ABSTRACT

In its annual effort to determine rate and occupancy trends in the Mid-Atlantic region, MACUHO surveyed by questionnaire the chief housing officers on its mailing list and received 99 usable responses, compared with 65 the previous year. The average double room rate was reported to be \$691, compared with \$646 in 1975; the average board rate rose from \$681 to \$704. This year for the first time members were asked to report the occupancy rate for their residence halls. Average occupancy rates were 96.89 percent in men's residence halls and 96.26 percent in women's halls. Other items covered in the survey included room cleaning, frequency of cleaning, linen service, and meals per week. (Author/LBH)

RATE & COUPANCY SURVEY RESULTS

In its annual effort to determine rate and occupancy trends in the region, MACUHO Research & Information sent a short questionnaire to the chief housing officers on its mailing list. Response was as follows:

1. INSTITUTIONS:

Ninety-nine usable responses were received, compared with sixty-five last year. The increased sample size will tend to make our information more reliable. The breakdown of responses by state and type of institution is:

2. ROOM RATES:

Members were asked to state their basic annual (nine month) <u>double</u> room rate, or to quote an average rate if they have more than one. Where only a combined rate for room and board was reported, we have used one half of that amount as the room rate. The following table indicates the averages:

3a. ROOM CLEANING:

Members were asked whether their basic room charge includes the cleaning of student rooms other than annually. The majority of those responding stated that it did not. The following table indicates the number of schools which include other than annual cleaning.

note that with a larger N this year (99 as compared with 65) this numerical increase is actually a percentage decrease, ie 17 is 26% of 65; 22 is 22% of 99.
