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ABSTRACT

The performance of 1,904 entering students taking the Survey of Reading Achievement test for placement in English at Los Angeles City College in fall 1977 was examined and produced the following information: (1) the median reading level was 9.2, compared with 10.0 in fall 1976; (2) the 26% of the test-takers with reading levels above 11.0 were recommended to English 1, the 30% with reading levels between 9.0-10.9 were recommended for English 60, and the 44% with reading levels below 9.0 were recommended for Developmental Communications; (3) males (40% of the total) averaged about one-half grade higher than females; (4) former students of Los Angeles city high schools averaged below other California public and private schools, and below other geographic regions of the United States; (5) performance according to former attendance at particular Los Angeles high schools varied from a grade range of 7 to 10; and (6) compared to fall 1976 entrants, the percentage recommended for English 1 declined from 35% to 26%, the percentage recommended for English 60 declined from 34% to 30%, while those recommended for Developmental Communications rose from 31% to 44%. Where students had attended other colleges, former California State University students scored lowest and former University of California students scored highest. (Author/RT)

PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

In order to enroll in an English class at L.A.C.C., day students are required to show evidence that they have achieved minimum level on an appropriate reading test. The Counseling Center each semester offers the "Guidance Examination" for entering freshmen to provide them that evidence. The test used most frequently in the past several years has been the Survey of Reading Achievement (advanced grades 9 to 12), published by California Test Bureau. This study looks at the performance of students taking this test for entrance into L.A.C.C. for the Fall 1977 semester.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

With the cooperation of the Data Center, IBM cards were punched for each student taking the Guidance Examination. Variables included in the data were raw score, grade level (according to national norms furnished by the test publisher), English course recommendation as well as the student's name and sex, and codes for last high school and college attended. SPSS (Statistical Package for the Social Sciences) programs, now available on the district computer, were used to provide frequency counts and raw score means and standard deviations for selected subsets of the data. Printouts from the programs were used as a basis for the analysis following.

FINDINGS.

1,904 cards were punched for students taking the SRA test at one of six administrations of the Guidance Examination during the summer of 1977. Table 1 and Figure 1 show the distribution of student scores according to their grade level placement by the test. Also indicated are the percentages recommended for the various English levels. Percents recommended by the counseling staff for the various English courses will not match the figures shown here, as they make adjustments for students with foreign background, a factor not considered in this study. Comparative data for Fall 1976 is included in Table 1. Table 2 indicates raw score mean and standard deviation by sex for each of these six test dates and for the total group. Table 3 presents statistics according to previous college attended, Tables 4 and 5 according to location of last high school attended, with Table 4 indicating geographical areas and Table 5 looking at individual Los Angeles City high schools.

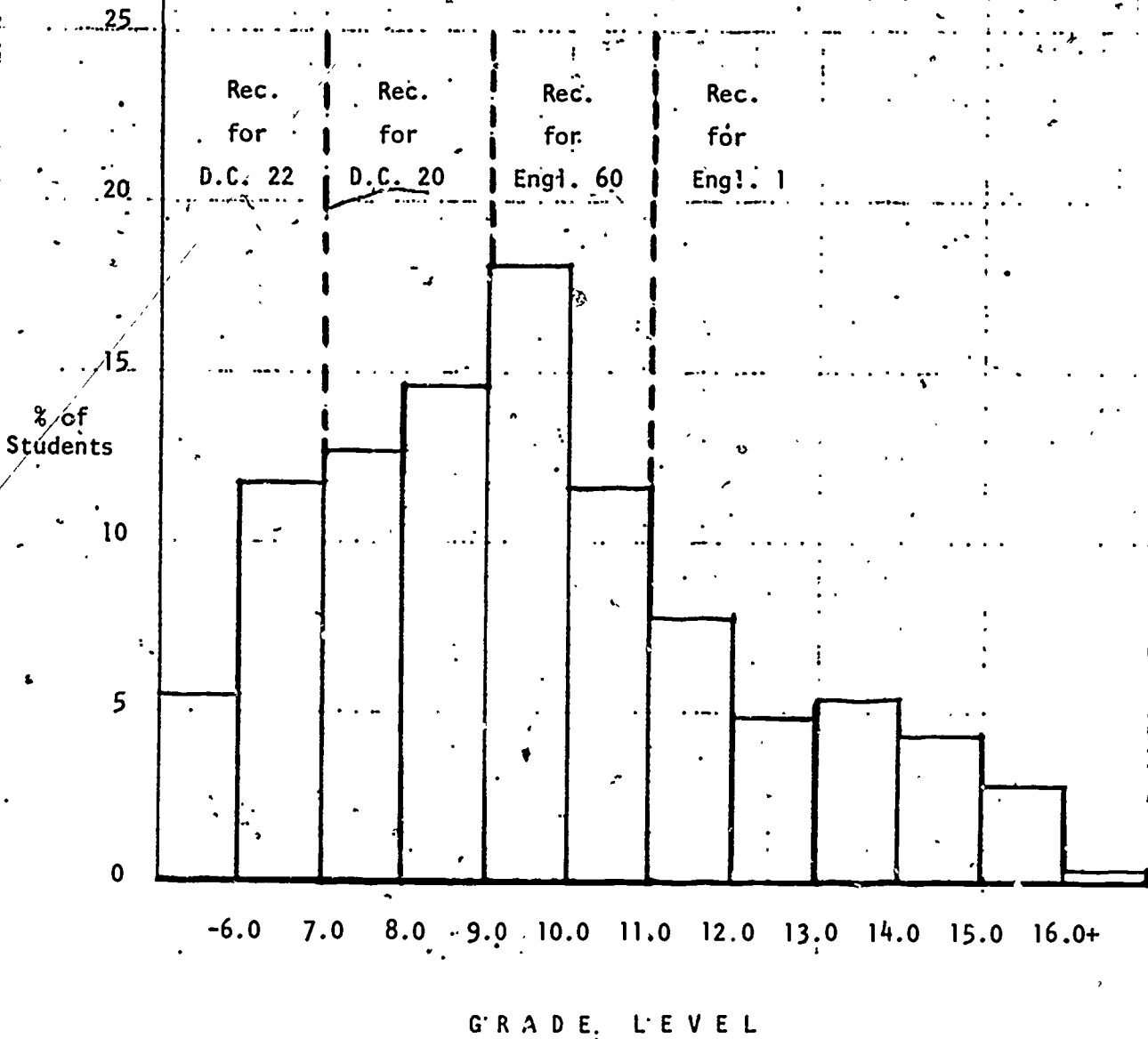

CONCLUSIONS

Following are some observations on the performance of 1904 students who took the Guidance Examination administered to students entering LACC in Fall 1977:

- (1) Median reading grade level was 9.2, compared with 10.0 in Fall 1976.
- (2) 26% of those taking the test received a recommendation to take English 1, a drop from the Fall 1976 figure of 35%. 44% were recommended for Developmental Communications, an increase over the Fall 1976 figure of 31%.
- (3) Males (40% of the total) average performance was about a half grade level higher than that for females.
- (4) Average performance for students who last attended a Los Angeles city high school was below the overall average.
- (5) Performance according to particular Los Angeles high school varied markedly, with averages ranging from seventh to tenth grade level.
- (6) Number of females taking the test was 60% of the total, an increase from last year's 57%. Females from the following high schools: Crenshaw, Fremont, Manual Arts, and Washington, outnumbered males by more than two to one.

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
