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ABSTRACT

Academic performance of Los Angeles City College (LACC) transfers to California State University at Los Angeles (CSULA) in 1976-77 was assessed by examining first quarter grade reports of all 667 students. Of these, 552 or 83% completed some work, with 50% entering in fall, 17% in winter, 19% in spring, and 13% in summer. The grade point average (GPA) for all 552 was 2.49 on a 4.0 scale, 0.11 points below the junior college average of 2.60. A 3.0 average or better was earned by 37%, while 19% fell below 2.0. A major in the School of Letters and Science was selected by 29%, with 25% choosing Business and Economics, 27% Fine Arts, 3% Engineering, and 15% undecided. Fine arts majors earned the highest GPA at 2.64, with business majors achieving the lowest at 2.32. Of 1,443 grades earned, 53% were A or B, and 14% D or F. Highest averages (3.0+) were achieved in physical education, music, recreation, Chicano studies, Spanish, and art. Since 1957, GPA's for new LACC transfers to CSULA have ranged from 2.36 to 2.60, with a differential between CSULA and LACC grades of -0.13 to +0.21. While grades have remained fairly constant, the number of transfer students has declined over the last five years. (Author/RT)

PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

To assess academic performance of recent Los Angeles City College transfers to California State University at Los Angeles, and to compare with past performance.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

Grade reports for transfers from L.A.C.C. are received periodically from the Office of School Relations of California State University at Los Angeles. Each grade report indicates, in addition to courses taken and grades earned, the class and major of the student. The report also indicates "transfer totals," i.e., units carried and grade points attempted at colleges prior to entering the University. For the purposes of this study, these figures are assumed to represent L.A.C.C. performance. A previous study indicated that this procedure would be reasonably reliable. The findings indicated in the next section of this study are based on information obtained from the State University grade reports for the academic year 1976-77.

FINDINGS

Table 1 indicates the number of grade reports received for each of the three-quarters of the 1976-77 year, plus the summer quarter of 1977.

667 students entered CSULA as transfers from L.A.C.C. during the four quarters indicated. 50% of these entered in September, 17% in January, 19% in April, 13% in the Summer. Of the 667, 115 (17%) failed to complete any work at CSULA during their first quarter. 73% of these withdrawals were without penalty.

Table 2 summarizes the first quarter academic performance of the 552 students completing some work during their first quarter.

Table 3 analyzes performance according to School or Division of major. Table 4 indicates distribution of grades earned (in student's first quarter) in each department at CSULA by the 552 transfers. Table 5 shows, in order of grade point average, the grade point averages earned in departments enrolling 15 or more students. Table 6 and Figure 1 present available data for previous semesters.

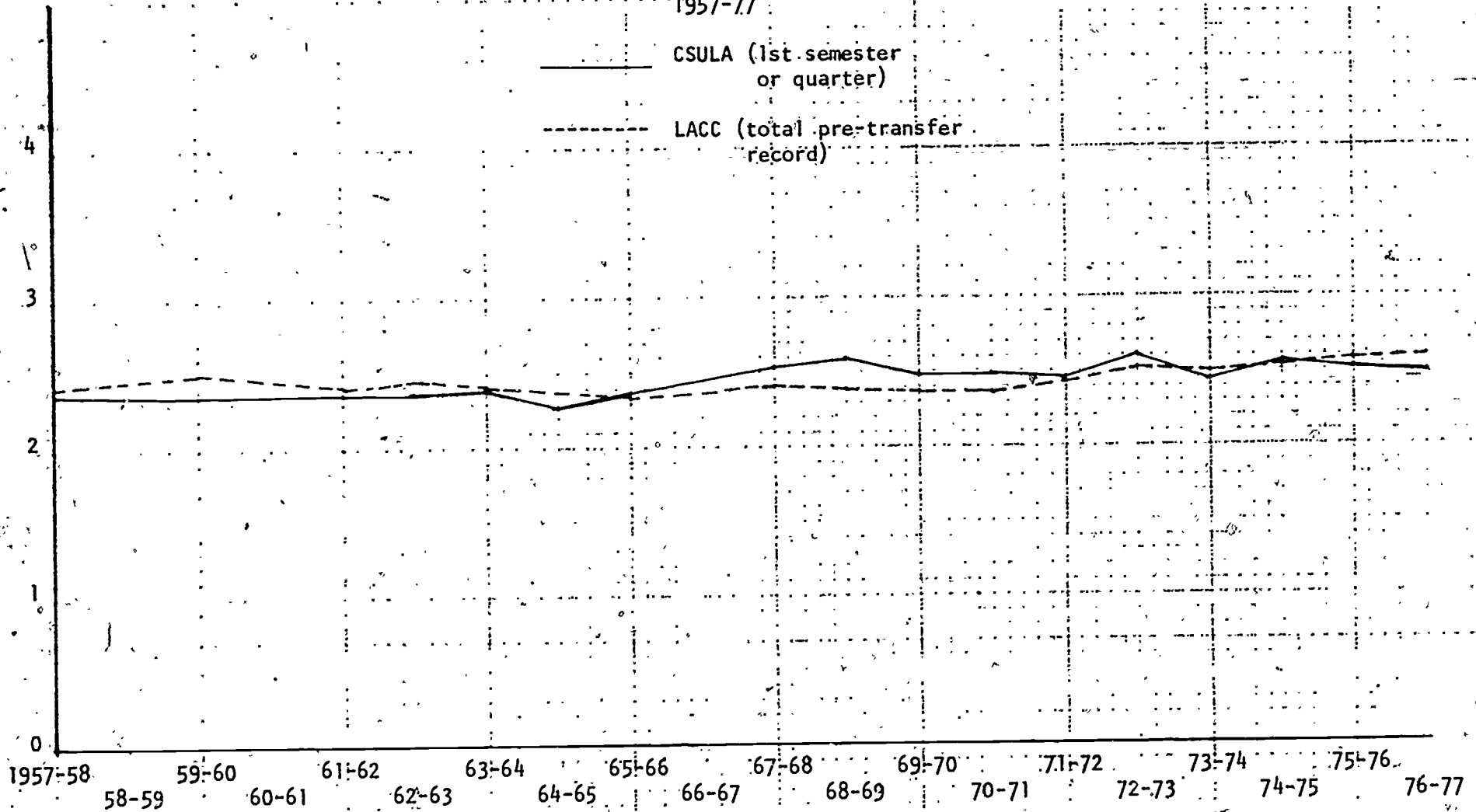

## SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

This study summarizes performance of L.A.C.C. transfers to CSULA during the 1976-77 year. Findings were based on first quarter grade reports for 667 students entering in Fall, 1976, Winter, 1977, Spring 1977, and Summer 1977.

552 (83%) of the 667 entrants completed some work. Of the 552, 50% entered in the Fall quarter, 17% in Winter, 19% in Spring, and 13% in Summer.

First quarter grade point average earned by the 552 entrants was 2.49, 0.11 grade points below their junior college average of 2.60. 37% of the students earned a "B" average or better at CSULA, while 19% fell below a "C" average.

29% of the entrants selected a major in the School of Letters and Science, 25% in Business and Economics, 27% in Fine Arts, 3% in Engineering, with 15% undecided. Students in Fine Arts earned the highest GPA at CSULA (2.64); students in Business had the most difficulty, earning a GPA of 2.32.

A total of 1,443 grades were earned by the 552 transfers in 42 different departments. 53% of these grades were A's or B's, 14% D's or F's. Highest averages (3.0 or higher) were earned in courses in P.E., Music, Recreation, Chicano Studies, Spanish, Art, and PAS. The only department averaging below 2.0 was Economics.

Over the 20 year period since 1957, the GPA earned by new LACC transfers to CSULA has ranged from 2.36 to 2.60, with the differential between CSULA and LACC GPA's ranging from -0.13 to +0.21. LACC transfers to CSULA continue to experience little, if any, "transfer shock." Number of transfers however, has declined, with total transfers for the past five years (in order) showing 729, 719, 639, 597, 552.

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
