This bibliography includes instructional media appropriate to the Health, Safety, and Physical Education programs in the schools. The items are listed by type of media. The order of the listing is as follows:

The absence from this list of a given type of media indicates that no media of that type were reviewed or that none were deemed worthy of being called to the attention of schools. The name of a school administrative unit appearing after an annotation indicates that educators in that school system reviewed the item annotated and submitted the information for inclusion on the ADVISORY LISTS. Occasionally, such items may not appear on display at the Materials Review and Evaluation Center in Raleigh. Educators should bear in mind that materials included on this list were selected from those which publishers chose to submit for evaluation and may assume that materials available for purchase not appearing on this list either were not submitted for evaluation or received unfavorable reviews. Information about negative reviews, which do not appear on this bibliography, can be obtained by writing or calling the Materials Review and Evaluation Center. At the end of this bibliography may be found an unannotated list of books which have had favorable reviews in reliable reviewing sources.

The levels at which the media may be most effectively used are indicated by "prim" (primary: Grades K-3), "elem" (elementary: Grades 4-6), "jhs" (junior high school: Grades 7-8[9]), and "shs" (senior high school: Grades [9]10-12). The insertion of an arabic numeral after the grade level indicates that the item is especially pertinent at that specific grade level--e.g,, "elem-6."

In some cases prices were not available. Prices shown are those quoted by publishers and producers. Prices quoted do not include postage and are subject to change.

All items included on this bibliography except 16mm films and some items suggested for inclusion by local school administrative units are displayed in the Materials Review and Evaluation Center at 620 North West Street in Raleigh.

Abisch, Roz, and Boche Kaplan. THE MAKE-IT, PLAY-IT GAME BOOK. Walker & Co., 1975.

Directions for making and playing 23 easy games, such as call toss, color bingo; concentration, straw race, and yarn bowling; step-by-step instructions and diagrams for making games from inexpensive odds and ends which require little supervision--paper towel rolls, shoelaces, drinking straws, cotton balls; illustrated with black-and-white drawings. (This item also appears on the Kindergarten-Early Childhood Education Advisory List:)

Allen, Maury. WHERE HAVE YOU GONE, JOE DIMAGGIO? THE STORY OF AMERICA'S LAST HERO. Dutton, 1975. 222 p. \$7.95. jhs shs

Smooth reading about one of the greatest living baseball players; the Yankee Clipper. has become a "genuine folk hero," yet remains a very private person even to his closest friends; glimpses of an enduring legend through interviews with players, managers, and old friends, concluding with an interview with DiMaggio himself; black-and-white photographs. (This item also appears on the Biography Advisory List.)

American National Red Cross. LIFESAVING: RESCUE AND WATER SAFETY. Doubleday, 1974. 240 p. \$1.80 paper. elem jhs shs

Always a good source for water safety instruction, these Red Cross materials are authoritative and up-to-date; useful supplementary text or main text; excellent for independent reading

Arthur, Lee, et al. SPORTSMATH: HOW IT WORKS. Lothrop, 1975. 96 p. \$5.11. elem jhs

Explains to students the uses of mathematics in sports through descriptions of events in football, baseball, hockey, basketball, and tennis, showing how mathematics is used to produce records in these sports. (This item also appears on the Mathematics Advisory List.)

Balestrino, Philip. FAT AND SKINNY. Crowell, 1975. 33 p. \$5,25. prim elem-4

Adequate though cursory introduction to metabolism and obesity which explains in simple terms what calories are, how metabolism turns food into energy, and why some foods affect some people one way and others another; brief calorie chart with number of calories in a specific food and kinds of activities per hour to burn up those calories; double-spread drawings, most in color. (This item also appears on the Science Advisory List,)

Belton, John, and Joella Cramblit. CARD GAMES. Childrens, 1976. 48 p. \$4.95.

Nine card games presented in simple, step-by-step instructions: Concentration, Thirty-One, Speed, Ninety-Eight, Fan Tan, Crazy Eights, I Doubt It, Kings in the Corner, and Rummy; excellent format; black and red print alternates on the page with clear pen-and-ink drawings, highlighted in red, showing the cards as they would be laid out for various games; well-constructed, durable little book; useful to teach recreational games in physical education classes; also fun for individuals who want to learn more about cardplaying

Berke, Art. UNSUNG HEROES OF THE MAJOR LEAGUES. Random, 1976. 152 p. \$3.69 elem jhs shs

Capsule studies of 10 of baseball's least publicized but most productive members; Oaklanders, Joe Rudi and Billy Williams, and Cincinnati Reds' Tony Perez high light these fitting vignettes capturing the players' images—steady, but unspectacular; possibly only source of information on some of these entries; high-interest/low-vocabulary material for secondary students; black-and-white photographs

Brown, Gene, ed. THE NEW YORK TIMES BOOK OF BASEBALL HISTORY: MAJOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE PAGES OF THE NEW YORK TIMES. Quadrangle, 1975. 327 p. \$12.50. shs

Thorough history of outstanding major league baseball events, highlighted by newspaper clippings and photographs; baseball history from 1870, when major leagues began, to October 3, 1974, when Frank Robinson became major league baseball's first black manager; lists American and National League Pennant winners and Most Valuable Player awards; indexed; every baseball fan will enjoy this book and gain knowledge of the game, it's history, and top players

Busch, Phyllis S. WHAT ABOUT VD? Four Winds, 1976. 114 p. \$6.95. jhs shs

Complete information on venereal diseases, their causes, symptoms, and cures in easy-to-read text; historical perspective offered, adding to readability; syphilis, gonorrhea, other venereal and venereal-related diseases described, along with means of transmission, signs and symptoms of each stage, physicians' method of determining disease's identity, and treatment; two especially interesting chapters deal with VD in history (Henry VIII, Louis XIV), in literature (references in Voltaire, Ibsen, etc.), and newest scientific developments in treating VD; appendix lists other books and pamphlets to read, "hot lines" in 48 states, excellent glossary, and index; not illustrated—a few pen—and—ink diagrams/drawings; useful self—study unit for better pupils; chapters or sections could be selected for concentration; excellent information

Cohen, Joel H. MANNY SANGUILLEN: JOLLY PIRATE. Putnam, 1975. 127 p. \$5.29. elem. jhs

In baseball it's said that the catcher has to be a special breed--Manny Sanguillen is true to that breed; playing in his native Panama, Manny shows his prowess with the bat which, combined with his conspicuous overall athletic ability, compels Pittsburgh Pirates to sign him; enter patient coaching, a healthy attitude, and lots of hard work on Sanguillen's part and . . BINGO . . one of baseball's premier catchers evolves; extensive play-by-play commentary adds to this competent effort. (This item also appears on the Biography Advisory List.)

Cook, Joseph J., and Joseph J. Cook II. FAMOUS FIRSTS IN BASKETBALL. Putnam, 1976. 64 p. \$4.49. elem-6 jhs shs

A concoction utilizing a series of biographical sketches devoted to college and professional basketball milestones and the performers that set them; each profile accompanied by black-and-white photographs; collectively, a good picture of the sport's development; especially suited to high school "reluctant" reader; indexed

Coombs, Charles. BE A WINNER IN BASKETBALL. Morrow, 1975. 126 p. \$4.81. elem jhs

Excellent, easy to read book for teaching elementary and junior high school students the fundamentals of basketball; glossary and index; could be used as an instructional guide in teaching a unit in backetball in physical education classes

Coombs, Charles. BE A WINNER IN TRACK AND FIELD. Morrow, 1976. 128 p. \$4.81. elem jhs shs

A superior in-depth account of track and field fundamentals; explains different events and suggests kinds of training for each, stressing hard, steady work; sprints, relays, hurdles, long-distance runs, long jumps, high jumps, and pole vaults among topics analyzed; attractive, well-designed format; nice print; black-and-white photos; glossary and index; useful physical education teaching aid with groups or individuals; different races and both sexes well represented in photos; excellent content for all physical education programs

Cunningham, Chet. YOUR BIKE: HOW TO KEEP YOUR MOTORCYCLE RUNNING. Putnam, 1975.
126 p. \$6.95. jhs shs

Easy maintenance and repair guide for young motorcycle buffs; black-and-white photographs illustrate instructions for cleaning filters, lubricating oil pump, servicing battery, etc., and making minor repairs; information on accessories and customizing, safe riding attire, safe driving, and choosing the right bike; indexed

Depel, Jim. THE BASEBALL HANDBOOK FOR COACHES AND PLAYERS. Scribner's, 1976. 96 p. \$7.95. jhs-9 shs

Illustrated guide to baseball techniques—hitting, bunting, baserunning, sliding, as well as defense plays; playing field construction and maintenance described; many, many pen-and-ink diagrams; appendix lists baseball associations, records, directions for computing batting and earned-run averages and fielding and slugging percentages

Dickmeyer, Lowell A. A CHILD'S FIRST SOCCER BOOK. Visual Media, 1976. 51 p. \$4.98. \$3.50 paper. prim elem-4

A book on soccer designed especially for the reading and interest levels of the younger child; a story told by a boy about his experiences playing for a soccer team; includes skills necessary to play soccer as well as rules of soccer; well illustrated

Dolan, Edward F., Jr. BASIC FOOTBALL STRATEGY: AN INTRODUCTION FOR YOUNG PLAYERS. Doubleday, 1976. 131 p. \$5.95. elem-6 jhs shs

Up-to-date coverage of both offensive and defensive football tactics; illustrates defensive alignments and their strengths and weaknesses, the wishbone "T" and "I" as well as other offensive formations, basic pass routes, and the kicking game; extremely effective vehicle for enlightening the young player and viewer alike

Donahue, Parnell, M.D., and Helen Capellaro. GERMS MAKE ME SICK: A HEALTH HANDBOOK FOR KIDS. Knopf, 1975. 96 p. \$5.99, \$2.50 paper, prim elem

Good resource book of interesting, useful information presented in a not-toodetailed fashion; factual coverage of variety of diseases, as well as information about germs; most children should enjoy reading this one

Eldred, Vince. TENNIS WITHOUT MISTAKES. Putnam, 1975. 224 p. \$8.95. jhs shs

Tennis professional, Vince Eldred, identifies common errors of players (novice and experienced) and gives valuable tips on how to correct faulty footwork, basic shots (service, forehand, backhand, etc.), how to utilize playing surfaces, singles and doubles tactics, and advice for the left-hander; discusses equipment and dress, taking lessons, and how to practice; excellent resource for teaching tennis in physical education; accurately, interestingly presented with good photographs, illustrations, and explanations

Gault, Clare and Frank PELÉ: THE KING OF SOCCER. Walker & Co., 1975. 62 p. \$5.95. prim-3 elem jhs-7

A vow made at the age of eight to be as good a soccer player as his father, plus an insatiable love for the game, were catalysts in developing a poor Brazilian youth into one of the world's great athletes; fast-paced, action-filled account of legendary Pelé concentrates on his youth, his later career receiving only limited notice; excellent addition to high-interest/low-vocabulary collection and exciting fare for growing numbers of soccer enthusiasts; black-and-white photos and career statistics appended. (This item also appears on the Biography Advisory List.)

Gleasner, Diana C. WOMEN IN SPORTS: SWIMMING. Harvey House, 1975. 63 p. \$4.97. prim-3 elem jhs shs

Describes a variety of swimming events; biographies of five swimmers, including Olympic speed swimmer Shirley Babashoff and marathon swimmer Diana Nyad; shows the hard work and extensive training required to become a champion; points out discriminations suffered by the poor and blacks as well as women; extremely positive role-models for boys and girls; high-interest/low-vocabulary content. (This item also appears on the Advisory List for the Reduction of Sex Bias and the Biography Advisory List.)

Goolagong, Evonne, with Bud Gollins. EWONNE! ON THE MOVE. Dutton, 1975. 190 p. \$8.95. jhs-9 shs

A personable young woman with an unusual set of values emerges from this chatty, first-person account of the ascent of Australian tennis luminary, Evonne Goolagong; diminishing inequities between male and female tennis tours and racial attitudes of people encountered (she's an Aborigine) are just two points candidly discussed; although an occasional, conspicuous lack of continuity troubles her narrative, Miss Goolagong's ability to project her personality and her skillful recounting of her more important matches shore up this appealing effort; of interest to avid tennis fans; black-and-white photographs. (This item also appears on the Biography Advisory List.)

Greenbank, Anthony. A HANDBOOK FOR EMERGENCIES: COMING OUT ALIVE. Doubleday, 1976, 205 p. \$5.95 elem-6 jhs shs

Written by a former Outward Bound instructor, this handbook is especially valuable to those interested in the outdoors; information on quick responses to accidents

and hazards occurring while hiking, canoeing, skiing, sunning, swimming, etc.; animal dangers, such as dogs, snakes, insects, (even swans!), analyzed and cautions offered; good explanations of ways of calling for help (ground-air signals, body signals, tin-can-lid signaling, rocket and flare practice); simple, direct, detailed instructions; some 40 pen-and-ink drawings are adequate if dull; book could use some color--situations depicted cry out for vivid illustration; fine survival guide for anyone interested in outdoor sports and hobbies; better-than-average index

Gregg, Walter H. PHYSICAL FITNESS THROUGH SPORTS AND NUTRITION. Seribner's, 1975. 112 p. \$5.95. elem jhs

Highly readable guide to physical fitness and overall good health for boys and girls 8-to-14 years old or thereabouts; emphasizes combining good eating habits with the right exercises; tests for conditioning and improving the body--muscle strength, speed, agility, endurance; excellent nutritional advice includes food guide selector, sample menus, calories lists, etc., all simplified but sound; text is enthusiastic without being pedantic or condescending; boys and girls are equally represented; many black-and-white drawings and photographs which reinforce content; token racial representation; information necessary for healthful living presented attractively--should help youngsters develop and maintain strong self-images

Griffin, John Q. MOTORCYCLES ON THE MOVE: A BRIEF HISTORY. Lerner, 1976. 51 p/. \$4.95. elem-6 jhs shs

Excellent text and photographs in an above-average little history of the motorcycling craze; traces invention of the motorcycle to Gottlieb Daimler's gasoline-burning, wooden bike (1885), acquainting readers with highlights in the cycle's evolution over the decades; influences of Marion Brando's film, The Wild One, contributions of people like Soichiro Honda, and the current mini-bike popularity are interesting points of departure; fast reading; good quality paper and print; nice photographs of old models and some good action shots in full color; one title in a racing series by Lerner

Gutman, Bill. MODERN BASKETBALL SUPERSTARS. Dodd, 1975, 124 p. \$4.95. elem jhs sh

Capsuled biographies of six basketball stars--Wilt Chamberlain, John Havlicek, Walt Frazier, Dave Cowens, and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar; emphasizes each helete's career; offers some good tips to basketball players; wide margins; dark print well spaced on the page; black-and-white photos; indexed; good high-interest/low-vocabulary title

Harris, Merv. THE LONELY HEROES: PROFESSIONAL BASKETBALL'S GREAT CENTERS. Viking, 1975. 230 p. \$8.95. jhs shs

Commendable effort to reveal other dimensions of 13 talented, well-established centers of recent times in professional basketball; discusses professionals chronologically from Bill Russell to Bob McAdoo, dispelling misconceptions the public holds regarding some of these so-called prima donnas; examines several cases of "magnificent fallures"--i.e., Jim McDaniels, former ABA Carolina Cougar--who never justified their "can't miss" label, as well as possible greats of near future; black-and-white photos

Haskins, James. DOCTOR J: A BIOGRAPHY OF JULIUS ERVING. Doubleday, 1975. 88 p. \$4.95. elem jhs

One of the more perceptive looks at talented, personable basketball specialist, Julius Erving; Haskins, like most of his fraternity when expounding on the exploits of Dr. "J", is often more press agent than objective biographer, but this one will suffice admirably until, if ever, an author appears who's completely objective toward this intriguing subject; simple, untrying, made-to-order for "reluctant" readers; black-and-white photos; glossary of terms appended. (This item also appears on the Biography Advisory List.)

Hauser, Hillary. WOMEN IN SPORTS: SCUBA DIVING. Harvey House, 1976. 79 p. \$4.97. prim-3 elem jhs shs

Illustrates various undersea careers: actress, photographer, scientist, aquanaut; includes husband and wife team who filmed live-shark segment for movie, <u>Jaws</u>; points out discrimination women divers have faced historically; excellent role-models; enjoyable for boys and girls; author knows her subject matter; numerous black-and-white action photographs; good "reluctant reader" content. (This item also appears on the Biography Advisory List and the Advisory List for the Reduction of Sex Bias.)

Higdon, Hal. SHOWDOWN AT DAYTONA. Putnam, 1976. 159 p. \$5.95. elem jhs-7

The Daytona 500 stock car race in exciting, lap-by-lap commentary interspersed with interesting sidelights on participants' background; insights into strategy and obscure racing proceedings; no need to be a racing buff to enjoy this well-written account; black-and-white photographs

Honig, Donald. BASEBALL BETWEEN THE LINES: BASEBALL IN THE '40S AND '50S AS TOLD BY THE MEN WHO PLAYED IT. Coward, 1976. 252 p. \$9.95. shs

Absorbing interviews with 19 players whose careers spanned the '40's and '50's, including Ted Williams, Lou Gehrig, Joe DiMaggio, Ralph Kiner, Enos Slaughter, Robin Roberts, and Monte Irvin; baseball buffs will enjoy this look back in history; black-and-white photographs; indexed; some profanity, but only what you would expect from a group of dedicated old pro's reminiscing about their favorite sport

Horvath, Joan. WHAT BOYS WANT TO KNOW ABOUT GIRLS/WHAT GIRLS WANT TO KNOW ABOUT BOYS. Nelson, 1976. 192 p. \$6.95. jhs shs

Interviews with eight boys and eight girls between ages of 12 and 16 who speak out candidly concerning opposite sex; book briefly discusses anatomy and physiology in first two chapters, then assumes interview method in each chapter thereafter; the young people ponder emotions and attitudes manifested by opposite sex and how to react to them, as well as voice doubts and queries—i.e., boys should not cry? how many of their friends have really had sexual relationships and how many are just talking? Some discussion of masturbation, sexual daydreams, and sexual intercourse, though text sticks chiefly to perceptions and opinions of general conduct; overall impression given by book is middle—class, white, and predictable; nevertheless, issues are certainly pertinent and approach is different; useful role—playing material; valuable for guidance collections; preview before purchase

Hyland, Ann. ENDURANCE RIDING. Lippincott, 1975, 159 p. \$9.95, elem-6 jbs shs

Comprehensive handbook for beginners who want to get started in long-distance riding events; step-by-step practical guidelines for choosing, training,

conditioning, and riding competitive horses; details on organizing and running a competition and a photo section illustrating author's instructions

Isaacs, Neil D. ALL THE MOVES: A HISTORY OF COLLEGE BASKETBALL. Lippincott, 1975. 319 p. \$12.95. jhs-9 shs

In prose so descriptive one can almost smell the gym's wax and sweat, Dr. Isaacs relates basketball history from two peach baskets in 1891 to today's sprawling ifield houses and billion-dollar "business"; the great players, coaches, teams, and games of yesteryear and today scrutinized, their contributions noted in appealing, highly readable fashion; profusely illustrated with black-and-white photographs; indexed

- Jackson, Robert B. FISK OF FENWAY PARK: NEW ENGLAND'S FAVORITE CATCHER. Walck, 1976. 71 p. \$5.95. elem jhs shs
- Entertaining reading on Red Sox star, Carlton "Pudge" Fisk, New England's "favorite" baseball catcher; records exciting moments from 1975 games when Red Sox rebounded to within an ace of capturing World Series title; easy reading; black-and-white photos
- Jensen, Helen. GAMES FOR HOME, TRAVEL, AND PARTIES. Golden, 1975. 64 p. \$4.95. prim elem

Explains and illustrates several activities and games for children; divided into "At-Home Games," "Travel Games," and "Party Games" with such old standbys as Tic-Tac-Toe and checkers, plus some new games like Laughing All the Way and On Being an Ant; strictly recreational and designed frequently for only a handful of participants; elaborately illustrated in pen and ink with touches of bright colors

Jones, Hettie. HOW TO EAT YOUR ABC'S: A BOOK ABOUT VITAMINS. Four Winds, 1976. 84 p. \$7.95. prim-3 elem

Basic information about importance of vitamins for life support and necessity of proper diet for growth and health; discusses each vitamin individually and gives brief statement about the vitamin's discovery, the body's need for the vitamin, how it affects the body, abnormalities/diseases related to its deficiency, and vitamin's importance in relation to other vitamins; practice exercises in planning a balanced diet presented in "problem-solving" format. (This item also appears on the Science Advisory List.)

Kalb, Jonah. THE EASY BASEBALL BOOK. Houghton, 1976. 49 p. \$5.95. prim

Long awaited, easy-to-read baseball manual addressed to 6-8-year-olds when good, sound instruction is crucial; short snappy sentences and simple, instructive line drawings illustrate proper techniques of hitting, throwing, and catching; common mistakes listed and possible remedies suggested

Valuable film on bicycle safety covering a broad spectrum all the way from choosing the correct bike to defensive driving; provides some detail on preventive maintenance, safety devices, traffic law, and common hazards to bicyclists; very realistic accident scenes should impress students; useful information for youngest through oldest public school audiences

BICYCLING FOR PHYSICAL FITNESS, HEALTH, AND RECREATION. 16mm. 14 min. sd. color \$220. AIMS, 1975. elem-6 jhs shs

Points out advantages of bicycle riding especially for people whose work restricts physical activity but for others as well; shows how use of cycle builds fitness, promotes weight loss, and increases stamina and endurance; discusses safety factors; good content for health and physical education classes or for any group interested in cycling

BIKE-WISE, TO BE SURE. 16mm. 14 min. sd. guide color \$210. Centron, 1974, elem jhs shs

Typical of many other bicycle safety films but nicely done overview of safe cycling procedures; begins with tips on choosing the proper type and size of bicycle and continues with simple preventive maintenance procedures; addresses special bicycle hazards, such as night riding, negotiating intersections, and dangers around parked cars; emphasizes that bicycles are vehicles which must obey traffic laws and rules of the road; useful resource for K-9 traffic safety program or as basis for bicycle safety unit developed by individual teachers.

BIKES ARE BACK. 16mm. 9 min. sd. color \$140, AIMS, 1974. elem-6 jhs shs

A short film presenting sensible advice and suggestions for bike riders; discusses accidents, number of bikers killed, etc., giving suggestions for avoiding accidents; shows where and how to ride, right of way considerations, and other factors to ensure safety; illustrates safety measures for night riding, such as wearing light-colored clothes and mounting lights on bike and biker; demonstrates ways to secure parked bike; narrated chiefly by young adults; useful for safety education classes; no guide; consider more comprehensive safety films along with this one when purchasing

BUS TRIPPING: AS A SECONDARY SCHOOL BUS PASSENGER, 16mm, 9 min. sd. guide color \$150. AIMS, 1976. elem jhs

Seeks to prove that each student passenger is responsible for assisting the bus driver in assuring school bus safety; safety tips from student's walking to bus stop, waiting for bus, boarding bus, riding bus, to leaving bus and evacuating bus in emergencies; accurate, well-produced information which should be used only to introduce the subject of school bus safety or as a summary following other class activities—too brief for comprehensive purposes

BUS TRIPPING: AS AN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL BUS PASSENGER. 16mm. 11 min. sd. guide color \$180. AIMS, 1976. prim elem

School bus safety, covering walking to bus stop, behavior at bus stop, boarding bus, riding behavior, and unloading; emphasizes passenger's responsibility to assist driver in providing a safe trip; "do's" and "don't's"--not leaning out windows, refraining from horseplay, etc.--stressed; right and wrong behavior for different age levels shown; common sense and courtesy defined as basis of all rules; useful preview or summary of unit on school bus safety

EVERYONE'S A WINNER: HEART-LUNG ENDURANCE. 16mm. 15 min. sd. guide color \$210. BFA, 1975. elem-6 jhs shs

Excellent presentation on developing heart-lung endurance which shows unique testing methods used to determine a person's endurance capacity and reviews several activities specifically helpful in prolonging one's endurance--running, jogging, swimming; citer explanation of heart and lung functions in relation to physical performance

EVERYTHING ABOUT BICYCLES. 16mm. 15 min. sd. guide color \$200. Pyramid, 1976. prim elem

Animated film on bicycle safety with appeal for lower grade levels (K-6); covers bike maintenance, rules of the road, and defensive driving on the part of the bicyclist; some bike history and development; useful introductory film for acquainting students with broad picture of bike safety.

FIRE SAFETY WITH HARV AND MARV. 16mm. 11 min. sd. guide color \$150. Higgins, 1976.

A fireman discusses "good" and "bad" fires-good ones bringing warmth, cooking food, etc., bad ones destroying property and taking lives-with an elementary class; discussed in depth are clothing fires and house fires; fireman demonstrates how cloth burns, how clothes catch on fire, and how children can extinguish a clothing fire on themselves or someone else; also discusses how to escape a house fire, how to plan an escape route, how to wake other family members, and how to report fire to fire department; Harv and Marv, animated characters, listen with the real-life children gathered in fire station for lecture and demonstration; fine material for acquainting young children with basic rules of self-protection in case of fire

FIRST AID ACTION. 16mm. 21 min. sd. guide color \$320. AIMS, 1975. jhs she

Developed cooperatively with American Red Cross, this film discusses and illustrates first aid actions; demonstrates techniques to revive a drowning person, stop bleeding, treat second— and third-degree burns, protect broken bones before setting, help victims suffering sudden illnesses, and treat poison victims; a very good, informative film for almost any audience; interspersed with scenes of victims being treated are short segments of serious accidents showing how, when, and where they may happen; harrated by Burt Reynolds

FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS. 16mm. 16 min. sd. guide color \$230. Handel, 1975. elem jhs shs

Vividly shows the fire potential of many liquids found in the home with special emphasis on gasoline; explains fire "triangle" (elements of air, heat, and fuel) necessary before a fire can occur; demonstrates simple fire fighting techniques to combat small household fires; points out dangers created by poor

FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS. (Cont'd).

handling and incorrect use of gasoline and other combustible liquids--paint thinner, insecticides; good dramatizations show exactly how to extinguish fires (techniques for stopping a grease fire, for example); excellent information in a format that can reach a wide audience

HABITS OF HEALTH: KEEPING IN TOP SHAPE. 16mm. 13 min. sd. guide color \$185. BFA, 1975. prim-3 elem jhs-7

Introduces young students to good health habits based on rest, cleanliness, balanced diet, and exercise; tips on hygiene, posture, advantages of proper lighting when studying, and hazards of indiscriminate television viewing; Presidential Physical Fitness Award shown and explained; excellent racial representation among youngsters depicted; good elementary school health class resource

MOTORCYCLE SAFETY AND COURTESY IN TRAFFIC, 16mm, 23 min, sd. guide color \$325. Centron, 1973. shs

Motorcycle safety with emphasis on proper techniques of learning to ride, cycle lane position, seeing and being seen by auto drivers, protective wearing apparel, motorcycle courtesies, natural and man-made dangers to cycles (manhole covers, wet leaves, rocks, gravel), and cautions to observe when carrying a passenger; information is factual, accurate, but voluminous; useful introduction and/or review; valuable addition to any safety education unit or regular driver education class

RAPE ALERT. 16mm. 17 min. sd. color \$260, AIMS, 1975. jhs-9 shs

Brief dramatizations of situations involving rape or potential rapists, along with methods of preventing or dealing with these situations; specific precautions outlined include carrying a key ring with keys inserted tightly between each finger of one's hand (as a weapon), as well as an athletic whistle attached to the ring; other tips warn against leaving garages unlocked so that intruders can seize one's own tools to break in, hitchhiking, inviting strangers in, etc.; convincing dramatizations are realistic but omit gory details; excellent multiracial representation; objective content; film's low-keyed approach balances the few moments of violence dramatized; useful suggestions for rape prevention

RAPE: THE RIGHT TO RESIST, 16mm, 16 min, sd, guide color \$250. AIMS, 1975 shs

Seeks to dispel myth that women are weaker sex; urges women to prepare themselves physically and mentally before, and in case, an attack occurs; stresses that flight and screams are best defenses but also demonstrates some physical defense techniques—striking the adam's apple, nose, and eyes, kicking groin area; presented in an open, frank manner

SKATEBOARD SAFETY. 16mm. 13 min. sd. color \$180. Pyramid, 1976. prim elem jhs

Excellent film devoted to precautions for skateboard enthusiasts in order to lessen the chance of serious injuries; discusses proper clothing, such as shoes, padding, helmets, gloves, etc., and proper places to skateboard; advises skaters to check both the board and the area to be used before skating; as skateboarding increases in popularity, films of this kind are a must in the classroom

THE SOAP BOX DERBY SCANDAL. 16mm, 24 min. sd. color \$295. Weston Woods, 1975. elem jhs

Encourages thoughtful reconsideration of whole concept of competition, showing how overemphasis on winning usually invites cheating; based on recent Soap Box Derby scandal at Akron, Ohio, in which the national winner's car was found, upon inspection, to have been built according to illegal specifications which were the brainchild of the winning boy's uncle; possibly too much stress on one "who got caught"—possibly too much rebuke of adults; definitely requires pre-viewing activities and much follow-up; useful in occupational education and health/physical education classes; raises many questions about winning, losing, cheating, guilt. SOAP, SCENTS AND THE HARD, HARD SELL. 16mm. 16 min. sd. guide color \$225. Higgins, 1975. jhs shs

Well-done presentation on good personal hygiene habits and gimmicky traps set by producers of expensive, highly advertised shampoos, deodorants, soaps, etc.; also stresses rest, exercise, and balanced diet; filmed in brilliant outdoor setting depicting teen-agers at camp who demonstrate proper way to shampoo one's hair, scrub and manicure nails, soap and shower, brush teeth, etc.; excellent de-mythicizing of highly touted commercial products (brand names shown) which claim to perform-impossible miracles--i.e., "herbal essence" shampoos, super deodorants, "sex appeal" toothpastes; appealing young people narrate much of the film; outstanding sex/racial representation among teen-aged participants; wholesome, nondidactic, and thorough. Colorful, exciting, informative film easily employed by teachers as effective guide to teaching soccer; fundamental skills and strategy necessary during an active game are well presented; those unfamiliar with soccer would most likely be motivated to join the "soccer generation"

WATER SAFETY: IT'S ELEMENTARY. 16mm. 12 min. sd. color \$180. AIMS, 1974. prim elem

Basic safety rules for young children in areas such as ocean waters, streams, lakes, and pools; covers safety precautions for passengers in boats, as well as "do's" and "don't's" while playing near water and around pool areas; water hazards depicted well visually though narration is not gripping for younger children; competent presentation

WINTER DRIVING TACTICS. 16mm. 14 min. sd. color \$220. AIMS, 1975. jhs-9 shs

Good, clear, detailed information on driving in hazardous winter weather; a group of travelers, isolated by a severe storm, demonstrate winter driving skills applied to snow, ice, skids, and the use of chains

YOUNG WOMEN IN SPORTS. 16mm. 16 min. sd. guide color \$215. BFA, 1974. jhs-9 shs

Four young women--swimmer, discus thrower, sprinter, and acrobat--discuss their specialties, how they practice, what they feel; emphasis on need for genuine interest, stamina, and perseverance essential to athletic success; inspirational,

motivational; shows women equally as capable as men and reveals the rewards that inspire young women to become professional competitors; for the already complete film collection; consider needs before purchasing

WHAT ARE YOU GOING TO DO ABOUT ALCOHOL? 2 color filmstrips, two 12" disc recordings 33 1/3 rpm, guide \$48.50. with cassette tapes \$48.50. Guidance Assocs., 1975. elem jhs

Two-part sound filmstrip which seeks to provide an understanding of the effects of alcohol, modern attitudes toward its use, and how it affects the lives of individuals; underscores the fact that problems associated with alcohol are caused by misuse and that drinking does not necessarily lead to problems; Part I informs students about alcohol and its physical and psychological effects; Part II presents problems associated with drinking: peer pressure, social attitudes, and effects on family; each scene followed by discussion questions to stimulate interest and response; excellent for small and large groups

WHAT ARE YOU GOING TO DO ABOUT SMOKING? 2 color filmstrips, two 12" disc recordings 33 1/3 rpm, guide \$48.50. with cassette tapes \$48.50.

Guidance Assocs., 1975. elem jhs

Two-part sound filmstrip designed to help students make their own decisions to smoke or not to smoke; action centers on debate between Flash, public relations man for cigarette industry, and Tom and Denise, two 13-year-old prospective smokers; in Part I Flash presents various arguments (some are absurd) for cigarette smoking, which Tom and Denise repeatedly squelch; in Part II Tom and Denise are made aware of how smoking damages the body's respiratory and circulatory systems; excellent for small and large groups
