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ABSTRACT

This study summarizes scholastic performance of Los Angeles City College (LACC) fall 1977 entering students according to last school attended prior to registering at LACC. Data were derived from a district computer center printout, "Grade Listing of Freshmen Fall 1977", which listed all students' names, units attempted and completed, grade points and grade point averages (GPA), grouped in terms of last school attended. The nearly 15,000 applicants included students from schools in 38 California counties, all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and over 100 foreign countries. Only 48% of applicants completed work at LACC during fall 1977. The average student who finished some work, completed 7.5 units and had a semester GPA of 2.558. GPA of students from local "feeder" high schools ranged from 1.881 to 2.785; four schools averaged above 2.7, while the remaining schools showed GPA below the overall 2.558 average. Among students showing higher than average GPA were transfers from 13 local community colleges, three Southern California state universities, the University of California at Los Angeles, and the University of Southern California, students from 28 out of 34 states, and from 20 of 27 foreign countries. PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

Following a request from one of the local high schools to provide information on the number of students who entered L.A.C.C. and some indications as to their scholastic performance, this study was undertaken to investigate the general question of performance of L.A.C.C. entrants according to last school attended prior to entering L.A.C.C.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

The District computer center provided a printout of their program #D 4084-003, Grade Listing of Freshmen Fall 1977, which listed names of all entering students (day and evening), together with units attempted, units completed, grade points and grade point averages, grouped according to last school attended prior to entering L.A.C.C. Averages for units attempted, units completed, and grade point average were given for each group. An analysis of this printout provided the findings described below.

FINDINGS

Schools last attended by Fall 1977 L.A.C.C. entrants included public high schools, private high schools, community colleges, and both public and private four-year institutions. Over 700 sources were listed, including schools in 38 California counties, in all fifty states and the District of Columbia, and in over a hundred foreign countries. The tables that follows summarize performance by type of institution or area indicated. California schools are summarized by type of institution, with a detailed breakdown for twenty local "feeder" high schools. Schools outside of California are

listed according to state or country. With the exception of the table listing the twenty local high schools, tables include only those schools or areas which totaled 25 or more entrants. The term "entrant" should be more appropriately labeled "applicant" as all students who completed the application process for Fall 1977 are included whether or not they attended a class.

Table 1 lists for comparative purposes the mean raw scores on the Fall 1977 Guidance Examination* (the Survey of Reading Achievement, California Test Norm) for students from each school who took the exam. Also presented is a correlation matrix showing Pearson correlation coefficients between each pair of variables in the table.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

This study summarizes performance of L.A.C.C. Fall 1977 entrants according to last school attended prior to attending L.A.C.C. Following are some observations on the findings of the study:

- (1) The nearly 15,000 applicants (both day and evening) included students who last attended school in 38 California counties, all fifty states and the District of Columbia, and over a hundred foreign countries.
- (2) Less than half (48%) of the new students who applied for admission to L.A.C.C. for the Fall 1977 semester completed work during that semester. Previous studies indicate that about 20% of those who apply do not attend class. Thus, it appears that about 40% of the entering students who started classes in Fall 1977 completed no work.
- (3) The average student who completed some work completed about $7\frac{1}{2}$ units and had a semester GPA of 2.558.
- (4) In considering students from twenty local "feeder" high schools, average GPA's ranged from 1.881 to 2.785. Four schools (Eagle Rock, Franklin, Marshall, Fairfax) averaged above 2.7. The remaining schools each showed GPA's below the overall average of 2.558.
- (5) Correlation coefficients show a clear relationship between performance on the Guidance Exams (a reading test) and percent completing the semester and also between Guidance Exam score and GPA. A lower but still positive correlation is shown between Guidance Exam performance and average units attempted. Reading proficiency is clearly related to both academic performance and retention.
- (6) At least 25 or more students transferred from each of 13 local community colleges, three Southern California state universities, UCLA and USC. Transfers from all the four year institutions and seven of the community colleges showed GPA's above the overall average.
- (7) Twenty-five or more non-California students came from each of 34 states. Twenty-eight of them showed GPA's above the overall average.
- (8) Twenty-seven foreign countries sent 25 or more entrants. Twenty of these showed GPA's above the overall average.

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
