ABSTRACT

This handbook is an annotated bibliography of 1,586 instructional materials for teaching about Asia. Existing materials are identified that can be used by precollegiate teachers of all subject areas. The handbook is arranged by grade levels--preschool to grade 3, grades 4-6, junior high, senior high, and ungraded. Within each section, materials are divided by geographic region and listed alphabetically according to their instructional formats. The region divisions include East Asia, South Asia, Southeast Asia, and Pacific Islands. Types of materials include multimedia, books, films, filmstrips, slides, maps and transparencies, records and tapes, and posters and study prints. Bibliographies, miscellaneous resources, and selected journals are listed separately. Entries contain title, date, description, price, and publisher. Some annotations provide an evaluation of the material's cross-cultural instructional value. A list of publishers and distributors is included for ordering materials. The handbook concludes with two model evaluation forms which may assist teachers in selecting materials on the basis of their cross-cultural value and for purposes of general assessment.

Introduction

More than 50 years ago historian Charles Beard noted with dismay the absence of global content for the study of American history at the primary and secondary levels. His statement of "How inadequate is such a treatment of our past!" has since been echoed many times.¹ A whole range of individual and institutional efforts have been made since Beard deplored the state of international content at the precollegiate level. All of these efforts have in one way or another been concerned with instilling in the school curriculum " . . . the social experiences and the learning processes through which individuals acquire and change their images of the world perceived as a totality and their orientation toward particular components of the world system".² Proponents of internationalizing the precollegiate curriculum have differed in their justifications of such efforts, and indeed the movement has not proceeded uninterrupted. What has emerged, however, is a recognizable stream of past and present attempts to broaden the social science curriculum at the precollegiate level in an effort to confront the realities of what has become an increasingly interdependent world. A brief glance at past efforts indicates that the growth of internationalized curriculum at the precollegiate level and that of world area studies at the collegiate level are closely related. In connection with international peace efforts and general concern over the negative effects of nationalism, the NEA as early as 1916 indicated the unfortunate lack of internationally related curricular materials at the elementary and secondary levels and urged the development of world knowledge and the concept of interdependence among nations.³ With the approach of WW II political pragmatism stimulated both public and private agencies to increase knowledge of the world, especially in those areas considered "critical" to American public and private interests. Latin America was the first region to receive attention. Training centers and funding became available for study at the collegiate level, inter-disciplinary research was planned, and the American Council of Learned Societies, National Research Council, and the Social Science Research Council set up a joint committee on Latin American Studies. Similar programs eventually developed for other world areas.⁴ During and immediately following the war a number of universities and other institutions assumed the responsibility of training military personnel in language and area studies (some 60 institutions). The University Contract System (1952), the International Cooperation Administration (1955) later renamed Agency for International Development (1961), the Peace Corps (1962), and NDEA VI (1958) all provided a base from which international study and information was pursued. This in turn triggered increased proposals for more international curricular content at the precollegiate level.⁵

Especially disheartening were the results of studies such as that conducted by Herbert Bruner during the decade 1930-1940 which found numerous examples of misinformation and stereotyping of non-Western populations in the curriculum at grades four through twelve.⁶ Apparently, what international content there was in the precollegiate curriculum at that time may have been having the negative effect of reinforcing existing stereotypical and ethnocentric attitudes and information. It would be safe to say that prior to WW II few efforts were made to revise the social science curriculum or in any other effective manner to provide for greater global understanding.⁷ Although massive changes were not forthcoming after the war, there was a discernible increase in interest and activity regarding

pre-collegiate curriculum revision, and teacher education around the theme of "global understanding." Reports by the Educational Policies Commission, the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development, the John Dewey Society, and other organizations all stressed the need to improve world understanding by increasing the international content of the curriculum at all pre-collegiate levels.¹¹ Interest increased in the early 1960s, when more materials began to appear with content organized around such concepts as culture, environment, and world understanding.

A major consideration in understanding the slow pace at which reform in these areas has taken place is, of course, with the perennial question of funding. Private foundations responded more quickly and generously than the government to the need to broaden international studies. The Rockefeller Foundation was perhaps the first major contributor (1934-1942), Carnegie followed in the period 1947-1951, and since 1952 the Ford Foundation has offered vital support to area and international studies at the collegiate and precollegiate levels. It was not until 1958 that governmental support of any significance accrued in the form of the National Defense Education Act, which, since that time, has been the mainstay of international "outreach" efforts. Other agencies such as the National Endowment for the Humanities have also been important sources of funding for curriculum development and other related projects.

Since the 1940s a variety of approaches and topics have characterized efforts to provide a more international flavor to the social sciences at the pre-collegiate level. During World War II, American schools were expected to fulfill the need for highly trained area specialists and linguistic experts. With the launching of Sputnik, the demand for excellence in the American educational system intensified. Widespread Federal assistance in the form of grants and subsidies to a variety of educational institutions and programs encouraged research and experimentation at all educational levels to achieve the stated goals of reform and innovation in public education. This effort included international studies.

As forces for social change gathered momentum and came to fruition throughout the decade of the 60s, the nation's school systems, particularly those in the urban areas, were settings for a wide variety of innovative attempts to change the school systems. Educators, too, were part of New Frontier and Great Society programs. The ferment resulted in some modifications of public school systems--legal, curricular, and organizational--though much remains to be accomplished. In curriculum, schools moved from a stress on the traditional and on formal indoctrination to emphasis on individual understanding and exploration of values and concepts. In philosophy, many schools have moved from a disciplinarian to a guidance approach in handling students. In orientation, schools have tended to replace emphasis on the past with a recognition of the need for teaching students the skills required for dealing with an uncertain future. These changes are reflected in what has been called the New Social Studies.

Broadly speaking, the New Social Studies emphasizes the application of the methodology of social scientists to the teaching of the social studies. In a variety of ways, students learn to observe, hypothesize, and test their hypotheses, which is to say they learn to apply the scientific method to the understanding of social phenomena. This is sometimes called an "inquiry approach".

These changes in methodology have been accompanied by a redefinition of the areas to be studied. In the study of other cultures, schools moved first from a traditional expository approach to what was called an "area approach", that is,

to studying specific regions of the world. Using the area approach, students often engaged in general over-definitions of such topics as geography, production, population, and customs. An enormous increase in cross-cultural, interculturally-oriented instructional materials appeared. The interested teacher is now able to find units on virtually every major and minor culture in the world and in almost any format. The problem has been not that there are too few materials, but that there are many of uncertain quality. Too often the new materials were overlaid with a North American cultural outlook and led to fragmentation and to an emphasis on curious customs, but not to an understanding of other cultures or to an appreciation of their integrity, diversity, and variety. This situation has necessitated a move in the direction of evaluation of materials and methods of presentation.

As education became a tool for effecting social change, another curricular orientation occurred: the study of specific disciplines such as history and economics became part of a much broader study, social education, which involved intellectual, social, and personal education. Intellectual education has as a goal teaching the use of analytic ideas and problem-solving tools developed by scholars in the social sciences in order to identify and solve social problems. Social education assumes that the content and procedures involved in the social studies can prepare a child to participate effectively in his society. Personal education stresses the idea that through exploration of culture, society, and the individual, a child can come to comprehend his experience and find meaning in it. The social sciences, then, are studied with the aim of understanding and guiding social behavior, not as ends in themselves.

As the 1970s began, it appeared that at least some form of consensus had emerged among educators and other professionals as to the importance and the potential role of increasing international content in the precollegiate curriculum.¹⁴ A variety of approaches had been pioneered in the '60s, materials were readily available and still being produced, and many schools formally offered courses or units containing cross-cultural content. Against this background of what appeared to be substantial progress, it was disappointing for many to note that the message still did not appear to be getting through to the children in the classroom. Studies conducted in a variety of regions in the United States (Colorado, Los Angeles, Ohio, New Jersey to name but a few) indicated continued ignorance, misinformation, ethnocentrism, stereotyping and other obstacles to world understanding.¹⁵

Curriculum development and reform efforts in the area of Asian Studies have perhaps been the most prolific of all world areas. The long standing interest and activities of the United States in Asia have prompted many educators to focus their writing and research on the development of instructional materials suitable for inclusion in the precollegiate curriculum. Unlike other areas where materials are in short supply, a variety of instructional modes and formats are available for those teachers interested in presenting units related to the study of the society, history and culture of various nation-states in the Asian region. As with other cross-cultural materials, recent assessments of Asian instructional materials reveal several problems. An evaluation of 306 texts by over 100 Asian scholars indicated that despite the recent proliferation of materials many of them continued to be viewing Asia from a Western orientation and evaluated by the values implied in that orientation. In most materials, Asian culture and tradition was juxtaposed with the Western experience of industrialization and usually came off second best. Other problems included historical distortion, factual inaccuracies,

and open-minded attitudes toward Asian life and culture. Although a variety of materials have been developed, a further problem has been the incorporation of these materials into the public school curriculum. Recent estimates are that at least 90% of students now in American high schools will graduate with little or no exposure to a culture other than their own. Statistics released in 1970-1975 indicate that only 1.5% of students in the 7th to the 12th grade were enrolled in either an Asian or African course. One major problem in this respect has been the training of teachers. Only about 8-10% of prospective teachers in the United States are ever exposed during the course of their study to instruction with an international focus.¹⁰

Thus, the UCLA Committee on Comparative and International Studies and the Committee on East Asia Studies have supported a program to address the issue of Asian Studies at the precollegiate level. A first step in this project has been to provide to the classroom teacher a comprehensive bibliography of currently available instructional materials for the study of Asia. Previous studies in the Los Angeles area indicated that many teachers felt motivated to offer units on Asia, but were not aware of the extent and sources of materials on the subject. The materials which are listed below may serve to augment or replace materials already in use by teachers.

The attempt has been made to be as inclusive as possible with regard to both grade level and type of instructional material. Educational publishing information on file at the Curriculum Inquiry Center in the Graduate School of Education at UCLA was extensively surveyed for materials directly related to the study of Asia at the precollegiate level. Those materials selected were arranged by grade level, appropriateness, region of Asia included in the unit, and instructional format. If a brief description of the unit was included in the publisher's statement then it also appears (in edited form) in the bibliography. It is important to stress the fact that it was not possible to evaluate the numerous items listed. (A very valuable evaluation report was compiled by The Asia Society.)¹¹ The second stage of the Asia project will be to build a collection of Asian instructional materials in the Curriculum Inquiry Center and begin a systematic evaluation in cooperation with the Graduate School of Education. Two model evaluation forms have been appended which may assist the teacher in the task of materials evaluation. The

Materials Assessment Sheet will allow the user to form some judgments as to the quality of the cross-cultural content of the materials. Users are encouraged first to attempt to receive the materials on an approval basis and then to apply some evaluation guidelines before purchasing. Some students at the upper secondary level may be able to work with more advanced materials usually required at the college level. These materials have not been listed in this bibliography, and the teacher is urged to consult additional bibliographies which are oriented to the college level. Several of these are listed in the Appendix.

Editor's Note

A price designation in an entry refers to the price listed in the publisher's catalogue and should be considered changeable.

Some entries do not include dates of publication. They either were not listed or could not be found in other reference sources. In general it would be fair to assume that the undated materials were published within the time period 1960-1975.

Both publishers and distributors are included in the entries. If publisher information was not available, then the distributor was listed. Addresses for both publishers and distributors appear in the appendix.

If the publisher or distributor does not appear in the index it is suggested that the user attempt to locate the materials through the nearest educational materials resource center.

Instructional materials, especially books, listed in chapter Four, Senior High, often are suitable for both teachers and students. Many of the books are standard textbooks or other adapted materials and would serve as excellent teacher preparation texts, as well as stimulating reading for the advanced upper-secondary student.
