Two major national speeches have drawn a great deal of interest and response from the education community. On October 31, 1975 Commissioner Bell addressed the Annual Conference of the Adult Education Association in Salt Lake City. Titled "Is Commitment Enough?", the speech emphasized the need for a restructuring of adult education around the needs and interests of the learner. Commissioner Bell stated that adults want to learn for practical reasons related to their lives. Also, adult educators could reach out to motivated people by making learning more accessible. The ability of the education community to reach adults who need help in simply coping with everyday life is a critical concern. To help make this point, Dr. Bell reviewed the findings of the APL Study and raised questions about our entire education system in light of this research.

In a November 1975 speech presented to State Consumer Affairs officials from throughout the country, Virginia H. Knauer, Special Assistant to the President for Consumer Affairs, called attention to the APL Study in relation to functionally incompetent adults who do not have the consumer skills to make the best use of their limited resources. Ms. Knauer also called for renewed efforts to reach people of all ages who have left the school systems.
