ABSTRACT

This report examines selected characteristics of regular credit (classified and unclassified) students in the Hawaii community colleges in spring 1977. Data for this report were derived from student applications, personal history forms, and student class registrations. Analysis of the data revealed: (1) regular students (20,625) comprised 71% of the total registrations (28,858) in community college programs; (2) spring 1977 enrollment of regular students was 1% less than in fall 1976; (3) males (57%) outnumbered females (43%), consistent with the pattern of previous semesters; (4) mean age of students was 25.5 years, compared to 24.7 years in fall 1976 and 26.0 in spring 1976; (5) the modal age group was the 18-19 year-old category; (6) 47% of the students were enrolled in the liberal arts program while 44% were enrolled in the vocational program; (7) average semester hours taken was 10.5 compared to 10.8 in the previous fall, and constituted the lowest average in three years; (8) 45% of the students were part-time, compared to 42% in the previous two semesters; and (9) 73% were continuing students and 13% were new students. Tabular and graphic data pertaining to student characteristics and enrollment are attached, including comparative data for the six semesters fall 1974 through spring 1977. (JDS)

Enrollment data and data on student characteristics are important indicators of the "clientele" served by the community college. These are shown by current statistics in the main section and historical tables in the appendix.

Although the emphasis of this report is on the regular students, registration figures on special students (early admits, concurrent, apprentice/journeymen and other special), Hoomana and Manpower Training Program are also cited.

Sources of Data

Except for Table I, the information cited in this report was extracted from the Student Enrollment Reports (SER) as of February 28, 1977. The basic data are derived from student applications, personal history forms and student class registrations.

Highlights

- 1. Total Registrations (Table I): Regular students (20,625) comprise 71% of the total registrations (28,858) in community college programs. Seventy-eight percent of all concurrent registrants (232 of 296) are enrolled at Hawaii Community College. Early admits number 321 compared to 274 during fall 1976; 109 (34%) are enrolled at Leeward Community College.
- 2. Regular Students (Tables II, III, Figure 1): The spring 1977 enrollment (20,625) is 1% less than fall 1976 (20,879) and 3% greater than spring 1976 (20,086). As shown in figure 1, the rate of growth is small for both the spring 1977 and fall 1976 semesters.

Sex: Males (57%) continue to outnumber females (43%).

Mean Age: 25.5 years old compared to 24.7 in fall 1976 and 26.0 in spring 1976.

Age Distribution: As in previous semesters, the modal group is the 18-19 age category. There are 156 students in the 60 years and over category, 15 fewer than in fall 1976. Most of them are enrolled at Honolulu (58) and Maui (35).

<u>Distribution By Program:</u> More students are enrolled in the liberal arts program (47%) than in vocational programs (44%). These percentages are similar to those reported during the past several semesters.

- Semester Hours Taken: Students are taking fewer semester hours on the average: 10.5 compared to 10.8 in the fall. This average is the lowest in three years. The range by campus is from 9.1 to 12.2.
- Full-Time and Part-Time Status: Proportionately more students are part-timers (45%) this semester compared to the previous fall and spring semesters (42%). The range by campus is from 30% to 57%.
- Student Status: Continuing students 73% and new students 13%. (Last spring, continuing students 76% and new, 12%.)
- Transfer Students: There are 1,125 transfer students from within the
 University of Hawaii system: 477 students transferred from the
 Manoa Campus (including CCECS); 56, from Hilo College; and 592
 from within the Community College System.

Summary

The enrollment in the community colleges has shown a modest increase compared to last spring. This pattern of slow growth is not unique to Hawaii but is a national trend. A recent article in the Higher Education Dailyl points out that "...enrollment in the nation's two-year colleges gained by only 0.4 percent this year..." The study further points to the return of students to the job market and the expiration of GI benefits as reasons for the enrollment slowdown.

Students are continuing to take fewer credits as reflected in the decrease in the average semester hour and the increase in the number of part-time students.

What are the implications for planning curricula, physical facilities and student services?

FALL 1972 - SPRING 1977


