## ABSTRACT

During academic year 1974-75, 256 former Los Angeles City College (L.A.C.C.) students entering the University of California (90% at UCLA). Of these, 14% were eligible to have entered directly from high school and 86% were ineligible. Male GPA's (grade point averages) at the university were higher than female for the "eligibles" while female GPA's were higher than male for the "ineligibles" and for the combined total. Overall, grade point averages for the transfers declined by .39 in their first year at university, compared to .37 for transfers from other state community colleges. Grades earned were 52% A's and B's and 14% D's and F's. Largest enrollments by the transfers were in sociology, psychology, and history; 83% chose majors within the College of Letters and Science. During the academic year 1975-76, 713 former L.A.C.C. students entered California State University at Los Angeles, of which 597 (84%) completed some work. First quarter GPA's of the transfers fell .06 grade points below their junior college average of 2.57. B averages or better were earned by 36% of the transfers while 20% fell below a C average; 52% of grades earned were A's or B's and 13% were D's and F's. Majors chosen by the transfers were more evenly divided: 33% in the School of Letters and Science, 24% in Business and Economics, 29% in Fine Arts, 3% in Engineering, and 11% undecided.

PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

To assess academic performance of Los Angeles City College transfers entering the University of California 1974-1975 and to compare with past performance.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

The Office of Educational Relations of the University of California sends annually to L.A.C.C. a report of the performance of new L.A.C.C. transfers. The most recent report included individual grade reports for 1974-1975 entrants, together with a summary of performance of these students and some comparative information regarding transfers from all California Community Colleges. The content and format of the report has undergone considerable change since the University inaugurated the "quarter system" in 1966. Comparison with earlier years is difficult for several reasons, among which are (1) different campuses of the University report statistics in different ways; (2) some figures include first quarter performance only, others include all work undertaken during the academic year; (3) some figures included Fall entrants only, others include all transfers through the year. For these reasons, some of the figures reported in the findings of the next section cannot be reconciled exactly with those of the UC report. Figures were obtained by a detailed analysis of that report and the accompanying grade reports. In spite of discrepancies indicated above, the overall conclusions of the report are believed reasonably accurate.

## FINDINGS

Table 1 presents 1974-1975 comparative data for all community college transfer fall entrants, and for L.A.C.C. transfer fall and other/quarter entrants to the University of California. Figures given in Table 1 show number of entrants, percent earning below a "C" average, percent earning a "B" average or above, grade point average at community college (cumulative), grade point average at the University of California (cumulative) and the differential in grade point averages. Since the GPA shown for all community colleges is for fall entrants only, the column entitled Fall Entrants for L.A.C.C. students is useful for comparison purposes.

Table 2 presents a summary over the last sixteen years of some of the information corresponding to that shown in Table 1 for 1974-1975. Prior to 1966-1967 (the beginning of the quarter system at UCLA), UC grade point averages were based on first semester performance only. Since 1966-1967, UC grade point averages have been based on all courses taken during any of the three quarters.

Figures 1 and 2 present in graphical form some of the sixteen year summary data, including some comparable information for all California community college transfers.

Table 3 presents data on the first year performance of all entrants from L.A.C.C. to the various campuses of the University of California. Table 4 presents data on the first year performance of fall quarter entrants. Table 5 shows the performance by L.A.C.C. transfers, a) the first year by fall entrants, b) the first quarter for fall entrants, and c) the first year by all entrants. Table 6 analyzes the transfers to UCLA (90% of the total), according to sex and college major.

Table 7 presents a detailed breakdown by departments of grades earned by transfers to UCLA. Table 8 shows, in rank order, grade point averages, earned in the departments with 15 or more enrollments and also shows performance for males, females, eligibles, and ineligibles in these departments.



(UC GPA - JC GPA)**



## SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

This study reports on the performance of former L.A.C.C. students who transferred to the University of California during the 1974-1975 academic year. Following are some conclusions from the findings of the study.

- (1) 259 students, the largest total in ten years, transferred to the University of California from L.A.C.C. during the 1974-1975 academic year. Of these, (14%) were eligible to have entered the University directly from high school, and 222 (86%) were ineligible.
- (2) Not included in the above totals (or in the study) are additional transfers "not charged" by the University to L.A.C.C. These include admission by "special action" and those who completed no work at the university.
- (3) Differential performance (UC G.P.A. - L.A.C.C. G.P.A.) is larger in magnitude for L.A.C.C. fall entrants (-.39) than the corresponding statewide community college average (-.37) for the first time in seventeen years. Corresponding figures for 1973-1974 were L.A.C.C. (-.20) and statewide (-.31).
- (4) 90% of the L.A.C.C. transfers attended UCLA with the remainder going to the other branches of the university.
- (5) 53% of the transfers were male. Male G.P.A. at the university was higher than female G.P.A. for the "eligibles" while female G.P.A. was higher than male for the "ineligibles" and for the combined total number of entrants.
- (6) Of those students from L.A.C.C. attending UCLA, 83% chose a major in the College of Letters and Science, 10% in Fine Arts, and 7% in Engineering. Those in Fine Arts earned the highest G.P.A. The number of Letters and Science enrollees decreased from 182 in 1973-1974 to 155 in 1974-1975 while the number of Fine Arts enrollees dropped from 21 in 1973-1974 to 19 in 1974-1975.
- (7) 52% of the grades earned at UCLA were A's and B's, while only 14% were D's and F's.
- (8) Comparison of grades earned in various departments at UCLA by L.A.C.C. transfers reveals highest G.P.A. in Dance, German, and Theatre Arts. Lowest G.P.A.'s were in Economics, Biology, and Chemistry.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS (continued)

- (9) Largest enrollments were in Sociology, Psychology, and History.
- (10) Comparison of male and female performance by G.P.A. suggests that males performed better in Kinesiology while females performed better in Art, French, Music, Philosophy, and Geography.

PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

To assess academic performance of recent Los Angeles City College transfers to California State University at Los Angeles, and to compare with past performance.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

Grade reports for transfers from L.A.C.C. are received periodically from the Office of School Relations of California State University at Los Angeles. Each grade report indicates, in addition to courses taken and grades earned, the class and major of the student. The report also indicate "transfer totals," i.e., units carried and grade points attempted at colleges prior to entering State University. For the purposes of this study, these figures are assumed to represent L.A.C.C. performance. A previous study indicated that this procedure would be reasonably reliable. The findings indicated in the next section of this study are based on information obtained from the State University grade reports for the academic year 1975-76.

FINDINGS

Table 1 indicates the number of grade reports received for each of the three-quarters of the 1975-76 year, plus the summer quarter of 1976.

713 students entered CSULA as transfers from L.A.C.C. during the four quarters indicated. 51% of these entered in September, 14% in January, 22% in April, 14% in the Summer. Of the 713, 116 (16%) failed to complete any work at CSULA during their first quarter. 57% of these withdrawals were without penalty.

Table 2 summarizes the first quarter academic performance of the 597 students completing some work during their first quarter.

Table 3 analyzes performance according to School or Division of major. Table 4 indicates distribution of grades earned (in student's first quarter) in each department at CSULA by the 597 transfers. Table 5 shows, in order of grade point average, the grade point averages earned in departments enrolling 15 or more students. Table 6 and Figure 1 present available data for previous semesters.



## SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

This study summarizes performance of L.A.C.C. transfers to CSULA during the 1975-76 year. Findings were based on first quarter grade reports for 713 students entering in Fall, 1975, Winter 1976, Spring 1976, and Summer 1976.

597 (84%) of the 713 entrants completed some work. Of the 597, 52% entered in the Fall quarter, 13% in Winter, 22% in Spring, and 13% in Summer.

First quarter grade point average earned by the 597 entrants was 2.51, 0.06 grade points below their junior college average of 2.57. 36% of the students earned a "B" average or better at CSULA, while 20% fell below a "C" average.

33% of the entrants selected a major in the School of Letters and Science, 24% in Business and Economics, 29% in Fine Arts, 3% in Engineering, with 11% Undecided. Students in Engineering earned the highest GPA at CSULA (2.76); students in Business had the most difficulty, earning a GPA of 2.30.

A total of 1,537 grades were earned by the 597 transfers in 44 different departments. 52% of these grades were A's or B's, 13% D's or F's. Highest averages (3.0 or higher) were earned in courses in Spanish, Chicano Studies, Art, Music, and Physical Education. Departments offering the most difficulty (averages below 2.0) were Economics, Physics and Chemistry.

Over the 19 year period since 1957, the GPA earned by new LACC transfers to CSULA has ranged from 2.36 to 2.60, with the differential between CSULA and LACC GPA's ranging from -0.13 to +0.21. LACC transfers to CSULA continue to experience little, if any, "transfer shock."
