ABSTRACT

The fifth annual financial report of West Virginia's state system of higher education is presented by the Board of Regents. Current operating revenue and expenditures for fiscal year 1974-75 are given, including trend data pertaining to total revenues and expenditures for fiscal years 1971-72 through 1974-75. Operating revenue and expenditures are classified according to three major categories: Educational and General, Auxiliary Enterprise, and Student Aid. Data for two medical schools are shown separately. This Current Fund Analysis does not include other fund groups, such as Loan Funds, Plant Funds, or Agency Funds. The tables attempt to group similar institutions, but such factors as enrollment differentials, curriculum or academic programs, geographic location, funding levels, and faculty characteristics must be considered. The first section of the report presents and discusses revenue to the state system, and the second section relates to expenditures. The appendix presents supplemental detailed data concerning regular educational and general revenue and expenditures. (LBH)

## INTRODUCTION •

This report for fiscal year 1974-75 constitutes the fifth annual financial report of West Virginia's state system of higher education. The Board of Regents, since its establishment in 1969 as the governing board for West Virginia's state colleges and universities, has sought to develop complete data on many aspects of the state system. This report analyzes the current operating revenue and expenditures for the West Virginia state system of higher education for fiscal year 1974-75. Also included are trend data pertaining to total revenues and expenditures for fiscal years 1971-72 through 1974-75.

Operating revenue and expenditures are classified according to three major categories—Educational and General, Auxiliary Enterprise, and Student Aid. Data for the Medical School of Marshall University and the West Virginia University Medical Center are shown separately and constitute another category. By design this Current Fund Analysis does not include other fund groups, such as Loan Funds (student loans), Plant Funds (new construction, bond principal and interest payments, property acquisition, etc.), Agency Funds (institution acting as fiscal agent on behalf of payor), and the like.

The tables presented in this report attempt to group similar institutions. However, due to inherent limitations, the reader is cautioned as to interpretations of these data. Such factors as enrollment differentials, curriculum or academic programs, geographic location, funding levels, faculty characteristics, etc., must be considered.

In West Virginia, the eight four-year colleges are considered a peer group, and the three community colleges form another peer group within the state system. Marshall University, West Virginia University, the West Virginia College of Graduate Studies, and Potomac State College of West Virginia University are not comparable with each other nor with any other West Virginia institution of higher education.

When making year to year comparisons, the data for any given fiscal year should not be considered as normative, nor is any standard ratio or relationship expected to exist among the major categories. Institutions vary with respect to the degree to which they undertake to feed, house, and provide services of a non-educational nature for students, faculty, and staff.

The introduction tables which follow summarize, by institution and by category, current operating revenue and expenditures for fiscal year 1974-75. Current funds revenue for the state system in fiscal year 1974-75 totaled 168.3 million dollars of which 167.2 million dollars was expended for current operations.

The first section of the report presents and discusses revenue to the state system, and the second section relates to expenditures. The Appendix presents supplemental detailed data concerning regular educational and general revenue and expenditures.

## TOTAL OPERATING REVENUE AND EXPENDITURES

Table 1 presents Total Operating Revenue and Table 2 presents Total Operating Expenditures of the West Virginia state system of higher education for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1975. The current funds revenue and expenditures presented are classified as follows:

Educational and General operations of the institutions are the educational, research, and extension and public service activities as well as the necessary supporting services of general administration, student services, libraries, and physical plant maintenance and operation.

Auxiliary Enterprise operations are conducted by the institutions primarily for the purpose of providing services of a non-educational nature to students, faculty and staff. Even though the existence of these operations is a convenience to students, faculty, and staff, they are not directly related to the fulfillment of the educational objectives.

Student Aid relates to gifts, grants, endowments, or other sources of income which are specifically designated for scholarships, prizes, etc.

Student aid revenue increased more than 1.6 million dollars during 1974-75, an increase of 48.6 per cent. This significant increase is attributable to the influx of federal dollars under the auspices of the Basic and Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants Programs.

Due to increase in the number of commuting students in West Virginia's colleges and universities, and specifically the establishment of the three multi-campus community colleges and the West Virginia College of Graduate Studies, auxiliary enterprise revenue has decreased as a per cent of total revenue. Again, however, as shown in Table 3, total revenue increased nearly two million dollars, to a four-year high of twenty-three million dollars.

As illustrated in Figure 1, total operating revenue for West Virginia's state system of higher education continued to increase in each category for 1974-75 over 1972-73, the base year for graphical comparisons. Increases were in excess of twelve million dollars for educational and general, six million dollars for the medical school and medical center, three million dollars for auxiliary enterprise operations, and one and one-half million dollars for student aid.

## TOTAL OPERATING REVENUE FISCAL YEAR 1974-75 COMPARED TO FISCAL YEAR 1972-73

The classification system used in reporting current operating expenditures is consistent with that utilized in reporting revenue. That is, expenditures are categorized as to Educational and General, Auxiliary Enterprises and Student Aid.





## TOTAL OPERATING EXPENDITURES FISCAL YEAR 1974-75 COMPARED TO FISCAL YEAR 1972-73

As shown in Table 5, total operating expenditures increased in 1974-75 to an all-time high of 167.2 million dollars. As illustrated in Figure 2, educational and general expenditures increased 13.5 million dollars, expenditures of the medical center and new medical school increased 7.1 million dollars, expenditures for auxiliary enterprise operations increased 2.4 million dollars and student aid expenditures increased 1.8 million dollars over the 1972-73 base year used in graphical comparisons.

As shown in Table 7, Summary of Total Operating Revenue and Expenditures, Fiscal Year 1974-75, surplus revenue was generated in each category, with the exception of regular educational and general. This surplus revenue is carried forward and available for expenditure during the subsequent year. However, total "surplus" was less than one per cent of the total revenue. The following sections of the report will detail revenue and expenditures of West Virginia's state system of higher education.

### METHODS OF ANALYSIS

There are two commonly utilized methods of analyzing current operating income and expenditures. One relates the percentage relationship of each income source or expenditure function to the total net income or expenditures. This technique reflects the comparative degree of support provided by a specific income source. For expenditures, it indicates not only the adequacy of support for one function compared to that given another function, but it also reflects the emphasis a particular institution places on the various expenditure categories. A second approach is to consider income and expenditures on a per full-time-equivalent student basis. The FTE student is the nationally accepted means to translate the student credit hours produced by an institution into a more manageable statistic. This statistic is only really useful in comparing similar type institutions.

It should be recognized that several educational and general activities are service oriented or are not directly related to the FTE student enrollment. Community, Public, and Extension Services, Physical Plant Maintenance and Operation, and Organized Research may have little or no relationship to the number of students attending the institution for earned resident credit. Therefore, the reader is especially cautioned when comparing these categories on a basis of expenditures per FTE student.

## REVENUE

### EDUCATIONAL AND GENERAL

Educational and general operating revenue or resources are typically classified according to source. This report presents data according to eight sources; a brief description of each source is listed below:

1. State General Fund--Allocations to the colleges and universities by the Board of Regents from the Legislature's annual state system operating appropriation. These allocations are restricted by the West Virginia State Budget Categories of Personal Services, Current Expenses, Repairs and Alterations, Equipment, Individual Accreditation, New Programs, and Unclassified. Amounts that reverted to the State Treasury at the end of the fiscal year are deducted from totals.
2. Student Fees--Revenue available for use by an institution from fees assessed students for educational and general purposes, plus the amount from the special "non-resident undergraduate student service fee" allocated to each institution by the Board of Regents. The fees assessed a student for educational and general purposes include those prescribed fees that must be paid by the student as a condition for (a) applying for admission to the institution, (b) enrolling in the institution, (c) enrolling in specific courses, and/or (d) graduating from the institution. The "non-resident undergraduate student service fee" is a special fee charged to all non-resident undergraduate students attending West Virginia's four-year colleges and universities. Proceeds from this fee are deposited in a special revenue account and allocated by the Board of Regents to the individual institutions. The report excludes all fees restricted by West Virginia statute from use as operating revenue.
3. Work-Study Federal--Revenue received from the federal government to be used for the purpose of employing students on a part-time basis.
4. Organized Activities Related to Instructional Departments--Revenue from activities organized and operated in connection with instructional departments primarily for the purpose of providing professional training to students. This includes revenue from specific facilities organized for the purpose of carrying on activities that simulate external enterprises for which students are preparing themselves in college (examples: home economics cafeterias and dental clinics).
5. Community, Public, and Extension Services--Revenue collected and available for use by the institution as a result of extension teaching activities and the operation of public and community service projects.

6. Gifts and Grants--Revenue from private individuals, business, industries, foundations, state government, and the federal government which is available for expenditure for educational and general purposes. This also includes West Virginia legislative earmarked appropriations for Regional Research Institute, the Bureau for Coal Research, etc.

7. Indirect Cost Reimbursement on Grants--Revenue from the recovery of indirect costs occurring from organized research and other sponsored programs:


8. Other--Revenue for educational and general purposes not included elsewhere (examples: endowment revenue and sales and services of educational departments). Detail information concerning sources of "Other" revenue can be found in Appendix Table D.

## STATE SYSTEM ANALYSIS

### PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF REGULAR EDUCATIONAL AND GENERAL REVENUE TO EIGHT SOURCES, FISCAL YEAR 1974-75

Table 8, Regular Educational and General Revenue, Fiscal Year 1974-75 details income according to the eight sources. This table provides the basic data analyzed in Tables 9, 10, 11, and 12. A percentage distribution of Regular Educational and General income is presented in Table 9 and illustrated graphically in Figure 3, and income per full-time-equivalent student is presented in Table 10. Trend data for both dollar amounts and a per FTE basis for fiscal years 1971-72 through 1974-75 are presented for Total Regular Educational and General Revenue and State General Fund Revenue in Tables 11 and 12, respectively.

As shown in Table 11, over the last four years West Virginia colleges and universities experienced a twenty-four per cent increase in Regular Educational and General Revenue, climbing from seventy-eight million dollars in 1971-72 to ninety-seven million dollars in 1974-75. On a per FTE student basis the increase was from \$1,637 in 1971-72 to nearly \$1,907 in 1974-75, an increase of sixteen per cent for the same four year period. By institutional category the per cent increases in revenue per FTE student were nearly twelve per cent for the universities, twenty-two per cent for the graduate college, about twenty-six per cent for the four-year colleges and the community colleges, and thirty-four percent for the branch college.

The Legislative appropriations from the state general fund accounted for more than seventy-seven per cent of Regular Educational and General Revenue in 1974-75. As shown in Table 12, the state general fund has historically provided more than three-fourths of all Regular Educational and General Revenue. On a per FTE student basis state general fund support increased from \$1,257 in 1971-72 to nearly \$1,476 in 1974-75, an increase of \$219, or more than seventeen per cent.

An analysis of Table 12 reveals that on an institutional basis state general fund support varies somewhat by institutional category. One reason for this is that in West Virginia, the amount of student fee revenue available to defray operating costs is relatively modest. Most student fees collected at state colleges and universities (except at community colleges) are restricted as to use by state statute. In some situations the pledge is to capital outlay; in others, the collected fee is required to be deposited in the state general fund. In either situation, the use of the fee collections for educational and general purposes is prohibited. Therefore, the degree of institutional support borne by the state general fund is somewhat dependent upon the degree to which institutions receive funds from other sources.

Sponsored research includes amounts from governmental agencies or other outside organizations or individuals for specific research projects for which payment is made in accordance with contracts, grants, or written agreements. Even though an educational and general activity, sponsored research is presented and analyzed separately from the regular educational and general component. There are two basic reasons for separating sponsored research revenue from regular educational and general revenue. First, sponsored research revenue typically flows on a project-by-project basis with no generally predictable revenue pattern. The inclusion of such revenue with regular educational and general revenue may lead to distortions and inconsistency of data on a year-to-year basis. Second, there is considerable variation in the extent to which comparable institutions seek and/or secure sponsored research support; therefore, to include sponsored research revenue as regular educational and general would make meaningful comparisons difficult.

As shown in Table 13, most sponsored or contractual research was undertaken by West Virginia University, the state's comprehensive and land-grant university. Sponsored research for 1974-75 increased 56.7 percent over the previous year.

## AUXILIARY ENTERPRISE REVENUE

Included here is all revenue for the enterprises operated by the institutions primarily for the purpose of providing services of a non-educational nature to students, faculty, and staff.

Table 14 shows auxiliary enterprise revenue, detailed by operation, for 1974-75. Each operation is further detailed showing gross receipts, transfers, and net revenue. Gross receipts represent the total income "earned" by the operation during 1974-75. This includes revenue from earmarked fees (example: athletic fee) as well as collections for services rendered (example: meal charges). Transfers represent change in the use of funds; this is accomplished by moving assets from one fund group to another (example: current funds to plant funds) or from one category to another within a fund group (example: educational and general to auxiliary enterprise). Net revenue is gross receipts plus or minus any transfers.

West Virginia's colleges and universities transferred funds both "in" and "out" of auxiliary enterprise operations during 1974-75. In the state system, the transfers "in" primarily represented direct educational and general revenue subsidies to certain auxiliary enterprise operations, while the transfers "out" primarily represented transfers to plant funds for bond principal and interest payments. When the situation exists whereby educational and general revenue is used to support an auxiliary enterprise activity, it should be recognized that the users of the auxiliary enterprise service (e.g., those who attend intercollegiate athletic events) are being subsidized by those (students) who do not. Conversely, when auxiliary enterprise revenue is used to support an educational and general activity, those users (students) are being subsidized by non-users (intercollegiate athletic spectators).

Each institution varies in the degree to which it endeavors to provide housing, dining, and other non-educational services to its students, faculty, and staff.

As revealed in Table 14 and Figure 4, the bulk of net revenue from auxiliary enterprise operations was derived from housing and dining (52.3 per cent), bookstores (24.0 per cent), intercollegiate athletics (13.5 per cent), and student unions (10.1 per cent). It should be noted that several institutions provide cafeteria services within the operation of the student union. Therefore, the student union enterprise is not comparable among the institutions.



## MARSHALL UNIVERSITY MEDICAL SCHOOL

Beginning in 1974-75; Marshall University began the development process for a medical school, to be operated in conjunction with Veterans Administration Hospitals. Revenue for 1974-75 totaled \$276,534. This included \$55,662 state general fund appropriation, \$126,955 gifts and \$93,917 research and development contracts.

Revenue for the West Virginia University Medical Center is shown in Table 16 according to source. A listing and brief description of each source follows:

State Appropriation: State General Fund--Includes amount from the State General Fund appropriated by the Legislature for the West Virginia University Medical Center.

State Appropriations: Soft Drink Tax--Includes amount collected and available for the West Virginia University Medical Center from the dedicated tax assessment on soft drinks.

Hospital Receipts--Includes revenue collected in connection with providing patient care in the teaching hospital.

Research and Development Contracts, and Other--Includes revenue from private individuals, businesses, industries, foundations, state governments, and the federal government available to the Medical Center for restricted use for educational, research, and general purposes. Also included is miscellaneous income such as tuition and fee receipts.

Medical Center Staff Gifts--Includes revenue from the Professional Fees Office generated by members of the Medical Center staff in their patient practice work.

Operated in conjunction with the Medical Center, is an auxiliary enterprise operation--university hospital cafeterias.

## EXPENDITURES

### EDUCATIONAL AND GENERAL

Included in this category are expenditures for the educational, research, and community, public, and extension service activities of the state system of higher education as well as the necessary supporting activities of general administration, general institutional expenses, student services, libraries, and physical plant operation and maintenance.

The report classifies educational and general expenditure data according to eight functional categories. They are:

1. General Administration and General Expenses--Includes all expenditures of the general executive and administrative offices serving the institution as a whole as well as those expenditures of a general character not relating to any specific division or segment of the institution.
2. Student Services--Includes all expenditures for services to students, such as admissions and registrar's office, guidance and counseling service, placement service, health service, dean of students' office, and the like.
3. Instruction--Includes all expenditures of the instructional departments and schools of the institution, such as instructional salaries, office expenses, laboratory expenses and replacement equipment, student teaching, and other related operating expenses. Also includes departmental research which is not separately budgeted or financed.
4. Organized Activities Related to Instructional Departments--Includes all expenditures for enterprises organized and operated in connection with instructional departments and conducted primarily for the purpose of giving professional training to students, such as home economics cafeterias and dental clinics.
5. Libraries--Includes the total expenditures of the institution for separately organized libraries, both general and departmental. Expenditures are separated into three major groupings--administration, circulation service, and technical service. (The circulation service generally handles the checking out and checking in of library books and various other circulation duties within a library. The technical service generally handles the purchasing of books, the cataloging and shelving of books, and the like.)

6. Community, Public, and Extension Services--Includes all expenditures for educational and other activities designed primarily to serve the general public. Also reported here are the costs of all extension activities including courses offered on a non-credit basis.

7. Physical Plant Operation and Maintenance--Includes all expenditures for the operation and maintenance of grounds, utilities, custodial service, etc.

8. Organized Research--Includes all expenditures for separately organized research divisions, such as research bureaus, research institutes, and experiment stations. Includes all research separately budgeted or financed. The report presents contractual research separately from institutionally organized research.

### State System Analysis

A statement regarding the West Virginia College of Graduate Studies should be made prior to any detail analyses of the expenditure patterns for this institution or for the state system. The College of Graduate Studies began operation July 1, 1972. It is an institution granting the master's degree only with a predominately part-time enrollment, a sizeable part-time or shared faculty, and utilizes the physical facilities of other institutions. As such, it would not be expected to have the same expenditure pattern as a traditional institution.

As shown in Table 17, statewide Regular Educational and General Expenditures for 1974-75 totaled ninety-seven million dollars. These data are detailed by institution according to the eight functional categories, and reflect a 7.6 million dollar increase over 1973-74. This table provides the basic data analyzed in Tables 18, 19, and 20. A percentage distribution of Regular Educational and General Expenditures is presented in Table 18, and illustrated graphically in Figure 5. Expenditures per FTE student are shown in Table 19. A comparison of Regular Educational and General Expenditures and amounts expended per FTE student for the last four years is shown in Table 20.

Studies by statewide coordinating and governing boards, the United States Office of Education, Dr. John Dale Russell, and others provide a useful base for interpreting "percentage distribution" data. The distribution shown on the following page is a synthesis based on these studies and is suggested as a helpful general parameters guide to the reader.

7-10 per cent for general administration and general expenses

5- 6 per cent for student services

51-60 per cent for instruction and departmental research (for comprehensive universities, percentage may be less because of emphasis on community, public, and extension services and on organized research)

0- 6 per cent for organized activities related to instructional departments


3- 7 per cent for community, public, and extension services (for comprehensive universities, percentage may be more)

0- 2 per cent for organized research, excluding sponsored research (for comprehensive universities, percentage may be more)

5- 6 per cent for libraries

10-16 per cent for physical plant operation and maintenance

Illustrated in Figure 5 is the systemwide percentage distribution of Regular Educational and General Expenditures to the eight functional areas for 1974-75. These systemwide distributions compare favorably with the guides listed above. However, as shown in Table 18, there are institutional deviations in two categories--Student Services and Libraries. These deviations will be focused upon in the following discussion.

As shown in Table 17, expenditures for General Administration and General Expenses totaled over eight million dollars in 1974-75, an increase of 1.1 million dollars over 1973-74. A review of the percentage distributions for this category in Table 18 shows that the three community colleges are above the general guideline. One explanation for such deviation is that two community colleges are multi-campus institutions and all three are developing courses and programs in various geographical locations away from the base campus.

Expenditures for the functional category Student Services increased from six million dollars in 1973-74 to over seven million dollars in 1974-75, an increase of nearly fourteen per cent. The expenditure per FTE increased nearly nine per cent to about \$140.<sup>2</sup> A review of the historical data available indicates that there appears to be a direct relationship between increasing enrollments and corresponding increases in expenditures for Student Services. The present emphasis on student service activities such as counseling, guidance and student placement has had an influence on the overall percentage the functional category has of total Regular Educational and General Expenditures.

As previously illustrated in Figure 5, it is readily apparent that the greatest proportion of expenditures are for instruction. This is to be expected since this is the largest major objective of the state system. Table 18 indicates that nearly fifty-three percent of all Regular Educational and General Expenditures were for Instruction, a percentage within the general guidelines. Reference to Table 19 indicates that per FTE expenditures in 1974-75 were \$1,007.07. This represents an increase of about \$34 or four per cent per FTE student systemwide. A review of the institutional figures shows that expenditures range from about \$710 per FTE for the community colleges, \$959 per FTE at the four-year colleges, \$1,067 per FTE at the universities, and \$1,564 per FTE at the graduate college. Such a range is to be expected since there are higher costs associated with graduate instruction and likewise, upper level instruction (junior, senior) is generally more expensive than lower level instruction (freshman, sophomore). Factors such as the number of teaching faculty, faculty with the terminal degree, and others typically increase commensurately with the level of instruction.

As previously mentioned expenditures for Libraries during 1974-75 generally exceeded the guideline.<sup>3</sup> This is somewhat attributable to the continuing impact of the Board of Regents' plan to eliminate existing library deficiencies. Such a plan necessitates greater than normal annual expenditures in order to move toward minimum standards. Also, the developing institutions would have immediate large outlays in order to achieve recommended standards as quickly as possible. This continued emphasis upon library development is warranted inasmuch as an institution's library is an integral educational component.

Physical Plant Maintenance and Operation accounted for more than thirteen million dollars during 1974-75. As shown in Table 18, expenditures for the community colleges and the graduate college are below the norm. This is to be expected since the facilities of these institutions are for a large part either new or leased from other agencies. Expenditures for all institutions increased during 1974-75; however, some of the increase can be attributed to increasing utility costs (see Appendix Table J). Even so, it appears that the institutions are increasing their emphasis upon physical plant maintenance.

West Virginia University, the state's comprehensive land-grant institution accounted for seventy-nine per cent of all expenditures for Community, Public, and Extension Services and one hundred per cent of expenditures for Organized Research. The cooperative extension service and agricultural experiment farms as well as other statewide efforts are maintained through these programs.

Table 20 provides a comparison of Regular Educational and General Expenditures and expenditures per FTE student for the last four years. During this period total expenditures have increased eighteen million dollars systemwide, and expenditures per FTE student have increased from \$1,645 to \$1,908. On an institutional basis increases have been eight million dollars for the universities, and one and one-half million dollars for the graduate college, five million dollars for the four-year colleges, three million dollars for the community colleges, and nearly one-half million dollars for the branch college.

## IMPACT OF SPONSORED RESEARCH

Just as sponsored research revenue is shown separately as an addition to regular educational and general revenue to arrive at grand total educational and general revenue, Table 21 reflects the impact of sponsored research expenditures on regular educational and general expenditures.

As shown in Table 11, over 95 per cent of all sponsored or contractual research was undertaken by West Virginia University, with limited programs at Marshall University, the West Virginia College of Graduate Studies, three four-year colleges, and one community college.

## AUXILIARY ENTERPRISE EXPENDITURES

Auxiliary enterprise services are intended to be "self-supporting"; that is, each auxiliary activity should generate sufficient revenue to defray all operational costs. Application of the "self-support" test has two interpretations. The first, or individual test, holds that each service should be wholly self supporting. The second, or group test, applies the "self-support" concept to the auxiliary enterprise operations as a group; thus, the surplus revenue from one operation is used to subsidize less profitable activities. As mentioned in earlier discussion, during 1974-75 regular educational and general revenue was transferred to certain auxiliary enterprise operations as a subsidy to these operations.

Table 22 indicates that the College of Graduate Studies had no auxiliary enterprise operations during 1974-75 and the three community colleges sponsored only minimal operations. Since the student bodies of these institutions are commuting students rather than resident students, the necessity for these services is vastly reduced. Figure 6 illustrates graphically the proportional relationship of the various auxiliary enterprise operations for the system.



## MARSHALL UNIVERSITY MEDICAL SCHOOL

As previously stated Marshall University began the developmental process for a medical school during 1974-75. This school, to be operated in conjunction with Veterans Administration Hospitals disbursed \$212,986 for current operations in 1974-75. These expenditures were principally for general administration and supporting services.

Expenditures for the West Virginia University Medical Center, as shown above, are reported according to the categories listed below. A brief description of each follows:

General Administration and Supporting Services--Includes expenditures of the general and administrative offices serving the entire Medical Center and expenditures of support services, such as Animal Quarters, Electronics Lab, etc., serving the entire Medical Center.

Instruction: Morgantown Center--Includes expenditures of the instructional departments of the schools of the West Virginia University Medical Center. Includes such items as instructional salaries, office expenses, laboratory expenses and replacement equipment, and other related operating expenses.

Instruction: Charleston Division--Includes expenditures in connection with the establishment of a division office of the Medical Center in the Charleston area to bring about an expanded production of health professionals. Note: 1972-73 was the first year of operation as the "Charleston Division".

Hospital Operation--Includes expenditures in connection with the operation of a teaching hospital. The hospital is an integral part of the West Virginia University Medical Center.

Public Service--Includes expenditures for educational and other activities designed primarily to serve the general public.

Physical Plant Operation and Maintenance--Includes expenditures for the operation and maintenance of the physical plant, such as custodial service and the care and maintenance of grounds.

Operated in conjunction with the Medical Center is an auxiliary enterprise operation-- university hospital cafeteria.
