ABSTRACT

This report describes faculty teaching load for fall 1976 in the Hawaii community college system as measured in terms of average semester hours taught, average hours in contact with students, and class size. The data used in generating this report were based on students registered in regular credit programs in Hawaii community colleges. A general increase in the number of courses, classes, and semester hours was noted at all campuses, due in part to the greater number of courses scheduled on a modular (short-term) basis. Average class size was smaller at most of the colleges. Faculty teaching figures indicated: a generally heavier workload in terms of average semester hours taught by instructors compared to 1975; a generally heavier workload in terms of weekly instructor contact hours compared to 1974; a decline in productivity ratios for the system compared to 1975; and an unchanged faculty/student ratio of 1:23 for the system. Decline in productivity ratios and average class size are attributed to lighter credit loads carried by both full- and part-time students and the greater proportion of part-time students. Tabular data on courses, classes, semester hours, contact hours, class size by program, average semester and contact hours taught, productivity, and faculty/student ratios are included for each college and for the system. 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Introduction

Faculty teaching load has long been a topic of vital interest to all concerned with education since it is so closely associated with cost and quality factors. As in the past, this report describes only one aspect of the instructor's workload: teaching load, i.e., the actual classroom situation as measured in terms of average semester hours taught, average hours in contact with students, class size, etc. (The total workload of the instructor would include many other professional activities such as responding to various community requests, engaging in departmental research, advising students, attending faculty committee meetings, etc.)

Sources of Data

SIS Computer Report 3010 and 3011 series (Course Registration Reports), which provide raw and summary data on faculty-student workload based on student credit hours were used as the primary documents for this report. (Data for these reports were abstracted from students' class registration data.) Computer reports 3030 (Schedule of Classes list) and Faculty-Staff Information System (FSIS) reports were used as reference points. Standard form 5Bs (personnel transaction forms) in the Chancellor's office were used to obtain a count on full-time equivalent faculty for staff on overload and for lecturers. The deans of instruction and/or the registrars of the colleges were also consulted for certain information.

Population Included

The information for this report is based on registration data including the following groups of students registered in the regular credit programs in seven community colleges: classified and unclassified students, early admittees, concurrent registrants, and other special students whose registration records are processed through the SIS. All computer reports are as of early October. The data have been "updated" since and where possible, certain changes have been made.

Adjustments

Equivalent credits were established for classes with variable credits. The methodology differed, however, depending upon the kind of classes under consideration, e.g., directed studies, cooperative education, etc. (See Appendix A, Definitions.)

Highlights

1. A general increase in the number of courses, classes and semester hours is noted at all campuses. However, registration count and student semester hour (SSH) declined at four campuses. (Table I)
 - a. The latter largely reflects a greater proportion of part-time students and a leveling off or a decline in enrollment.
 - b. As has been true in the past, the increases in the number of classes reflect a greater number of classes scheduled on modular (short-term) segments in some instances.
2. The number and proportion of classes with 10 or fewer students increased for the system and at several colleges. (Table II)
 - a. Systemwide, the 172 "low enrollment" classes is 51 (42%) more than the 121 reported last fall.
 - b. Many of these small classes are held regardless of low enrollment because of graduation requirements, facility limitations, and accreditation requirements especially in the health services, etc.
3. Average class sizes are slightly smaller at most of the colleges. As in the past, average class sizes in general education courses are larger (28 students) than those in vocational education courses (25 students). Average class sizes vary by campus: from 19-32* (Table III).
4. Faculty teaching figures indicate (Table IV):
 - a. A generally heavier workload in terms of average semester hours taught by instructors: 13.3 for the system, 12.6-13.8 by campus. (Comparable figures for fall 1975: 13.1 for the system, 11.8-13.7 for the colleges.)
 - b. A generally heavier workload also in terms of weekly instructor contact hours: 16.7 for the system, 13.2-18.6 by campus. (Comparable figures for fall 1974: 16.4 for the system, 13.8-18.8 by campus. Data not available for fall 1975.)
 - c. A decline in productivity ratios for the system and at three colleges: 347, system 253-402, by campus. (Last fall's: 355, system; 274-415 by campus.)
 - d. Faculty/student ratio remains the same for the system 1:23. The figures range from 1:16-1:27 by campus.

*John Lombardi's study on faculty workload indicates that generally average class sizes fluctuate between 25-60 with 35 as the average. 5. The full-time equivalency (FTE) count of instructors engaged in teaching credit courses this fall is 658.4 about 11 FTE more than last fall. The headcount of instructors totals 1,048, 33 more than the 1,015 reported in fall 1975. (Table V)

Summary

Instructor's teaching load is heavier in terms of average semester hours taught and average class contact hours. However, reflecting the lighter credit load carried this fall by both full- and part-time students and the greater proportion of students enrolled as part-time students, there is a decline in productivity ratios and average class sizes.

APPENDIX A
DEFINITIONS

1. COURSE: A unit of instruction consisting of recitations, lectures, laboratory sessions, etc., in a particular subject.
Example: English 100
2. CLASS: A lecture section of one or more students meeting regularly for instruction in a lecture or seminar course.
Example: Lecture section 39 of English 100
3. SEMESTER HOURS: Semester or semester hour value assigned to each lecture section of each fixed credit course. (Also known as credit hours.)
Example: Three semester hours for lecture section 39 of English 100
4. STUDENT REGISTRATIONS: Number of students registered in each class, excluding students auditing the class.
Example: 25 student registrations in lecture section 39 of English 100
5. STUDENT SEMESTER HOURS: Sum of semester hours taken by all students registered in all classes, excluding auditors (Also known as student credit hours, SCH)
Example: 75 student semester hours taken by 25 students in lecture section 39 of English 100 which is a three credit course
6. AVERAGE CLASS SIZE: Student registrations divided by number of classes. (Excludes classes and student registrations in classes such as directed studies, cooperative education.)
7. FTE FACULTY: FTE instructors employed on a full-time basis, counting the time of division chairman as two-third FTE; the position count of part-time instructors; and the FTE count of lecturers, instructors on overload and non-instructional staff teaching certain courses.
8. FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT OF: (1) "LECTURERS"; (2) INSTRUCTORS ON "OVERLOAD"; (3) AND "NON-INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF TEACHING CERTAIN COURSES":
Number of semester hours taught by these three groups divided by 15 credits. (Based on credits instructor is compensated for in the case of "overloads" and lecturers.)
9. FTE STUDENTS: The conversion of full- and part-time students into full-time equivalent by dividing total SCH taken by 15 credits.

10. EQUIVALENT CREDITS for classes with variable credits:

- (a) Regular subject, self-paced classes: average SH
(derived by dividing SCH by number of students).
- (b) Classes with catalog numbers 099, 199, 299: total
SCH divided by 10 credit hours.
- (c) Cooperative vocational - liberal arts courses:
50 students = 15 credit hours.

11. TEACHING LOAD MEASUREMENTS:

- (a) Average credit hours taught: the quotient obtained
by dividing credit hours taught by FTE faculty,
e.g. $\frac{8,473 \text{ credits taught}}{647.5 \text{ faculty}} = 13.1$
- (b) Productivity ratio: the quotient obtained by dividing
student semester hours (SSH) by FTE faculty,
e.g. $\frac{229,573}{647.5} = 355$
