The handbook concludes with two evaluation forms which may assist teachers in selecting materials on the basis of their cross-cultural value and for purposes of general assessments. (ND)

Preface

Recent assessments of precollegiate education in the United States have signalled the need for greater attention to the complexity and diversity of world cultures. Nowhere is this need for cultural awareness more evident than in the study of Latin America at the elementary and accordary school levels. Despite a long and eventful history of U.S. Latin American relations, perceptions of Latin America by U.S. students remain disappointingly superficial and, in many cases, maccurate, It is likely that relations between the United States and Latin America will increase in importance in the years to come and tew would disagree with the argument that American students must acquire some familiarity with other regions of the world, especially regions as configuous and important as Latin America. Although an increasing number of teachers are introducing units on Latin America into their school programs, the results have not been encouraging. A recent survey in the Los Angeles area, where the study of Latin America is an established part of the curriculum in primary and secondary schools, indicated uniformly low scores on test items related to geography, socioeconomic organization, and culture. Despite the fact that geography is the tocus for introducing Latin America, only 27 percent of the subjects knew where Latin America was located and only 30 percent could pick out France as not being a Latin American country (30 per cent also selected Mexico as not being a Latin American country). Of additional interest was the fact that the low scores cut across all ethnic groups surveyed: black. Chicano, Anglo, and Asian-American. Many reasons can of course be cited to explain the low scores including poor teacher preparation, an already overcrowded curriculum, and a variety of other problems generally associated with public education in the United States. Many teachers, however, samply voiced the often heard concern that they were not aware of the extent and sources of instructional materials for teaching Latin America and, turther, that resource bibliographies were unavailable

Thus the decision was made to identify as thoroughly as presable existing instructional materials value i may serve to augment or replace materials already in use by teachers. To this end the LASCD with in cooperation with the Carricultum Inquiry Center of the Caradoute School of Education embarked on a joint program to survey and identify existing instructional materials produced during the past tive years. In some cases earlier publications are also listed because of their importance or unique nature.

The attempt was made to be as inclusive as possible with regard to both grade level and type of instructional material. Educational publishing information on tile at the Curriculum Inquiry Center was extensively surveyed for materials which directly related to the study of Latin America at the precollegiate level. Those materials selected were arranged by grade level appropriateness, region of Latin America included in the unit, and instructional format. It a brief description of the unit was included in the publisher's statement then it also appears in the bibliography. It is important to stress the fact that it was not possible to evaluate the numerous items listed. Many of those examined revealed stepeotypical approaches and or ethnocentric attitudes. An extensive evaluation was carried out on several educational kits currently in use in California and the results were not encouraging. Most materials were heavily oriented toward geography, ignoring concepts related to culture, society, and environment-ecology. The emphasis in the materials evaluated was primarily cognitive with little attempt to promote instructional strategies aimed at the affective domain. Other problems included inadequate teacher manuals and programmatic deficiencies related to cross-cultural instructional strategies. Two model evaluation forms

Latries followed by an alterist have been examined and annotated by the LASCID staff.

A police designation in an entry refers to the price listed in the publisher's catalogue and should be considered changeable.

Some entries do not include dates of publication. They either were not listed or could not be found in other reference sources. In general it would be fair to assume that the undated materials were published within the time period 4009-1975.

Both publishers and distributors are included in the entries. If publisher information was not available, then the distributor was listed. Addresses for both publishers and distributors appear in the appendix.

It the publisher or distributor does not appear in the index it is suggested that the user attempt to locate the materials through the nearest educational materials resource center.

Instructional materials, especially books, listed in chapter Five, Grade Ten to Twelve, often are suitable for both teachers and students. Many of the books are standard introductions to the subject matter and would serve as excellent teacher preparation texts as well as stimulating reading for the advanced upper-secondary student.

Preface

Recept assessments of precollegiate education in the United States have signaffed the need for greater attention to the complexity and diversity of world cultures. Nowhere is this need for cultural awareness more evident than in the study of Latin America at the elementary and acondary school levels. Despite a long and eventful history of U.S. Latin American relations, perceptions of Latin America by U.S. students remain disappointingly superficial and, in many cases inaccurate. It is likely that relations between the United States and Latin America will increase in importance in the years to come and few would disagree with the argument that American students must acquire some familiarity with other regions of the world especially regions as contiguous and important as fatin America. Although an increasing number of teachers are introducing units on Latin America into their school programs, the results have not been encouraging. A recent survey in the Los Angeles area, where the study of Latin America is an established part of the curriculum in primary and secondary schools, indicated uniformly low scores on test items related to geography, socioeconomic organization, and culture. Despite the fact that geography is the tocus for introducing Latin America, only 27 percent of the subjects knew where Latin America was located and only 30 percent could pick out France as not being . Latin American country (30 per cent also selected Mexico as not being a Latin American country). Of additional interest was the fact that the low scores cut across all ethnic groups surveyed: black, Chicano, Anglo, and Asian-American Many reasons can of course be cited to explain the low scores including poor teacher preparation, an already overcrowded curricrdum, and a variety of other problems generally associated with public education in the United States, Many teachers, however, supply voiced the often heard concern that they were not aware of the extent and sources of instructional materials for teaching Latin America and, turther, that resource bibliographies were unavailable

The LASCD project has been a major activity of the Latin American Center at the University of California. Los Angeles for the part 1850 years. It is a long-term project to design and implement in 20% from all materials for teaching Latin. America at the precollegiate level beyond studies were conducted to determine the needs and peroprions of teachers, students, and parents with a gord to Latin Assertea as a curricular component. Although it becan e clear that a definite need existed for new and innovative instructional materials. it was also recognized that curriculum development in a long term procedure. Thus the decision was made to identify as theroughly as possibile existing instructional materials which may serve to augment or replace materials already in use by teachers. To this end the LASSID staff in cooperation with the Curriculum Inquiry Center of the Cataduate School of Education embarked on a joint program to survey and identify existing instructional materials produced during the past tive years. In some cases earlier publications are also listed because of their importance or unique nature

The attempt was made to be as inclusive as possible with regard to both grade level and type of instructional material. Educational publishing information on file at the Curriculum Inquiry Center was extensively surveyed for materials which directly related to the study of Latin America at the precollegiate level. Those materials selected were arranged by grade level appropriateness, region of Latin America included in the unit, and instructional format. It a brief description of the unit was included in the publisher's statement then it also appears in the bibliography. It is important to stress the fact that it was not possible to evaluate the numerous items listed. Many of those examined revealed stereotypical approaches and or ethnocentric attitudes. An extensive evaluation was carried out on several educational kits currently in use in California and the results were not encouraging. Most materials were heavily oriented toward geography, ignoring concepts related to culture, society, and envir onment-ecology. The emphasis in the materials evaluated was primarily cognitive with little attempt to promote instructional strategies aimed at the affective domain. Other problems included inadequate teacher manuals and programmatic deficiencies related to cross-cultural instructional strategies. Two model evaluation forms

The Materials Assessment Sheet will allow the open to perm tome indyments as to the quality of the cross-cultural content of the materials. Users are urged first to attempt to receive materials on an approval basis and their to apply some evaluation and clinics before purchasing. Some students at the upper secondary level may be able to work with more advanced materials usually required at the college level. These materials have not been listed in this bribhographies which are oriented to the college level. Several of these are listed in the Appendix.

The LVS-D Project will be in the process of developing three instructional modules for teaching Latin America in the middle 15 he passed over and well continue to destribute materials as they become as idable. We hope meets of the bibliography will camera come a with the Project and through an extended exchange of ideas and information contribute to the improvement of Latin American studies in the schools.


