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ABSTRACT

This document consists of 13 tables that provide information on the 4,702,228 full-time employees of state and local governments who were members of employee organizations in October 1975. Areas of information covered include the extent of employee organization, labor relations policies and written agreements, negotiating units, and work stoppages. There were 11,895 state and local governments that engaged in collective negotiations and/or meet and confer discussions with employee organizations as of October 1975. These governments had 25,770 labor-management agreements with 23,643 bargaining units. During the period of October 16, 1974, to October 15, 1975, state and local governments experienced 490 work stoppages involving 316,011 employees. (Author/IRT)

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INTRODUCTION

State and local governments had 4,702,228 full-time employees who were members of employee organizations in October 1975, a 0.5 percent decrease from October 1974. There were 11,895 State and local governments which engaged in collective negotiations and/or meet and confer discussions with employee organizations as of October 1975, and these governments had 25,770 labor-management agreements with employee organizations in effect as of that time.

The number of employee-bargaining units in State and local governments totaled 23,643 in October 1975, an increase of 13.3 percent from the 20,860 employee-bargaining units reported for October 1974. These bargaining units represented a total of 4,211,127 employees in October 1975, or 34.9 percent of all State and local government employees.

During the 12-month period of October 16, 1974 to October 15, 1975, State and local governments experienced 490 work stoppages involving 316,011 employees. When these work stoppages are measured in terms of the scheduled days or work shifts for which employees withheld their services, a total of 2,420,634 days of idleness occurred.

EXTENT OF EMPLOYEE ORGANIZATION

A total of 4.7 million, or 49.9 percent, of all full-time State and local government employees belonged to employee organizations in October 1975. This represents a 0.5 percent decrease since October 1974 in the number of full-time employees who belong to organizations which exist for the purpose, in whole or in part, of improving conditions of employment.

Table A provides a distribution of the 50 States and the District of Columbia in terms of the percent of full-time State and local government employees who belonged to employee organizations in October 1975.

In this report, data on the extent of employee organization are presented by level and type of government and by governmental function. When these data are examined in terms of types of government, independent school districts are found to have the highest proportion of employees who belong to employee organizations 63.4 percent of all full-time employees. Table B provides a distribution of the number of organized full-time employees in State and local governments by type of government in October 1975.

When the extent of employee organization is viewed on the basis of both governmental level and function, one finds at the local government level that the fire protection function, with 72.4 percent of full-time employees belonging to employee organizations, had the highest proportion of organized employees. At the State government level the highway function, with 59.0 percent of full-time employees belonging to an employee organization, had the highest proportion of organized employees. Table C displays the percentage of full-time employees organized by governmental level and function in October 1975.

LABOR RELATIONS POLICIES AND WRITTEN AGREEMENTS

The number of governments reporting a labor relations policy in October 1975 was 11,895, an increase of 2.2 percent over the 11,636 governments reporting such a policy in October 1974. Table D provides a summary of the number and percentage of governments with a labor relations policy in October 1975.

Of the governments with a labor relations policy, 4,038 reported that they engaged in collective negotiations only, 3,262 reported a policy for meet and confer discussions only, and 4,595 reported policies for both collective negotiations and meet and confer discussions.

Meet and confer discussions, as used in this report, refers to negotiations in which the public employer consents to discuss conditions of employment with representatives of the employee organization. If the negotiating parties come to an agreement, it is written in the form of a memorandum of understanding. The public employer is, however, not legally bound to enter into these discussions, nor to abide by any resulting memoranda of understanding. These options constitute the major differences between meet and confer discussions and collective negotiations.

Collective negotiations, on the other hand, refers to negotiations in which both management and employee representatives are equal legal parties in the bargaining process and decisions are reached jointly through bilateral negotiations. The end result of collective negotiations is a mutually binding contractual agreement.

Table E illustrates, by State, the number of governments that had a labor relations policy in October 1975. Because special district governments represent a large portion of all local governments but only a small number of them engage in collective negotiations or meet and confer discussions, the data in Table E have been displayed to both include and exclude special districts.

As mentioned above, labor-management agreements in the public sector fall into two categories—contractual agreements and memoranda of understanding. There were 25,770 of these agreements in effect between State and local governments and employee organizations in October 1975, an increase of 8.2 percent over the same period in 1974. The number of contractual agreements reported by State governments decreased by 10.2 percent during this period while the number of memoranda of understanding increased slightly. The primary cause for the decrease in the number of contractual agreements was a change in the bargaining structure in the Massachusetts State government. In

October, 1974, the individual agencies of the Massachusetts State government bargained with employee organizations and written contractual agreements were between the individual agencies and employee organizations. By October 1975, Massachusetts had changed to a system of statewide bargaining and contractual agreements, when negotiated, would be between the general State government and employee organizations.

At the local level there were increases in both the number of contractual agreements and the number of memoranda of understanding; however, the increase in the number of contractual

agreements was 17.1 percent whereas the increase in memoranda of understanding was only 2.8 percent. The trend toward the more formalized labor-management relations process of collective negotiations noted in 1974 appears to be continuing.

School districts again reported more labor-management agreements than any other type of government, and special districts again reported the least. Table F summarizes the distribution of State and local government labor-management agreements by type of government in October 1975.

Of all agreements in effect on October 15, 1975, nearly two-thirds, or 17,139, came into effect during the 12 months preceding that date. Of the 12,917 contractual agreements that became effective between October 16, 1974 and October 15, 1975, 1,503 were new agreements and the remaining 11,414 were renegotiated.

The contractual agreements in effect on October 15, 1975 covered 3.1 million employees, or 26 percent of all State and local government workers; over one-third of this number were employees of school districts. A total of 1,678,895 employees were covered by contractual agreements which became effective during the period October 16, 1974 and October 15, 1975; 199,776 of these employees were covered by new contractual agreements (i.e., negotiated for the first time) and the remainder were covered by renegotiated contractual agreements.

BARGAINING UNITS

Bargaining units were reported to exist in 38 State governments and 8,554 local governments as of October 15, 1975. These governments had a total of 23,643 bargaining units representing 4,111,127 employees, or 34.9 percent of all full-time and part-time employees. In October 1974 there were 20,860 bargaining units representing 31.4 percent of all full-time and part-time employees.

In governments where bargaining units exist, a group of employees must demonstrate a "community of interest" in order to be represented by a particular unit for the purpose of collective negotiations. The definitions of "community of interest," however, varies greatly from government to government. Some bargaining units, therefore, may represent all members of an employee organization. Others may represent all employees of a government or agency who are classified as eligible for representation by an employee organization, and some may represent only employees of a specific occupational category. The occupational categories represented may be very broadly defined

(such as "blue collar workers") or they may be more specifically defined (such as "machinists").

Of the 8,554 local governments with bargaining units, the majority reported having only one or two units, and only 20 local governments reported having 20 or more bargaining units. State governments, on the other hand, reported larger numbers of bargaining units per government. Of the 38 State governments having bargaining units, 14 reported 20 or more bargaining units and only five reported one or two bargaining units. In table 12, governments with bargaining units are grouped according to their number of bargaining units.

The tendency noted in 1974 toward small bargaining units continues. Almost one-half (49.5 percent) of all State and local government bargaining units in October 1975 represented fewer than 50 employees. In contrast, bargaining units representing 500 or more employees accounted for only 5.6 percent of the total. Table 13 provides data on bargaining units according to their size.

WORK STOPPAGES

From October 16, 1974 to October 15, 1975, State and local governments experienced 490 work stoppages which lasted for at least one full shift or one full workday. These work stoppages involved 316,014 employees and their duration accounted for 4,208 workdays. The effect of these stoppages, in terms of time lost from work, is more apparent when the duration of each stoppage is multiplied by the number of employees involved. The sum of these calculations is a total of 2,420,634 days-of-idleness, an increase of 72.3 percent from the days-of-idleness for work stoppages that occurred during the preceding 12-month period of October 16, 1973 to October 15, 1974. Table G provides a summary of the average number of employees idled, the average duration and the average days-of-idleness for work stoppages in each type of government during the period October 1974 to October 1975.

School districts again experienced the largest number of work stoppages, 2234, and the most days-of-idleness, 928,233. The governmental function most affected by work stoppages was education. Table H below provides summary information on work stoppages by function.

During the 12-month period ended October 15, 1975, a State or local government work stoppage was most likely to have occurred during the renegotiation phase of an existing labor-management agreement, and the major cause for more than three-fourths of the stoppages concerned disputes of an economic and/or hours-of-work nature.

Direct negotiations between the employer and the grievants or their representatives was the method used most frequently (43.7 percent of all cases) to resolve State and local government work stoppages during the 12 months ended October 15, 1975. Third party resolution of issues was used to end 25.7 percent of all work stoppages and the majority of these were by mediation. Slightly more than 13 percent of all work stoppages were ended by court injunction and approximately 17 percent were ended by some other means such as a voluntary return to work by employees, dismissal of employees engaged in the work stoppage, etc.

SOURCES OF DATA

Data for State governments shown in this report result from a complete canvass of all State agencies and institutions. Data concerning total employment, fulltime employment and payrolls for local governments are estimates from the Bureau of the Census Survey of Government Employment. The Survey of Government Employment utilizes a random sample of approximately 16,000 local governments; for an explanation of sampling techniques and measures of sampling variation, see Public Employment 1975 issued by the U.S. Bureau of the Census in June 1976.

Labor relations data were gathered primarily by a mail canvass of all State governments, the approximately 16,000 local governments sampled for the Survey of Government employment and all other local governments which reported 50 or more full-time employees in the 1972 Census of governments. Mail requests for data were sent to over 4,400 State government agencies and to approximately 22,000 local governments and school systems. Usable replies were received from 84 percent of the panel canvassed. For governments not included in the survey panel, 1972 data were utilized, and for units which were surveyed but failed to respond, the latest available data were utilized.

Data received on questionnaires were reviewed and edited for internal consistency, comparability with prior year data, and other known facts about each unit. Supplementary correspondence and telephone followup with State and local officials were utilized to resolve any apparent problems. Some public employee organizations were contacted to obtain information on membership when an individual unit of government could not supply the requested data. Special assistance was obtained from the American Association of University Professors, State government employee organizations, and State personnel boards and directors.

Information on work stoppages for this report were generally reported by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), U.S. Department of Labor, from its regular statistical series. Units of government were asked to report the occurrence of work stoppages on the Bureau of the Census questionnaires and these reports were then checked against the work stoppage situations regularly collected by BLS. The BLS work stoppage data supplied for inclusion in this report consisted of completed questionnaires prepared by the employing government; alternative BLS source information was supplied, whenever possible, if an employer report was not obtainable.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics attempted to secure information for work stoppages not already collected for its statistical series and also provided the Bureau of the Census with information on work stoppages not reported by its respondents. Coverage of State and local government work stoppages by the Bureau of the Census includes all stoppages, regardless of size, provided

the duration was for at least 1 day or shift; BLS limits its coverage to those stoppages involving six or more employees for a period of at least 1 day or shift.

RELIABILITY AND LIMITATIONS OF DATA

The mail questionnaires used in this survey contained detailed definitions and reporting instructions to guide respondents and facilitate uniform interpretation and reporting procedures. The information reported for number of organized employees depended, however, on the ability of the respondent to determine which organizations should be included. Data on the number of employees belonging to organizations which have not traditionally participated in the collective negotiations process (i.e., professional and social organizations) were not always reported. In order to overcome any shortcoming in this regard, a few of the significant organizations were themselves contacted to obtain information regarding membership. In other cases, however,

members of a particular organization were included or excluded on the basis of how the State or local government official responding to the request for data perceived the organization's role. Essentially, public officials made their decision on the basis of whether or not an organization attempted to provide input into the government's policies regarding conditions of employment.

Since information on size and numbers of bargaining units was not collected in the 1972 Census of Governments, the data concerning bargaining units which are presented in this report represent only the 50 State governments and the approximately 22,000 local governments that are included in the survey and that responded in the 1975 or 1974 surveys. Data concerning numbers of new and renegotiated contractual agreements and numbers of employees covered by contractual agreements were collected for the first time as part of the 1975 survey. For governments not included on the survey panel and for governments that failed to respond, all contractual agreements reported on a previous survey were counted as renegotiated.

For units that responded in 1974 but did not respond in 1975, the number of employees represented by bargaining units was also used for the number of employees covered by contractual agreements. No data are included in this report on the number of employees covered by contractual agreements for governments

not on the survey panel or for governments on the survey panel which did not respond in the 1974 or 1975 surveys.

Data utilized from the 1972 Census of Governments account for 3 percent of the total number of local government employees shown as belonging to an employee organization in October 1972. The 1972 Census data also account for 23.2 percent of the number of local governments that had a labor relations policy and for 10.7 percent of all written labor-management agreements at the local government level. Table I provides a display of data from the 1972 Census of Governments used in this report for governments not on the survey panel and also a display of the latest available data utilized for units on the survey panel which did not respond.

Human and mechanical errors occur in any mass statistical operation. Errors during the data collection phase can include failure to obtain desired information from respondents and the recording of information in the wrong place or incorrectly. Errors can also occur during the review and editing process, the clerical handling of survey questionnaires and various stages of electronic processing of information. Careful efforts were made, however, to keep errors at an acceptably low level. Errors that may be introduced during processing (input preparation, etc.) are minimized through the use of intensive computer editing of the data at various stages of the processing system.

DEFINITION AND EXPLANATION OF TERMS

This appendix discusses, in detail, terms utilized in this report. Specific terms can be located under the following major headings: Types of Government, Functions of Governments, and Labor Relations Terms.

TYPES OF GOVERNMENTS

State Governments. This refers to the governments of the 50 States which constitute the United States.

Local Governments. The Bureau of the Census classifies local governments by five major types—county, municipality, township, school district, and special district.

County. Organized county governments (legally designated as "boroughs" in Alaska and "parishes" in Louisiana) are found throughout the Nation except in Connecticut, Rhode Island, the District of Columbia and limited portions of a few other States. There were 3,044 county governments reported in the 1972 Census of Governments. Excluded from county government statistics and included with municipalities are certain local governments that combine area and governmental characteristics of both counties and municipalities. For further amplification, refer to the discussion under "Municipality" below.

Municipality. For purposes of Census classification, a municipality is defined as a political subdivision within which a municipal corporation has been established to provide general local government to a specific population concentration in a defined area. A municipality may be legally designated as a city, village, borough (except in Alaska) or town (except in the six New England States, New York, and Wisconsin). Included in this category, are certain cities that are completely or substantially consolidated with their county governments, operate outside the geographic limits of any county or for other reasons have no organized county government operations within their boundaries. Comprising this group are the following: Anchorage, Baltimore, Baton Rouge, Boston, Carson City, Columbus (Ga.), Denver, Honolulu, Indianapolis, Jacksonville, Lexington (Ky.), Juneau, Nashville, New Orleans, New York, Philadelphia, St. Louis, Sitka, San Francisco, and Washington, D.C. as well as the "Independent Cities" in Virginia. A total of 18,517 municipalities were reported in existence as of 1972.

Township. The term "township" was applied in the 1972 Census of Governments to 16,991 organized local governments in 21 States and included those governments officially designated as towns in the six New England States, New York, Wisconsin, and some "plantations" in Maine and "locations" in New Hampshire, as well as governments called townships in other areas. As distinguished from municipalities, townships exist to serve inhabitants of areas defined without regard to population concentrations.

School District. There is a marked organizational diversity in the types of governmental units that provide for the administration and operation of public schools. In the 1972 Census of Governments there were 15,781 independent school districts which had sufficient administrative and fiscal independence to be classified as independent governmental units. Excluded from this total are 1,457 "dependent" school systems which are

treated as agencies of other governments—county, municipality, township or State. In 27 States, responsibility for local government public schools rests solely with school districts which are independent governmental units. In another three States—California, Indiana, and Ohio—all school systems that provide education through grade 12 are independent governments. Each of these three States has an institution of higher education operated by a city or county government. A "mixed" situation is found in 15 States, with the public schools that provide elementary and secondary education operated in some areas by independent school districts and elsewhere by some other type of government. In the District of Columbia and in five States (Alaska, Hawaii, Maryland, North Carolina, and Virginia) there are no independent school districts.

Special District. Special districts counted in the 1972 Census of Governments were governmental entities, authorized by their enabling legislation to provide only a single service or a limited number of services, but with sufficient administrative and fiscal independence to be classified as independent governmental units. They are known by a variety of titles including districts, authorities, boards, and commissions. A number of interstate agencies are classified as special district governments. There were 23,885 special districts identified in the 1972 Census of Governments.

FUNCTIONS OF GOVERNMENTS

Employment in each of the following functions is not limited solely to the personnel directly involved in providing the services mentioned in the title of each category, but also includes all support personnel who are indirectly providing services or who are providing maintenance functions for others in that service.

Education. This category includes instructional employees as well as the administrative, clerical, maintenance, and auxiliary employees of public schools. The category Teachers includes not only teachers in the traditional sense, but also principals, supervisors of instruction, librarians, and guidance personnel. For institutions of higher education, persons engaged in departmental research, and teachers at hospitals and agricultural experiment stations and farms are included in the category "Teachers." The "Other" category under education in this report, in addition to all noninstructional personnel, also includes State government employees in institutions for the training and education of blind, deaf and other handicapped persons, and other State government education related programs such as adult education and vocational education and rehabilitation.

Fire Protection. This functional classification is used only for local governments and is performed chiefly by municipalities. It includes all personnel involved with fire protection and prevention activities as well as uniformed firefighting forces.

Hospital. In this report this function includes only the employees of government-operated facilities providing in-patient care. Employees in government-owned facilities that are leased to private corporations are excluded. In hospitals connected with a medical school, the instructional staff has been reported under "Education," leaving traditional types of hospital employees included in this category.

Police Protection. Police protection includes all persons engaged in the enforcement of law and order. This function is not limited to uniformed police forces, but also includes clerical, administrative, communication and custodial personnel concerned with police protection activities. Also included in Police Protection are personnel concerned with the operation and maintenance of jails, holding tanks, lockups and other noncorrectional detention facilities.

Public Welfare. Public welfare includes the administration of various kinds of assistance programs of needy persons, programs which provide payments to indigents for medical care and other services, and the operation of homes for the elderly and other indigent care institutions.

Sanitation Other Than Sewerage. All refuse collection and disposal activities, as well as street cleaning, are classified and reported here.

Streets and Highways. This category covers the provision, maintenance, and repair of streets, roads, and highway facilities not only for regular street and roads, but also for toll turnpikes, bridges, and tunnels. Snow and ice removal activities and street lighting activities are also included.

LABOR RELATIONS TERMS

This section includes terms especially pertinent to the field of State and local government labor relations. These terms were also defined for the respondents who contributed to this publication for purposes of uniformity in reporting.

Employment and Employees. Employment refers to persons within the gainful employ of a government. Employees include all persons paid for personal services performed. Full-time employees are defined to include those persons engaged for the regular workweek as defined by each of the respondent governments.

Collective Negotiations. The method of determining conditions of employment through bilateral negotiations between representatives of the employer and employee organizations. An agreement reached is set forth in a mutually binding contract.

Meet and Confer Discussions. The method of determining conditions of employment whereby the representatives of the employer and the employee organization hold periodic discussions to seek agreement on matters within the scope of representation. Any written agreement is in the form of a nonbinding memorandum of understanding.

Bargaining Unit. A group of employees recognized as appropriate for representation by an employee organization for the purpose of collective bargaining and/or meet and confer discussions. Units commonly include both members and nonmembers of the employee organization.

Work Stoppage. A concerted and complete withholding of services by employees which lasted for at least one workday or one work shift. A work stoppage is included in this publication if its starting date fell during the survey period of October 16, 1974 through October 15, 1975.

Duration of Work Stoppages. The number of regular work shifts or workdays during which employees were idled by a work stoppage. The average duration is computed by summing the number of work shifts or days idled and dividing the resultant total by the number of work stoppages.

Days of Idleness. This category represents the total number of employee workdays or work shifts lost during a work stoppage. It is computed by multiplying the number of employees affected by a work stoppage by the number of work shifts or days that occurred during the period of stoppage. The average days of idleness is computed by summing the days of idleness and dividing the resultant total by the number of work stoppages.

Work Stoppage Issue. As shown in this report, this term refers only to the primary issue responsible for the work stoppage. Economic and Hours disputes refer to pay-for-labor issues including shift differentials, overtime pay, salary scales and promotion guidelines and the length of work duty and scheduling of work shifts. Job Security issues include seniority or layoff clauses, job maintenance, division of work, job transfers, subcontracting and mechanization. Plant Administration issues refer to supervision of personnel, physical facilities, safety, work rules, work assignments, and employee discharge and discipline. Organization Recognition disputes are those arising from the lack of an employer's acknowledgment of an organization's right to represent some or all employees in matters affecting the conditions of employment. Organizational Security and Related Matters disputes involve issues thought to be vital to the organization's continuance as the representative of the employees. Issues such as dues checkoff, agency shop and maintenance of membership fall into this category. Other work stoppage issues refers to those issues which do not meet the criteria of the work stoppage issues defined above.

Contract Status. Contract Status pertains to the status of contract negotiations at the time of the work stoppage. Recognition refers to situations where formal organization recognition does not exist; however, the organization has requested recognition and the employer may legally recognize the organization. Negotiating First Agreement means that the organization has been recognized as the official bargaining representative and negotiation on the first agreement has commenced. Renegotiation of Existing Agreement means that the parties have negotiated at least one agreement prior to the negotiations in which the dispute arose, and the dispute arose during renegotiation due to expiration or reopening. During Time of the Agreement means that negotiation of a new agreement is not involved, and there is a negotiated agreement in force. Other includes situations in which organizations are not involved, recognition is not legally allowed, or recognition has not been requested.

Method of Resolution. This term pertains only to the final method used to end the work stoppage. Agreement of Parties refers to stoppages that are resolved by direct negotiation between the striking workers and the employer. Mediation is an attempt by a third party to help in the settlement of a labor dispute (the mediator may interpret, suggest and advise but does not make recommendations). Fact-finding is a procedure whereby an impartial individual, panel or board investigates a labor dispute in order to report the issues in dispute (the fact-finder, agreed upon by the parties or appointed under government authority, may have the authority to make recommendations and his report may be made public). Arbitration is a method of settling disputes through recourse to an impartial third party whose decision is final, or advisory in certain circumstances. Arbitration is compulsory if required by law and voluntary when both parties agree to submit disputed issues to arbitration. Injunction or Court Order is a judicial order restraining individuals or organizations from continuing or performing certain acts. Other methods of resolution refers to methods which do not meet the criteria of the methods of resolution defined above. Most of the work stoppages that came under this category were ended by the employees' returning to work without a settlement.
