ABSTRACT A series of tables and graphs comparing student enrollment and migration in 1968 and 1975 is presented. The report compares headcount enrollment for the two years at Vermont higher education institutions, public and private, by home state of students. It also compares enrollment of Vermonters in public and private institutions of other New England states for the two years. Also given are headcount enrollments of Vermont public and private colleges and those of the other New England states for the two years, showing percentage increases for each class of institution in each state and the increase of in-state students, New England students, and students from outside the region. This report presents a series of tables and graphs comparing student enrollment and migration in 1968 and 1975. It compares headcount enrollment for the two years at Vermont higher education institutions, public and private, by home state of students. It also compares enrollment of Vermonters in public and private institutions of other New England states for the two years. Also given are headcount enrollments of Vermont public and private colleges and those of the other New England states for the two years, showing percentage increases for each class of institution in each state and the increase of in-state students, New England students and students from outside the region.

Summary of Data

The migration pattern of New England residents seeking higher education and the pattern of students from other states seeking education within New England has changed significantly from 1968 to 1975. The number of Vermonters attending Vermont institutions of higher education has more than doubled since 1968 while the total enrollment in Vermont institutions has grown at a slower pace (72%). The proportion of Vermonters attending public institutions in Vermont has increased four percentage points since 1968, while the proportion of students from outside of New England attending Vermont's public institutions decreased four percentage points. Vermont students are enjoying a greater share of the higher education available in Vermont than they did in 1968.

The source for 1968 enrollment data is the Residence and Migration of College Students, Fall 1968 published by the National Center for Educational Statistics, 1969. Data for 1975 is contained in a recent report prepared by the New England Board of Higher Education, The Residence and Migration of Students in New England Institutions of Higher Education, Fall 1975. The Vermont institution enrollment data for 1968 used in Table 5. was compiled by the Institute for Educational Development and varies slightly from the NCES data for 1968.

Table 1. "Headcount of All Students by Home State Attending Vermont Institutions of Higher Education, 1968 and 1975". Between 1968 and 1975 Vermonters attending public Vermont schools has more than doubled (from 5,252 to 11,976) and Vermonters enrolled in private Vermont schools has a similar growth (from 1,508 to 2,746). Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Maine, and Pennsylvania have more than doubled the number of students they send to Vermont public institutions. The numbers of students from those states attending private Vermont institutions have increased less than 50% during the seven year period.

Table 2. "Headcount of Vermonters Attending Institutions of Higher Education by State of Attendance, 1968 and 1975". The number of Vermonters attending institutions in Massachusetts has increased only slightly (from 1,189 to 1,269); however, twice as many Vermonters are attending institutions in Rhode Island, Maine, and New Jersey in 1975 than did in 1968. By comparing the data in Table 1. with the data in Table 2. the net exchange of students between Vermont and the various states may be discerned. The 1975 NEBHE Residence and Migration report presents the net migration data in detail and with analysis.

Table 3. "Headcount Enrollment in New England Higher Education by State, 1968 and 1975". Between 1968 and 1975 the total enrollment in New England's public schools has increased 115%, private enrollment has increased 25%, and total enrollment has increased 59%. Vermont's enrollment has kept pace in the public sector (114%) and has a growth in the private sector (34%) well above the New England average (25%). Vermont's total enrollment has increased 72% between 1968 and 1975 which is similar to New Hampshire's growth (73%), but less than the growth of higher education in Maine and Rhode Island (96% and 92% respectively). Relative to the other New England states, the greatest public growth is in Maine (144%) and Massachusetts (135%) while their private growth is the smallest of the New England states, 18% and 20% growth respectively. Rhode Island has shown the greatest growth rate in private enrollments with a 78% increase.

Table 4. "Headcount Enrollment in Vermont Institutions of Higher Education by In-State/Out-of-State, 1968 and 1975". In both the public and private Vermont institutions resident enrollment has increased at a greater rate than the enrollment of out-of-state students in Vermont.

Table 5. "Headcount Enrollment by Residency, Vermont Institutions, 1968 and 1975". The in-state and out-of-state enrollment at each Vermont institution is given for 1968 and 1975. All public schools have grown to varying degrees, UVM increased from 5,789 to 10,487, while VTC increased from 441 to 644. Goddard, the School for International Training, and Southern Vermont College have each doubled their enrollment during the period, while enrollments at Vermont College, Windham, and Green Mountain College have decreased.

Graph: "Headcount Enrollment in New England Institutions of Higher Education by Residence, 1968 and 1975". Most noteworthy is the increase of public enrollment within New England. In 1968 private enrollments in New England exceeded public enrollments. However, in 1975 public enrollments exceeded private enrollments. The residency "mix" of students in New England has remained relatively stable.

Graph: "Headcount Enrollment in Vermont Institutions of Higher Education by Residence, 1968 and 1975". Following the pattern for the whole of New England, Vermont's public institution enrollments exceeded private enrollments in 1975 which was not the case seven years earlier. In both the public and private institutions the proportion of students attending Vermont schools from outside of New England has dropped.

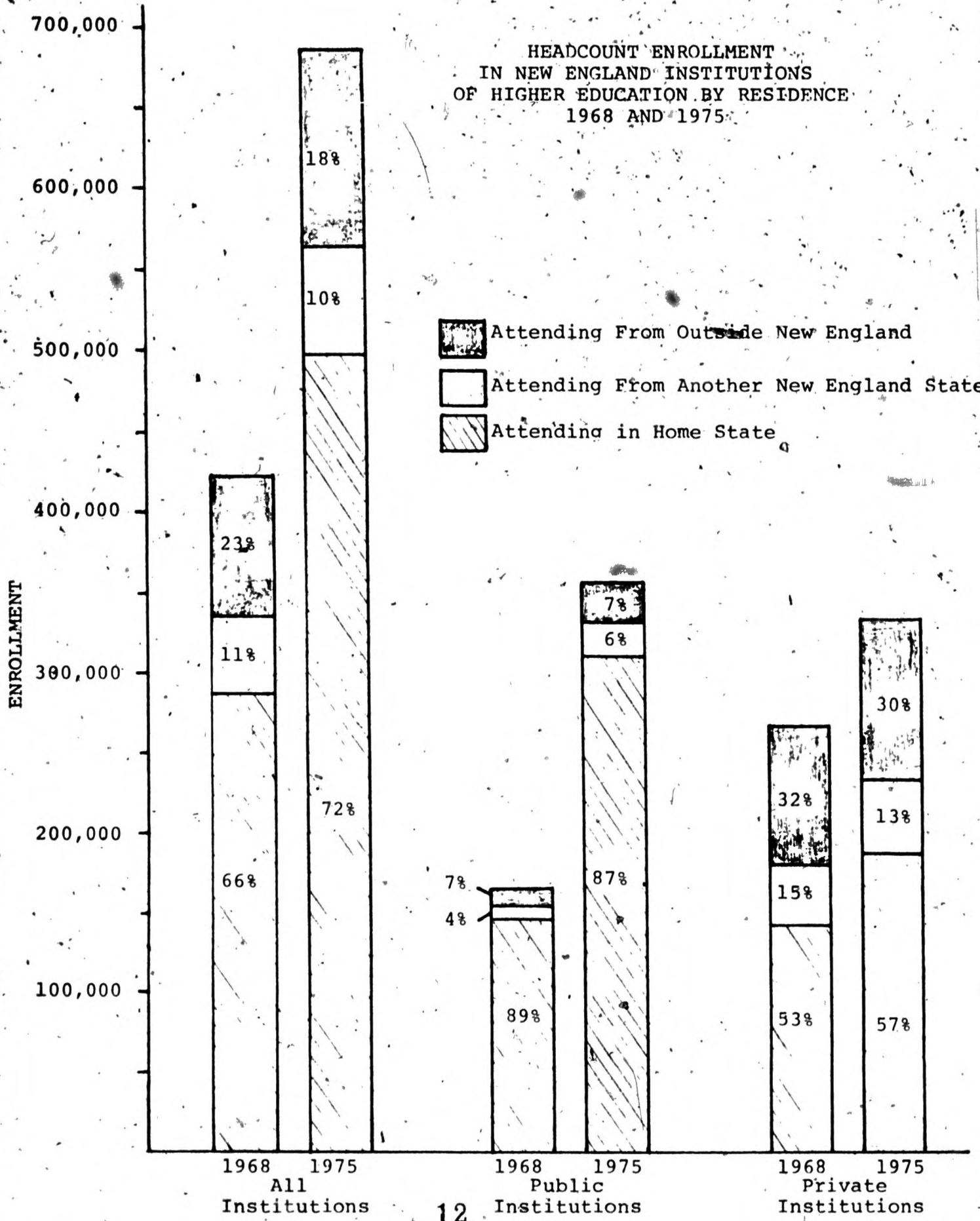

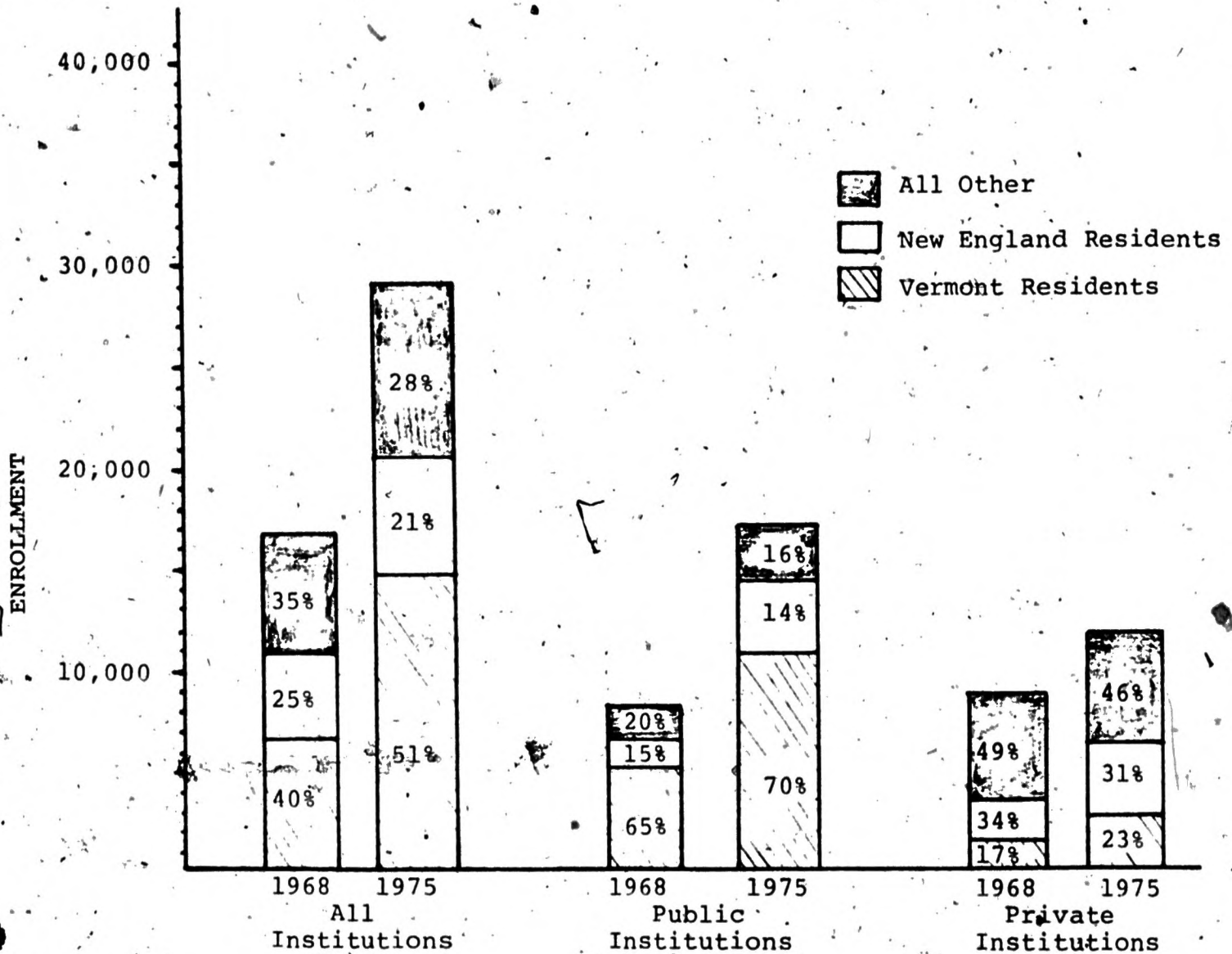
