#### ABSTRACT

This directory contains information on 39 institutions and 198 projects of research teaching and training in demography in Asia and the Pacific. Eight countries are represented: Australia, Bangladesh, Hong Kong, India, Iran, Japan, New Zealand, and Pakistan. The following information is given for each institution: name, address, person in charge, professional staff, publications, and curricula. Information on research projects includes title, director, aim, area of research, publications, and date of completion. Most of the research projects are concerned with population growth and characteristics, fertility, mortality, migration, interrelations of demographic and other factors, and research methodology. Tables are included which show the scope of the entire survey to which this document is a third supplement. Among these is a list of all institutions surveyed, arranged alphabetically by each of 21 countries, with indicators showing which of the original or supplementary publications contain information about their projects. Emphasis is not on teaching demography per se but on its implications for social welfare. Studies done by students in group projects are: (i) Communication of the small family norm in a hospital setting; (ii) A follow-up study of abortions.

The Board of Economic Inquiry, Lahore, is a research institution conducting surveys of all socio-economic aspects of the country. Population/demographic studies are not regular features of research.

The problem of housing in the urban areas of Bangladesh has assumed a gigantic magnitude due to the recent rapid urbanization of the country. Industries have grown up as communication has improved. As a result, there has been a considerable rural-to-urban migration. Old towns have expanded and some new ones have arisen. Many new structures have been raised in the urban areas by individual citizens as well as by the Government to accommodate people, offices, business centres and institutions of various kinds. But the efforts made so far for meeting the housing needs have not been comprehensive, organized or co-ordinated. Although the cities have grown in size as well as content, the housing problem has remained serious as ever, especially for the people in the middle and low income groups. In the modern world, new cities are built and old ones are extended and reconstructed with the help of well thought out plans which are based on scientific investigations on the demand for housing, existing conditions of housing and availability of resources. According to the definition of "urban area" adopted in the 1961 population census, the urban area in Bangladesh consists of 78 towns and townships and the total urban population comes to about 5 per cent of the total population of the country. In order to provide information relevant to housing demand in the urban areas of Bangladesh, a sample survey was conducted during the months of June, July and August in 1970.

However, before any action is taken in this respect it will be necessary to know the existing knowledge of the students regarding population problems, the ideas of the teachers and guardians arout the introduction of such topics in the schools, and the class level at which these topics may be introduced. It will also be necessary to know the extent of knowledge which may be imparted at various levels. Another allied problem worth studying is the sex preference which leads towards many problems, such as larger families and the deterioration of the psychological health of the family. If a baby of unwanted sex is born, it may be reared as a baby of the wanted sex. This can lead to sex role confusion and further personality problems. Keeping in view the funds available, a sample survey of secondary studen's, their teachers and guardians has been attempted only in Dacca city, in the industrial area in and around Dacca and in the rural area of Dacca Sadar subdivision, with the hope that a followup study will be made after five years.

It appears as though, under the existing economy, technology and levels of living, they have approached some kind of a saturation level. By contrast, rapid growth of population is characteristic of areas that are thinly or only moderately populated and where considerable in-migration has been taking place in response to industrial, mining or agricultural developmental activities.

The traditional activities associated with these castes may be traced back to their connection with the cattle which were so basic in the primitive subsistence, agricultural economy of India. With the development of manufacturing industries based on leather and cotton in modern India, many of these castes have left their traditional jobs, at least partially, and found employment in agriculture. Although 94 per cent of the scheduled caste people live in the countryside, urbanization and industrialization have induced their movement from their rural hearths, particularly in areas where industries which can make use of their traditional skills have developed.
