ABSTRACT

The selected bibliographies and journals listed in this volume provide reviews of books, periodicals, and audiovisual materials of relevance for elementary and secondary school instructional programs. Section one furnishes booklists and nonselective bibliographies to aid in book selection; an inventory of specialized periodicals and periodicals devoted to books, reading, and libraries; and citations of guides and handbooks serving as reference tools, providing surveys of juvenile literature, or suggesting a philosophy of book selection. Section two details sources of audiovisual materials and suggests general periodicals, as well as specialized journals and subject journals, which review audiovisual materials. Sources of multiethnic materials are delineated in section three; teachers' resources for selection and use of materials and multimedia selection aids for elementary and secondary schools are described. Includes books, pamphlets, periodicals, films, filmstrips, loops, recordings, and realia because of "their usefulness as an interpretation of all aspects of city living," for K-12. In the main, materials dealing with contemporary themes and issues cited, with historical development of the city incidentally included. Arranged alphabetically by authors under broad topics as "A City is...People," "A City is...Many Problems, Many Solutions." Index to Authors and Titles and a Key to Publishers and Distributors provided.

National Aeronautics and Space Administration Film List. Washington: NASA, October 1972. 24 pp. Free upon request.

A revised list of films and filmstrips, describing NASA research and development in space and aeronautics, including 17 films produced since 1970, arranged alphabetically under such topics as General Interest, Educational and Special Interest Films for Non-Technical Audiences, and Adventures in Research (films useful in career counseling). The date, color or b/w, running time, annotation, and regional library code are given for each title. Films and filmstrips may be borrowed or purchased.

National Aerospace Education Council. Aerospace Bibliography. 5th ed. Compiled for NASA by National Aerospace Education Council. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1970. 102 pp. \$1.

Divided into four parts: Subject Index for books and materials (pamphlets, charts, pictures, models, maps, leaflets, kits, and etc.); Annotated Bibliography; Reference Materials; Periodicals. Also includes index to titles, addresses of sources, NASA services. Indicates grade levels.

National Art Education Association. Reproductions and Paperback Books on Art. Washington: The Association. 1967. 64 pp. \$1.50.

A comprehensive list of reproductions and paperback books on art, the third in a series of publications sponsored by the Uses of Newer Media Project of the Association. Paperback books are listed with bibliographic data arranged by: countries; artists; surveys; collections; art education, etc. Codes for distributors cited under each country. The size of prints, cost, and the historical or national classification given in the list of distributors.

National Art Education Association. Films on Art. Washington: The Association. 1965. 60 pp. \$1.50

First in a series of resource guides published under the sponsorship of the Uses of Newer Media Project, this is arranged alphabetically with information on length of film and level of instruction, short description plus cost, bibliographic data, and producers and distributors for each entry.

National Council of Teachers of Mathematics. Films for Mathematics - Titles and Sources. Washington: The Council. November 1968. 21 pp. Free.

Fifty-six sources are represented in this list of films, filmstrips, and filmloops, with type of film, color or b/w, and code number for sources in the source index.

National Information Center for Educational Media Indexes, published by the National Center for Educational Media, University of Southern California, University Park, Los Angeles, California 90007.

Each of the NICEM Indexes, listed below, contains a Subject Heading Outline (a list of all major subject and sub-headings); an Index to Specific Subject Headings; Subject Guide, citing the complete title, distributor key, audience level whenever possible; Alphabetical Guide with an outline of the content, audience level, color or b/w, sound reproduction requirements where applicable, duration or number of frames, series title, L.S. number; Producer/Distributor Code Section, indexed by name and codes and includes complete addresses.

The NICEM Update of Nonbook Media, an update subscription service, is available for \$106.00 per year, during which time 4 bi-monthly issues with 3,000-4,000 entries in each can be used to supplement and update the indexes.

Lists and describes 20,000 audio tapes.

Lists and annotates over 35,000 educational overhead transparencies.

Index to Educational Records. 3d ed. 1974. 762 pp.
\$42.50 net in U.S. and Canada; \$46 elsewhere.

Lists and describes 18,000 educational records and gives record sides in album, band listings, record speed and size for each item.

Index to Educational Video Tapes. 3d ed. 1974. 380 pp.
\$26.50 net in U.S. and Canada; \$29 elsewhere.

Annotated list of 9,000 video tapes indicating broadcast quality and tape size.

Index to 8mm Motion Cartridges. 4th ed. 1974. 658 pp.
\$42.50 net in U.S. and Canada.

Lists and describes more than 18,000 educational 8mm motion cartridges.

Index to Health and Safety Education-Multimedia. 2d ed.
1975. 1,082 pp. Postpaid \$26.50 net in U.S. and Canada;

Includes 16,000 nonbook titles useful for general and specific areas of health and safety education for elementary school through university and professional education levels.

National Institute of Mental Health. A Guide to Drug Abuse Education and Information Materials. Washington: Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, 23 pp. \$.50.

A complete listing of films, audiotapes, a simulation program, and printed matter that indicates the latest educational techniques of drug abuse prevention, how one becomes aware of his own and others' emotional reaction to drug abuse, various approaches used in drug abuse prevention and educational activities throughout the U.S., and beginning approaches to alternatives to drug misuse.

National Institute of Mental Health. Selected Mental Health Films. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1967. 110 pp. 40 cents. (Revision in process)

Based on the following criteria: soundness, freshness, usefulness, and cinematic qualities. Selections in this film guide are for the use of the general public, teachers, policemen, nurses, and physicians; they cover such topics as adolescence, dropouts, disadvantaged children, drug addiction, and child growth and development, and are arranged alphabetically by title. Running time, date, description, audience, producer, distributor, and cost are given. Subject index also included.

New York State Education Department. Bureau of Business Education, Division of Occupational Education. Business Education Bibliographical Series, 1972-___. Free.

This series of lists includes: Bookkeeping/Accounting, Business Law, Business Management, Career Education, Data Processing, General Business, and Office and Secretarial Practice. These lists of books, periodicals, booklets, filmstrips, resource units, tapes, and slide-tape presentations include the "most pertinent references and supplementary aids" Bibliographical information cited for each item.

Parker, David L. A Filmography of Films About Movies and Movie-making. 1971 rev. Rochester, N.Y.: Eastman Kodak Co., 1971. 16 pp. \$.35.

"This major revision contains 233 titles of films on movie-making - 63 more than the previous edition. Aspects of motion picture production illustrated include history of the cinema, general facts about movie film and the nature of the film medium." A brief description accompanies each title as well as the date, running time, color or b/w. Rental or purchase price must be secured from the source of the film. A list of sources and addresses is included.

I. BOOK SELECTION SOURCES

A. Book Selection Aids

Part 1: Nonselective Bibliographies

The volumes described below are primarily quick-reference tools. For the book selector they indicate the range of the field and of subject categories, as well as current availability; any element of choice has been exercised only by the publishers.

R.R. Bowker Co. Books in Print 1974. New York: 1974. \$64.50
Annual revision in the fall.

Author and title indexes to 425,000 books of all kinds; includes specific publication data for each title, and a complete directory of publishers.

Books in Print Supplement 1973-1974. 1974. 2,500 pp. \$27.95.
Annual revision in spring.

New tool designed to close the gap between the fall publications of the other "in-print" lists. First edition includes author and title indexes to 36,000 books of all kinds published since July 1973 or due to be published through August 1974, and to 68,000 backlist titles undergoing changes in this period, and to 7,500 titles which have gone out of print since the fall volumes were published.

Children's Books in Print 1973. 5th ed. 1973. 790 pp. \$17.95 in U.S. and Canada; \$14.85 elsewhere. Annual revision in December.

Lists 40,000 juveniles representing nearly 500 publishers; provides author, title, and illustrator indexes to books from pre-kindergarten through grade 12. Also includes information on translator, price, imprint, year of publication, and data as available on binding, edition, number of volumes, and grade range.

El-Hi Textbooks in Print 1974. 1974. 466 pp. \$19.95. Annual revision in spring.

Subject, title, and author indexes to 18,500 elementary, junior, and senior high school textbooks, pedagogical books, and related teaching materials.

Large Type Books in Print, ed. by Robert Landau and Judith Nyren. 1970. 193 pp. \$12.50.

Lists about 1,500 titles from 38 publishers; includes fiction, non-fiction, and textbooks for use by visually handicapped readers.

Paperbound Book Guide for Colleges. 1974. 184 pp. Single copy free to college professors; \$.75 each to others; quantity rates on request. Revised annually in spring.

A guide to approximately 10,000 titles in every subject area, chosen by 164 cooperating publishers for use in college classrooms and by serious readers.

Subject Guide to Books in Print 1974. 1974. 4,000 pp. Annual revision in fall.

Lists available books under 63,000 LC subject headings; some forthcoming books also listed "in prep."

Subject Guide to Children's Books in Print 1973. 4th ed. 1973. 484 pp. Annual revision in December.

Indexes 40,000 juvenile titles under more than 7,000 subject headings based on the Sears list.

Part 2: Comprehensive Lists

American Library Association. Books for Children, 1960-1965. Chicago: The Association, 1966. 456 pp. \$10. Annual supplements.

Reprints the reviews which appeared in the Booklist and Subscription Books Bulletin, September 1, 1960, through August 1965. The arrangement is by Dewey Decimal System, with an author-subject-title index. Purchase information is given, and grade levels and subject headings are suggested for each book. The total of 3,068 titles included were chosen from about 12,000 juveniles published during the 5 years covered. Annual paperback supplements each year follow the same pattern and include reviews of an additional 3,330 books.

Books for Children, 1966-1967. 1967. 136 pp. \$2.25.

Books for Children Preschool Through Junior High School, 1970-1971. 1972. 176 pp. \$5.00. Paperback.

American Library Association. Books for Elementary School Libraries: An Initial Collection, compiled by Elizabeth Hodges. Chicago: The Association, 1969. 336 pp. \$7.50. Paperback.

Designed as "a buying guide to a quality collection of books for initial library service to elementary pupils in kindergarten through eighth grade." Includes approximately 3,080 books, chosen for their close relationship to the elementary school curriculum and to the needs and interests of children; all books here are recommended for first purchase to establish first-year collections in new school libraries and for addition to existing collections, although the list is "not intended to describe a collection meeting minimum standards." Provides brief descriptive annotations and buying information for each book; list was current as of July 1968. There is a section on Professional Tools for Building Book Collections, a single index for subjects, titles, and authors, and a directory of publishers and distributors. Compiled with the advice of the ALA Editorial Committee's Subcommittee on New List for School Libraries. While this is now five years old, it still has value for building new collections.

National Association of Independent Schools. Library Committee. Books for Secondary School Libraries. 4th ed. New York: R.R. Bowker, 1971. 308 pp. \$9.95.

Arranged by Dewey number, this list of 4,000 fully cataloged books is intended as "an up-to-date book selection guide, on the college-bound level, for librarians, teachers, administrators, and mature students working and studying both on formal assignments and independent projects." Also includes sections on reference and professional materials. Not annotated. L.C. subject headings given; an author-title-subject index.

Van Orden, Phyllis, ed. The Elementary School Library Collection. 9th ed. New Brunswick, N.J.: Bro-Dart Foundation, 1974. 778 pp. \$24.95. Annual edition.

Annotates about 8,500 books and 2,000 audiovisual items chosen by a selection committee aided by an advisory committee. Classified catalog (DDS) has sections for Reference, Non-fiction, Fiction, Easy Reading, Periodicals, and Professional Tools, with audiovisual media integrated with books on the same subject; entry is by author, in catalog-card format, with indication of suggested phase of purchase (1,2, or 3), grade level, and purchase and binding information. There are author, title, and subject indexes; appendixes include a

grade listing, a classified listing of audiovisual materials, and a classified listing of large print books. Annual edition is planned for fall publication. Includes reading level according to the Spache table.

H.W. Wilson Company. Standard Catalog Series. Bronx, N.Y.: Wilson.

Each of these volumes is revised periodically, and the service is kept current with annual paperback supplements. In each, Part 1, which is classified by the Dewey Decimal System (DDS), provides bibliographic information for each book and suggests grade levels and subject heading; Part 2 is an author-title-subject index; Part 3 is a directory of publishers and distributors. Selection of titles by advisory committees and consultants.

Children's Catalog. 12th ed. 1971. 1,156 pp. \$25. Includes four annual supplements, 1972-1975.

Includes 5,119 titles. Part 2 gives 13,273 analytical entries for fairy stories, folklore, short stories, plays, collective biographies, and other parts of books. Revised every 5 years. Intent is to include "the best books for children in the fields of fiction and nonfiction."

Junior High School Library Catalog. 2d ed. 1970. 808 pp. \$30. Includes four annual supplements, 1971-1974.

Includes 3,412 titles, with approximately 2,000 additional titles to be covered in the supplements. Part 2 provides 8,807 analytical entries for stories and plays in collections and other parts of books. Revised every 4 years.

Senior High School Library Catalog. 10th ed. 1972. 1,214 pp. \$30 in U.S. and Canada; \$35 elsewhere. Includes five annual supplements, 1973-1977.

Includes 4,760 titles, including adult titles considered appropriate to advanced high school curriculums. Part 2 provides 14,661 analytical entries. Revised every 4 years.

Senior High School Library Catalog, Catholic ed. 10th ed. 1,373 pp. 1972. \$35 in U.S. and Canada; \$40 elsewhere. Includes five annual supplements, 1973-1977.

Includes all services provided by regular edition, with the addition of bound-in Catholic supplement containing 658 titles selected for Catholic schools by a committee of the Catholic Library Association.

Part 3: General Book Lists

American Library Association. Chicago: The Association, 1975.

Annual selections of outstanding titles, briefly annotated; published in leaflet format suitable for imprinting. Spring. 6 pp. 50 copies for \$3.00; quantity prices available.

Best Books for Young Adults 1974. Chosen by Committee of the Young Adult Services Division of the ALA.

Notable Children's Books 1974. Chosen by a committee of the Children's Services Division of the ALA.

American Library Association. Notable Children's Books, 1940-1959. Prepared by the Book Reevaluation Committee, Children's Services Division. Chicago: The Association, 1966. 48 pp. \$1.50.

Includes about 285 titles; compiled after reappraisal of the books on the annual lists of Notable Children's Books for the years covered. This combined checklist includes the work of four different "Books Worth Their Keep" Committees, reviewing consecutive 5-year editions of Notable Children's Books, and considering for each period both the comparative perspective and the response of children and librarians after using the selections, in a search "for the ultimate and enduring best in children's books." The last similar reappraisal was issued in 1960 as Notable Children's Books, 1940-1954. Annotations from the original annual list are included, as is a title index to this volume.

Arbuthnot, May Hill, and others. Children's Books Too Good To Miss. 6th ed. New York: University Press Book Service. 1971. 97 pp. \$2.95.

Annotates 230 books "of outstanding merit," in the judgment of the late Mrs. Arbuthnot and her co-compilers, Margaret Mary Clark, Harriet G. Long, and Ruth M. Hadlow. Arrangement is by

four age groups, with entry by title of the book. A final chapter, "The Artist and Children's Books," discusses 18 books, with black and white reproductions of "some of the best present-day picture material." There is a combined title index and price list, and an author-illustrator index.

Association for Childhood Education International. Bibliography: Books for Children. Washington: The Association, 1974. 112 pp. \$2.75.

Annotates approximately 1,700 books for children, from preschool through junior high school. Designed for use by teachers, families, librarians, and other group leaders. Compiled by the 1971-1974 Children's Book Review Committee of ACEI, Lois B. Watt, Chairman.

Association for Childhood Education International. Good & Inexpensive Books for Children. Washington: The Association, 1972. 62 pp. \$2. Paperback.

Formerly titled Children's Books...for \$1.50 or less, this revision lists about 500 books (mostly paperback), arranged by author in such categories as Picture Books, Fiction (with three age-level divisions), Rhymes and Verses, Fairy Tales and Legends, Biography, Social Studies, Science, Recreation and Hobbies. Includes a section for parents and teachers. Briefly annotated; prices given; author and title indexes.

Association for Childhood Education International and American Association of School Libraries. Excellent Paperbacks for Children. Washington: The Association, 1975. (In Process)

Selected annotated bibliography of paperbacks for children 1972-1975.

Child Study Association. Children's Books of the Year 1974. New York: The Association, 1975. 48 pp. \$2.50.

"Designed as a guide for parents and those working with children," this edition lists about 600 books, briefly annotating them. General arrangement is by age level, subdivided into such categories as Fantasy, Children in Other Lands, Easy to Read, Adventure and Mystery, Sports, Mostly About Animals, Science Fiction, title index.

Child Study Association of America, Inc. Reading With Your Child Through Age 5. New York: The Association, 1972. 34 pp. \$1.50. Paperback.

Includes about 225 titles selected by the Children's Book Committee in conjunction with other staff members of the CSA. Introduction suggests a basic guide to choosing books for this age group.

Horn Book, Inc. Fanfare, The Horn Book's Honor List of Children's Books. Boston: The Horn Book; Leaflets. \$.15 each.

Printed annually in the October issue of the Horn Book Magazine, the lists call attention to books of the year which Horn Book reviewers feel "deserve a fanfare of trumpets." Reprinted and sold separately.

Library of Congress. Children's Books, 1974, compiled by Virginia Haviland and Lois B. Watt. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1975. 16 pp. \$.15 each.

Eleventh in a series compiled annually with the assistance of an advisory committee of city and county public and school library specialists and coordinators of public library services to children. Annotating usually about 200 books for preschool through junior high school age, the list covers such sections as: Picture and Picture Story Books, Stories for the Middle Group, Stories for Older Boys and Girls, Folklore, Poetry and Rhymes, Arts and Hobbies, Biography, History, Peoples and Places, and Nature and Science. Earlier lists available. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office. 16 pp. \$.15 each.

National Council of Teachers of English. Adventuring With Books: 2,400 titles for pre-k-grade 8. 2d ed. Prepared by Shelton L. Root, Jr., and a Committee of the Council. New York: Citation, 1973. 395 pp. \$1.95. Paperback.

An annotated list of books which combine "the qualities of entertaining reading with literary merit." Most titles published since 1967 but older classics and award winners also included. Arranged by 14 broad subjects, with author and title indexes.

National Council of Teachers of English. Books for You: A Reading List for Senior High School Students. Rev. ed. Jean A. Wilson, editorial chairman. New York: Washington Square, 1971. 334 pp. \$.95.

Prepared by a representative committee of the Council. Annotation of more than 2,000 titles, divided into numerous broad categories.

National Council of Teachers of English. Picture Books for Children. Chicago: The American Library Association, 1973. 159 pp. \$5.95. Paperback.

Prepared by a committee chaired by Patricia Jean Cianciolo and planned as a resource for teachers, day-care centers, librarians, and parents. Annotates approximately 600 picture books for nursery school through junior high school, in 4 subject categories: "Me and My Family," "Other People," "The World I Live In," and "The Imaginative World."

New York Public Library. Children's Books 1974: Suggested as Holiday Gifts. New York: The Library, 1974. 55 pp. \$2. Annual edition.

Prepared by staff as a catalog to the yearly exhibition held in November and December in the Library, this list provides brief annotations for nearly 400 books published in the first three-quarters of the year. Arrangement is by such categories as Christmas, Nature, People and Places, Picture Books, Folk Tales, and Stories; entry is by title in each category; author-title index.

The School Library Journal Book Review. New York: R.R. Bowker. \$10.95 each volume.

Cumulations of the more than 2,100 juvenile book reviews (reprinted in full) that appear in the School Library Journal each year from September through May. Arranged by Dewey Decimal Classification; author, title, and illustrator indexes; suggested grade levels.

1969-70 Volume. 1970. 301 pp.

University of Chicago. Center for Children's Books.

Two bibliographies covering books favorably reviewed in the Bulletin of the Center for Children's Books, in successive years 1950-1972. Chicago: University of Chicago Press.

Eakin, Mary K., comp. Good Books for Children. Rev. ed. 1966. 407 pp. \$2.95. Paperback.

Includes 1,391 books, most of which were reviewed during the years 1950 to 1965, and which are still in print; not intended as a balanced list. Coverage is preschool through high school, with majority for grades 4 through 9. Arrangement is alphabetical by author, with a subject-title index. Entries include bibliographic information and grade levels; annotations are analytical and evaluative. Introduction

discusses good book selection practices, suggests general criteria of evaluation, and describes the method of analyzing books at the Center for Children's Books, which uses terminology based on Havighurst's Developmental Tasks and Education.

Sutherland, Zena K., ed. The Best in Children's Books: The University of Chicago Guide to Children's Literature 1966-1972. 1973. 484 pp. \$9.95.

Includes 1,400 books. Arrangement, indexes, and terminology similar to the Eakin volume above.

Part 4: Specialized Lists

American Association for the Advancement of Science. The AAAS Science Book List, compiled by Hilary J. Deason. 3d ed. Miscellaneous Publication 70-8. Washington: The Association, 1970. 454 pp. \$10.

Selected and annotated list of 2,441 science and mathematics books for secondary school students, college undergraduates, and nonspecialist adult readers; updated and expanded edition of the AAAS Science Book List for Young Adults, from which titles were reevaluated for inclusion here, along with additions of titles favorably reviewed in Science Books: A Quarterly Review (see Section II B, "Periodicals," below). Arrangement is by the DDS, then alphabetically by author. Bibliographic information is provided along with symbol designating whether most appropriate for junior or senior high, or college level; author and title-subject indexes, and a directory of publishers.

American Association for the Advancement of Science. The AAAS Science Book List for Children, compiled by Hilary J. Deason. 3d ed. Washington: The Association, 1972. 265 pp. \$8.95.

Annotates about 1,500 science and mathematics books for children, and for elementary school and public library collections.

Compiled for the AASL by the Committee on Paperback Lists for Elementary Schools. Lists approximately 700 titles in five broad groups: Picture Books; Fiction; Nonfiction; Myths, Folklore, and Fairy Tales; and Poetry, Rhymes, Riddles and Jokes. Brief annotations and general grade levels given.

American Humane Association. Animal Books. Denver, Colo.: The Association, 1971. 9 pp. \$.50 subscription includes semi-annual supplement.

Replacing the earlier Animal Books for Children, this list annotates 34 books, designating for primary, intermediate, young adult or adult readers. Selections are made by the Association's Humane Education Committee.

American Humane Association. Animal Books Supplement. Vol. 4, No. 1, May 1974. Denver, Colorado: The Association, 1974. 16 pp.

Includes subject and title indexes to the 120 books described.

American Library Association. Book Bait: Detailed Notes on Adult Books Popular With Young People, compiled by Elinor Walker. 2d ed. Chicago: The Association, 1969. 136 pp. \$2.25.

Comments on each of 100 adult titles chosen for their appeal to readers in the 13-to-16-year group; includes special points for book talks and audience appeal. Suggests other titles of related interest.

American Library Association. Books for Junior College Libraries, compiled by James W. Pirie. Chicago: The Association, 1969. 468 pp. \$35.

Covers approximately 20,000 books compiled with the advice of 300 consultants to relate to the curricular requirements of junior and community college transfer and liberal arts programs as well as to the needs of secondary schools with accelerated programs. Titles are arranged by a subject system developed especially for this volume, incorporating classification principles used in both the Dewey and the LC systems.

Entry within the subject is by author, and purchasing information is given; there are also author and subject indexes. The publication is jointly endorsed by the American Association of Junior Colleges and the American Library Association.

American Library Association. Books for Other Countries, 1968-1971, compiled by Elana Rabban. Chicago: The American Association of School Librarians. 1972. 48 pp. \$1.50; 6 copies for \$8.

Issued by the AASL "as its major contribution to the International Book Year," and designed for use by "children and young people, parents, teachers, and library media specialists when focusing on any phase of international or intercultural relations." Annotates 186 titles, arranged by countries and classified by social studies themes, with reading range designated, preschool through junior high.

American Library Association. Children's Books of International Interest: A Selection From Four Decades of American Publishing, edited by Virginia Haviland. Chicago: The Association, 1972. 69 pp. \$2.50.

As an American project for International Book Year, some 700 books previously noted in annual lists of the Children's Services Division/International Relations Committee were reevaluated for literary worth and universality of interest. The resulting compilation includes 300 titles annotated in two categories: "Books for Younger Children" includes Picture Books and First Reading, while "Books for Older Children" includes Fiction, Folklore, Poetry, Biography, History, Peoples and Places, The Arts, and Science and Nature. A Directory of Publishers is provided.

American Library Association. I Read...I See...I Hear...I Learn.... Chicago: The Association, 1971. 112 pp. \$2. Paperback.

Prepared for the Children's Services Division by the Library Service to the Disadvantaged Child Committee. Divided into four broad age-level categories, along with a section of "Suggested Program Aids for Adults." Describes books, motion pictures, and recordings appropriate at each level, for a total of about 100 items.

American Library Association. Books to Help Children Adjust to a Hospital Situation, edited by Vera S. Flandorf. Chicago: The Association, 1967. 55 pp. \$.50.

Prepared and sponsored by the Association of Hospital and Institutional Libraries, the list includes about 790 books in seven subject categories; arrangement is by age level.

American Library Association. Let's Read Together: Books for Family Enjoyment. 3d ed. Chicago: The Association, 1969. 116 pp. \$1.50. Paperback.

Selected and annotated by a Special Committee of the National Congress of Parents and Teachers and the Children's Services Division of the American Library Association; 1966-1969 committee chairman was Ruth Adams. The list includes 577 titles, of which 231 are new to this edition. Table of Contents lists 21 categories, and there is an author-title index.

American Library Association. Periodicals for School Libraries: A Guide to Magazines, Newspapers, and Periodical Indexes, compiled by Marian H. Scott. Rev. ed. Chicago: The Association, 1973. 292 pp. \$4.95. Paperback.

Annotates and evaluates 500 periodicals for children and young adults in relation to curriculum needs, reading levels, and interest range, from kindergarten through grade 12; includes some foreign and ethnic periodicals.

American Library Association. Reading for Boys and Girls: Illinois; A Subject Index and Annotated Bibliography, edited by Dorothy Hinman and Ruth Zimmerman. Chicago: The Association, 1970. 136 pp. \$3.25.

Prepared for the Illinois State Library and designed primarily as a quick reference tool for librarians, teachers, and students in Illinois needing to locate information about their State. However, the editors suggest also a far wider use in that the annotated bibliography of 200 titles is a source of much information in children's literature about America in general as well as Illinois in particular.

American Library Association. Subscription Books Bulletin Reviews Series. Chicago: The Association. 5 vols. \$2.25. Paperback.

Reprints from successive years of the ALA Booklist and Subscription Books Bulletin contain all the detailed evaluative reviews of major reference works (sets, series, encyclopedias, dictionaries, and atlases) which appeared during each 2-year period; all reviews were prepared by the Subscription Books Committee of the ALA.

Dierksen, Deane C. An Annotated Checklist of Children's Stories with Settings in Cities Outside the United States, 1960-1971. Unpublished Research Paper. Washington: The Catholic University of America, 1972. 50 pp.

Designed to aid librarians looking for reading materials about foreign cities, the list annotates about 100 fiction titles in English for elementary age children. Arranged alphabetically by country with city subdivisions.

Enoch Pratt Free Library. A Is For Abracadabra: A Booklist of Fantasy. Baltimore: The Library, 1970. \$.15. Leaflet.

Includes 60 titles chosen and very briefly annotated by a committee of children's librarians.

And All The Dark Make Bright Like Day: Christmas Books 1960-1972, compiled by Sidney Long. 1974. 15 pp. \$1.50 + \$.10 postage.

Compiled by a joint committee of the ALA Children's Services Division and the African-American Institute, this list includes approximately 300 titles in English, published in nine countries. Arranged by regions and countries of Africa; indicates books which are "not recommended for use in American public and school libraries for children," but which, because of their special content or style, will be "of interest chiefly to the African school"; some adult titles are included and designated as such; an author-title-country index.

Information Center on Children's Cultures. Latin America: An Annotated List of Materials for Children, edited by Elena Mederos de Gonzalez and Anne Pellowski. New York: The Center, 1969. 96 pp. \$1.

Evaluates 493 titles selected by a committee of librarians, teachers, and Latin American specialists, nationals, or former residents of the countries concerned, in cooperation with The Center for Inter-American Relations. Attempting to evaluate all in-print English language materials on the subject, the Committee fully annotated only those items recommended as the best; limitations are noted for some otherwise recommended items; books reviewed but not recommended are listed separately, with reasons indicated; a few Spanish language materials are listed which are considered classics in countries of origin. Arrangement is by region, then by country, then alphabetical by author. Bibliographic information and grade levels are indicated; author-title index.

Kircher, Clara J., comp. Behavior Patterns in Children's Books. Washington: Catholic University Press, 1966. 132 pp. \$1.95. Paperback.

Annotates about 500 titles for consideration by those interested in bibliotherapy; there is a section of selected readings from professional literature on the subject, and three indexes: behavior, author, and title.

Library of Congress. Children and Poetry: A Selective, Annotated Bibliography, compiled by Virginia Haviland and William Jay Smith. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1969. 67 pp. \$.75.

Annotates about 160 titles which the compilers hope will "help children find what is both pleasing and rewarding" among the rich available store of poetry books; arrangement is in five categories: Rhymes, Poetry of the Past, 20th Century Poetry, Anthologies, and World Poetry, with an author-title index. There is an introductory essay by Mr. Smith, Consultant in Poetry at the Library of Congress at the time of this compilation.

Annotates titles judged to be useful source books for students and teachers concerned with the African heritage.

Library of Congress. Folklore of the North American Indians: An Annotated Bibliography, compiled by Judith C. Ullom. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1969. 126 pp. \$2.25.

Annotates 152 titles, of which 50 are children's editions, the others being source books for teachers and secondary school students. There is a section of books presenting an overall picture of North American mythology and folklore, and succeeding sections are arranged according to the 11 North American Culture Areas, with "children's editions" identified in each section; compiler-title index.

Library of Congress. The Wide World of Children's Books: an Exhibition for International Book Year, compiled by Virginia Haviland. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1972. 84 pp. \$.50.

Annotates 138 titles (representing 38 countries) which were chosen to honor UNESCO's designation of 1972 as International Book Year. Selection considerations involved contemporary writing and illustration, notable recent editions of

folklore and classics, attractiveness for display, intrinsic excellence, relative importance within national body of literature, awards, and appearance on national "best lists."

National Aeronautics and Space Administration. NASA Educational Publications, Washington: NASA, November 1974. 11 pp. Free upon request.

Educational and informational books, pamphlets, fact sheets, posters and picture sets designed for educators, students, and the public. Annotations and prices given.

National Council for the Social Studies. American History Booklist for High Schools: A Selection for Supplementary Reading, edited by Ralph and Marion Brown. Bulletin 42. Washington: The Council, 1969. 206 pp. \$3.

Includes about 2,300 titles, briefly annotated; compiled by a committee of the Council concerned with helping the high school teacher locate books to enrich programs. Arranged in 15 chronological sections, with two additional sections devoted to reference tools and source materials. Provides general bibliographic data, but not specific ordering information.

National Council for the Social Studies. World Civilization Booklist: Supplementary Reading for Secondary Schools, edited by Morris Gall and Arthur E. Soderlind. Bulletin 41. Washington: The Council, 1968. 234 pp. \$4.20.

Annotates about 1,200 titles, compiled by a committee of the Council. Part 1 lists books according to Time Periods, Topics, and Geographic Areas; Part 2 lists and annotates books alphabetically by author; Part 3 includes a title index, and lists other social studies bibliographies. Each entry includes bibliographic information, date and price, and a general estimate of age/maturity level.

National Council of Teachers of English. Dimensions of Dialect, edited by Eldonna L. Everetts. Urbana, Ill.: The Council, 1967. 76 pp. \$1.40.

Primarily a tool for the classroom teacher attempting to translate theories of language development and social dialectology into practice, with 12 articles drawn largely from Elementary English; however, 53 titles are covered in an "Annotated Bibliography for Elementary Children in English and Foreign Editions," arranged alphabetically by author.

National Council of Teachers of English. High Interest-Easy Reading for Junior and Senior High School Students, edited by Marian E. White. New York: Citation Press, 1972. 140 pp. \$.95. Paperback.

Prepared for the Council by a representative committee and designed for use by students. Annotates about 400 titles which teachers and librarians have observed to be popular with students who do not usually enjoy reading. Arranged in 18 broad subject categories.

National Council of Teachers of Mathematics. A Bibliography of Recreational Mathematics, compiled by William L. Schaaf. 4th edition. Washington: The Council, 1970. Vol. 1, 148 pp. \$4. Vol. 2, 192 pp. \$4.

Includes sources of games, puzzles, brainteasers, paradoxes, tricks, and other pastimes arranged by subjects such as number theory recreation, geometric recreations, magic squares, classical problems of antiquity, Pythagorean relationships, etc.

National Council of Teachers of Mathematics. A Bibliography of Recreational Mathematics, compiled by William L. Schaaf, 4th edition. Washington: The Council, 1973. Vol. 3, 187 pp. \$5.

Updates material in first two volumes; includes classroom games, activities, and glossary.

National Council of Teachers of Mathematics. The Elementary and Junior High School Mathematics Library, compiled by Clarence Ethel Hardgrove and Herbert F. Miller. 3d ed. Washington: The Council, 1973. 70 pp. \$1.50.

Briefly annotates about 400 titles, organized at three levels: primary grades, intermediate grades, and junior high, and arranged alphabetically within each; bibliographic and grade level information provided.

National Council of Teachers of Mathematics. The High School Mathematics Library, compiled by William L. Schaaf. 5th ed. Washington: The Council, 1973. 74 pp. \$1.50.

Includes about 1,000 titles, very briefly annotated; the compiler has marked with one star those he recommends for first purchase; arrangement is by mathematical categories; also included are sections identifying Mathematics for Parents, Professional Books for Teachers, Dictionaries and Handbooks, Paperback Series, and Periodicals and Journals. Directory of Publishers.

New York City Board of Education. Suggested Readings in the Literatures of Africa, China, India, Japan. Curriculum Bulletin, 1967-1968 series, No. 13. New York: New York City Board of Education, 1968. 124 pp. \$2. Paperback.

Annotates about 500 titles selected for their pertinence to the City's non-Western study programs, primary grades through senior high school. Arrangement is by subject, then by form: Drama, Fiction, Folklore, Nonfiction, Poetry; grade levels are indicated. There is an introductory section on guidelines and suggestions for teachers; index is author-title.

New York Public Library. Books for the Teen Age. New York: The Library, 1975. 64 pp. \$2. Annual revision in February.

Prepared by the Library's Committee on Books for Young Adults; includes 1,250 titles, about 80 percent of them adult publications; 400 books published in 1974 are identified. Books are briefly annotated and grouped in some 72 categories. List is available without charge to anyone who requests it at any New York Public Library Branch. New subject headings include: Books for the Bicentennial, Classical Music and New Forms, and Making Music. Index of subjects and index of titles.

Reinhart, Bruce, ed. Vocational-Technical Learning Materials; Books and Manuals for Schools and Community Colleges. 2d ed. Williamsport, Pa.: Bro-Dart, 1974. 307 pp. \$35.

Annotates briefly about 5,167 books and 394 journals which may be useful in high school through college. Added feature is materials for the employed and the unemployed. Three libraries are included in the collection: Instructional Library, Professional Library, and Journal Library; these are ranked in three phases of priority by title; bibliographic and ordering information are given, and each title is marked for either secondary or postsecondary use. Subject and author index are included.

School Library Journal's Book Review Staff.

Annual revision.

Annotates about 300 children's books; designed to aid parents, teachers, and librarians.

Growing Up With Paperbacks. 4th ed. 1973. Biennial revision. 32 pp.

Annotates about 200 titles for preschoolers through 15-year-olds, selected by a group of librarians/reviewers.

Growing Up With Science Books. 10th ed. Fall 1974. 36 pp.

Annotates about 200 books for children of all ages; graded, arranged by subject, and illustrated.

Spache, George D. Good Reading for Poor Readers. 9th ed. Champaign, Ill.: Garrard, 1974. 304 pp. \$5.75.

Identifies about 1,800 titles which remedial reading specialists have found useful, including trade books, some textbooks, series books, workbooks, kits, games, programmed materials, periodicals, materials for visual perception, indexes, and reading lists. Brief annotations and grade levels are provided for elementary and secondary school materials. There are chapters on selecting and using books with poor readers, and a section on the development and the application of the revised Spache Readability Formula in evaluating primary level reading materials, along with author and title indexes.

Bibliography of bibliographies of materials for the non-performer.

Wynar, Christine L. Guide to Reference Books for School Media Centers. Littleton, Colorado: Libraries Unlimited, Inc., 1973. 496 pp. \$17.50.

Prepared for use in elementary, junior, and senior high schools, vocational programs, and junior colleges. Annotates 2,575 items arranged in 54 subject categories.

American Association for the Advancement of Science. Science Books: A Quarterly Review. Published in March, May, September, and December. The Association. \$12.00 a year; \$3.50 a copy.

Annotates about 250 books in each issue, including trade books, textbooks, and reference books in both pure and applied sciences, for elementary school through the first 2 years of college, with attention to professional books as well. Each book is reviewed by a subject specialist. Arrangement is by DDS, with author entry. Unfavorable as well as favorable reviews are provided; books are ranked by symbols and age/grade levels indicated; ordering information given, and there are reviewer and title indexes in each issue.

American Library Association. American Association of School Librarians. School Media Quarterly. Published four times a year in fall, winter, spring, and summer. Subscription price of \$1.25 a year, included in membership dues; AASL membership required. Single copies \$2.

Official journal of the AASL. While not primarily a selection tool it is included here because of the implications many of its articles hold for the process of book evaluation, and because of significant bibliographies published from time to time.

American Library Association. The Booklist. Published semimonthly, September through July; one issue in August. The Association. \$20 a year, \$1 a copy.

Each issue annotates about 125 books, for all ages, of which about 40 are children's books and about 50 are identified for young adults. Arrangement is by author in fiction and nonfiction categories; DDS numbers are given, as are grade levels, subject headings, and purchasing information. Only books recommended for purchase are reviewed, and each issue identifies books recommended for the small library. However, the "Reference and Subscription Books Reviews" section provides detailed and analytical reviews of reference books and sets, both those recommended and not recommended by ALA's 50-member Reference and Subscription Books Review Committee. American Library Association. Choice. Published monthly, 11 times a year, with combined July-August issue. The Association. \$25 a year for initial subscription; available back issues, \$2 a copy.

Designed to aid librarians and faculties of undergraduate colleges, universities, junior colleges, and high schools with

advanced placement programs, this magazine evaluates 500-700 new publications each month; reviews, often comparative, are written by undergraduate faculty or librarian subject specialists. Author, title index, and list of reviewers in each issue; annual cumulative index in February issue. Sample copy free on request.

American Library Association. Choice Reviews-on-Cards. Published monthly, 11 times a year, with combined July-August issue. The Association. \$95 a year; available only to regular subscribers of Choice.

Designed as an aid to ordering and cataloging. All reviews from regular issues, individually reprinted 3x5 cards; collated in order used in magazine, each review identified by subject heading and issue date.

American Library Association. Top of the News. Published quarterly. Available only as a membership service, not for separate subscription. \$2 per single copy.

Journal of the Children's Services Division and the Young Adult Services Division, providing in each issue brief annotations for approximately 30 books considered currently significant by the Book Evaluation Committee of each division; this Children's Services Division Committee each year selects the list of Notable Children's Books, which is published also in the Top of the News.

Appraisal: Science Books for Children. Children's Science Book Review Committee. Published 3 times a year. \$4 a year; \$1.50 a copy; foreign, \$3.75 a year.

Covers about 50 books in each issue, preschool through junior high school. A unique feature is that each book is evaluated by two persons, one a children's librarian, the other a specialist in the subject field; opinions, which sometimes differ, are expressed in both favorable and unfavorable terms. Arrangement is alphabetical by author; standard bibliographic information is provided, and age levels indicated. Reviewers are listed for each issue, and there is an author-title index for each volume. The magazine is jointly sponsored by the New England Round Table of Children's Librarians and the Harvard Graduate School of Education.

APA Publications, Inc. Children's Literature in Education. Published quarterly. \$15 a year.

A British journal, since 1970 prepared for publication by an editorial committee based at the Exeter University Institute of Education. While the content is primarily literary criticism and detailed discussion of specific children's books and their relation to educational theory, the journal is listed here because of (a) the importance of the issues to school media people and (b) the value of the bibliographies, including those which support individual articles as well as those featured specifically (e.g. John Rowe Townsend's "A Working List of Children's Fiction" in the September 1972 issue).

Bookbird. International Institute for Children's Juvenile and Popular Literature. Vienna, Austria: Published quarterly, in March, June, September, December. \$7.32 a year in Europe; \$10.37 a year elsewhere.

Issued jointly by the International Board on Books for Young People and the Institute, whose headquarters is in Vienna. Provides news from all over the world about activities related to juvenile literature; reprints acceptance speeches of authors and artists winning international awards; and annotates juvenile books of international interest. A major feature is "Recommendations for Translation," submitted from member countries; the U.S. list is the work of a subcommittee of the ALA International Relations Committee.

Bulletin of the Center for Children's Books. University of Chicago Press. Published monthly, except August. \$8 a year; \$1 a copy.

Gives critical evaluations of about 65 books each month, indicating for each book whether it is recommended or not, whether it has only marginal value, or might be useful as an additional purchase, or for special-interest readers; age and/or grade levels are shown. Reviews are prepared by librarians, classroom teachers, and subject specialists working under the direction of the editor and librarian of the Center for Children's Books. Carries no advertising. Annual author-title index in July-August issue.

Favorable reviews are periodically reconsidered and largely included in successive editions of Good Books for Children, compiled by Mary K. Eakin.

Horn Book Magazine. The Horn Book, Inc. Published bimonthly in February, April, June, August, October, December. \$8.50 a year; \$1.50 a copy; \$7 foreign.

Covers 50-60 books in each issue in various categories: Picture Books; Stories for the Younger Readers; Folk Tales and Legends; Stories for the Middle Readers; Stories for Older Boys and Girls. Includes special sections for Views on Science Books, Poetry, Biographies, and an Outlook Tower, which covers adult books of interest to young readers. Only books recommended are reviewed although some limitations are identified; sometimes editorial objection to types of books is published, with an occasional "difference of opinion" noted. The magazine contains articles of literary criticism along with articles by and about authors and illustrators and their work. Each issue includes an author-title-illustrator index; annual cumulative index in December. October issue includes annual "Fanfare, the Horn Book's Honor List of Children's Books," available as a reprint; see section II B.

Kirkus Reviews. The Kirkus Service, Inc. Published semimonthly. New York: The N.Y. Review, Inc. \$36 a year to school libraries.

Covers about 4,500 titles, adult and juvenile, annually; carries no advertising. Reports, sent out in bulletin form, are printed 6 to 10 weeks in advance of book publication dates and are indexed cumulatively at 2, 4, and 6 month intervals.

Juvenile Section, \$30 a year.

Covers about 2,400 titles a year, preprimer through young adult levels. Annotations summarize content and evaluate unfavorably as well as favorably; age levels are suggested and ordering information provided. Arrangement is alphabetic by author within categories: Picture Books, Younger Fiction, Younger Nonfiction, Older Fiction, Older Nonfiction, and Adult Books Suggested for Young Adult Consideration; juvenile author index on same schedule as complete service.

Library Journal. R.R. Bowker. Published semimonthly, except monthly in July and August. \$16.20 a year; \$1.35 a copy; Canada Postal Union of the Americas and Spain, \$18.20 a year; \$19.20 elsewhere.

Appraisals of new books by practicing librarians and subject specialists; feature articles and news of the library world. Contains School Library Journal bound in each 15th-of-the-month issue.

Phaedrus: A Newsletter of Children's Literature Research. Vol. I, No. 1, Fall 1973. Published semi-annually at Fairleigh Dickinson University, Madison, N.J. 07940. \$5 per year.

A journal edited by James Fraser, to call attention to related research, "for those whose professional concerns are directed toward theoretical inquiry into the media environment of the child and adolescent".

Publisher's Weekly. R.R. Bowker, \$20.00 a year, single issue, \$1.35, announcement numbers and other special issues, \$2.50 each; Canada and Panama, \$23.00 a year; \$25.00 elsewhere.

Lists all new books, as published; those children's books considered likely to be successful sales items are briefly annotated in advance. Special "Spring Children's Book Number" and "Fall Children's Book Number" containing single line listings, by author and by title, of all children's books advertised in PW, are useful to librarians seeking current publishing news rather than a tool for selection purposes.

School Library Journal. R.R. Bowker. Published monthly September through May. \$10.80 a year, \$1.35 a copy; Canada and Pan America, \$11.80 a year; \$12.80 elsewhere. See also Library Journal.

Covers approximately 200 new books for children and young people each month. Appraisals are by 250 volunteer school and public librarians, teachers, 10 volunteer subject specialists, and the four members of the SLJ Book Review editorial staff. Both favorable and unfavorable reviews are published; books considered excellent among others of their kind are marked with a single star; difference-of-opinion discussions are printed in a "Letters" column. Titles are grouped in categories, as: Preschool and Primary Grades, Grades 3-6, Junior High up, Reference, and Young Adult. Each year the SLJ editors identify "Best Children's Books of the Spring," and in December, "SLJ Best Books of the Year," which are available as reprints. Like the LJ, the SLJ contains feature articles and news of the book world, in this case, juvenile.

H.W. Wilson Company. Book Review Digest. Published monthly except February and July. Service basis rate quoted on request. Cumulations available.

Lists reviews of approximately 6,000 books each year, representing adult and juvenile fiction and nonfiction, appearing in more than 70 American, British, and Canadian periodicals.

Part 2: Specialized Periodicals

Only official journals of professional organizations have been included in this section: they give varying amounts of attention and space to the selective reviewing of books for children and young people. Those representing education and the language arts cover juvenile books of general interest, sometimes rather fully, and the editors frequently call upon experts in children's literature as reviewers. Others may review only occasionally, and cover a smaller total of books; however, in the cases of the journals of separate disciplines, when the attention of a subject specialist is engaged in the evaluation of juvenile books, the school librarian usually finds it profitable to consider the specialist's assessment of the accuracy and timeliness of the material presented.

Association for Childhood Education International. *Childhood Education*. Published seven times a year in October, November, December, January, February, March, and April-May. \$18 a year (includes membership).

Annotations for 20-25 books each issue, prepared by members of the Book Review Committee. Reviews are cumulated and most are incorporated in successive editions of the Association's Bibliography: Books for Children, revised every three years.

Elementary English: A Magazine of the Language Arts. National Council of Teachers of English. Published monthly, October through May. \$15.00 a year; \$2.00 a copy.

Reviews about 20 books each issue in "Books for Children" section; articles about writers and illustrators of books for children are frequent features of this journal.

The English Journal. National Council of Teachers of English. Published monthly, September through May. \$15.00 a year (includes membership).

Reviews about 10 books each issue in a special "Book Marks" section, covering adult books of significance for secondary school programs as well as some "juvenile" literature for adolescents.

Science and Children. National Science Teachers Association. Published monthly, September through November, and January through May. \$8.00 a year, \$1.00 a copy.

Annotates briefly about a dozen children's books each month in a special section, "Resources Reviews," which also covers audiovisaul materials and textbooks.

The Science Teacher. National Science Teachers Association.
Published monthly, September through May. \$15. to schools
or libraries; \$1.77 a copy.

Annotates briefly about 20 books each month (some for
adults, some for young adults and the junior high school age)
in a "Resources Reviews" section which also covers audiovisual
materials and textbooks.

Included in this section are several varieties of professional
literature related to book selection and to the training of book

Includes three sections: (1) directory of paperback
publishers (including general information, series for young
people, special services, prices and ordering information),
(2) listing of paperback distributors arranged by State, and
(3) a discussion and listing of selection aids.

American Library Association. Siemon, Frederick. Science Fiction
Story Index 1950-1968. Chicago: The Association, 1971. 284 pp.
\$3.95. Paperback.

Covers 3,400 short stories, novels, and poems included
in 237 anthologies published in the U.S. and England. Provides
three sections: an Author-Title Index, a Bibliography of
Indexed Anthologies, and a Title-Author Index.

American Library Association. Steps to Service: A Handbook of
Procedures for the School Library Media Center, by Mildred L.
Nickel. Chicago: 1974. 136 pp. \$4.50.

A practical manual covering all varieties of functions
and procedures and basic concerns, including evaluation and
selection of materials.

The Children's Book Council, Inc. Children's Books: Awards and Prizes. New York: The Council, 1973. 192 pp. \$2.95. 3rd ed. Paperback.

Identifies the 60 awards in the field of children's books. The list includes distinctions conferred by professional organizations, State agencies, regional and local agencies, newspapers, universities, and foundations, including some from abroad. For each award there is a brief statement of its history and its terms.

Davies, Ruth Ann. The School Library Media Center: A Force for Educational Excellence. 2nd ed. New York: R.R. Bowker, 1974. 484 pp. \$12.50; 20% off on 5 or more.

Focuses on qualifications of school media specialist as curriculum consultant and as materials specialist. Includes new units on materials for black studies, ecology, and drug education, as well as independent study and team teaching.

International Reading Association. A Guide to Information Sources for Reading, compiled by Bonnie M. Davis. Newark, Del.: The Association, 1972. 158 pp. \$2.50. Paperback.

A joint publication of National Reading Center, Eric/Crier, and the International Reading Association. Divided into three sections: Reading Information Sources, General Information Sources, and Related Information Sources (on education, behavioral sciences, and medical sciences). Briefly annotated. Indexed.

Library of Congress. Children's Literature: A Guide to Reference Sources, compiled by Virginia Haviland and others. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1966. 34. pp. \$2.50.

An annotated bibliography of 1,073 items covering books, pamphlets, and articles in periodicals, selected for their "estimated usefulness to adults concerned with the creation, reading, or study of children's books." Organized under headings of History and Criticism, Authorship, Books and Children, The Library and Children's Books, International Studies, and National Studies. Pertinent to the concerns of media selection are listings under such subheadings as General Lists and Catalogs, Reading Guidance, Story Telling, Book Selection, History and Criticism of Literature.

First Supplement, 1972. Compiled with the assistance of Margaret N. Coughlan. 316 pp. \$3.

"Covers chiefly publications issued from 1966 through 1969," but also "includes older items not available to the compilers in 1966." Two new sections have been added, "The Publishing and Promotion of Children's Books," and "The Teaching of Children's Literature." The Supplement annotates a total of 746 items.

Reid, Virginia M. Reading Ladders for Human Relations. 5th ed. Washington: American Council on Education, 1972. 346 pp. \$3.95. Paperback.

Prepared with the help of a committee from the National Council of Teachers of English. Nearly 1,500 titles are annotated in this revision, and the "leaders" have been reduced from the earlier six to four: "Creating a Positive Image," "Living With Others," "Appreciating Different Cultures," and "Coping With Change."

New Books have been added, annotations have been expanded, and instructional strategies are suggested to increase the responses of young readers through drama, book talks, and book illustrations.

Rosenberg, Judith K., and Kenyon C. Rosenberg. Young People's Literature in Series: Fiction, An Annotated Bibliographical Guide. Littleton, Colo.: Libraries Unlimited, Inc., 1972. 176 pp. \$7.50.

Describes 1,400 books for children in grades 3-9, published from 1955 to date. Arranged by author, then by individual volume's sequence in the series. Annotations are evaluative. Series and title indexes.

Rosenberg, Judith K., and Kenyon C. Rosenberg. Young People's Literature in Series: Publishers' and Non-Fiction Series. Littleton, Colo.: Libraries Unlimited, 1973. 280 pp. \$10.00 in U.S. and Canada; \$12 elsewhere.

Intended as a quick reference aid rather than a selection tool. Includes in-print series for grades 3-12 published through 1972. Each series is annotated with some evaluation; author and title indexes.

Scherf, Walter, ed. Children's Prize Books. 2nd ed. (Bilingual edition, German/English). New York: R.R. Bowker, 1974. 285 pp. Price to be announced.

Identifies 80 national and international awards, and 25 countries. The histories and terms of the awards are described, and more than 1,800 prizewinning books are listed. Arrangement is by country, and then by year of award. An introductory essay by the editor, "Book Awards, and Some Insight to Be Gained from Them," provides an interesting overview. Published by Verlag Dokumentation in Munich and distributed in the Western Hemisphere by Bowker.

Scherf, Walter, ed. The Best of the Best (Die Besten der Besten). 2nd ed. Catalogs of the International Youth Library: 3 (Katalog der Internationalen Jugendbibliothek: 3). New York: R.R. Bowker Company, 1976. (Munich, Verlag Documentation.) 320 pp. \$14.50 in U.S. and Canada.

Stimulated by an idea of the Swedish educator Margo Nilson that "children from minority groups should be able to find in their school library a collection of the best children's books in their mother tongue," the editor of this bilingual catalog has compiled information on some 1,800 children's books representing 60 countries or languages.

Countries are arranged alphabetically. For each country, books are listed alphabetically by author, in four age groups. Titles are given in major language of the country, with English and German translations of each title. Librarians of the International Youth Library selected titles for inclusion, in collaboration with book experts from individual countries.

Shapiro, Lillian. Young Adult Librarianship in the High School. New York: R.R. Bowker. 1975. 300 pp. \$14.95.

While this work focuses "on the human elements involved" in effective service, it also includes a "highly selective annotated list of selection tools for print and non-print" materials.

Townsend, John Rowe. Written for Children: An Outline of English Children's Literature. New York: Lothrop, 1967. 160 pp. \$4.50.

Brief and selective study which omits verse and picture books, but whose broadly chronological arrangement could provide quick reference help, and this British author/critic's analysis and assessment of individual titles provides background for the inexperienced book selector.

Part 2: Surveys of Juvenile Literature

Alderson, Brian. Looking at Picture Books 1973. London: National Book League, 1974. Distributed by the Children's Book Council, Inc., New York. 64 pp. Paperback. \$4.95.

Catalog for the 1973-74 exhibition of the League, prepared by the children's book review editor of the London Times, who is also a library educator. More than a catalog, it is an "education in the picture book"; includes analysis of modern types and examples from British and American publishers, comparisons with older titles of the same kind, and criteria for the various categories.

Arbuthnot, May Hill, and Zena Sutherland. Children and Books. 4th ed. Glenview, Ill.: Scott, Foresman and Co., 1972. 836 pp. \$12.25.

Reorganized and redeveloped; new section on "Areas and Issues Related to Children and Their Books." Includes material on the media center, minorities, censorship, and television. Extensive bibliographies of children's books, expanded and updated from previous editions, are an especially valuable feature.

Broderick, Dorothy. Image of the Black in Children's Fiction. New York: Bowker, 1973. 219 pp. \$12.75.

This "scholarly and provocative study" examines past and present treatment of blacks in juvenile literature, analyzes stereotypes and related manifestations of racism, and considers historical developments. Bibliographies, indexes, and references to standard selection tools provide provocative perspective for the book evaluator.

Egoff, Sheila. The Republic of Childhood: A Critical Guide to Canadian Children's Literature in English. New York: Oxford University Press, 1967. 287 pp. \$5.00.

Written at the invitation of, and with financial support from, the Children's Recreational Reading Council of Ontario, discusses individual writers and their books in terms of basic criteria for book selection, covering such categories as Indian Legends, History and Biography, Historical Fiction, The Realistic Animal Story, and Fantasy and Folk and Fairy Stories; each chapter is followed by a section of annotated entries, alphabetically arranged by author, for a total of about 250 titles; comments are both favorable and unfavorable; author-title-illustrator index.

Eyre, Frank. British Children's Books in the Twentieth Century. New York: Dutton, 1971. 153 pp. \$7.95.

Originally published in 1952 as 20th Century Children's Books, this revised treatment includes chapters on Books with Pictures, In-Between Books, Fiction for Children, and a Historical Survey. Appendixes on Regional Writing, Award Winners, and books about children's books are added.

Fisher, Margery. Matters of Fact: Aspects on Non-fiction for Children. New York: Crowell, 1972. 488 pp. \$11.95.

Annotates briefly about a dozen children's books each month in a special section, "Resources Reviews," which also covers audiovisual materials and textbooks.

Gersoni-Stavn, Diane, ed. Sexism and Youth. New York. Bowker, 1974. 448 pp. \$9.95.

Contains 47 articles dealing with aspects of the effect of sexism on children and teenagers; foreword by Letty Cotten Pogrebin. Part III ("Books: Propaganda and the Sins of Omission") gives attention to children's literature and also to textbooks.

Haviland, Virginia, and Margaret N. Coughlan, compilers. Yankee Doodle's Literary Sampler of Prose, Poetry, and Pictures. New York: Thomas Y. Crowell Company, 1974. 466 pp. \$18.75.

While this is admittedly "an Anthology of Diverse Works Published for the Edification and/or Entertainment of Young Readers in America Before 1900," it is included here because of the light it sheds on the development of children's literature in the United States, and on the resultant problems for book selectors.

International Reading Association. Reading, Children's Books, and Our Pluralistic Society, compiled and edited by Harold Tanyzer and Jean Karl. (Perspectives in Reading, No. 16). Newark, Del.: The Association, 1972. 89 pp. \$3 to members; \$3.50 to nonmembers.

Prepared by a Joint Committee of the International Reading Association and Children's Book Council. Numerous articles on ethnic literature for children followed by an annotated list of recent (nothing before 1967) bibliographies on ethnic materials for children, adolescents, and adults.

Kujoth, Jean Spealman. Best-Selling Children's Books. Metuchen, N.J.: Scarecrow Press, 1973. 305 pp. \$7.50.

Reports on a survey to determine which children's books have been bought in the largest quantities. Identifies and describes 958 books now in print which, according to their U.S. publishers, have sold 100,000 copies or more since publication. Books are listed by author, title, illustrator, year of original publication, number of copies sold, and by type of books, subject-category, and age level.

Library of Congress. Fables from Incunabula to Modern Picture Books, A Selective Bibliography, compiled by Barbara Quinnam. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1966. 85 pp. \$.40.

Prepared originally as a catalog for an exhibit at the Library of Congress, the bibliography remains a valuable resource for the librarian or teacher concerned with choosing among available editions, and with developing criteria for choosing among subsequent publications. Two hundred titles are annotated in five major categories: General Studies, Indian and Related Fables, Aesop, La Fontaine, and Krylov, with subdivision by time and by format, and indication of special editions for children.

Meigs, Cornelia, and others. A Critical History of Children's Literature. Rev. ed. New York: Macmillan, 1969. 708 pp. \$12.95.

Survey of children's books in English: Part One, "Roots in the Past up to 1840," by C. Meigs, also general editor; Part Two, "Widening Horizons 1840-1890," by Anne Thaxter Eaton; Part Three, "A Rightful Heritage 1890-1920," by Elizabeth Nesbitt; and Part Four, "Golden Years and Time of Tumult 1920-1967," by Ruth Hill Viguers; an authoritative view, providing documentation and a sense of perspective for the librarian who is concerned with books as developments in a continuum.

Pellowski, Anna. The World of Children's Literature. New York: R.R. Bowker, 1968. 538 pp. \$22.50.

An annotated bibliography of nearly 4,500 titles, representing an attempt to provide "an accurate picture of the development of children's literature in every country where it presently exists, even in the most formative stages." Entries are arranged by regions, with a commentary introducing each country.

Seruya, Flora, Susan Losher, and Dr. Albert Ellis. Sex and Sex Education: A Bibliography. New York: R.R. Bowker, 1972. 336 pp. \$15.75.

Provides a wide range of viewpoints and information about some 2,300 publications.

Part 3: Philosophy of Book Selection

Arbuthnot, May Hill. Children's Reading in the Home. Chicago: Scott Foresman, 1969. 374 pp. \$7.50.

Discusses about 600 books for an age range of 2 through 14 years, with analytical annotations; chapters are arranged by age level and by subject interest, with substantial attention to standards and reasons for choice in relation to children's needs.

Cameron, Eleanor. The Green and Burning Tree: On the Writing and Enjoyment of Children's Books. Boston: Little, 1969. 377 pp. \$6.95.

Essays which are, according to the author, "concerned with appreciation rather than criticism," but which are also so detailed in their analysis of literature as to make them useful to the book selector seeking background.

Carlsen, G. Robert. Books and the Teenage Reader: A Guide for Teachers, Librarians and Parents. Rev. ed. New York: Harper, 1972. 250 pp. \$8.95.

Discusses "how one goes about giving good reading experiences to young people"; chapters on such themes as "Subliterature," "The Adolescent Novel," "The Ethnic Experience in Literature," "The Popular Adult Novel," and "Significant Modern Literature" are supported with selective bibliographies annotating hundreds of books; a final chapter, "A Guide to Reference Books," discusses criteria as well as specific recommended titles.

Children's Book Council, Inc. Choosing A Child's Book. New York: The Council. 1975. Leaflet. 50 for \$2.00.

Brief, informational discussion designed to help non-professional personnel concerned with book selection; bibliography included.

Duff, Annis. "Bequest of Wings": A Family's Pleasures With Books. New York: Viking Compass, 1966. 191 pp. \$1.45 paperback.

First published in 1944; however, basic criteria, child psychology, and some techniques of dovetailing children's interests and books are still relevant.

Egoff, Sheila, G.T. Stubbs, and L.F. Ashley, eds. Only Connect: Readings on Children's Literature. New York: Oxford University Press, 1969. 471 pp. \$7.50 hardcover, \$4.50 paperback.

Essays mostly printed in the 1960's, by many writers, covering literary history, changing society and its effect on juvenile literature, with much attention both direct and indirect to criticism and criteria.

Fader, Daniel N., and Elton B. McNeil. Hooked on Books: Program and Proof. New York: Putnam, 1968. 244 pp. \$6.95.

Reporting on how they "get the most reluctant reader to read, read, read!" the authors comment on books which have been most useful, and provide a "Reading List of 1,000 Paperback Books" to guide selectors.

Haviland, Virginia, compiler. Children and Literature: Views and Reviews. New York: Scott Foresman. 1974. 480 pp. \$7.95. (Paperback, Scott Foresman. \$5.75)

A "Selection of essays, criticism, and statement of trends... intended for those concerned with... children's books. Each group of selections is introduced with comments to focus attention on the issues at hand.

International Reading Association. Evaluating Books for Children and Young People, compiled and edited by Helen Huus. Perspectives in Reading Series, No. 10. Newark, Del.: The Association, 1968. 137 pp. \$3.50.

A committee report, designed to help teachers (a) emphasize the role of literature in their students' lives, and (b) promote sure evaluation of juvenile books at all levels; included is a list of about 180 books which are evaluated by various writers in the sections on "Literary Criticism: An Overview," "Criticism of Juvenile Literature," and "Criticism of Books for Young People."

Karl, Jean. From Childhood to Childhood: Children's Books and Their Creators. New York: Day, 1970. 175 pp. \$6.50.

Observations of an experienced editor about the nature, development, and production of juvenile literature, with some consideration of the factors which combine to make a good book.

Kingston, Carolyn T. The Tragic Mode in Children's Literature. New Aims in Children's Literature Series. New York: Teachers College Press, 1974. 177 pp. \$5.95.

Identifies and analyzes such "tragic essences" as rejection, entrapment, war, and loss, with detailed discussion of 55 examples of realistic fiction.

Robinson, Evelyn R., ed. Readings about Children's Literature. New York: McKay, 1966. 431 pp. \$6.00 Hardcover, \$3.95 Paperback.

Articles of about 60 writers, covering history and trends, new developments, reading interests, with sections: criteria, evaluation, and selection.

Sayers, Frances Clarke. Summoned By Books: Essays and Speeches, compiled by Marjeanne Jensen Blinn. New York: Viking Compass, 1968. 173 pp. \$1.35. Paperback.

First published in 1965, this "affirmation of faith in fine books for children" also provides, by careful analysis of the finest, lucid revelation of the characteristics which make them so.

School Library Journal. Issues in Children's Book Selection: A School Library Journal/Library Journal Anthology. New York: R.R. Bowker, 1973. 216 pp. \$9.95.

Lillian Gerhardt, Editor-in-Chief of School Library Journal, provides the "Introduction" for 29 articles on aspects of current book selection reprinted from the Journals. The articles, originally published between 1968 and 1973, are grouped in five categories: "Perspectives on Selection," "Intellectual Freedom or Censorship?" "Images," "Themes and Genres," "Past, Present and Future."

Smith, Lillian. The Unreluctant Years: A Critical Approach to Children's Literature. New York: Viking Compass, 1967. 193 pp. \$1.50. Paperback.

First published in 1953, long familiar as a basic statement in book selection and still a keystone for subsequent writers on the subject.

Townsend, John Rowe. A Sense of Story: Essays on Contemporary Writers for Children. Philadelphia: Lippincott, 1971. 216 pp. \$6.50.

Discusses the work of 19 British, American, and Australian writers; the biographical and bibliographical details are valuable. However, the consideration of these English-language writers' work in literary terms gives this tool its primary significance for book selectors.

Selective bibliography of 627 films "identifies films under 21 major categories and provides a synopsis of content, treatment, and ecological objectivity." Arrangement alphabetical by book titles, with related films, filmstrips, and recordings following each book's annotation. Directory of distributors and six indexes: authors, film titles, filmstrip titles, media about or presented by authors and illustrators, record titles, and subjects complete this publication.

Hendershot, Carl H., comp. Programmed Learning: A Bibliography of Programs and Presentation Devices. 1973 ed. Bay City, Mich.: The Compiler, 1973. \$27.

Completely revised, annotated bibliography of programmed instruction, self-study textbooks, student-paced instruction, educational systems, machine-assisted instruction and equipment used in self-progress learning. Title, author and

standard book number, number of hours, number of frames/pages, level, price, availability of developmental and field test data, and copyright are available for each program listed. Loose leaf format.

Hopkins, Lee Bennett. Pass the Poetry, Please! Using Poetry in Pre-Kindergarten - Six Classrooms. New York: Citation, 1972. 199 pp. \$2.65.

Describes dozens of effective techniques for encouraging youngsters to listen to, read, write, and enjoy poetry; includes informal biographies of best-loved children's poets and lists children's books; descriptions of films, recordings, posters, filmstrips, study print-record sets, and other forms of media.

Primarily an annotated bibliography of 400 books which a reference or AV librarian can use to answer questions about films, filmstrips, recordings, theater, music, dance, radio, and television. Books recommended for a basic collection noted. Alcoholism, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and mental illness in children are among areas treated in depth. For each film and pamphlet, a summary, an evaluation, suggested audience, ordering information, and excerpts from the discussion guide are available. Indexed by title.

Shrank, Jeffery. Media in Value Education: A Critical Guide. Chicago: Argus Communications, 1970. 168 pp. \$4.95.

Reviews and discussion guide for 75 short secular films, useful for high school guidance and religion classes as well as some social studies areas, are included. Some rock albums also reviewed. Sources and addresses of chief suppliers of media are located in "An Annotated Guide to Media and Other Sources." Indexed by forms of media.

Singer, Laura J., and Judith Buskin. Sex Education on Film: A Guide to Visual Aids and Programs. New York: Teachers College, Columbia University, 1971. 170 pp. \$3.95. Paperback.

A critical, annotated bibliography of available filmstrips, transparencies, 8mm, and 16mm films. Arranged by topic with notes on age levels and ordering. Indexed by title and by age and socio-economic group. Distributors listed. A sample program for parents and teenagers contains suggested films and discussion questions.

Snyder, Ellie. Environmental Education for Everyone: Bibliography of Curriculum Materials for Environmental Studies. Washington: National Education Association, March 1970. Stock Number 471-14600. 75 cents.

Edward Wall appears in each issue and updates Multi-Media Reviews Index, an annual volume published by the Pierian Press.

AV Guide (formerly Education Screen and AV Guide). Educational Screen, Inc. Published monthly. \$6 a year.

Evaluative reviews of all kinds of learning media. Special theme issues several times a year. Blue Book of Audiovisual Materials (\$2) appears in December.

Davis, A.L., ed. Culture, Class, and Language Variety: A Resource Book for Teachers. Urbana, Ill.: National Council of Teachers of English, 1972. 230 pp. \$6.25.

Attempts to improve insights and methodologies by giving general background information followed by specific discussion

of social dialects, nonverbal communication, English problems of Spanish speakers, and notes on Acadian English. Selective bibliography for teachers.

Dodds, Barbara. Negro Literature for High School Students. Champaign, Ill.: National Council of Teachers of English, 1968. 157 pp. \$2.20.

This annotated bibliography is divided into five sections: (1) Historical Survey of Negro Writers, (2) Works about Negroes, (3) The Junior Novel, (4) Biography, and (5) Classroom Uses of Negro Literature. Approximately 150 titles. Title and author index. Useful suggestions of ways to integrate Negro literature into the curriculum.

Duphiney, Lorna. Oriental-Americans: An Annotated Bibliography. IRCD Bulletin. New York: ERIC Information Retrieval Center on the Disadvantaged, 1972. 24 pp. Free.

Emphasizes Japanese-Americans and Chinese-Americans. Covers literature published since 1960 on social, economic, and political development, with emphasis on educational development.

Grambs, Jean. Intergroup Education: Methods and Materials. Englewood Cliffs, New Jersey: Prentice-Hall, 1968. 199 pp. \$3.75.

Part I deals with the use of instructional materials in intergroup education, including examples of successful practices. Part II is an annotated bibliography of 1,076 print and non-print materials for teachers and students. Journals and organizations listed.

Henry, Jeanette, ed. Index to Literature on the American Indian. San Francisco: Indian Historian Press, Annual. \$8.00 Paper; \$12.00 Hard Cover.

Index of available popular and scholarly source materials found in books and periodicals and arranged in 63 subject areas, compiled by American Indian Scholars. Directed especially to the inner city language arts teacher, techniques suggested would be applicable in any teaching-learning situation. Sections include suggestions for multi-media aids and bibliography of readings; graded booklist at the end.

Hymes, Jody, ed. Teaching About Japan; A Resource Guide. Ann Arbor, Michigan: Project on Asian Studies in Education, University of Michigan, n.d. 21 pp. \$.25.

Provides critical evaluations of selective print and audio-visual materials on Japan. Arranged under five headings: (1) Books on Japan for Teachers and Students, (2) Audio-Visual Materials on Japan, (3) Information on Japan, (4) Japanese Food and Accessories, and (5) Museums with Major Japanese Collections. The publication is expanded and updated every six months to keep materials current.

Oklahoma State Department of Education. A Guide for Teachers and Librarians with Suggestions for Teaching Indian Students. Oklahoma City: The Department, 1972. 30 pp. Free.

Includes about 1,600 entries, under 10 classes: Research Studies into American Black English, General Studies, Pedagogy, General Interest, Reviews, Folklore, Slave Narratives, Literature; Related Materials, and "Disadvantaged Approach." Most of the entries are annotated to advise the searcher that such an item exists and gives the basic content.

Lists and annotates 459 titles. Arranged alphabetically in three sections: Section I, Autobiographies. Section II, Autobiographical Books, includes diaries, travelogs, letters,

Section III, a checklist of similar books written before the end of the Civil War and reprinted or published for the first time since 1945. The three indexes follow the list of library symbols: index of experiences, occupations, and professions; a list of geographical locations and institutions mentioned in the annotations; and an index of titles.

Byler, Mary Gloyne, comp. American Indian Authors for Young Readers: A Representative Bibliography. New York: Association on American Indian Affairs, 1973. 30 pp. \$1.00.

Selected bibliography of children's books and materials including oral literature suitable for story-telling. Introductory essay evaluates hundreds of children's books written by non-Indians about Indians and explains the misrepresentation of Indian culture.

Cohen, David. "Multiethnic Media: Selected Bibliographies Currently Available." Library Journal, Vol. 98, no. 8, April 15, 1973. pp. 1352-1358.

Four major divisions: A Rationale for a Pluralistic Society, Evidence of Ethnic Bias in Instructional Materials, Efforts to Change, Resources for Education. The final section is a practical guide for evaluation of instructional materials with reference to racism and sexism; approximately 309 items listed.

An annotated bibliography of print and nonprint media, sources, and resources on ethnic groups other than blacks. Extensive index.

Glancy, Barbara. Children's Interracial Fiction. Washington: American Federation of Teachers, 1969. 124 pp. \$1.00.

An annotated, unselected bibliography arranged alphabetically by author which identifies 328 books with black characters. Interest level, reading grade level, and recommended titles are indicated. Included is an essay, "Black Barbecue: Books for Changing Education," which is a survey-review of children's literature about blacks.

Griffin, Louise. Books in Pre-School. Washington: National Association for the Education of Young Children, 1970. 48 pp. \$2.00.

While this publication is intended chiefly as a guide to selecting, purchasing, and using books for and with preschool children, there are listings of Bilingual Books, Non-English Books, Books in English Using Non-English Phrases, as well as a bibliography of all books mentioned in the text.

"The purpose is to bring together a selection of books, 16mm films, 35mm filmstrips, 8mm film loops, recordings, slides, transparencies, and other audiovisual media which provides information on the historical backgrounds, cultural heritage and contemporary social, economic and political problems of Mexican Americans." Divided into two sections: I - Print Materials arranged under Mexico's History, Mexican Americans in the United States, The Arts, Literature, Biography, and Fiction; II - Audiovisual Materials subdivided by medium. Detailed annotations of books about Afro-Americans, Indians, Eskimos, Spanish-speaking Americans, Asian-Americans, nationality groups and religious minorities, bilingual/bicultural children.

Latimer, Bettye I., ed. Starting Out Right; Choosing Books About Black People for Young Children. Pre-School Through Third Grade. Madison, Wisconsin: Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, 1972. 96 pp. Free.

Approximately 230 juvenile books about blacks are analyzed "in depth." Criteria is established for judging these books. Titles are recommended or not recommended according to the criteria. Author index.
