ABSTRACT

Presented are results of a salary survey covering professional positions in member libraries of the Association of Research Libraries (ARL). Tabular summaries are provided for: (1) salary ranges; (2) relationship of salaries to total expenses; (3) median and beginning salaries in member libraries; and (4) rank ordering of both beginning and median salaries for university libraries. Data cover the 1973-74 and 1974-75 academic years. (EMH)

INTRODUCTION

In the past few years approximately 60 percent of the total operating budgets of ARL university libraries has been used for salaries and wages. Thus, labor costs are a critical element requiring special consideration and analysis by library management in making decisions regarding the allocation of limited financial resources.

In order to provide information regarding salaries in research libraries, the Association of Research Libraries has published since 1967 the ANL Annual Salary Survey. In the past the surveys have been primarily a compilation of basic information regarding the median and beginning professional salaries in ARL libraries. It has become increasingly apparent, however, that with some further simple analysis of the data collected, the survey could offer some additional information to aid decision makers regarding salaries for library staff. Thus, beginning with the 1972/73 survey rank order tables, consumer price indices, and rates of change of figures for selected years were included.

Several new features have been added to the survey this year. A significant feature which is included for the first time is salary figures for the current (1974-75) as well as the previous (1973-74) year. Also, in order to provide a general context in which to analyze the salary figures, information on ARL library budgets and expenditures for salaries has been extracted from Academic Library Statistics (p. 6). A review of the annual percent of increase in salaries indicates that libraries have not been able to keep pace with the cost of living increases over the past several years. The effects of inflation are also reflected in the current statistics regarding number of positions and salary levels:

- 26 university libraries have reduced by 65 the number of professional positions reported.
- 20 university libraries report the same number of positions for 1973-74 as for 1974-75.
- 21 libraries report no change in the beginning professional salaries for 1973-74 and 1974-75.

In addition, while the data has not been collected long enough to identify significant patterns or trends, the summary of rankings (p. 12) indicates some interesting relationships of median and beginning professional salaries in individual institutions, and provides bases for comparison among institutions.

It is recognized that there can be many interpretations of the figures presented, dependent upon variations in reporting the data, local circumstances, the influence of other variables not considered here, etc. In future surveys we shall continue to try to refine our reporting and analysis to provide useful information on this most important subject.

EXPLANATORY NOTES FOR THE ARL ANNUAL SALARY SURVEY

- 1. This survey deals with position salaries for the fiscal year 1973-74, as well as for the new fiscal year. For most libraries this means the survey will cover budgeted positions for the period July 1, 1973 through June 30, 1974, and July 1, 1974 through June 30, 1975.
- 2. The survey is concerned with the salaries for professional positions only. Since the criteria for determining professional status vary among libraries, there is no attempt to define the term "professional." Each library should report the salaries of those staff members it considers professionals, including, when appropriate, staff who are not librarians in the strict sense of the term, such as computer experts, systems analysts, budget officers, etc.
- 3. Salaries are reported for all available professional positions, whether filled or unfilled.
- 4. Salaries are reported for full-time positions only. Part-time positions are computed in terms of full-time equivalents.
- 5. The salaries for all professional positions are included, regardless of whether the salaries come from the regular library budget or from special funds such as research grants.
- 6. The salary figures are straight gross salary figures. Fringe benefits are not included.
- 7. The median salaries for the total number of positions in both university and nonuniversity libraries are approximations. Exact medians are not indicated because individual salaries are not reported, only salary ranges.
- 8. When beginning professional salaries are reported as a range, the lower figure is used for the tabulation.
- 9. Any position, such as that of director of libraries, for which a salary figure has not been provided are indicated in the footnotes.
- 10. Explanatory footnotes to the reported figures are provided when necessary.

Because in a number of cases there is a relatively insignificant difference in the salary level between two institutions (which are nevertheless given two different rankings), it was decided that a "coarser" ranking of institutions was desirable. Therefore, in addition to the individual rankings, institutions are clustered into groups according to ranges of beginning professional salaries. The ranges for each group are:
