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ABSTRACT

The Northern Region Education Group conducted a comprehensive survey of the needs and resources for adult continuing education in the North Country, consisting of St. Lawrence, Franklin, Lewis, and Jefferson Counties of New York State. Detailed institutional profiles were attempted of all the providers of such services, notably the nine colleges and six technical institutions. Data were gathered regarding the needs of the region by various personal and telephone interview techniques and written questionnaires directed toward students, businessmen, health service institutions, library personnel, Indians, military personnel, educators, social workers, etc. Copies of the questionnaires and other instruments used in the survey are provided in this report.

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INTRODUCTION

The Northern Region Education Group with the help of federal grants provided under the Title I, Higher Education Act of 1965, conducted a comprehensive survey of the needs and resources for adult continuing education in the North Country consisting of St. Lawrence, Franklin, Lewis and Jefferson counties of New York State.

In order to assess the resources available for adult continuing education detailed institutional profiles were attempted of all the providers of such services. The principal providers of educational services were the 9 colleges and the 6 technical institutions of the BOCES. A survey of the newspapers of the region indicated a large number of informal sources of educational programs for adults such as conducted by yachting clubs, hiking groups, Red Cross and the like. Furthermore the newspaper surveys also indicated that church groups, the libraries and the museums are also very active in providing adult programs which could be labeled educational. For the purposes of our study institutional profiles were made only of the formal educational institutions offering post-secondary programs for adults. The following processes were used in collecting the required data for preparation of the institutional profiles:

1. Survey of the catalogues and other published materials of the institutions.
2. Studies and reports made of the institution in the past.
3. HEGIS and other such formal reports of the institution.
4. Registrars' Records on registrations, graduations etc.
5. Budgetary information.
6. Personal interviews with the chief administrators, some faculty members, select sample of students and staff personnel.
7. Survey of Students.
8. Interview with the Director of Continuing Education.

For the purposes of a uniform data collection system several questions and formats were decided upon which we have put together in the section "survey of providers".

Dr. George Nolfi from the University Consultants, Inc., had been retained as a consultant at the early stages of the research project. The questionnaires and some of the interview procedures adopted to survey the Providers and prepare the

institutional profiles were taken from materials provided to us by Dr. Nolfi. We wish to acknowledge that though considerably modified the questionnaires originate in idea from Dr. George Nolfi.

The survey of the needs of the region was also undertaken using several methods.

1. A random sample of the general population was surveyed using a telephone interview.

2. A personal interview was conducted of a random sample of rural women to assess the needs of rural women.

This survey was conducted by Ms. Wyant who was a graduate student at Cornell University. The questionnaire used for the survey of rural women was mainly designed by Ms. Wyant with the help of NORPEG staff and her faculty advisors at Cornell.

3. A written questionnaire was used to survey the needs and attitudes of the adult continuing education students. The Student Questionnaire that was used is a modified questionnaire taken from "Strengthening the Alternative Postsecondary Education System: Continuing and Part-Time Study in Massachusetts" by George J. Nolfi and Valerie I. Nelson. Dr. George Nolfi had been retained as a consultant by NORPEG at the initial stages of the project.

4. A telephone interview was conducted of the needs of Businessmen in the community. Two weeks before the telephone calls were made the businessmen received a letter informing them of the forthcoming interview.

5. The hospitals, nursing homes and other health service institutions were surveyed with the use of 2 written questionnaires and some personal interviews. One of the Questionnaires was distributed to the administrators of the institutions to evaluate their assessment of the educational and training needs of the personnel and the second questionnaire was distributed to the personnel.

6. The Libraries were also surveyed with the use of 2 questionnaires: one for the administrators and the second for all personnel.

7. The industries were surveyed with the help of Ms. Doris Frazer, Director of the Technical Information Center at Clarkson College of Technology. She personally interviewed the Personnel Directors and some Labor Union Leaders of the industries surveyed. A written questionnaire was distributed to a select sample of workers and another one was distributed to the Personnel Directors.

8. A written questionnaire was distributed to the personnel at the St. Regis Mohawk Indian Reservation to survey the needs of the adults at the Reservation.

9. A written questionnaire was prepared and distributed to the personnel at the Army and Air-force Base at Fort Drum.

10. Written Questionnaires were also prepared and distributed to the teachers and other personnel in the school districts. Parochial schools were also included in the survey.

11. Professionals and, para-professionals and other social-workers working in an advisory role for adults in the community were also surveyed with the use of a written questionnaire in order to assess the counseling services and needs of adults.

12. Three Questionnaires were prepared mainly by Ms. Gladys Santo of the Arts and Humanities Council of the St. Lawrence Valley to prepare an inventory of personnel and groups in the performing arts in the community.

We have had several requests for copies of the questionnaires and other instruments used in the survey of needs and resources of the region. Hence, this effort to collate all of them in one pamphlet.
