AESTRACT

This report presents statistical data for all Illincis public and private two-year and four-year colleges and universities extracted from the Fall 1975 Space Survey completed by the Illinois Board of Higher Education. Summary data by institution and totals and weighted means for types of institutions are provided on building efficiency (net assignable square feet compared to gross square feet), average weekly usage for classrooms and laboratories, distribution of space by type of room, and net assignable square footage per on-campus FTE (full-time equivalent) student. The data show that college buildings within the public community college system had a relatively high ratio of usable space to gross space when compared to other types of institutions. Although the public community colleges did not rank first among other institutions on measures of day utilization, when evening utilization rates were combined with day utilization rates the public community colleges ranked first in average weekly room hours of utilization for classrcoms (30.5 hours) and laboratories (26.9 hours), and student station utilization rate for classrooms (27.1%) and laboratories (23.8%). Analysis of net assignable square feet (NASF) shows that the community colleges had 11.0 NASF for classroom space and 17.3 NASF for laboratory space per cn-campus student FTE. (JDS)

LCCB SUMMARY REVIEW OF THE IBHE FALL 1975 SPACE SURVEY

Introduction

This report is a brief review of the Fall 1975 Space Survey completed by the Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE) as it pertains to the public community colleges. This space survey is conducted by the IBHE every other year and includes all institutions of higher education both public and private. All institutions completed the space survey using the same definitions and utilization was calculated on the same basis for six types of institutions (public universities, medical schools, public community colleges, private senior universities, private senior colleges, and private junior colleges).

The ICCB Management Information System (MIS) produced the space survey data for twenty-six public community colleges that were able to have their course enrollment data and facility inventory data completed in time for this purpose. Some community colleges did not participate in the study. In all, forty-three public community colleges participated in the IBHE Space Survey, with seventeen submitting data directly to IBHE.

The IBHE Space Survey Report provides statistical data on the amount of space (usable and total) by type of space for each institution participating in the study. The data was separated for residential (dormitory) and non-residential facilities. Only the non-residential data is analyzed for the community colleges in this ICCB summary report since Lewis and Clark Community College is the only public community college to report residential space.

This summary includes data on (1) comparison of GSF and NASF or building efficiency, (2) average weekly room usage for classrooms and laboratories, (3) station or seat utilization for classrooms and laboratories, (4) distribution of space by type of room, and (5) NASF per on-campus student FTE.

Highlights

- i. The buildings in the public community colleges of Illinois had a relatively bigh ratio of usable space (net assignable square feet (NASF) to gross space when compared to other institutions. The 68.1 percent ratio for the public community colleges was the second best of any other type of institution.
- 2. The public community colleges ranked first among all institutions in average meekly room hours of utilization for classrooms during day and evening with 30.5 hours. They were third on this measure during the day with 20.2 hours.
- 3. The public community colleges ranked first among all institutions in average weekly room hours of utilization for class laboratories during day and evening with 26.9 hours.
- 1. The classroom student station utilization during day and evenings in the public community colleges of Illinois was higher than at all other institutions with a 27.1% utilization rate. The public universities did have a higher rate of utilization during the day (33.6%) than did the community colleges (27.9%), however, the community colleges had by far the highest utilization during evening hours.
- 5. The class laboratory student station utilization at the community colleges during day and evening hours combined was also higher than at all other institutions with a 23.8% utilization rate. Again, the public universities had a slightly higher utilization rate during day hours but the community colleges had by far the highest utilization rate during evening hours.
- 6. The analysis of on-campus student FTE per Net Assignable Square Foot (NASF) by room use showed that the community had an average of 11.0 NASF of class-room space per FTE and 17.3 NASF of class laboratory space per FTE.



Summary of NASF and GSF for On-Campus Facilities with Efficiency Percentage

The first basic analysis (IBHE Table Al) attached was a comparison of the Net Assignable Square Feet (NASF) to Gross Square Feet (GSF) for each college. This measure shows the proportion of <u>usable</u> space (NASF) which can be used for instruction and administration compared to the total square footage within the building and indicates the "efficiency" of the building. NASF includes classrooms, laboratories, libraries, offices, gymnasiums, student centers, auditoriums, storage, and other space usable for the basic functions of the colleges. NASF does <u>not</u> include stairways, corridors, circulation area, custodial, mechanical and structural space.

The public community colleges ranked relatively high in this area with an average efficiency factor of 68.1%. This was surpassed only by the private senior colleges who had an efficiency ratio of 73.0%.

The current ICCB procedure (#38.24) requires that the campus-wide net-to-gross ratio (or building efficiency) shall be 70% unless special waiver is approved by the ICCB, IBHE, and CDB. Individual projects may vary above and below 70% according to type of space being built. However, many community colleges still have a campus-wide ratio below 70% and the statewide average is still below 70%.

The chart below shows a comparison of the various types of institutions on this measure. The detailed information for all institutions is reportuced from the IBME survey and is shown on the next two pages.

Average Weekly Room Usage

An important measure of space utilization is the number of hours per week that each room is used. The IBME Space Survey defined "Day" room usage to be between the hours of 7:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. on Monday through Friday (50 hours per week) and accounted for these hours in the study. Evening usage was defined as the hours of 5:00 P.M. through 10:00 P.M., Monday through Friday (25 hours per week), although classes are seldom held on Friday evenings. Hence, a total of 75 hours per week were used in the survey as a basis for alculating weekly room usage.

Although the community colleges did not have the highest day room usage, they did have the highest evening room usage for both classrooms and class laboratories. The charts below show that the public community colleges compared relatively well with all other institutions on this measure of utilization. The tables on the next two pages were reproduced from the IBHE Survey and show the detailed information for each public community college. However, the amount of room usage for both classrooms and laboratories is fairly low for all institutions as the IBHE data appears to indicate that there is alot of unused space during the week. Many times, a laboratory is designed for special purposes and cannot be fully used 75 hours per week. Nevertheless, classrooms can be assigned normally for general use. Therefore, it is of some concern that classrooms are used less than 50% of the time:

Station (Seat) Utilization

Another important measure of space utilization is the station utilization percentage. A student station is defined to be a chair, a laboratory station, a desk, or some other facility necessary to accommodate one student during the instructional period. This measure provides information on the usage of each student station within a room per week. For example, although a room may be used, if it is only half occupied, the station utilization for that period would be 50%.

Again, the public community colleges scored relatively high on this measure of utilization when compared to other institutions. Although the public senior universities had higher station utilization during the day, the community colleges had the highest utilization in the evenings and for day and evening combined.

The charts below show a comparison of station utilization rates of the various institutions in Illinois. The next two tables show the detailed information for each of the public community colleges which were reproduced from the IBHE Space Survey.

The IBHE Space Survey also shows a distribution of nonresidential Net Assignable Square Feet (NASF) by room use type. Nonresidential includes all campus space but residence halls (dormitories). The basic room types are classrooms, class laboratories, offices and study areas. This report shows the laboratories subdivided into four special types. Special use facilities include armories, athletic facilities, greenhouses, and clinics. General use facilities include assemblies, lounges, and recreation rooms; and support facilities include computer rooms, shops, garages, and storage areas. Below is a chart which shows the number and percent of total NASF utilized in each room type for all the public community colleges. The table on the next two pages shows the detailed information for each public community college.

NASF Per On-Campus Student FTE

A measure of available space on campus per student which is commonly used as a criteria for space allocation is the Net Assignable Square Feet per On-Campus FTE student. 
