ABSTRACT

In 1976-77, Los Angeles City College (LACC) received the annual reports from 14 of the 19 campuses of the California State University and College System on the performance of LACC transfers. A synthesis of these reports produced the following highlights: (1) 856 transfers were reported; (2) the Los Angeles (65%), Northridge (17%), Long Beach (7%), and Dominguez Hills (5%) campuses accounted for 94% of the reported transfers; (3) total transfers dropped from 1,119 in 1972-73, a drop of nearly 5%; (4) grade point average (GPA) at the state institutions for transfers averaged 2.55, compared with an LACC average of 2.64; (5) females achieved a GPA of 2.63 compared to 2.48 for males; and (6) comparisons of GPA by majors at Los Angeles, Long Beach, and Northridge campuses showed that students in Letters and Science had more difficulty in 1976 than in 1972, while students in Business had less. PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

The 19 colleges in the California State University and Colleges system report annually to the California Community Colleges on the performance of their transfers. In 1976-1977, Los Angeles City College received reports from 14 of the 19 campuses. It is the purpose of this study to summarize these reports.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

Format for the reports varies from campus to campus, making comparative analysis difficult. Some include all students, others first semester (or quarter) students only. Some indicate sex, major, and/or totals from the community colleges. Some send individual grade reports, others a summary. With assistance from L.A.C.C. records, a considerable amount of detective work and some interpolations and extrapolations produced the findings of the next section. While the data presented cannot be guaranteed 100% correct, it is believed to be an accurate picture of the numbers and performance of L.A.C.C. transfers to the State University and Colleges in 1976-1977.

FINDINGS

Table 1 summarizes the numbers of students transferring from L.A.C.C. to one of the State Universities or Colleges in 1976-1977 as indicated by the reports received. A total of 856 transfers were reported. Estimating the missing data, one can infer the actual total was around 1,000. Comparative totals for 1972-1973 are included.

FINDINGS (continued)

Table 2 summarizes academic performance by campus and by sex, while Table 3 presents a more detailed look by major field at the three large campuses in the greater Los Angeles area, viz., Los Angeles, Northridge, and Long Beach. Entrants for Fall, 1976 only are included in Tables 2 and 3. Comparative totals for Fall 1972 are included in Table 2.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

- (1) 14 of the 19 campuses reported at least one transfer from L.A.C.C. during 1976-77. The other five campuses failed to send reports.
- (2) Four southland campuses accounted for over 90% of the total reported number of 856: Los Angeles 65%, Northridge 17%, Long Beach 7%, Dominguez Hills 5%.
- (3) In comparison with 1972-1973 figures, total number of reported transfers dropped from 1,119 to 856 in 1976-1977, a drop of nearly 25%. Dominguez Hills showed a 60% increase, however, replacing San Diego as the fourth largest number of transfers.
- (4) Overall Fall 1976 first semester (or quarter) grade point average at the State institution was 2.55, compared with L.A.C.C. average of 2.64. This differential of -0.09 can be compared with a corresponding figure of +0.09 in 1972 (State 2.60, L.A.C.C. 2.51). Females performed at a higher level than males (State males GPA 2.48, females 2.63).
- (5) A comparison of performances in schools of major at three nearby campuses shows that students in Letters and Science had more difficulty in 1976 than in 1972, while students in Business had less (especially at Northridge.) Little differences among the three institutions are apparent.
