ABSTRACT

The report presents advance data from the March 1977 Current Population Survey on selected demographic, social, and economic characteristics of persons of Spanish origin. Persons of Spanish origin are divided into the subcategories of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, and other Spanish origin. Data pertain to such population characteristics as age, sex, marital status, metropolitan-nonmetropolitan residence, educational attainment, employment and occupation, income, and poverty status. In March 1977, there were about 11.3 million persons of Spanish origin in the United States: 6.5 million of Mexican origin, 1.7 million of Puerto Rican origin, 700,000 of Cuban origin, 900,000 of Central or South American origin, and 1.4 million of other Spanish origin. About 85% of the families lived in metropolitan areas. The median age was 22 years; 42% were under 18 years old. Only about 40% of those 25 years old and over had completed a high school education. About 57% of the employed men were working in blue-collar occupations, and about 23% were working in white-collar jobs. The median income of Spanish origin families in 1976 was \$10,300 as compared with a median of \$15,200 for families not of Spanish origin. In addition, 23% of the Spanish origin families had incomes below the poverty level as compared with 9% of the families not of Spanish origin. (NQ)

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Persons of Spanish Origin in the United States: March 1977

This report presents advance data from the March 1977 Current Population Survey on selected demographic, social, and economic characteristics of persons of Spanish origin in the United States.

HIGHLIGHTS

- The number of persons of Spanish origin in the United States in March 1977 totaled about 11.3 million; 6.5 million were of Mexican origin, 1.7 million of Puerto Rican origin, and 700,000 of Cuban origin. In addition, 900,000 persons were of Central or South American origin, and 1.4 million of other Spanish origin.
- Most families of Spanish origin live in the metropolitan areas of the Nation; about 85 percent resided in metropolitan areas in March 1977 as compared with 66 percent of those families who were not of Spanish origin.
- The Spanish origin population is a young population. The median age in March 1977 was 22 years as compared with a median of 30 years for the non-Spanish origin population. Moreover, 42 percent of the persons of Spanish origin were under 18 years old as compared with 30 percent of those not of Spanish origin.
- Persons of Spanish origin have lower educational attainment levels than persons not of Spanish origin. Only about 40 percent of the Spanish origin population 25 years old and over had completed a high school education as compared with 66 percent of those not of Spanish origin.
- Working men of Spanish origin are more likely to be employed as blue-collar workers and less likely to be employed as white-collar workers than men not of Spanish origin. About 57 percent of the employed men of Spanish origin were working in blue-collar occupations in March 1977 as compared with 45 percent of those not of Spanish origin. Only about 23 percent of the employed men of Spanish origin were working in white-collar jobs as compared with 43 percent of the non-Spanish origin men.
- The families of Spanish origin are not as well off financially as other families in the Nation. The median income of Spanish origin families in 1976 was \$10,300 as compared with a median of \$15,200 for families not of Spanish origin. In addition, 23 percent of the Spanish origin families had incomes below the poverty level, as compared with 9 percent of the families not of Spanish origin.

Since the estimates in this report are based on a sample, they may differ somewhat from the figures that would have been obtained if a complete census had been taken. The chances are about 68 out of 100 that an estimate from the survey differs from a complete census figure by less than the standard error (a measure of the sampling variability that occurs because a sample rather than the whole of the population was surveyed). If a complete census instead of a sample survey had been taken in March 1977, the chances are about 68 out of 100 (one standard error) that the census would show the total number of persons of Spanish origin to be within the range of 11.0 to 11.6 million persons, and the chances are about 95 out of 100 (twice the standard error) that the census total would be between 10.7 and 11.9 million persons.

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CURRENT POPULATION SURVEY

Persons of Spanish origin were persons who reported themselves as Mexican-American, Chicano, Mexican, Mexicano, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish, origin. Persons who reported themselves specifically as Mexican-American, Chicano, Mexican, or Mexicano were consolidated into the one category, Mexican.

Tables in this report show data for some or all of the subcategories of persons of Spanish origin — Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, and other Spanish origin. A more inclusive report on the characteristics of these persons will be published in this series in the near future.

Rounding.—The numbers in this report are in thousands and were rounded to the nearest thousand without being adjusted to group totals, hence, the sum of the parts may not equal the total shown. Also, because of rounding, the figures may differ slightly from table to table, and individual percentages may not always add to 100 percent.

Symbols.—A dash represents zero or rounds to zero. The symbol "B" means that the base for the derived figure is less than 75,000.

Figure 1. Number of Persons of Spanish Origin by Type of Spanish Origin: March 1977

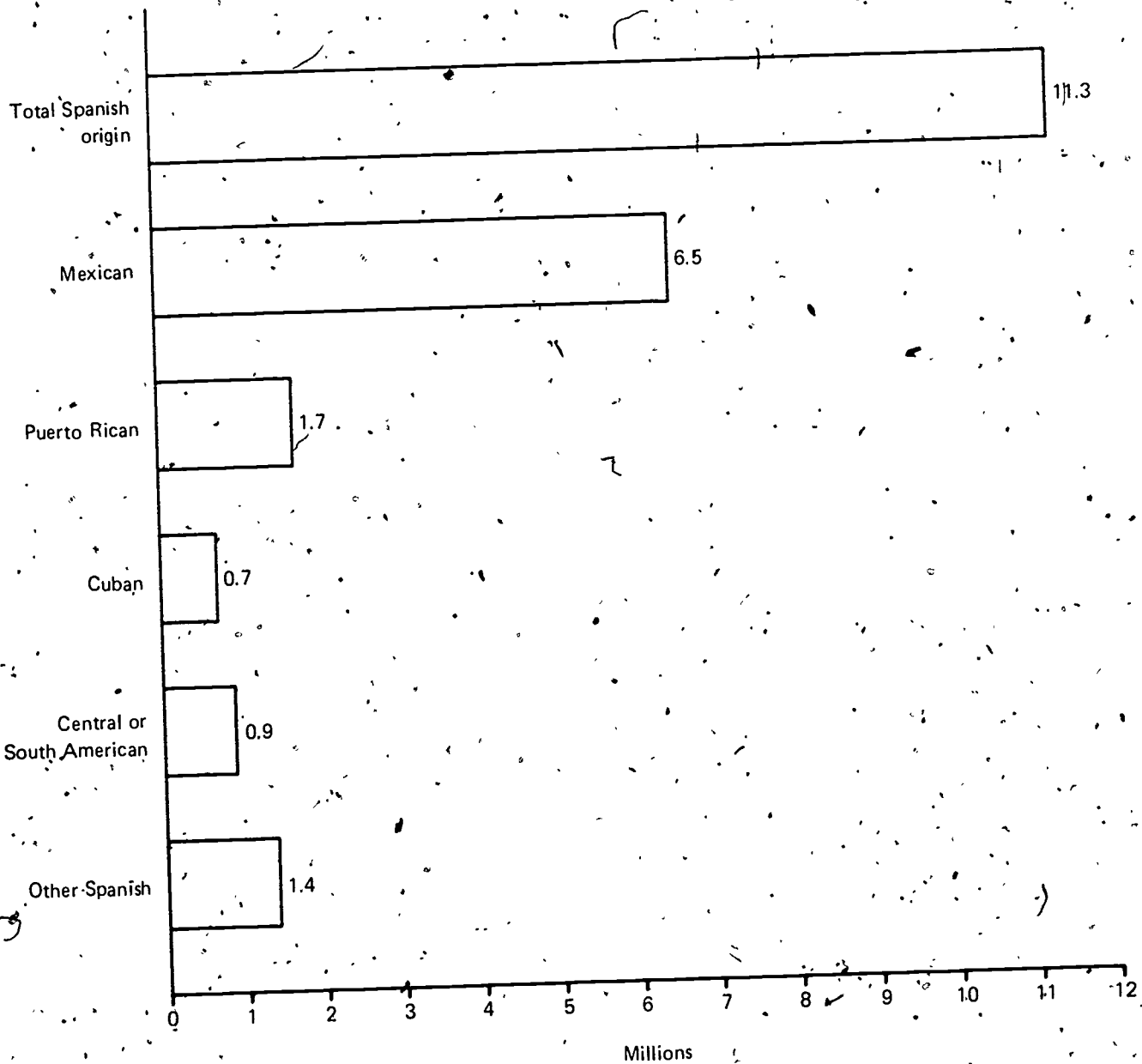
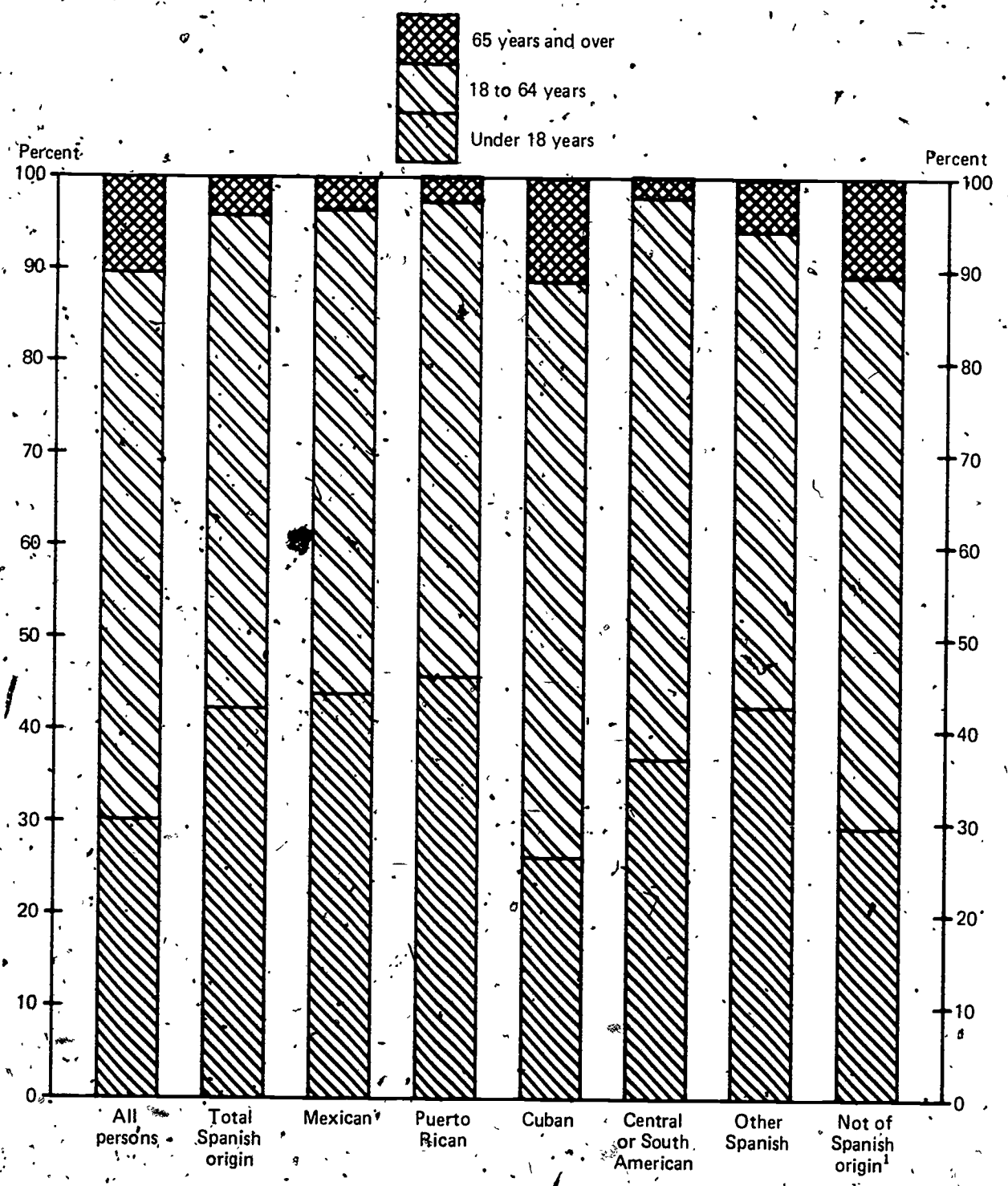
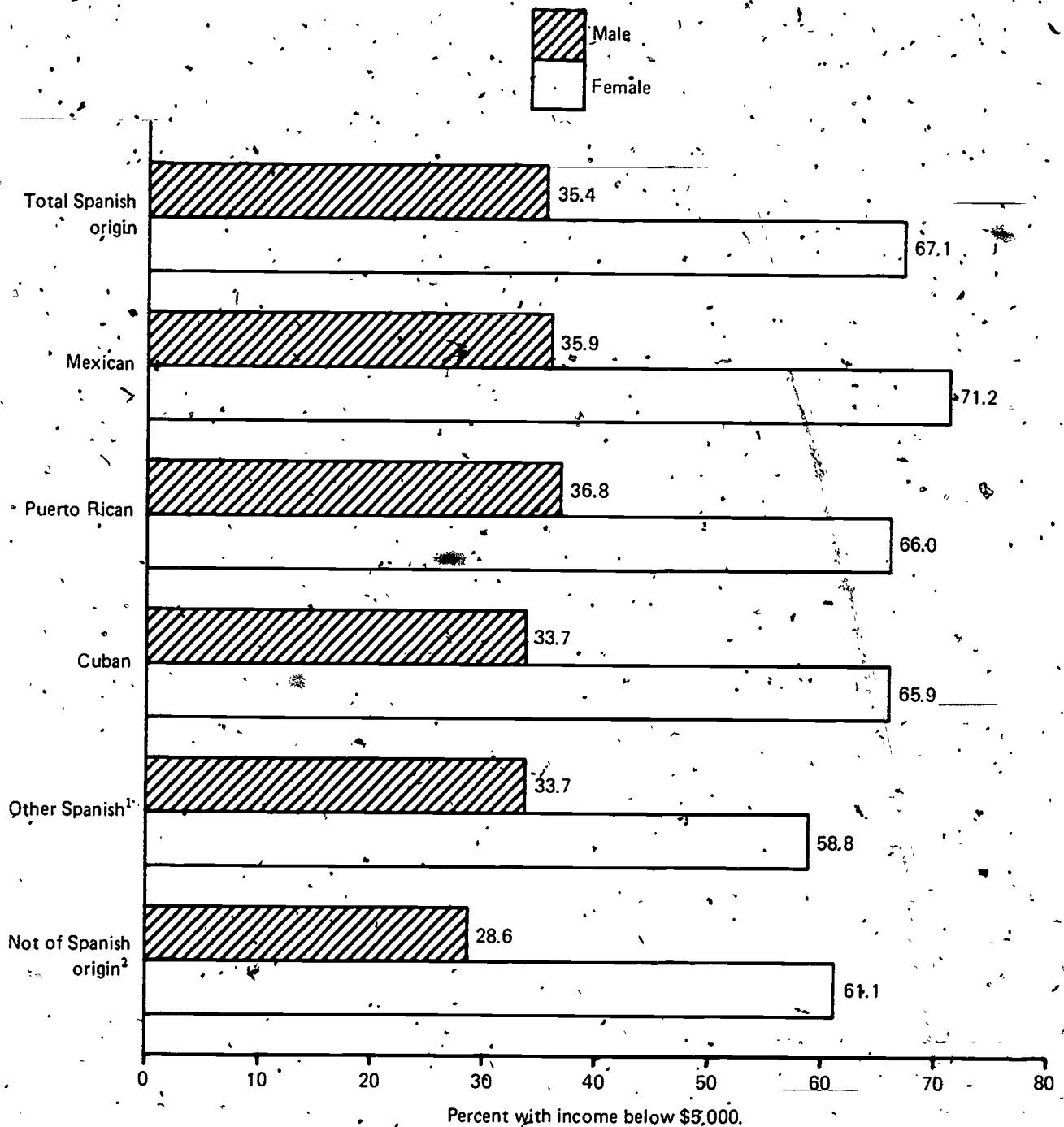


Figure 2. Percent Distribution by Age for All Persons and Persons of Spanish Origin by Type of Spanish Origin: March 1977

NOTE

In the past the Census Bureau has designated a head of household to serve as the central reference person for the collection and tabulation of data for individual members of the household (or family). However, recent social changes have resulted in a trend toward recognition of more equal status for all members of the household (or family), making the term "head" less relevant in the analysis of household and family data. As a result, the Bureau is currently developing new techniques of enumeration and data presentation which will eliminate the concept of "head." While much of the data in this report are based on the concept of "head," methodology for future Census Bureau reports will reflect a gradual movement away from this traditional practice.

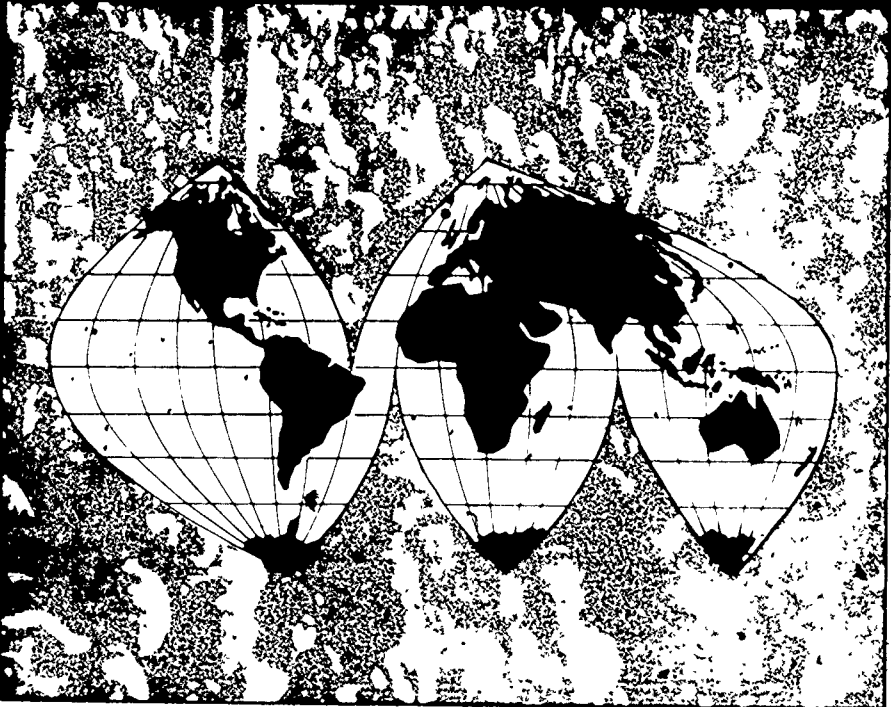

Recent Demographic Estimates for the Countries and Regions of the World



This publication from the International Statistical Programs Center of the Bureau of the Census presents reported and estimated demographic data for all countries of the world with a population of at least 2,000 persons, and for world regions. Benchmark, or hard, data for each country include enumerated and adjusted populations from the latest census or survey, birth and death rates, annual rate of growth, life expectancy at birth, infant death rate, percent of population under 15 years of age, median birth order, percent urban, median age of mother, and percent of labor force in agriculture. A projected estimate of the

population of each country for 1975 as well as birth and death rates and the annual rate of growth for 1974 are shown. All benchmark data and projected estimates are annotated. Also included for each country are historical population series for the years 1950 to 1975. This report was prepared under a Resources Support Services Agreement with the Office of Population, Bureau for Population and Humanitarian Assistance, U.S. Agency for International Development.

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
