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ABSTRACT

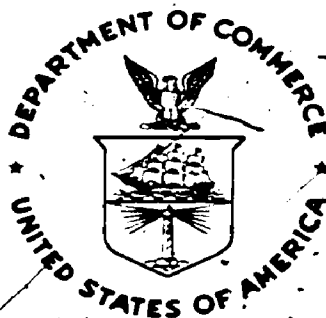
Since 1967 the Economic Development Administration (EDA) has carried out an Indian program that emphasized economic development of Indian reservations and trust lands. In the past 12 years Indian tribes in 32 states have received community and industrial development grants to assist them in developing a viable economic base on their lands. Tribes in Arizona have received the greatest amount of assistance with \$113,263,174 awarded in the period from August 26, 1965 to September 30, 1977. New Mexico tribal groups received \$37,927,795, and Indians in Washington received \$37,467,572. Indians in Massachusetts received the smallest amount of assistance: \$146,050. EDA grants were made for such projects as planning and impact studies, water and sewer systems, tourism facilities, industrial parks, and community facilities such as fire stations, community centers, and health centers. Assistance was also given to national Indian groups for conferences, training programs, studies, and other types of activities, including those related to industrial development. In addition to listing the total Indian project funding by state for the 12 year period, this document itemizes the amounts and kinds of assistance given to specific tribes in each state. It also lists the amounts and kinds of aid awarded to the national level projects. (DS)

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FOREWORD

The American Indian is known today as the poorest segment within the population of the United States. Although the Indian tribes have a land base unlike any other ethnic group, their annual incomes are far below and their unemployment rates are far above any other group of citizens of this country.

Beginning in 1967, the Economic Development Administration developed an Indian program with special emphasis on economic development on Indian reservations and trust lands, which also includes community and industrial development. The direction of this program encompasses all of the Agency's programs.

A listing of all projects approved by EDA for Indian tribes and groups as of September 30, 1977, indicates the vital mission this Agency carries on in assisting the Indian tribes to develop a viable economic base on their land. It will take time for the total impact of these projects to be felt, as identified in employment opportunities, improved living conditions, and vital community activities.

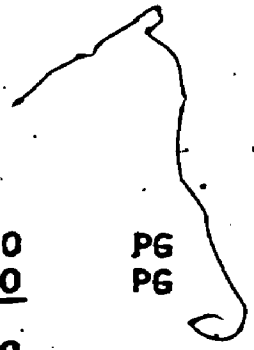
