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ABSTRACT

As part of a continuing study of student flow in the seven Hawaii community colleges, this study examined the number and characteristics of fall 1975 entering students who did not enroll at their campus of entry (non-enrolled) in fall 1976, but who registered at one of the other community colleges. Of the total fall 1975 entering students (8,979), 81 had graduated by fall 1976 and 4,308 or 48% were enrolled at their campus of entry. Out of the 4,565 non-enrolled students, 324 or 4% of the entering group were enrolled at another community college. Of these students, 42% had credit-completion ratios of less than .50, 56% were males, 56% had fewer than 12 cumulative credits, 40% had grade point averages below 2.0, and 41% kept the same major field of study at their new college as they had at their college of entry. Significant differences between the 324 registrants and the total population of non-enrolled students were found on six characteristics: entry status, full- or part-time status, program, grade point average, credit-completion ratio, and cumulative credits earned. Data are reported by campus and for the community college total. (JDS)

A. Introduction

Report No. 20 of the Student Flow Project dealt with Fall 1975 entering students who did not enroll at their campus of entry (non-enrolled) in Spring 1976 but who registered at other community colleges. This report presents similar data for non-enrolled students in Fall 1976.

As indicated in the earlier report, we hope to find out, by campus of entry, the number and characteristics of non-enrolled students who register at another public community college. The characteristics studied were: sex, entry status, full-/part-time status, program, grade point average, credit-completion ratio and cumulative credits earned. We used the Statistical Program for the Social Sciences (SPSS) in our analysis of the characteristics of:

- a. non-enrolled students who register at another community college and those who do not, by campus of entry
- b. registered students, by current campus.

Several types of findings are summarized in this report: (1) differences between registrants and non-registrants among non-enrolled students in Fall 1976; (2) characteristics of students who leave a particular community college to transfer to another; (3) characteristics of students who transfer to a particular community college. These findings are presented for the community college total and for each college.

Some detailed tables for the community college total are included in the Appendix. Although campus details are not presented in this report, they will be sent to the Dean of Students on each campus.

B. Findings: Community College Total

There were 4,565 non-enrolled students in Fall 1976, and 324 or 7 percent of these students registered at another community college.

1. Registrants and Non-Registrants

There were statistically significant differences between registrants and non-registrants on six out of seven characteristics: entry status, full-/part-time status, program, grade point average, credit-completion ratio and cumulative credits earned. The 7 percent rate of registration at another college was exceeded by the following groups, as shown in Appendix A:

- 8% new students
- 10% full-time students
- 9% liberal arts and technology majors; 8%, hotel/food services
- 10% students with grade point averages of 2.0-2.9
- 30% students with credit-completion ratios of .90-.99; 13%, .80-.89; 12%, .70-.79; 10%, .50-.59; 9%, .60-.69.
- 10% students who had accumulated 12-24 college credits; 8%, 25-36 credits

Campus data on registrants and non-registrants (Table 1) indicate that there was a range in registration rates: from 2 percent at Kauai Community College to 10 percent at Windward. Registration rates for students on the Neighbor Islands were below those of Oahu's colleges, except for Hawaii's rate which was similar to Leeward's.

2. Registrants, by Current Campus

Data on the 324 registrants are presented in Table 2 which shows that:

- a. Most of these registrants were enrolled at Honolulu (109) and Kapiolani (102).
- b. More registrants transferred into than out of the following colleges: Honolulu, Kapiolani, Kauai and Maui.

There were significant differences among the current campuses, by previous major and credit-completion ratio of registrants, as shown by data in Appendix B:

a. Previous major

- (1) Most of the registrants majored in liberal arts (195), and many enrolled at Honolulu (80) and Kapiolani (67).
- (2) Of the 47 who majored in business, 14 went to Honolulu and 13 to Kapiolani.
- (3) Of the 45 who majored in technology, 16 went to Kapiolani.

b. Credit-Completion Ratio

- (1) Although a majority of registrants had credit-completion ratios above .50, 42 percent did not.
- (2) Of the 103 registrants with CCRs of .90-1.00, 37 went to Kapiolani and 31 to Honolulu.
- (3) Of the 85 with CCRs of .50-.89, 27 went to Kapiolani and 26 to Honolulu.
- (4) Of the 136 with CCRs below .50, 52 went to Honolulu and 38 to Kapiolani.

3. Registrants, by Current Major Fields of Study

Among the 324 registrants at other community colleges, 133 (41 percent) kept the same major field of study. This was especially true of students who majored in liberal arts (95) and business (20) during the previous semester. The data in Table 3 show that:

- a. Liberal arts was the previous major of 195 students and the current major of 142: 95 kept the same major and 47 shifted to it in Fall 1976.
- b. Business was the previous major of 47 students and the current major of 53: 20 kept the same major and 33 shifted to it (24 were liberal arts majors previously).
- c. Technology was the previous major of 45 students and the current major of 74: 12 retained the same major and 62 shifted to it (49 were liberal arts majors previously).

4. Graduates

In addition to the 324 registrants, there were 2 non-enrolled students who registered at another community college and graduated at the end of Fall 1976. Both graduated from Leeward Community College, and both had changed majors: 1, from business to public services; 1, from technology to liberal arts.

C. Findings: Campus Highlights

1. Hawaii Community College

There were 348 non-enrolled students in Fall 1976, and 22 or 6 percent of these students registered at another community college. Since the number of students is small, statistical tests of significance are not included.

a. Registrants Lost

Data in Table 4 indicate that many of the 22 students who enrolled at other community colleges were characterized as follows:

- 20 were new students
- 21 were full-time students
- 11 were liberal arts majors
- 10 had grade point averages of 2.0-2.9
- 8 had credit-completion ratios of 1.00; 7, below .50
- 10 had cumulative credits of 12-24
- 8 enrolled at Kapiolani Community College

b. Registrants Gained

Hawaii Community College attracted 7 non-enrolled students from other community colleges, and data on their characteristics are found in Table 4. A majority were females, new students, full-time students. They also had grade point averages of 2.0-2.9 and credit-completion ratios of .80-.99.

2. Honolulu Community College

There were 870 non-enrolled students in Fall 1976, and 79 or 9 percent of these students registered at another public community college.

a. Registrants and Non-Registrants

There were statistically significant differences between registrants and non-registrants, by full-/part-time status, program, credit-completion ratio and cumulative credits. The 9 percent rate of registration at another community college was exceeded by the following groups:

- 13% full-time students
- 14% liberal arts majors; 11%, technology majors
- 26% students with CCRs of .80-.99; 21%, .60-.79; 10%, .50-.59
- 16% students with cumulative credits of 12-24; 11%, 25-36 credits.

b. Registrants Lost

There were no statistically significant differences among Honolulu students enrolled at other community colleges, by student characteristics.¹ However, dominant characteristics for the 79 registrants, shown in Table 5, are presented below:

- 59 are males
- 57 were new students
- 52 were full-time students
- 37 were liberal arts majors; 32, technology majors
- 30 had grade point averages below 2.0; 24, 2.0-2.9
- 30 had credit-completion ratios below .50; 27, 1.00
- 41 had cumulative credits below 12; 33, 12-24 credits
- 40 registered at Kapiolani; 22, Leeward

c. Registrants Gained

Honolulu Community College attracted 109 non-enrolled students from other community colleges, and data on their characteristics are found in Table 5. Dominant characteristics are given below:

- 73 are males
- 91 were new students
- 65 were full-time students
- 80 were liberal arts majors; 22 of them kept the same major
- 56 had grade point averages below 2.0; 26, 2.0-2.9
- 52 had credit-completion ratios below .50; 30, 1.00
- 73 had cumulative credits below 12
- 50 came from Kapiolani; 39 from Leeward

3. Kapiolani Community College

There were 1,005 non-enrolled students in Fall 1976, and 91 or 9 percent of these students registered at another public community college.

a. Registrants and Non-Registrants

There were statistically significant differences between registrants and non-registrants, by full-/part-time status, program and grade point average. The 9 percent rate of registration at another community college was exceeded by the following groups:

12% full-time students
14%, liberal arts majors; 10%, hotel/food services
11%, grade point average below 2.0; 10%, 2.0-2.9

b. Registrants Lost

There was a significant difference among students enrolled at different campuses, by program only: most liberal arts majors (32 out of 43) registered at Honolulu, and business majors (12 out of 31) went to Honolulu. Dominant characteristics of the 91 students who left Kapiolani to study at another community college, as shown in Table 6, are presented below:

55 are females
69 were new students
63 were full-time students
43 were liberal arts majors; 31, business majors
58 had grade point averages below 2.0
45 had credit-completion ratios below .50; 27, 1.00
55 had cumulative credits below 12
50 registered at Honolulu

c. Registrants Gained

Kapiolani Community College attracted 102 non-enrolled students from other community colleges, and data on their characteristics are found in Table 6. Dominant characteristics are given below:

73 were new students
68 were full-time students
67 were liberal arts majors; 35 of them kept the same major
42 had grade point averages of 2.0-2.9; 31, below 2.0
38 had credit-completion ratios of below .50; 35, 1.00
46 had cumulative credits below 12; 40, 12-24 credits
40 came from Honolulu; 32 from Leeward

4. Kauai Community College

There were 280 non-enrolled students in Fall 1976 and 5 of these students registered at another community college.

a. Registrants Lost

A majority of the registrants were males, new students, full-time students, liberal arts majors, and had grade point averages of 2.0-2.9 and cumulative credits of 12-24.

b. Registrants Gained

Kauai Community College attracted 15 non-enrolled students from other community colleges, and data on their characteristics are found in Table 7. Dominant characteristics are given below:

- 9 are males
- 11 were new students
- 11 were full-time students
- 5 were liberal arts majors; 4, technology majors
- 7 had grade point averages below 2.0; 6, 2.0-2.9
- 4 each had credit-completion ratios of 1.00 and below .50
- 7 had cumulative credits below 12; 6, 12-24 credits
- 7 came from Kapiolani; 4 from Hawaii

5. Leeward Community College

There were 1,269 non-enrolled students in Fall 1976, and 79 or 6 percent of these students registered at another public community college.

a. Registrants and Non-Registrants

There were no statistically significant differences between registrants and non-registrants, by student characteristics.

b. Registrants Lost

There was no significant difference among students enrolled at the different campuses.² Dominant characteristics of the 79 students who left Leeward to study at another community college, as shown in Table 8, are presented below:

- 51 are males
- 60 were new students
- 42 were full-time students
- 63 were liberal arts majors
- 31 had grade point averages of 2.0-2.9; 20, below 2.0
- 32 had credit-completion ratios of below .50; 23, 1.00
- 51 had cumulative credits below 12
- 39 registered at Honolulu; 32 at Kapiolani

c. Registrants Gained

Leeward Community College attracted 44 non-enrolled students from other community colleges, and data on their characteristics are found in Table 8. Dominant characteristics are given below:

- 25 are males
- 29 were new students
- 32 were full-time students
- 18 were liberal arts majors (15 of them kept the same major);
10, technology majors
- 17 had grade point averages below 2.0; 12, 2.0-2.9
- 18 had credit-completion ratios below .50; 13, 1.00
- 23 had cumulative credits below 12; 20, 12-24 credits
- 22 came from Honolulu; 14 from Kapiolani

6. Maui Community College

There were 458 non-enrolled students in Fall 1976, and 15 or 3 percent of these students registered at another public community college. Since the number of students is small, statistical tests of significance are not included.

a. Registrants Lost

Data in Table 9 indicate that many of the 15 students who enrolled at other community colleges were characterized as follows:

- 10 are males
- 11 were new students
- 11 were full-time students
- 7 were liberal arts majors; 6, technology majors
- 6 had grade point averages of 2.0-2.9; 5, below 2.0
- 5 had credit-completion ratios of .80-.99; 4, below .50
- 7 had cumulative credits below 12; 6, 12-24 credits
- 5 registered at Kapiolani; 4 at Honolulu

b. Registrants Gained

Maui Community College attracted 20 non-enrolled students from other community colleges, and data on their characteristics are found in Table 9. Dominant characteristics are given below:

- 12 are females
- 16 were new students
- 12 were full-time students
- 11 were liberal arts majors; all of them kept the same major
- 7 each had grade point averages below 2.0 and 2.0-2.9
- 11 had credit-completion ratios below .50
- 12 had cumulative credits below 12
- 8 came from Kapiolani; 4 each from Honolulu and Leeward

7. Windward Community College

There were 335 non-enrolled students in Fall 1976, and 33 or 10 percent of these students registered at another public community college. Since the number of students is small, statistical tests of significance are not included.

a. Registrants and Non-Registrants

The 10 percent rate of registration at another community college was exceeded by students with grade point averages of 2.0-2.9 (20 percent).

b. Registrants Lost

Data in Table 10 indicate that many of the 33 students who enrolled at other community colleges were characterized as follows:

- 21 are females
- 23 were new students
- 17 were part-time students
- 31 were liberal arts majors
- 11 had grade point averages of 2.0-2.9; 10, below 2.0
- 18 had credit-completion ratios below .50
- 19 had cumulative credits below 12
- 15 registered at Kapiolani; 12 at Honolulu

c. Registrants Gained

Windward Community College attracted 27 non-enrolled students from other community colleges, and data on their characteristics are found in Table 10. Dominant characteristics are given below:

- 14 are females
- 19 were new students
- 16 were full-time students
- 11 were liberal arts majors; 10 of them kept the same major
- 10 had grade point averages below 2.0; 8, 2.0-2.9
- 12 had credit-completion ratios below .50
- 16 had cumulative credits below 12
- 11 came from Honolulu; 10 from Kapiolani

D. Summary and Conclusion

Student Flow computer reports indicated that out of the Fall 1975 entering students (8,979), 81 (1 percent) had graduated by Fall 1976 and 4,308 or 48 percent were enrolled at their campus of entry. Out of the 4,565 non-enrolled students, 324 or 4 percent of the entering group were enrolled at other community colleges in the University of Hawaii system, making for a total of 52 percent still enrolled. These 324 students represent 7 percent of the non-enrolled students in Fall 1976.

1. Findings

Some of the major findings of this study are summarized below:

- a. There were significant differences between registrants and non-registrants on six out of seven characteristics (entry status, full-/part-time status, program, grade point average, credit-completion ratio and cumulative credits). This was also true for the Spring 1976 group except for entry status.
- b. There was also a range in registration rates, from 2 percent at Kauai to 10 percent at Windward Community College. Registration rates for Neighbor Island colleges were generally below those of Oahu's campuses.
- c. There was a range in the "attraction" rate, by campus. Out of the 324 registrants, 109 went to Honolulu and 102 went to Kapiolani. These two colleges also attracted the largest number of registrants in Spring 1976.
- d. Among the 324 registrants, the following represented the majority or plurality group:

Noteworthy are the numbers of students who registered at other community colleges with below 2.0 grade point averages, below .50 credit-completion ratios, and below 12 credits earned in the previous semesters. This observation was also true of the Spring 1976 registrants at other community colleges.

- e. Among the 324 registrants at other community colleges, 133 (41 percent) kept the same major field of study.³ This was especially true of liberal arts majors: 95 out of the 142 liberal arts majors in Fall 1976 had the same major in Spring 1976.

2. Concluding Comment

A number of inferences, identical to those for Spring 1976, might be drawn from our data regarding non-enrolled students who registered at another community college in Fall 1976. There were some registrants who, in addition to changing campuses, also changed their major field of study. There are others who had "limited" academic success (low grade point average and low credit-completion ratio) at their campus of entry who changed to another campus in Fall 1976.
