ABSTRACT

This report is based on a questionnaire survey of all two-year and four-year colleges in the United States listed in the 1972-73 "Education Directory" (Part 3, Higher Education). Registrars at 2,614 institutions replied to the questionnaire; 2,419 reported registrations in one or more foreign languages. The fall 1972 survey shows a decline of 9.2% in total foreign language registrations between 1970, the year of the last previous investigation conducted by the MLA, and 1972. Registrations declined in French, German, Italian, Latin and Spanish, but increased slightly in Russian and significantly in Ancient Greek and a number of the so-called "other" or less commonly taught languages. Spanish continues to be the leading language in U.S. colleges, having displaced French from this position in 1970. The totals for summer 1973 show an estimated decline of 11.6% from the overall total of foreign language registrations recorded in the summer of 1971. The report consists of an introduction, 24 tables, and an institutional directory. The tables present summary data, by region and state, for the seven most commonly taught languages and for the aggregate of "other" languages, as well as detailed comparative figures from surveys undertaken in 1960, 1968 and 1970. This report is based on a questionnaire survey of all two-year and four-year colleges in the United States listed in the 1972-73 Education Directory (Part 3, Higher Education). Registrars at 2,614 institutions replied to the questionnaire; 2,419 reported registrations in one or more foreign languages.

The Fall 1972 survey shows a decline of 9.2% in total foreign language registrations between 1970, the year of the last previous investigation conducted by the MLA, and 1972. Registrations declined in French, German, Italian, Latin, and Spanish, but increased slightly in Russian and significantly in Ancient Greek and a number of the so-called "other" or less commonly taught languages. Spanish continues to be the leading language in U.S. colleges, having displaced French from this position in 1970.

The totals for Summer 1973 show an estimated decline of 11.6% from the overall total of foreign language registrations recorded in the Summer of 1971.

FOREWORD

The present study of college language registrations is the eleventh in a series that the Modern Language Association has conducted under contract with the United States Office of Education. It is the fourth to present data for all foreign languages, both classical and modern, in colleges and universities in the United States. The body of the report consists of twenty-four tables summarizing the data, plus a directory of the 2,419 institutions that reported registrations in one or more foreign languages. Like the two previous reports, it includes summer school data (see tables 18-24) for courses taught in Summer 1973.

To facilitate the study of trends in foreign language registrations over the twelve year period between 1960 and 1972, registration data from the surveys undertaken in 1960, 1968, and 1970 have been incorporated into the present report (see tables 4-13). The comparative figures are drawn from the following reports: "Modern Foreign Language Teaching in Junior Colleges, Fall 1959 and Fall 1960"; "Modern Foreign Language Enrollments in (1206 four-year) Colleges and Universities, Fall 1960"; "Foreign Language Registrations and Student Contact Hours in Institutions of Higher Education, Fall 1968 and Summer 1969"; and "Survey of Foreign Language Registrations on Student Contact Hours in Institutions of Higher Education, Fall 1970 and Summer 1971."

It should be borne in mind, in consulting the comparative figures, that those for each year are derived from a different base, ranging from 1,661 institutions in 1960 to 2,419 in 1972.

As in the 1970 survey, information on student contact hours was requested from college registrars together with the figures on the number of registrations in each language. Due to limitations of space, however, data on aggregate contact hours have not been included in the present report. Instead, the average number of contact hours per student per week has been computed for the aggregate of registrations in all languages in each state; these figures are reported in tables 1-3, for fall 1972, and 18-20, for summer 1973.

The data for the present report were compiled and tabulated by senior research assistant Jeffrey H. Meyerson with the assistance, at various times, of Kathryn Buck, Cheryl Dernorsek, and Page H. Tigar.

The staff is grateful to Dr. Kenneth Mildenberger, retiring Deputy Executive Secretary of the Modern Language Association, for continuous advice and guidance, and to Mrs. Julia A. Petrov of the U.S. Office of Education for her helpful cooperation and responsiveness to special requests.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE REGISTRATIONS IN INSTITUTIONS
OF HIGHER EDUCATION, FALL 1972

The basic data for this report were obtained from a questionnaire sent to the registrars of the 2,617 two-year and four-year institutions listed in the MLA's computerized files, plus an additional roster of institutions--largely seminaries--taken from the 1972-73 edition of the Educational Directory (Part 3, Higher Education) published annually by the Office of Education. Of the 2,614 institutions replying to the questionnaire, 2,419, or 87.4%, reported registrations in one or more foreign languages. In the last previous full-coverage survey, that of Fall 1970, 2,572 institutions were canvassed and 2,538 replies were received. Of these replies, 2,353, or 92.3% of the total completing the questionnaire reported registrations in foreign languages.

The 1972 survey shows a total of slightly over one million foreign language registrations--a drop of 9.2% since the last published report in 1970. The 1970 report was the first in the series to show any decline at all: about 1.4% since the previous report of 1968. In 1970, enrollments in Spanish and Italian (and also many of the so-called "exotic" languages) were seemingly unaffected by the general downward trend; in 1972, however, both had lower enrollment figures. Only Ancient Greek (up 23.3%), Russian (0.6%), and the aggregate of "exotic" languages show gains between 1970 and 1972; the leading languages in the latter group are Hebrew, Chinese, and Japanese.

As was the case in 1970, the downward trend in college foreign language enrollments is especially serious in the light of continuing (although slight) growth of college enrollments in general, since it means that the role played by foreign languages in the U.S. college curriculum is diminishing even more rapidly than the absolute number of students taking language courses. Table A compares total college enrollments (as reported by the Office of Education) with the MLA's figures for modern foreign languages, giving a percentage ratio for each of the years in which the MLA conducted its survey.

Table B shows the results of the 1972 enrollment survey, with a breakdown by language for the seven most commonly taught languages plus an aggregate figure for the "other" languages, tallies for two-year college and graduate registrations, comparative totals from the 1970 survey, and a figure showing percentage change in the language totals between 1970 and 1972. As the table shows, the decline in enrollments was not uniform in all languages and segments of the higher education community. Thus, the decreases in French and German enrollments were considerably more severe than those in Spanish and Italian, and Russian enrollments managed to hold steady. Enrollments in Ancient Greek enjoyed an increase, while those in Latin continued to decline. For the first time in the history of MLA surveys, foreign language registrations in two-year colleges show a decline, though not as severe as the drop for four-year colleges and universities.

Distribution of Registrations

Five languages--French, German, Italian, Russian, and Spanish--accounted for 89.6% of the total registrations in foreign languages in the 2,419 colleges and universities covered in the survey; Latin and Ancient Greek accounted for an additional 4.5%; and the remaining 5.9% were distributed among 120 additional languages, ancient and modern. Spanish, having displaced French from its "leadership position" in 1970, is still the most widely taught foreign language in U.S. colleges and universities, as it has been in secondary schools for many years. Spanish is the leading language in registrations in 29 states; French holds first rank in 17 states and the District of Columbia, German leads in three states, and Japanese is the most popular language in one state (Hawaii).

Spanish now accounts for 40.3% of the total registrations in the five leading modern languages. In 1960, Spanish had only 30% of the total and French had 38.4%. Table C, based on the registrations in the five leading languages, shows the percentage of the total in each language from 1960 to 1972. Table E depicts growth trends in the five leading modern languages between 1960 and 1972. Table F shows enrollments by state for 1970 and 1972. Only eleven states showed increased enrollments between 1970 and 1972, and six states showed a loss of 20% or more in enrollments during the same two-year period.

Foreign Languages in the Junior Colleges

As junior and community colleges in the United States continue to grow in size and number, they become increasingly significant in enrollment studies. In 1960, 455 two-year colleges reported foreign language registrations; by 1970 the number had grown to 861. In fall 1972, foreign language offerings were reported by 899 two-year colleges, but their language enrollments had declined by 1.7% since 1970. Spanish is the leading language in the junior and community colleges, with French in second place, and German in third.

Russian, Chinese, and "Other" Languages

After a sharp decline (11.1%) between 1968 and 1970 figures, enrollments in Russian have improved to the point that they were able to hold steady (0.6% increase) between 1970 and 1972. This improvement, taken together with the rapid growth of enrollment in Chinese during the same period (from 6,238 to 10,044, or 61.0%), suggests a direct connection between language enrollments and external events--in this case the strengthening of political and commercial ties between the U.S. and both the Soviet Union and the Peoples Republic of China.

The growth rate for the so-called "other" or less commonly taught languages continues to be quite encouraging. In the aggregate, they grew 30.1% between 1970 and 1972, and several of them, most notably Hebrew, Chinese, and Swahili, grew at even faster rates during this period. Only Portuguese, which more than quadrupled its enrollments between 1960 and 1970, began to show slight signs of decline. Table D shows enrollment trends in the ten most widely taught "other" languages.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE REGISTRATIONS IN INSTITUTIONS
OF HIGHER EDUCATION, SUMMER 1973

Prior to its 1968-69 survey, the Modern Language Association covered foreign language registrations in the fall term only. The first summer survey, taken in 1969, tabulated a total of 141,763 registrations reported by 879 institutions. In 1971, reports from 1,009 institutions yielded a total of 137,615 registrations in foreign language courses.

In 1973, the survey response rate was lower than in 1971, despite two mailings of the questionnaire and numerous follow-up telephone calls. Replies received from 643 institutions yielded a total of 77,524 registrations. The average registration for each responding college or university was 136.4 in 1971 and 120.6 in 1973, a drop of 11.6%.

Summer registration data are presented in detail in Tables 18-24 of the report.
