to 2 points in 1974. Over this period, the rate for blacks decreased while that for whites increased, as shown in the following tabulation:

(Although the proportion of black women who

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either worked or looked for work was unchanged, the proportion of these women who found jobs decreased.) Among men, as usual, a higher proportion of whites than of blacks worked during 1974. The difference in rates between these two population groups widened from 2 percentage points in 1967 to 8 in 1974, as the rate for blacks fell more sharply than for whites.

The reduced economic activity at the end of 1974 was reflected in a drop of nearly 500,000 in the number of men who worked year-round full time. Most of the loss in steady employment among men was in manufacturing industries. Among women, 800,000 more than in 1973 worked year-round full

time, led by workers in wholesale and retail trade and in services (industries in which women workers are employed in large numbers). Within occupation groups, the over-the-year reduction of about 400,000 in year-round full-time employment among craft workers and a similar number among operatives, except transport, primarily affected men, whereas the rise in steady employment among clerical workers benefited only women.

Persons with unemployment

The increase in unemployment in 1974 was sharper for men than for women, but the proportion

of the work force with unemployment during the year continued to be higher for women, 18.3 percent, compared with 17.1 percent. Although the proportion of the work force with unemployment rose over the year in every age group, the rise was greater for persons under 25 than for older persons. Consequently, younger workers' share of the increase in unemployment was greater than their proportion in the work force—43 and 26 percent, respectively.

The proportion of the black work force with unemployment rose more rapidly in 1974 than that of whites, and the spread between the two percentages widened. Blacks also had a greater proportion of unemployed who accumulated 15 weeks or more of joblessness.

As women have become a larger part of the civilian labor force in recent years, their share of total unemployment has also increased. About 44 percent of all persons unemployed during 1974 were women, compared with 39 percent a decade earlier. The majority of these women (51 percent) were married and 12 percent were household heads. Unemployment rose relatively more among female family heads than among married women. Contributing to the increase were the sharp rise during the year in the number of women who became heads of households and the traditionally larger proportion of female household heads with unemployment. Whereas the number of married women in the work force increased only in line with the population growth—and thus were proportionally unchanged in 1974—female family heads increased by 5 percent and their number in the work force by 9 percent.

With the rise in unemployment over the year, the size of all duration-of-unemployment groups increased in 1974. However, with the increase concentrated in the final months of the year, the effect of the recession on the proportion of the work force with unemployment of long duration was limited. The total number of those who accumulated 15 weeks or more in all spells of unemployment rose to 5.6 million, but the proportion of those who experienced long-duration unemployment—31 percent—was about the same as in 1973. As in earlier years, the proportion of unemployed with long-duration unemployment was greater among black than among white workers.

The proportion of the work force with unemployment rose over the year among nearly all industry and occupation groups. A third of all construction workers and a fifth of the workers in durable and

nondurable manufacturing were unemployed at some time during the year, much larger proportions than in 1973; increases were much smaller in other industries. Among both men and women, the proportion with unemployment jumped most sharply among operatives (except transport), among whom 1 out of 4 was unemployed for at least 1 week during 1974, compared with 1 out of 5 in 1973. The cutback in the construction industry in 1974 was reflected in the high proportion of men in this industry who had unemployment during the year—about 4 out of 10 laborers and 1 out of 3 skilled construction workers. Furthermore, long-duration unemployment of 15 weeks or more increased only in the construction industry. Among occupation groups, only women professional and technical

workers showed an increase in long-duration unemployment in 1974.

Labor force status in March 1975

Because of the continuing high rate of unemployment in early 1975, the labor force status in March 1975 (the month of the annual work experience survey) of persons with unemployment during 1974 is of special interest. Somewhat more than half of those who had been out of work at some time in 1974 were employed in March and one-fourth were unemployed. (See table 5.) A higher proportion of men than of women who had been unemployed in 1974 were employed or unemployed in March. Relatively more of the women than of the men had left the labor force.

Persons with relatively short periods of unemploy-

ment in 1974 were more likely to be working in March 1975 (and, correspondingly, a smaller proportion of them were unemployed) than those who were unemployed a total of 15 weeks or more. Persons who had been unemployed for 27 weeks or more in 1974 were as likely to be unemployed as employed in March 1975. Apparently the problems and circumstances which adversely affected these persons during the year were still operative at the time of the survey.

Data on the work experience in 1974 of the 8.4 million persons unemployed in March 1975 show that 18 percent of them had not worked in 1974. However, 67 percent had held full-time jobs in 1974, including 22 percent who had worked year-round full time. This very large proportion out of work among previously fully employed workers is the highest since this type of data were first collected

in 1966, and it indicates the rapidity of the growth of unemployment in less than 3 months. □

—FOOTNOTES—

¹ The annual survey of the work experience of the population during a given year is made in March of the following year. The information obtained relates to the *civilian* work experience of all persons 16 years of age and over in the civilian noninstitutional population as of the March date. Thus, the work experience of persons who were in the civilian labor force during 1974 but not in the civilian noninstitutional population in March 1975 is not included; similarly, data on persons who died in 1974 or in 1975 before the survey date are also not reflected. The persons who reached 16

during January, February, or March 1975 are included. The data are compiled from supplementary questions in the March 1975 monthly survey of the labor force, conducted for the Bureau of Labor Statistics by the Bureau of the Census through its Current Population Survey.

This is the latest in a series of reports on this subject. Data from the March 1974 survey were published in the *Monthly Labor Review*, December 1974 (pp. 49-53), and reprinted with additional tabular data and explanatory notes as Special Labor Force Report 171.

² Data for all persons other than white are used in this report to represent data for blacks, since the latter constitute about nine-tenths of all persons other than white in the United States.

Appendix

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Explanatory note

ESTIMATES in this report are based on supplementary questions in the March 1975 Current Population Survey conducted and tabulated for the Bureau of Labor Statistics by the Bureau of the Census. Basic labor-force concepts, sample design, estimating methods, and reliability of the data are described briefly in the following sections. 1/

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Population Coverage. Each month trained interviewers collect information from a sample of about 47,000 households in 461 areas in 923 counties and independent cities with coverage in each of the 50 States and the District of Columbia. Estimates in this report are for persons 16 years of age and over in the civilian noninstitutional population during the calendar week ending March 15, 1975. The civilian noninstitutional population excludes all members of the Armed Forces and inmates of institutions such as homes for the aged and correctional institutions. All persons were asked how many weeks they worked and whether they looked for work during 1974. Persons who worked less than 50 weeks were asked detailed questions on reasons for part-year work and whether they had more than one period of unemployment.

Work Experience. Persons with work experience are those who worked as civilians at any time during the year at full-time or part-time jobs.

Part-Time and Full-Time Jobs. Persons are classified as having worked at full-time jobs if they worked 35 hours or more per week in a majority of the weeks worked during the year. They are classified as having worked at part-time jobs if they worked 1 to 34 hours per week in a majority of the weeks worked during the year.

Weeks Worked. Persons with work experience are classified according to the number of weeks in which they did any work during the year as civilians for pay or profit (including paid vacations and sick leave) or worked without pay on a family-operated farm or business.

Year-Round Full-Time Workers. Year-round full-time workers are persons who worked primarily at full-time jobs for 50 weeks or more.

Part-Year Workers. Part-year workers are persons who worked either full time or part time for 1 to 49 weeks.

Major Reason for Part-Year Work. Part-year workers are classified by major reason for part-year work on the basis of what they were doing most of the weeks in which they did not work. Their reasons are reported as unemployment or layoff from a job, illness or disability (not including paid sick leave), taking care of home, going to school, retirement, in the Armed Forces, and other reasons. The "going to school" category was restricted to persons under 30 years of age, "taking care of home" was restricted to women, and "in the Armed Forces" was restricted to men.

Nonworkers. Nonworkers are persons who did not work during the year. They are asked whether they looked for work during the year and, if they looked, for how many weeks. Nonworkers are classified according to the main reason for not working. Their reasons are reported as illness or disability, taking care of home, going to school, inability to find work, retired, in the Armed Forces, and other reasons.

Longest Job. A person's longest job during the year is the one at which he worked the greatest number of weeks. For most wage and salary workers, a job is defined as all the time worked for the same employer. The only exception is work for private families (domestic service, babysitting, odd jobs and the like) which is counted as a single job regardless of number of employers. Self-employment and unpaid work in family-operated enterprises are also designated as jobs for purposes of this survey.

Occupation, Industry, and Class of Worker. The data on occupation, industry, and class of worker refer to the job held longest during the year. Persons who held two jobs or more are reported in the job at which they worked the greatest number of weeks.

The occupation and industry categories used here are those used in the 1970 Census of Population. The class-of-worker breakdown specifies "wage and salary workers," "self-employed workers," and "unpaid family workers." Wage and salary workers are persons working for a wage, salary, commission, tips, payment in kind, or at piece rates for a private employer or any government unit. Self-employed workers are persons working in their own unincorporated business, profession, or trade, or operating a farm for profit or fees. Unpaid family workers are persons working without pay on a farm or in a business operated by a member of the household to whom they are related by blood or marriage.

Spell of Unemployment. A spell of unemployment is a continuous period of unemployment of at least one week's duration. A spell is terminated by employment or withdrawal from the labor force.

Duration of Unemployment. The number of weeks accumulated in all spells of unemployment represents the total number of weeks of unemployment during the year.

Employed in March 1975. Employed persons are all those who during the survey week (a) did any work at all as paid employees or in their own business or profession, or on their own farm, or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers in an enterprise operated by a member of the family or (b) did not work but had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent because of illness, bad weather, vacation, labor-management dispute, or personal reasons, whether or not they were paid by their employers for the time off, and whether or not they were seeking other jobs.

Unemployed in March 1975. Unemployed persons are all those who did not work during the survey week, made specific efforts to find a job within the preceding 4 weeks, and were available for work during the survey week or would have been available except for temporary illness. Also included as unemployed are those who did not work at all, were available for work, and (a) were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off, or (b) were waiting to report to a new wage or salary job within 30 days.

Civilian Labor Force in March 1975. The civilian labor force comprises all civilian persons classified as employed or unemployed according to the above definitions.

Not in Civilian Labor Force in March 1975. Persons not classified as employed or unemployed are defined as not in the labor force. Persons doing only incidental unpaid family work (less than 15 hours) are also classified as not in the labor force.

Age. The age classification is based on the age of the person at his last birthday.

Race. The population is divided into three groups on the basis of race: white, Negro, and "other races." The last category includes American Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and any other race except Negro and white.

Marital Status. Persons are classified into the following categories according to their marital status at the time of interview: Single, married, spouse present, and other marital status. The classification "married, spouse present" applies to husband and wife if both are reported as members of the same household even though one may be temporarily absent on business, vacation, on a visit, in a hospital, and the like at the time of interview. The term "other marital status" applies to persons who are married with spouse absent, widowed, or divorced.

Sums of Distributions. Sums of individual items, whether absolute numbers or percentages, may not equal totals because of independent rounding of totals and components. Percentage totals, however, are always shown as 100 percent.

RELIABILITY OF THE ESTIMATES

Estimating Procedure. The estimating procedure used in this survey inflates weighted sample results to independent estimates of the civilian noninstitutional population by age, sex, and race. These independent estimates were based on statistics from the 1970 Census of Population and other data on births, deaths, immigration, emigration, and strength of the Armed Forces.

Variability. Since the estimates are based on a sample, they may differ somewhat from the figures that would have been obtained if a complete census had been taken using the same schedules and procedures. As in any survey, the results are also subject to errors of response and reporting. These may be relatively large in the case of persons with irregular attachment to the labor force.

The standard error is primarily a measure of sampling variability, that is, of the variations that might occur by chance because a sample rather than the entire population is surveyed. As calculated for this report, the standard error also partially measures the effect of response and enumeration errors but does not measure any systematic biases in the data. The chances are about 2 out of 3 that an estimate from the sample would differ from a complete census by less than the standard error. The chances are about 19 out of 20 that the difference would be less than twice the standard error.

Tables 1 and 2 show approximations of the standard errors of various characteristics and should be interpreted as providing an indication of the order of magnitude of the standard error rather than a precise standard error for any specific item.

The following examples illustrate their use. An estimated 10,211,000 men 16 years old and over were unemployed at some time in 1974. Table 1 shows the standard error on this estimate to be approximately 140,000. The chances are about 2 out of 3 that the difference between the sample estimate and a complete census count would be less than 140,000. The chances are 19 out of 20 that the difference would have been less than 280,000.

The 10,211,000 men represented 17.1 percent of the 59,605,000 men 16 years old and over in the labor force at some time in 1974. Table 2 shows the standard error of 17.1 percent with a base of 59,605,000 to be about 0.2 percent. Consequently, the chances are 2 out of 3 that a complete census would have disclosed the figures to be between 16.9 and 17.3 percent, and 19 out of 20 that the figure would have been between 16.7 and 17.5 percent.

The reliability of an estimated percentage that is based on sample data for both numerator and denominator depends on both the size of the percentage and the size of the total upon which the percentage is based. Estimated percentages are relatively more reliable than the corresponding absolute estimates of the numerator of the percentage, particularly if the percentage is large (50 percent or greater).
