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ABSTRACT

The purpose of this study was to bring together, for planning purposes, the published data concerning the general and educational characteristics of the population of Berrien County, Michigan. The study was limited to data found in the United States Census and documents of the Berrien County Planning Commission. The study is divided into three parts: (1) the population and population forecasts; (2) the general characteristics of the population, including selected social and economic characteristics; and (3) selected educational characteristics of the county population. 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PREFACE

One of the first steps in planning is an understanding of the local environment. Thus some agencies and organizations serving Berrien County, Michigan, have expressed a need for a compilation of the basic demographic data of the county.

On May 30, 1975, the Board of Trustees of Lake Michigan College, Benton Harbor, Michigan, contracted with the Center for Studies and Services in Education of Andrews University for a study for the development of the college's philosophy, goals, and objectives.

The present compilation was developed to serve primarily as an exhibit for that study. But it is hoped that it will serve also a larger public such as educational, government, planning, and business agencies, as a basic data base in planning and evaluation.

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Chapter I
INTRODUCTION

Berrien County is located in the southwestern corner of Michigan. Lying on the eastern shore of Lake Michigan, it consists of a congenial blend of industry, commerce, agriculture and recreation. Much demographic data concerning the county lies buried in various government and other publications.

The purpose of this compilation was to bring together for planning purposes, the published data concerning the general and educational characteristics of the population of Berrien County, Michigan. The compilation was limited for data found in the United States Census and documents of the Berrien County Planning Commission. Further editions of this compilation may concern themselves with broader data bases and more currently gathered data.

The compilation is divided into three parts. The first part, presented in chapter 2, deals with the population and population forecasts. The second part, given in chapter 3, concerns itself with the general characteristics of the population. Included in this part are selected social and economic characteristics. Chapter 4, presenting the third part, gives selected educational characteristics of the county population.

CHAPTER 2

THE POPULATION OF BERRIEN COUNTY, MICHIGAN

The 1970 census listed the population level of the county as 163,875. In 1971, the Berrien County Planning Commission developed a projection of the county population to 1999, which is presented in table 1. Care must be exercised in the use of the projected data since factors have changed since the development of the projection. Table 2 presents an estimation of the county population and number of households for 1975, which formed the basis for various studies by the Center of Studies and Services in Education at Andrews University. Figures 1 and 2 show graphic representation of the data presented in table 1. Another projection, somewhat different from the one first presented, was developed by Verway and is presented in table 3. Table 4 shows his figures for the population of the towns in the county.

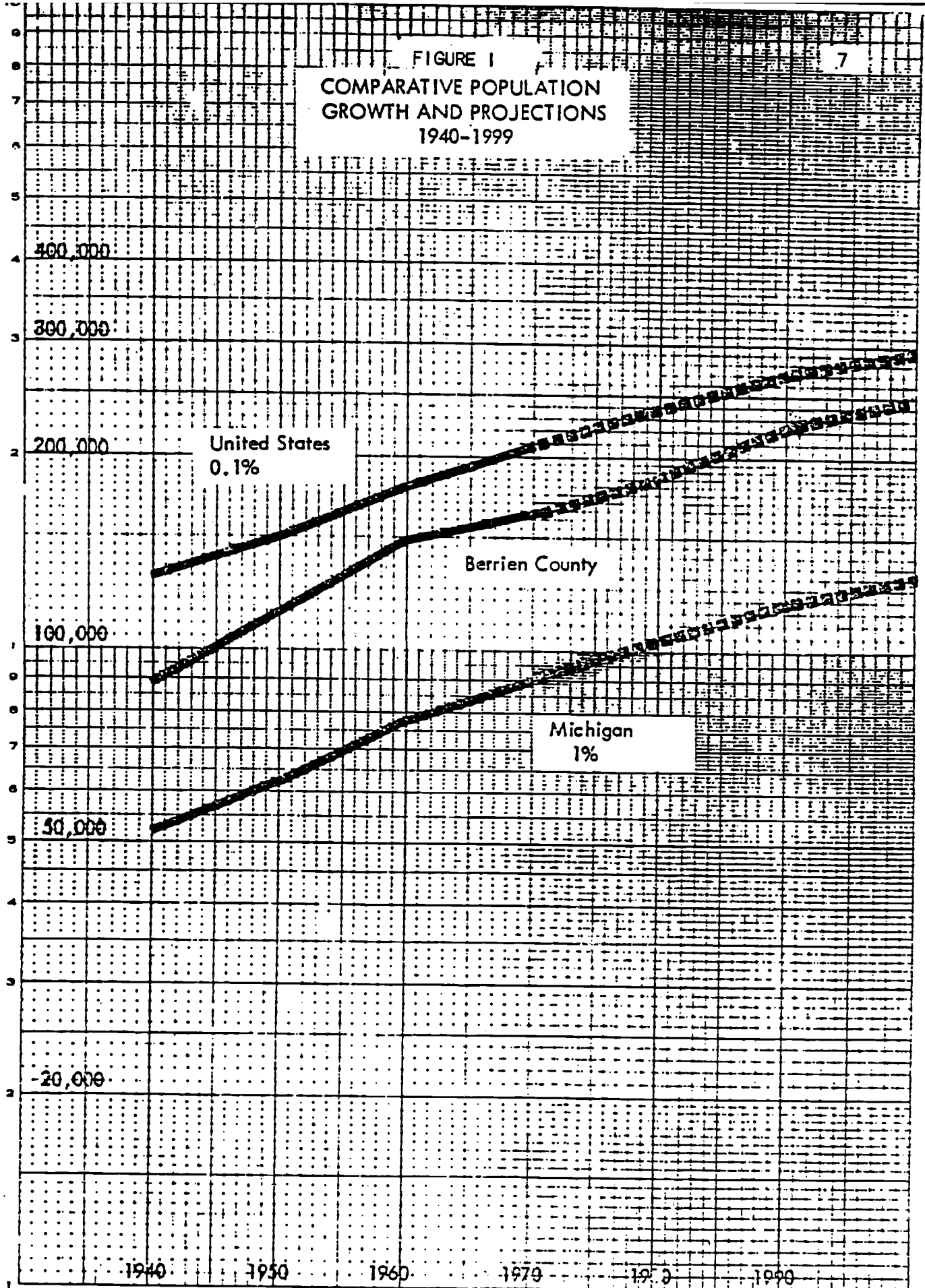

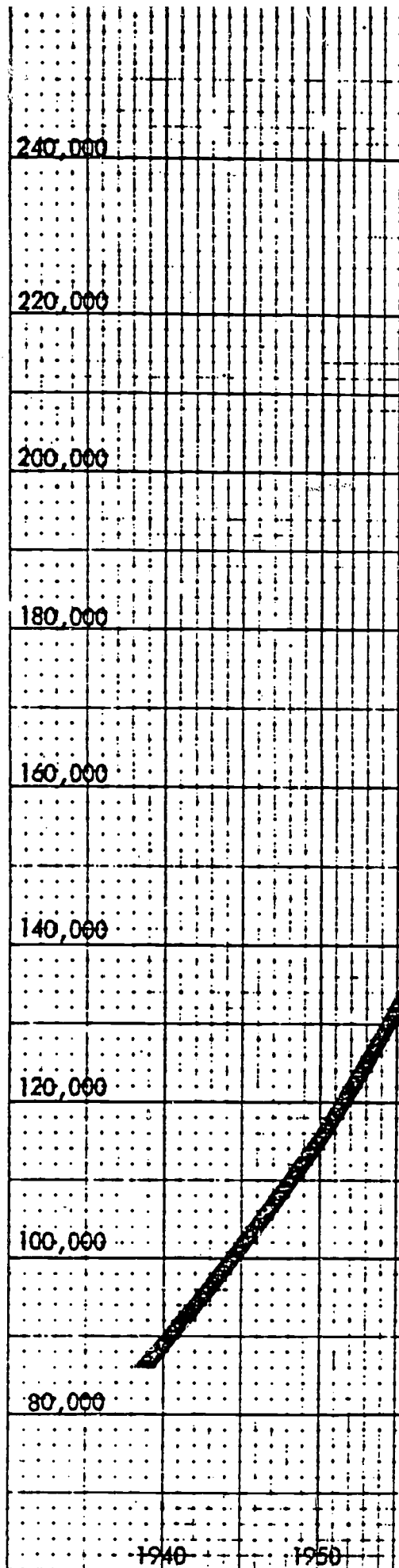

1940-1999

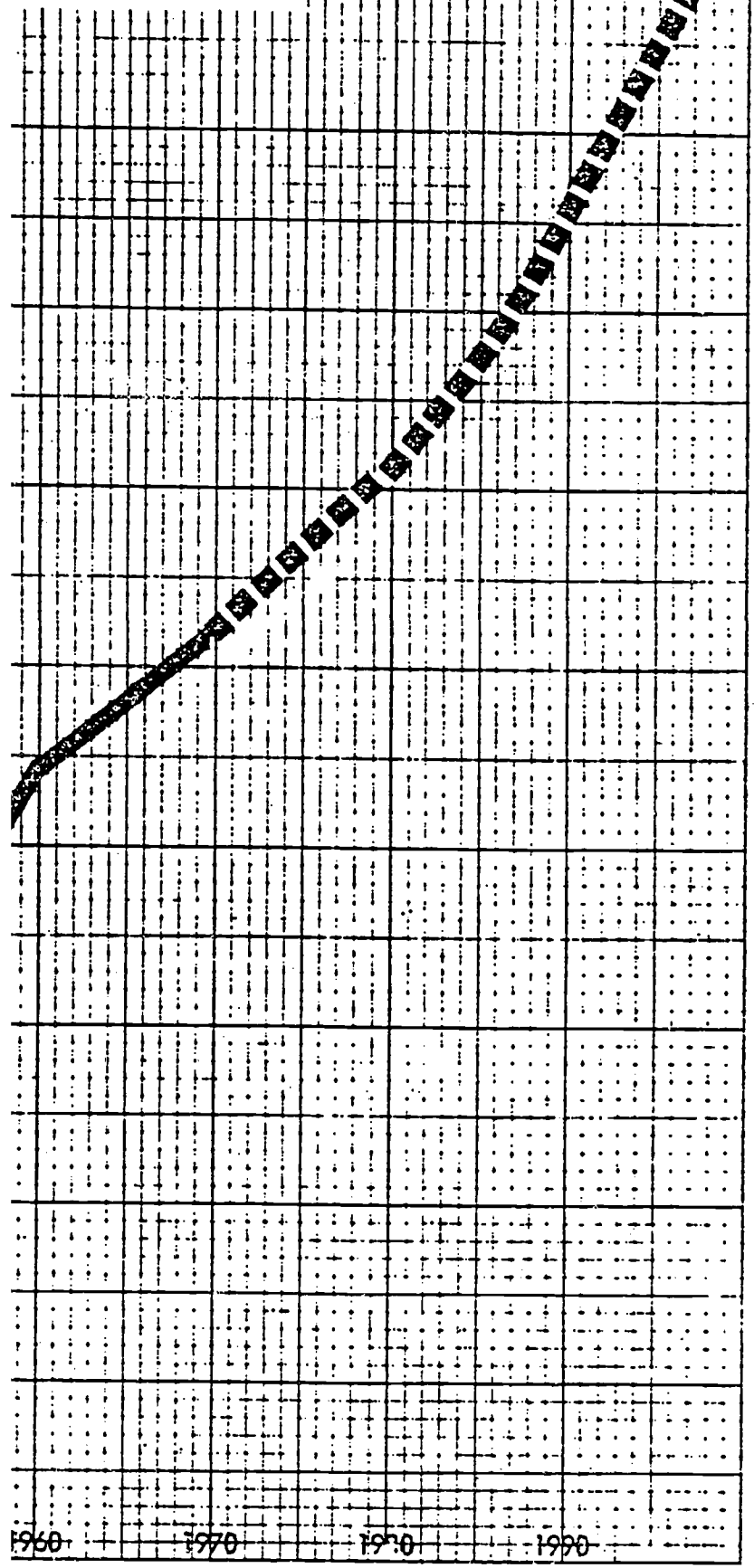

CHAPTER 3
GENERAL CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION
OF BERRIEN COUNTY, MICHIGAN

The tables presented in this chapter follow the order developed for the United States Census concerning general population characteristics and general social and economic characteristics. The sections thus are:

1. Race, sex, and age
2. Household relationship and families, children under 18 years old and marital status
3. Social characteristics on country of origin etc.
4. Economic characteristics on employment and poverty status, etc.

The tables are presented without comment. For further explanation of the various criteria, the reader is advised to consult the original sources.

First presented is a survey of social and economic characteristics and a comparison between characteristics of the State of Michigan and Berrien County. Then the general characteristics of the population and households for the county subdivisions are given. After a number of tables based on United States Census data, tables developed by the Berrien County Planning Commission are presented.

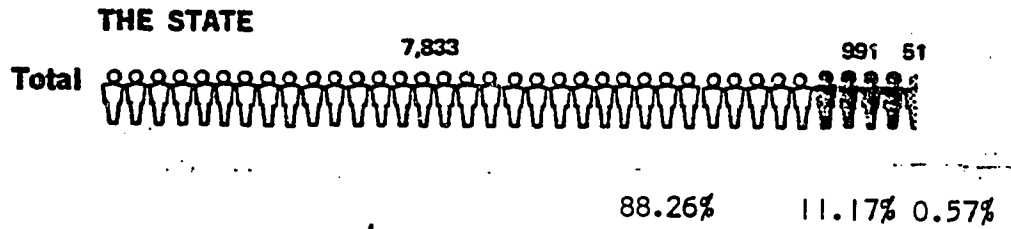

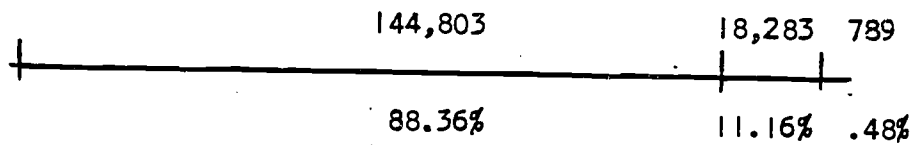
GENERAL POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS

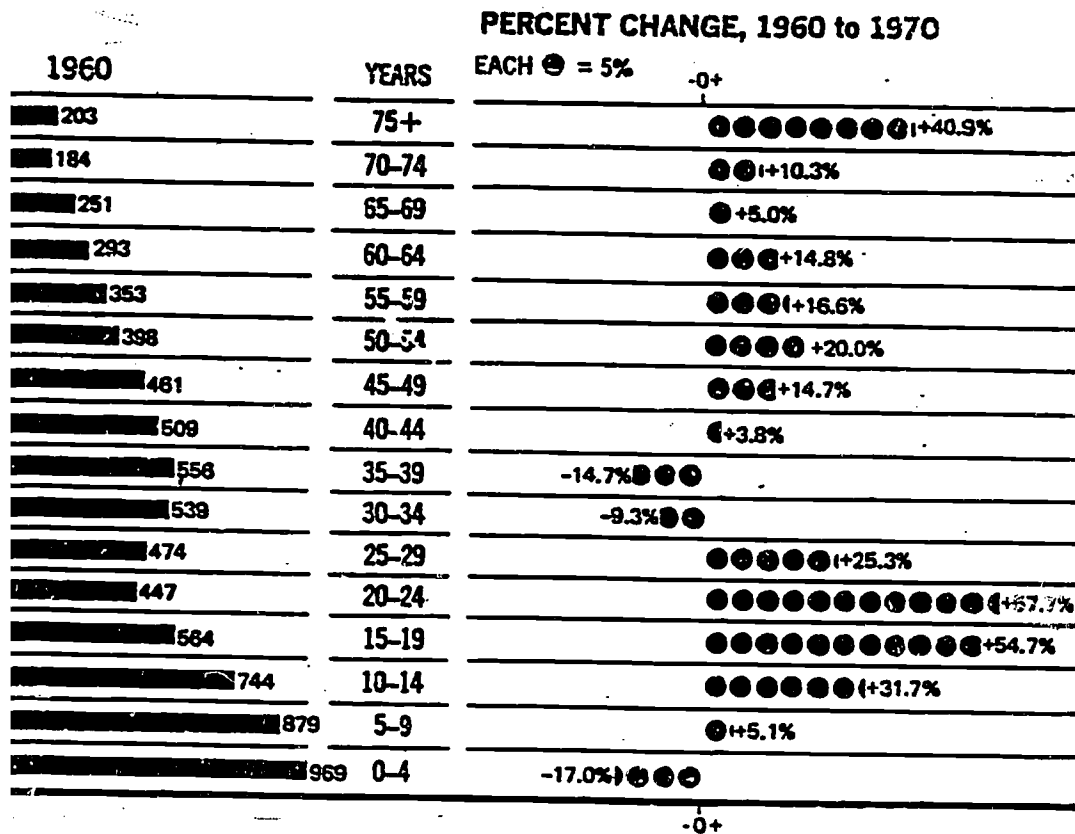

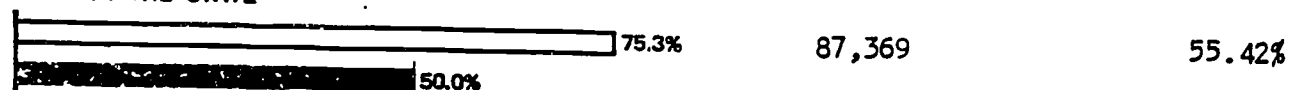

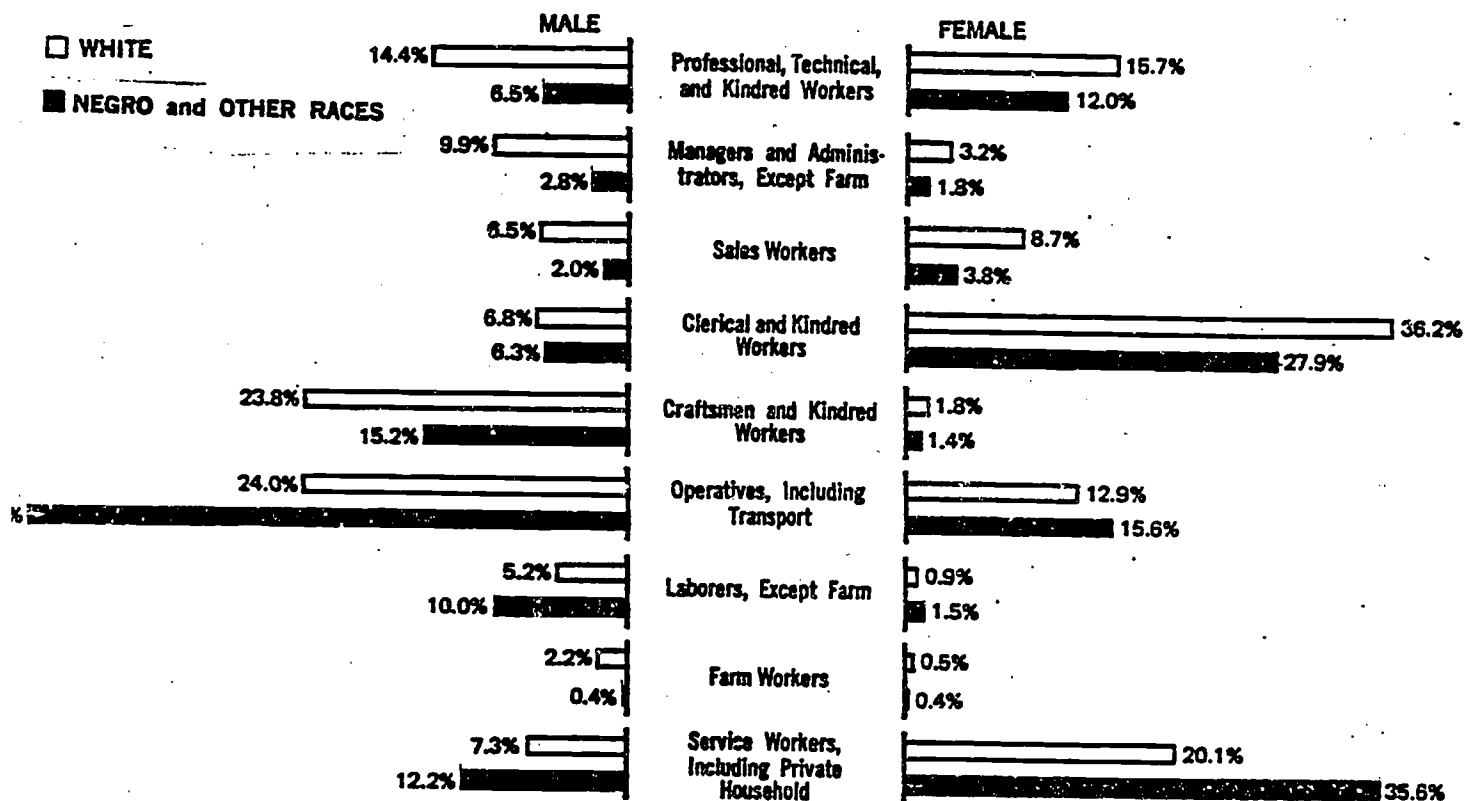

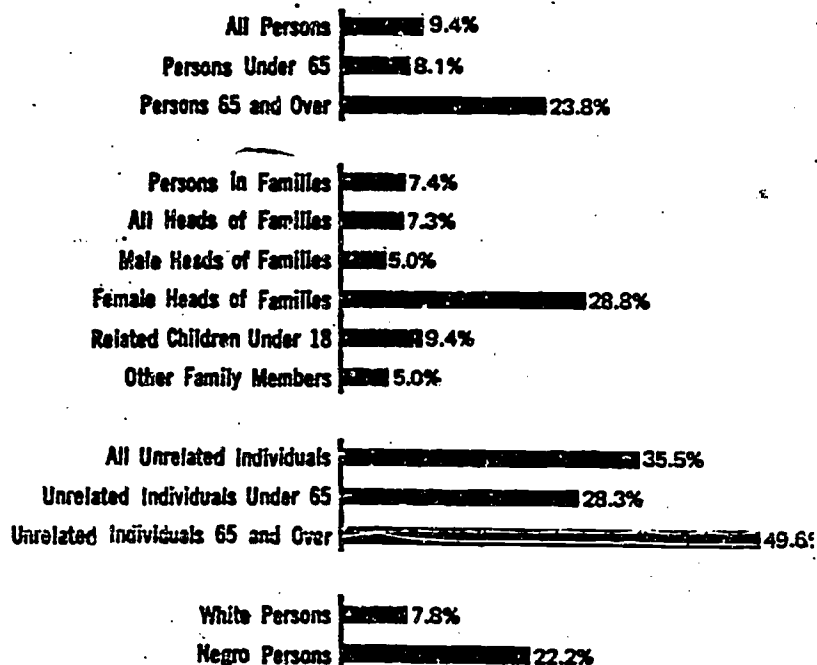

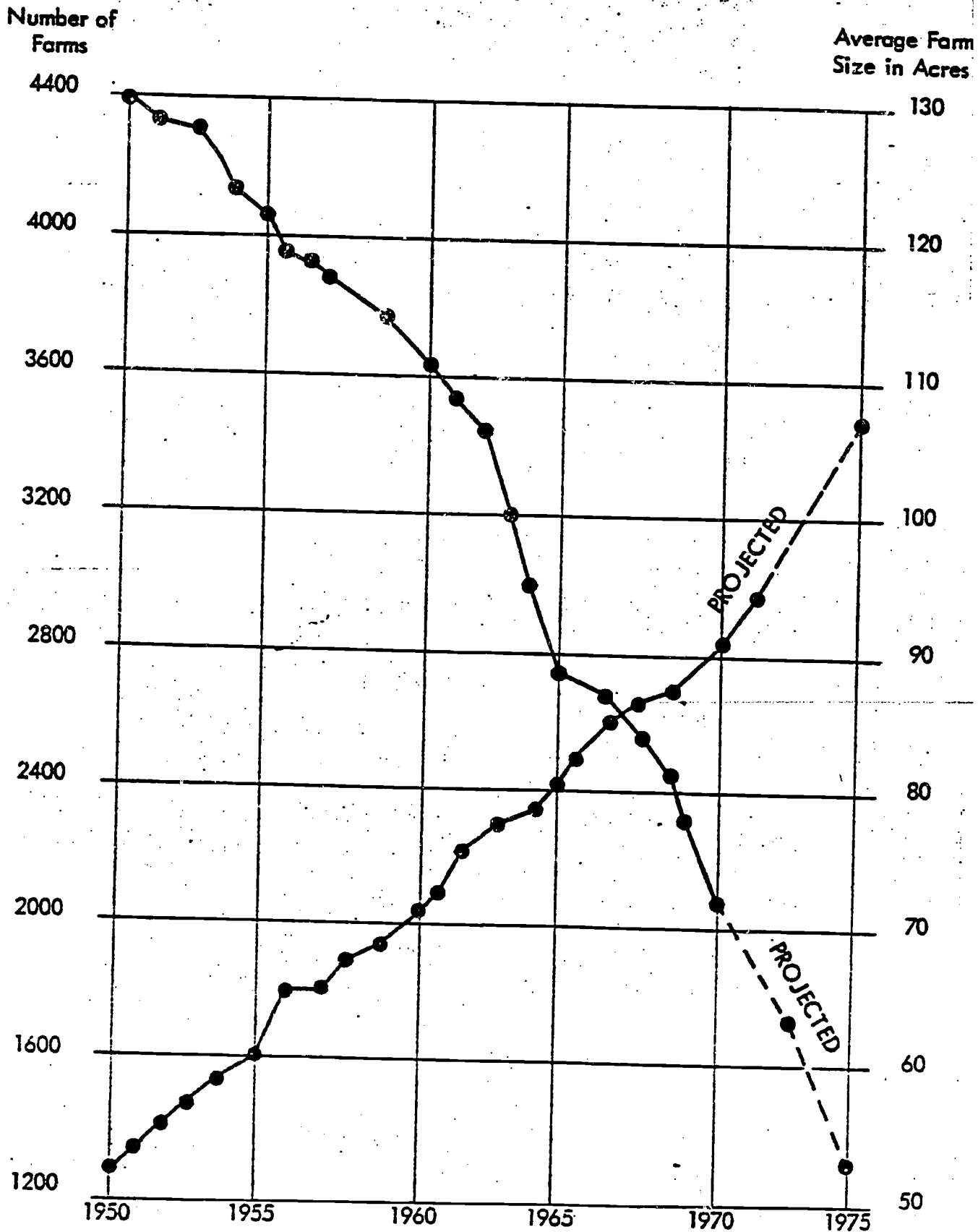

CHAPTER 4

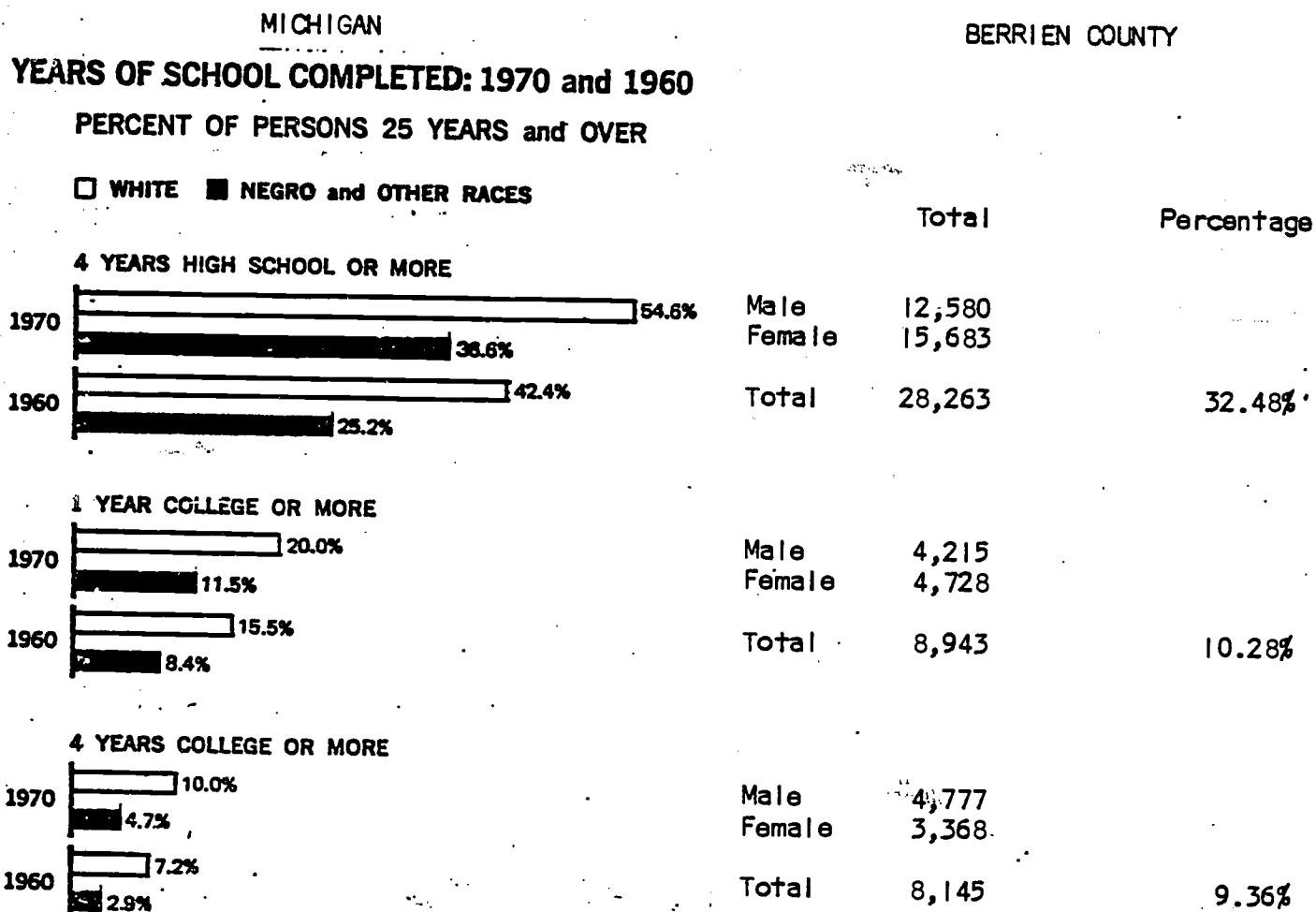
