ABSTRACT

Tabular data are presented that classify the employees and colleges and universities in New York state from 1972 through 1976. Definitions are included for occupational activities and program function, or the institutional purpose for which a particular set of employee activities is designed or exists. Categories of occupational activities include: executive, administrative, and managerial; instructional (faculty and teaching assistants); professional (research, business, health, etc.); and nonprofessional (technical, office, crafts and trades, and service). The four program function groupings include: instruction program; organized research program; public service program; and academic support, student service, and institutional support. The tables provide data on numbers of employees classified by occupation, by professional or nonprofessional status, in public and independent institutions, and by institutional type. (LBH)

DEFINITIONS

I. OCCUPATIONAL ACTIVITIES

- a) **EXECUTIVE, ADMINISTRATIVE, MANAGERIAL** - Includes persons who are assigned a primary responsibility for management of the institution, a department, or a subdivision. The assignment may require the performance of work directly related to management policies or general business operations of the institution and should require discretion, independent judgment, and direction of the work of others.
- b) **INSTRUCTIONAL** - Includes persons with assignments customarily made for the purpose of instruction; excludes persons assigned a job associated with research projects.

Faculty: Generally associated with titles of professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, and lecturer.

Teaching Assistants and Associates: Includes persons who carry out instruction with guidance from others who exercise the primary responsibility. Typically, the position is staffed by people with student status.

- c) **PROFESSIONAL** (research, business, health, etc. other than administrative or instructional) - Includes only persons whose positions require at least a bachelor's degree or its equivalent, persons with assignments of a professional nature associated with organized research projects, and persons assigned to positions requiring knowledge of an advanced type in a field of science or learning, or original and creative work in an artistic field.
- d) **NONPROFESSIONAL**

Technical: Includes persons with assignments requiring specialized knowledge or skills which may be acquired through experience or degree certificate programs below the bachelor's degree.

Office: Includes persons with assignments typically associated with clerical activity.

Crafts and Trades: Includes persons assigned to activities typically requiring knowledge or skill gained in recognized crafts or trades.

Service: Includes persons assigned to activities requiring a limited degree of previously acquired skills and knowledge.

DEFINITIONS

(Concluded)

II. PROGRAM FUNCTION - The institutional purpose for which a particular set of employee activities is designed or exists. In all cases, the primary intent or objective should be the criterion for classifying any function.

- a) INSTRUCTION PROGRAM - Includes persons assigned to programs in which a student enrolls to earn credit toward a degree or certificate at the institution whether it is general academic instruction, occupational and vocational instruction, special session instruction, or extension instruction. Those persons assigned to instruction in courses not creditable toward degrees or certificates are not included in this category. If the primary intent of the nondegree program is to provide supplemental or remedial educational services for registered students, these persons are reported in the fourth category STUDENT SERVICE. If the primary intent of the nondegree program is to offer instructional services for members of the community, these persons are reported in the third category PUBLIC SERVICE.
- b) ORGANIZED RESEARCH PROGRAM - Includes persons assigned to research related projects established within the institution under the terms of agreement with agencies external to the institution (except Federally Funded Research Projects), or separately budgeted and conducted with internal funds. This category also includes assignments to research divisions, bureaus, institutes, and experimental stations. Externally funded educational programs such as workshops, short courses, and training grants would normally be considered as either INSTRUCTION or PUBLIC SERVICE. In all cases, the primary intent or objective should be the criterion for classifying any function.
- c) PUBLIC SERVICE PROGRAM - Includes persons assigned to functions within the institution that benefit the community or individuals residing within the geographic service area of the institution. This category includes (1) community education not part of the degree curriculum, (2) community service activities such as conferences and institutes, general advisory services and reference bureaus, urban affairs, international affairs, radio and television presentations, consultation, and similar activities which are beneficial to groups and individuals outside of the institution, and (3) cooperative extension services.
- d) ACADEMIC SUPPORT, STUDENT SERVICE, AND INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT

Academic Support Program: Includes persons with assignments that support the primary programs through the retention, preservation, and display of materials and assignments that provide services of direct relevance to the academic functions of the institution. Examples are libraries, museums and galleries, audio-visual services, computing support, ancillary support, academic administration, and course and curriculum development.

Student Service Program: Includes persons whose assignments relate to the institution's student body, excluding degree-related curriculum and whose assignments are in areas such as social and cultural development, supplementary educational service, counseling and career guidance, financial aid, and student support.

Institutional Support Program: Includes persons who have assignments within the institution that provide campus-wide support to other persons.
