Comparative



analyses using samples of American and Uruguayan infants and additional data from other studies of American newborns led to the conclusion that light levels of obstetrical medication do not appear to have significant effects on meanatal behavior. It is noted, however, that this conclusion may well be be qualified by some initial population differences, by the measurements commonly used in the studies reviewed, and possibly by critical cut-off points dividing the levels of medication that will and will not uffect meanatal behavior.

The clearinghouses, each focusing on a specific area of education (such as early childhood, teacher education, languages and linguistics), are located at universities and other institutions throughout the United States.

Each clearinghouse staff searches systematically to acquire current, significant documents relevant to education. These research studies, conference proceedings, curriculum guides, program descriptions and evaluations, and other publications are abstracted and indexed in Resources in Education (RIE) a monthly journal. RIE is available at libraries, or it may be ordered from the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington D.C. 20402. The documents themselves are reproduced on microfiche by the ERIC Document Reproduction Service for distribution to libraries and individuals (see preceding page).

Another ERIC publication is <u>Current Index to Journals in Education (CIJE)</u>, a monthly guide to periodical literature which cites articles in more than 700 journals and magazines in the field of education. Most citations include annotations.
