ABSTRACT

This handbook is an annotated bibliography of 633 instructional materials for teaching about Russia and East Europe. Existing materials are identified that can be used by precollegiate teachers of all subject areas. The handbook is arranged by grade levels--preschool and kindergarten, elementary, junior high school, junior and senior high school, senior high school, advanced and nongraded. Within each section, materials are divided by the two regions and listed alphabetically according to their instructional formats. Types of materials include films, books, records and tapes, filmstrips and slides, maps and transparencies, posters and pictures, and multimedia. Entries contain title, date, description, price, and publisher. Some annotations provide an evaluation of the material's cross-cultural instructional value. A list of publishers and distributors is included for ordering materials. The handbook concludes with two model evaluation forms which may assist teachers in selecting materials on the basis of their cross-cultural value and for purposes of general assessments. (ND)

Preface

Recent studies of precollegiate education in the United State have revealed a serious lack of attention to the diversity and complexity of cultures both within this country and throughout the world. Although American educators have for years seen fit to "compete" with the Soviet Union through science and mathematics, there has been a general failure to regard that nation as other than our global counterpart in a struggle for power. In a similar way disregard and ignorance of the Eastern European nations — their cultures, political and social systems, and economic conditions — has been and remains a contemporary fact in American education.

There are many pragmatic reasons why these conditions must be alleviated. Not the least of these is the necessity to understand the history and cultures of the nation which will play so large a part in shaping the world in which today's precollegiate student will participate. Stereotypical attitudes regarding "Russians" are prevalent at all levels of the American school system and they are influenced and sustained by the dearth of culturally sensitive instructional materials available to teachers.

It is also important to note that the countries of Eastern Europe, although they form a historically, culturally, and economically contiguous whole, are more than simply an appendage of the Soviet Union. Knowledge of these nations is lacking on the part of American students despite the significant fact that Eastern European immigrants comprise a crucial segment of American society.

There is little question of the necessity of upgrading the study of Russia and Eastern Europe in American schools.

To this end the Center for Russian and East European Studies at the University of California, Los Angeles, in conjunction with the Curriculum Inquiry Center of the Graduate School of Education, has embarked upon a long-term project to acquire, evaluate, disseminate and eventually develop instructional materials for teaching about Russia and Eastern Europe. This handbook is the result of the first stage of that project and is in response to the fact that many teachers have voiced concern over the lack as well as the quality of instructional material available for Russian and East European studies. While the ultimate goal of the project is to develop materials, it is recognized that curriculum development is a long and complicated process. Thus the decision was made to identify as thoroughly as possible existing teaching material which may serve to replace or augment that currently in use.

The attempt was made to be as inclusive as possible with regard to both grade level and type of material. An extensive survey of publishing information available at the Curriculum Inquiry Center of the Graduate School of Education as well as other sources was made. Those materials selected were arranged by grade level appropriateness, region, and instructional format.

It is important to stress the fact that it was not possible to evaluate the numerous items listed. Of those that were examined, most materials ignored concepts of culture and society in favor of geography. In addition, primary emphasis in the materials tended to be cognitive rather than focusing on the promotion of instructional strategies designed to have impact on the affective domain. Two model evaluation forms have been appended which may prove helpful to the teacher in the task of assessing the materials listed in this handbook. Teachers are urged to attempt to receive materials on an approval basis and then to apply evaluation guidelines before purchasing.

Financial support for this project has been through the National Defense Education Act, Title VI grant to the Center for Russian and East European Studies. The Center wishes to thank those who were instrumental in compiling the bibliography and in preparing this handbook. Staff members who have been closely involved in the project include Michael Graham, Jonathan Friedlander, Joseph Kanarek, and Grace Fielder.
