## DEFINITIONS

### STUDENTS

**ENROLMENT** -- The number of individual students registered in one or a group of educational institutions. Includes full-time and/or part-time students.

**EVENING CREDIT PROGRAM STUDENT** -- An evening credit student is one who is registered in one or more Evening Credit sections of a course and is not registered in any daytime sections of any course.

**FRESHMAN** -- A student in the first year of an undergraduate program who is for the first time enrolled in an institution of post-secondary education.

**FULL-TIME STUDENT** -- A full-time student is one whose primary occupation is personal attendance at the university. Beginning Fall 1973, full-time undergraduate students are those registered in the equivalent of three or more half courses over one academic session. In years previous to Fall 1973, full-time undergraduate students are those registered in the equivalent of three or more full courses over one academic year.

**GRADUATE STUDENT** -- A student registered in a program leading to a graduate degree. The following graduate degrees are presently offered at The University of Calgary: Master of Arts (M.A.), Master of Science (M.Sc.), Master of Science in Engineering (M.Sc. in Eng.), Master of Education (M.Ed.), Master of Engineering (M.Eng.), Master of Social Work (MSW), Master of Environmental Design (M.E.Des.), Master of Management Studies (MMS), Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.).

**PART-TIME DAY STUDENT** -- A part-time day student is one who is registered in one or more daytime courses and is not classified as a full-time student.

**UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT** -- A student registered in a program leading to an undergraduate degree. The following undergraduate degrees are presently offered at The University of Calgary: Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.), Bachelor of Science in Engineering (B.Sc. in Eng.), Bachelor of Commerce (B.Comm.), Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.), Diploma of the Faculty of Education (Dip.Ed.), Diploma of the Faculty of Engineering (Dip.Eng.), Bachelor of Fine Arts (B.F.A.), Bachelor of Music (B. Music), Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), Bachelor of Nursing (BN), Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P.E.), Bachelor of Social Work (BSW), Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.).

### COURSES

**COURSE** -- Instruction offered in a special subject matter within a given period of time for which credit toward graduation or certification is usually given. Courses can carry full, half or quarter weights.

**COURSE ENROLEE** -- One student enrolled in one full equivalent course.

**CREDIT COURSE** -- A course which upon successful completion counts towards the student's graduation or certification. Certain courses constitute part of the student's prescribed program even though no actual credits are assigned to the course. In this report such courses are treated like credit courses.

**EVENING CREDIT PROGRAM (ECP)** -- Sections of courses carrying university credit which are offered in the evening. Such sections are numbered 91 to 98.

**FALL SESSION** -- Courses carrying university credit held either during the day or evening between September and December.

#### INSTRUCTION LEVEL

(a) Lower Level: Lower level instruction is identified by courses numbered 100-299.

(b) Upper Level: Courses numbered 300-599 are considered upper level, except for faculties and departments which had not as of December, 1975 changed their course numbering system based on GFC's decision of May, 1970. For those departments and faculties, 500 level courses are considered graduate.

(c) Graduate Level: Courses numbered 600 and higher are considered graduate level. In addition for faculties and departments which had not as of December, 1975 changed their course numbering system, 500 level courses are also considered graduate level.

**SECTION** -- One or more students formally organized for instruction in a specific course under the supervision of one instructor. A group of students taught simultaneously by two or more instructors represent two or more sections. (A student or group of students who may meet informally or irregularly for discussion with an instructor would not be considered a "section.") One course can have several types of sections depending on the type of instruction comprised in the course (lecture, tutorial, laboratory, etc.). Sections carry the same full, half and quarter weights as the course.

**SECTION ENROLEE** -- One student enrolled in one full equivalent section. One course enrollee can generate several section enrollees depending on types of instruction comprised in the course (lecture, tutorial, laboratory, etc.).

**SECTION HOURS (SH)** -- The number of weekly formal instructional hours per full equivalent course multiplied by the number of sections in each course. Lecture hours are multiplied by the number of lecture sections, laboratory hours by the number of laboratory sections and so on.

**SECTION HOURS PER SECTION** -- The number of section hours per full equivalent section.

**SPRING SESSION AND SUMMER SESSION** -- Courses carrying university credit offered during a six week period in May and June (Spring) or in July and August (Summer).

## DEFINITIONS (Continued)

UNWEIGHTED AVERAGE SECTION SIZE -- The number of section enrollees per full equivalent section.

WEEKLY STUDENT HOURS (WSH) -- The number of weekly formal instructional hours multiplied by the number of course enrollees.

WEIGHTED AVERAGE SECTION SIZE -- An unweighted average section size weighted by the number of hours each section is taught.

WINTER SESSION -- Courses carrying university credit held either during the day or evening between January and April. Prior to 1973, Winter Session extended from September to April.

## GRADES

COLLEGE TRANSFER STUDENTS -- Students who entered The University of Calgary as full-time students with full accreditation for first year from Mount Royal College, Medicine Hat College or Red Deer College.

COURSE GRADE POINT AVERAGE (CGPA) -- The average of grade points obtained by students registered in a course. The following grade points are attached to course marks used in 1974-75 at The University of Calgary: A+ and A, 4; B+ and B, 3; C, 2; D, 1; and F, 0. Effective September, 1973, the following grade points are attached to course marks in courses numbered 600 and higher: A-, 3.7; B-, 3.3 (graduate students only); B-, 2.7.

MATURE NON-MATRICULATED STUDENTS<sup>a</sup> -- A student of mature age (23 years of age or above except for the Faculty of Education and School of Physical Education which will consider applicants at 21 years of age) who is unable to present complete matriculation, and who realizes a need for a University education, may apply for admission under special conditions. Each application will be considered on its own merits by the dean or director of the faculty or school concerned. Such students will normally be required to provide evidence of ability to undertake academic studies, such as a recent matriculation or correspondence course taken, and to undergo special entrance examinations.

STUDENT GRADE POINT AVERAGE (SGPA) -- The average of grade points (0-4) obtained by a full-time student for courses taken during a session. For "Winter 1974" and "Winter 1975" SGPA is based on all courses (both fall and winter) of students who were full-time in the winter sessions of 1974 and 1975 respectively. Students who were full-time in the fall only are not included in the SGPA data. For the purpose of the average, marks carry the same full, half and quarter weight as the courses.

## STAFF

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) ACADEMIC STAFF -- The number of university-funded Full-Time Faculty plus Full-Time Equivalent of Part-Time Faculty, the latter being determined by the department head based on a full-time workload. As a general rule a graduate assistant who receives the maximum stipend is considered one third of a full-time equivalent academic staff. Includes deans, directors, professors, associate professors, assistant professors, lecturers, instructors, other permanent and temporary faculty, faculty on leave with university financial assistance, graduate assistants (teaching) GA(T), graduate assistants (research) GA(R) and graduate service assistants (GSAs).

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) ACADEMIC TEACHING STAFF -- FTE Academic Staff less FTE Graduate Assistants (Research) and Graduate Service Assistants.

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) SUPPORT STAFF -- The number of Full-Time Support Staff plus Full-Time Equivalent of Part-Time Support Staff.

PERMANENT ACADEMIC STAFF -- Full-Time appointees by the Board of Governors who have tenure or are on probationary appointments leading to tenure.

TEMPORARY ACADEMIC STAFF -- Persons appointed by the Board of Governors for one year or for one session on a full-time basis.

## FINANCE

CAPITAL EXPENDITURE -- An outlay or the incurrence of a liability during one fiscal period to acquire or add to an asset producing benefits extending beyond the same fiscal period.

FISCAL YEAR -- A period of twelve months for which the normal accounting cycle is performed. At The University of Calgary, the fiscal year begins on April 1st of one year and ends on March 31st of the following year.

OPERATING EXPENDITURE -- An outlay or the incurrence of a liability during one fiscal period to acquire or add to an asset whose benefits expire during the same fiscal period.

TRUST FUNDS -- Funds restricted for research purposes generally coming from sources external to the university.

## SPACE

ASSIGNABLE SQUARE FEET (ASF) -- The sum of all areas on all floors of a building assigned to or available for assigning to an occupant, including every type of space functionally useable by an occupant. Does not include custodial, circulation, or mechanical areas.

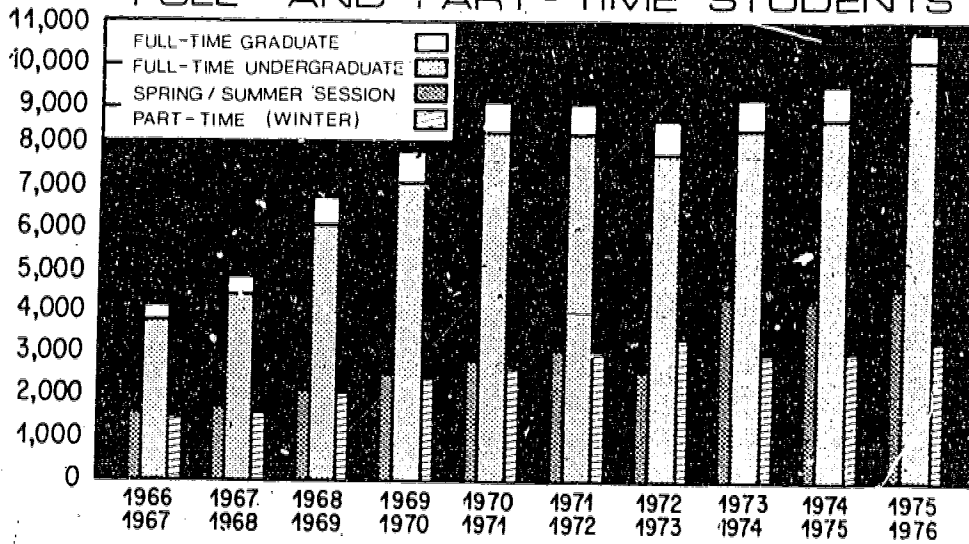

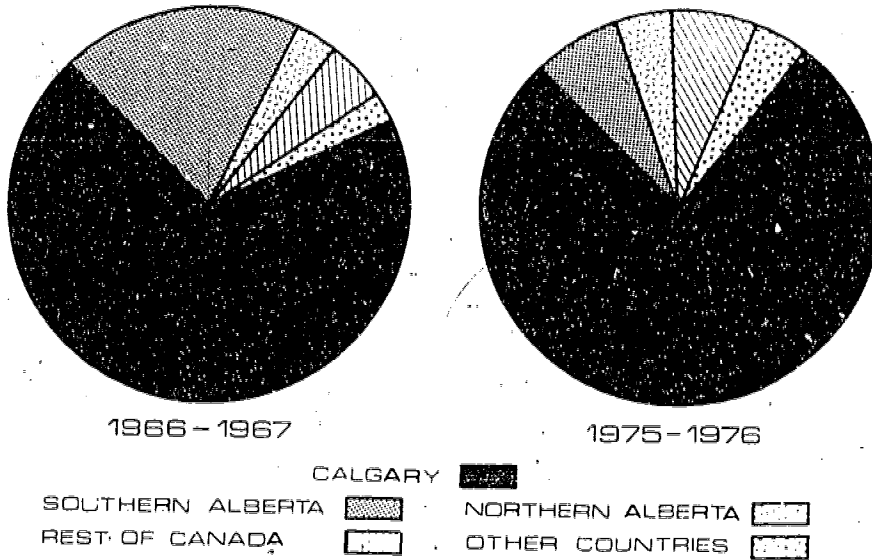

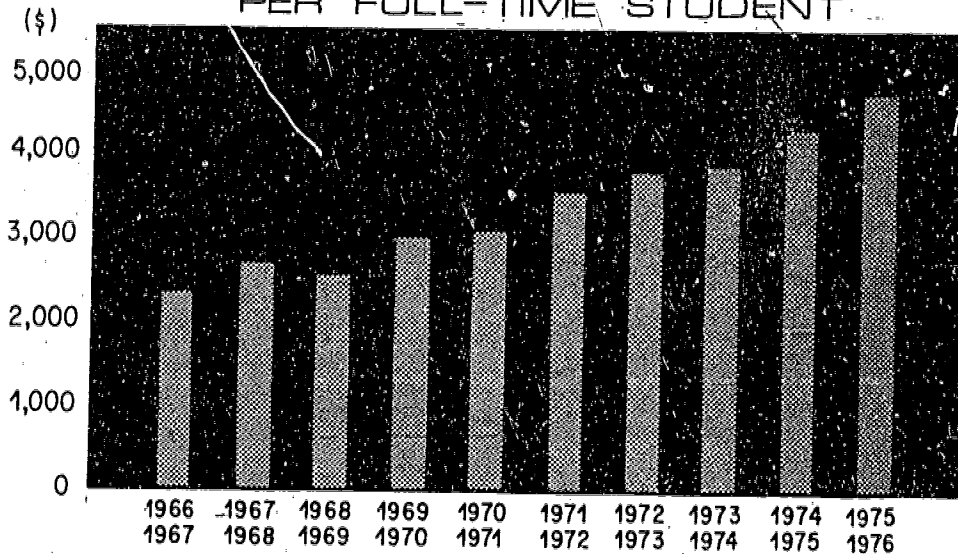
## FULL- AND PART-TIME STUDENTS
