ABSTRACT

This publication summarizes a variety of information on each of the 42 public schools in Eugene (Oregon) School District 4J, presented in the form of two-page statistical profiles of each individual school. Five basic categories of information are contained in each profile, including data on building characteristics, student information, staff information, community factors, and test scores on nationally standardized tests. These data were gathered from U.S. Census data and the Oregon Total Information System, as well as from records of the Eugene school district. Most of the data listed are for the 1975-76 school year, though figures on the cost of vandalism and standardized test scores are for 1974-75. (JG)

INTRODUCTION

The Eugene School Profile is a document which summarizes information from each of the schools in the Eugene School District 4J. It has been designed as a tool to aid educational decision makers in the planning and budget process. Information was obtained from the Lane Council of Governments (LCOG), the Oregon Total Information System (OTIS), Eugene School District 4J Media Center, the Superintendent's office, and the Plant Management office.

Prior to publication each Principal received a profile of his or her school. It was requested that they review the information and suggest needed changes. All profiles returned with changes were reviewed and appropriate corrections were made.

Action High and Opportunity Center are not contained in this edition of the School Profile due to a lack of information. However, data are being collected and will be included in a future update of the profile.

The information in this Profile is presented as accurately as possible. However, part of these data are subject to sampling error, changes in personnel files, limitations of the data files within District 4J, and human related error since most of the information was, by necessity, assembled by hand.

The remainder of the introduction defines how the data were obtained and tabulated. Each item is presented in the order that it is found within the School Profile. District averages for appropriate items can be found in the margin. These averages are determined for each educational level, i.e., high school, junior high, and elementary.

Building Characteristics

- 1) Location of School This is the physical, street location of the school.
- 2) Date of construction This is the date of completion of the first structure at this school's site.
- Square feet of primary educational space per student Primary educational space is defined as any classroom of 500 square feet or more, educational laboratories, (reading, language, science, others), lecture rooms, home economics, industrial arts (automotive, metal, industrial mechanics, woodworking, electricity-electronics, drafting-mechnical drawing, forestry), student rooms (play, quiet,

activity, study, student work, reading, listening, large group), special education (deaf, emotionally handicapped, educable mentally retarded, Easter Seal program when housed in public school, trainable mentally retarded, and speech therapy), musicensemble-instrumental, other classrooms. The total for each school was obtained from the Building Capacity Study. It was then divided into the total number of students in the school to determine the average allotment of space each student had in the school.

- Number of library books per student The total number of library books was obtained from the Multi-Media Center, and includes all books, excluding texts, assigned to the library. The number of books per student was obtained by dividing the total number of students into the number of books. A cautionary note: each school is assured of a basic library of 1600 books, therefore a small school may have a very large number of books per student, yet have very little variety when compared to a larger school which may have more total books, but fewer books per student.
- 5) Square feet of gymnasium space per student The number of square feet of gymnasium space was obtained from the Building Capacity Study and was divided by the number of students in the building.
- 6) Annual cost of vandalism 1974-75 This is the annual cost of material and labor incurred by each school to replace or repair damages to equipment or building due to vandalism. This information was obtained from the Plant Management Department.
- 7) Size of site (in acres) This figure was provided by the Plant Management Office as an estimate of the total acreage of the entire site -- buildings and surrounding grounds.
- 8) Special Programs This includes any special programs the school maintains.

Student Information

- 9) Total number of regular students enrolled as of September 30, 1975 As implied, this is the total enrollment for each school as
 reported by the Classification Report. However, each kindergarten student is considered .5 of a regular full-time student
- 10) Number of students enrolled in Special Education Programs as of 9-30-75 This is the total number of Educable Mentally Retarded, Trainable Mentally Retarded, Emotionally Handicapped, Easter Seal
 Program, Learning Disabilities, and Deaf children in the school.
- 11) Average percent days absent The data for this figure was acquired from the Pupil Personnel Report Form. It was calculated by dividing the total number of days absent for all students by the total number of days attendance possible.



Staff Information

NOTE: These data include all certificated staff in a building.

- 12) The average total number of years of experience This figure was tabulated by summing the total number of years of experience for all certificated staff members in a building and dividing by the total number of certificated staff members in that school.
- 13) The average total number of years in the 4J School District This figure was tabulated by summing the total number of years of experience in the 4J School District for the certificated staff member in a building and dividing by the total number of certificated staff members in that school. The information for both figures was from District personnel files.
- 14) Percent of staff with Bachelors only This value reflects the number of certificated staff with only a Bachelor level college degree divided by the total number of certificated staff in the school. This information was from District personnel files.
- 15) Percent of staff with Bachelors +45 This figure was tabulated following the same procedure described in item 14 and represents the percentage of staff with a Bachelors degree with 45 additional credit hours of study.
- 16) Percent of staff with Masters only This figure represents the percent of Masters level degree staff.
- 17) Percent of staff with Masters +45 This represents the percent staff with a Masters degree with 45, more additional hours of study. Again,all data were obtained from District personnel files.
- 18) Average salary for Certificated Staff This value was obtained from District personnel files and was derived by summing the salary of each certificated staff member and dividing by the total number of certificated staff members in a building.

Community Factors

estimates of 1975 characteristics. The information was made available through the Lane Council of Governments. The census data were transformed so that the figures offered in each of the items related directly to the school's attendance are and takes into account all individuals in the area. In addition there were sampling error and protection from personal disclosure. The bias introduced when personal disclosure protection criteria was applied affects those areas where population density is low. For example, if a census area contained only one family and the information was published for that area, the family

may be exposed to unwanted public disclosure. Thus schools in rural areas may have highly biased information due to the fact that a portion of their population could not be represented. Though admittedly not perfect, the census data are the most accurate information available for community related viewed.

- 19) Percent of individuals 25 years or older with four or more years of college This item gives an estimate of the proportion of individuals with four or more years of college.
- 20) Percent of persons living at the same residence from 1965 to 1970 This gives an estimate of the relative mobility of the individuals in the area. Persons sampled were those who are renters and homeowners.
- 21) Percent of individuals living in structure with 1.01 or more persons per room This figure is computed by dividing the number of persons in the unit by the number of rooms in the unit, (living rooms, dining rooms, kitchens, bedrooms, finished recreation rooms, family rooms, etc.). The figures, therefore, refer to the number of housing units having the ratio of 1.01 persons per room.
- 22) Average family income This is the average income of each family including wages earned by all members 14 years and older.

Testing Information

The testing information was acquired during the 1974-75 academic year. Test—scores for the Elementary School represent the sixth grade averages as determined by the Gates-MacGinitie—Reading Test and the Metropolitan Mathematics Test. Test scores for the Junior High School represent the ninth grade average, and test scores for the High School were taken from the eleventh grade. The Iowa Test of Educational Development was used in testing the secondary schools.

Errors associated with testing information can come from test development, statistical treatment of the data, test use, and student reaction to content and/or testing situation. During the past few years standarized testing in the Eugene District has been de-emphasized and as a result the precise testing procedure for administration of the tests may not have been observed in all cases. As a result of these constraints the test data should be viewed as estimates and interpeted with caution.

Principal's Statement

The Jefferson staff and students work together to create a comfortable learning environment. Students use counseling services and a teacher-student advisor system to select individualized programs from a wide range of elective offerings. Such offerings include a class for apathetic students and a class for emotionally handicapped students.

Besides the regular extracurricular activities, all students may participate in an after-school intramural program. Jefferson students may also enroll in Jefferson II, an alternative school-within-a-school, which allows students to pursue their studies as members of small groups. Students explore career opportunities through various art, music, and industrial education electives.

Patterson tries to provide parents with a choice of a nearly traditional program for pupils and a more open choice program. Twenty percent of the current student body transfers here from other attendance areas in the district, stating they are attracted by the choice of programs. The turn-over rate (moving in and out) of non-transfer students has exceeded 72% the past 3 years. After mid-year the typical new pupil has been in 4 or more schools. On any given day, between 30-40 pupils are living in motel units. Statements provided by parents in 1974-75 indicated that 65% of the pupils live below the poverty level, as identified by the Orshansky Scale. Title I funds help provide staff for extra learning opportunities for the neighborhood pupils with learning difficulties. Test data indicate that any pupil who has been at Patterson for three or more years and has normal learning ability performs at or considerably above grade level.

Principal's Statement

Instruction in the basic skills is the core of the curricular program at James Monroe Junior High School.

Basic skills are emphasized in Reading, Math, Language Arts, Science, Social Studies, Physical Education and Health. All classes at Monroe are on a Semester basis (18 weeks).

Reading is required for every seventh and eighth grade student for a full year in addition to Language Arts (rhetoric, composition, and literature). The reading program includes testing to determine a student's reading level with the goal to advance skills in reading vocabulary and comprehension to the approximate level of the student's ability. Reading includes work study, decoding exercises, spelling, and developmental reading.

Roosevelt expects each student to build a selective and individualized educational plan. Most classes are open to any student. Each student may learn how to be responsible by having the opportunity to be responsible. A strong guidance system is the keystone: each staff member provides an adult guidance for 20 students meeting daily.

The program provides the strong basic skills courses common to all 4J junior high schools. It differs because all courses are elective, and must be high interest offerings to attract student enrollment.

The flexibility built into this program, to more closely meet the needs of each individual, makes unusual demands upon students, parents, and staff. The program has flourished for seven years primarily because of the personal commitment and effort of Roosevelt teachers.

Principal's Statement

The Edison Building houses two programs. One is the Edison Program with kindergarten through grade 6, with a more conventional pattern. Children are assigned to self-contained classrooms. Some classrooms have combined grades, others have one grade. Teaching styles vary from informal and open to structured programs.

The Eastside Program is ungraded with children from one through six grade working together. The staff works very closely together in planning the instructional activities and changing schedules. Children and parents are expected to have a voice in many of the learning experiences. The organizational pattern includes both family rooms and children assigned to adulately advisors.
