ABSTRACT

This catalog provides information on the 159 vocational/career education programs which have been funded by the 1968 Vocational Amendments and Wisconsin's 16 vocational technical and adult education districts to provide services to special needs students. The preface indicates that many innovative methods and techniques for training special needs students can be found in the various programs, which provide pre-vocational and supportive services for special needs students in addition; to modifications in **M**ocational curriculum areas. The intended audience is high school and Vocational-technical adult education (VTAE) counselors and agencies, and persons' who are working with special needs students. The table of contents provides a listing of the disadvantaged and handicapped occupational programs. Each program citation includes title, address, name, and phone number of an information contact and an administrative contact, type of handicapped students served, and a one- or two-sentence program description. This publication contains information on the 159 Vocational/Career Education programs which have been funded by the 1968 Vocational Ammendments and Wisconsin's 16 Vocational Technical and Adult Education Districts to provide services to Special Needs Students. This is not a comprehensive listing of all programs for Special Needs Students in Wisconsin. Other programs have been developed through categorical aids and through VTAE District initiated activities which receive no special funding.

These programs reflect the great amount of work being carried on in Special Needs Education by the 16 Wisconsin VTAE Districts. Although there is still much work remaining to be done in order to provide vocational education to Special Needs Students, these programs have provided access to the VTAE system for these Special Needs Students. The programs have helped coordinate school and community resources and have made communities more aware of the needs of the handicapped and disadvantaged persons.

Many innovative methods and techniques for training Special Needs
Students can be found in the various programs. The programs provide pre-vocational and supportive services for Special Needs
Students in addition to modifications in vocational curriculum
areas. Sources of information on where these programs are located
and names of persons to contact for further information is provided.
This information should be of special interest to high school and
VTAE counselors, agencies and persons who are working with Special
Needs Students.
