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ABSTRACT

As the basis for planning the University of Texas Liberal Arts Career Symposium, the Overall Coordination Committee assessed freshmen through seniors' self-reported post-graduate plans, career interests, and need for job-hunting/career planning services. A questionnaire was completed by 3,735 liberal arts and fine arts students. Major survey findings were that (1) two-thirds of the seniors reported considering graduate school, with percentages by college ranging from a low of 56% in natural sciences to a high of 81% in social and behavioral sciences; (2) 85% of seniors indicated they did not have a job lined up after graduation; this percentage varied from 78% in general and comparative studies to 89% in fine arts; (3) although career field interests differed by college, greatest interest areas for the total sample were education, health, and social services-related careers; (4) students in general and comparative studies appeared to be considering the broadest range of possible career fields; fine arts students seemed more narrowly focused; (5) 60% of the total sample wanted career/job information particularly in the employment outlook area; 28% requested help in choosing a career; (6) nearly half the seniors indicated a need for job-hunting assistance; and (7) post-graduation plans and indicated needs for career planning assistance varied by major. 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## INTRODUCTION

An important aspect of planning any student services intervention should be an assessment of students' needs for that service. To this end, the Overall Coordination Committee for the 1978 University of Texas Liberal Arts Career Symposium decided to survey undergraduate Liberal Arts (Colleges of Social & Behavioral Sciences, Natural Sciences, Humanities, General & Comparative Studies) and Fine Arts students concerning their post-graduate plans, their interest in meeting representatives from various career areas, and their self-perceived need for job-hunting/career planning services.

The Career Concerns Survey (see Appendix A) was distributed as part of the fee payment procedure during 1978 Spring Preregistration. Three thousand seven hundred thirty-five students completed usable questionnaires during registration. The data were then coded by the Career Choice Information Center staff for computer analysis.

The purpose of this report is to present the results of this survey. Given the size of the sample, the survey represents perhaps the most comprehensive assessment of University of Texas Liberal Arts students' career concerns to date.

The questionnaire has been divided into three major sections: areas of career interest, post-graduation plans, and the need for career planning/job-hunting assistance. Each question has been analyzed by college and classification level. Therefore, it is possible to determine, for example, the number and percentage of seniors in Humanities who are interested in Government careers. In addition, twelve of the largest majors were selected for individual analysis. Consequently, for example, the career plans of history majors can be compared with those of Biology majors.

## SAMPLE CHARACTERISTICS

Before presenting the survey results, the characteristics of the sample will be described. Table 1 presents the sample breakdown by college. The total enrollment of each college is also shown, for comparative purposes. Twenty-eight percent of the total number of students enrolled in Liberal Arts and Fine Arts Colleges participated in the survey. As in the University as a whole, students in Natural Sciences and Social and Behavioral Sciences are over-represented in this sample.

Table 2 shows the sample breakdown by classification level. This table indicates that upperclassmen and underclassmen are fairly evenly represented in this sample.

## SURVEY DESCRIPTION & ANALYSIS

### Career Interests Questions:

The questionnaire included a section that assessed career interests, as given below:

*REPRESENTATIVES FROM DIFFERENT CAREER AREAS WILL BE AT THE CAREER SYMPOSIUM. WHICH AREAS ARE THE MOST RELEVANT TO YOUR JOB INTERESTS? CHECK YOUR TOP THREE.*

- Paralegal*
- Industry (Circle specifics: petro-chemical, pharmaceutical, \_\_\_\_\_)*
- Business (Circle specifics: real estate, management, sales, banking)*
- Social Services*
- Health Care*
- Education (Circle specifics: teaching, research)*
- Communications (Circle specifics: publishing, advertising, RFP, translation)*
- Government (Circle specifics: local, state, federal)*
- Arts (Circle specifics: performing, technical, museum work)*
- Other fields of interest: \_\_\_\_\_*

Since students were asked to limit their choices to three career fields, it is possible that this survey underrepresents the range of career interests among Liberal Arts students. However, it does reflect students' major areas of interests.

For the areas with subareas listed, students were asked to mark the subarea of interest. Many times students checked the general career fields, without circling a subarea. This response probably reflects failure to follow the directions, although in some cases the students may have been indicating an interest in the general field but not in the specific subareas listed. All students marking the general field, but not circling a specific subarea, have been included in the "general" category on all tables.

### Post-Graduation Plans Questions:

Students were asked:

*ARE YOU CONSIDERING GOING TO GRADUATE SCHOOL?     Yes     No*

*Do you have a job lined up after you graduate? \_\_\_\_\_*

Because of the way the question about graduate school was worded, students may have responded positively if they were ever considering going to graduate school, not just if they planned to enter graduate school immediately after graduation. Results should be reviewed with this consideration.

Need For Career Planning/Job-Hunting Assistance Questions:

Students were asked:

*DO YOU NEED?*

- Help in choosing your career*
  - Information about your career/job area (Circle specifics: employment outlook, training, qualifications)*
  - Job-Hunting Skills (Circle specifics: how to write a resume, how to make the most of your interview, determining specific places you might be hired)*
- What else?* \_\_\_\_\_

Again, students who checked one of the last two categories, but did not circle a specific subcategory have been included under the "general" category in the following tables.

Analysis By Selected Majors:

In addition to the analyses by college and classification, responses were analyzed for twelve Liberal Arts majors. To insure adequate sample size, the largest majors in each college were selected for this analysis. The following table lists the selected majors, sample sizes, and comparison with total enrollment in these majors. (See Table 3, next page.)

## RESULTS & DISCUSSION

### Career Interests Questions:

Interest in the nine career areas listed in this survey varied considerably from college to college. (See Table 4.) For example, over a third of the Humanities students indicated interest in Communications (particularly in publishing and translation), while less than 10% of the Natural Science students expressed interest in this career field. Close to half the Natural Science students were interested in health careers, but less than 20% of students in the other four colleges expressed interest in this career field.

The most popular career fields (see Table 5) among students in Social and Behavioral Sciences were Government and Social Services. Among Natural Science students, Health careers were most popular. Careers in Education and Communication were the fields most frequently cited by Humanities students while Art careers were most popular among Fine Arts students.

Students in General and Comparative Studies appeared to be considering the broadest range of career options. There were no one or two areas of greatest interest, as there were among students in the other colleges. Instead, each of the career fields listed here was cited by at least one-fifth of students in this concentration.

Table 6 summarizes interest in career areas by classification. The amount of change in career interests between classifications is remarkably slight. This suggests that students do not tend to modify their general career interests from their freshman through their senior year.

A report following up the 1977 graduating class of Social and Behavioral Sciences majors, "The Class of '77: One Year Later"\*, offered some interesting post-graduation comparative data. (See Table 7.) For instance, the first employer of 48% of those surveyed was a business firm,

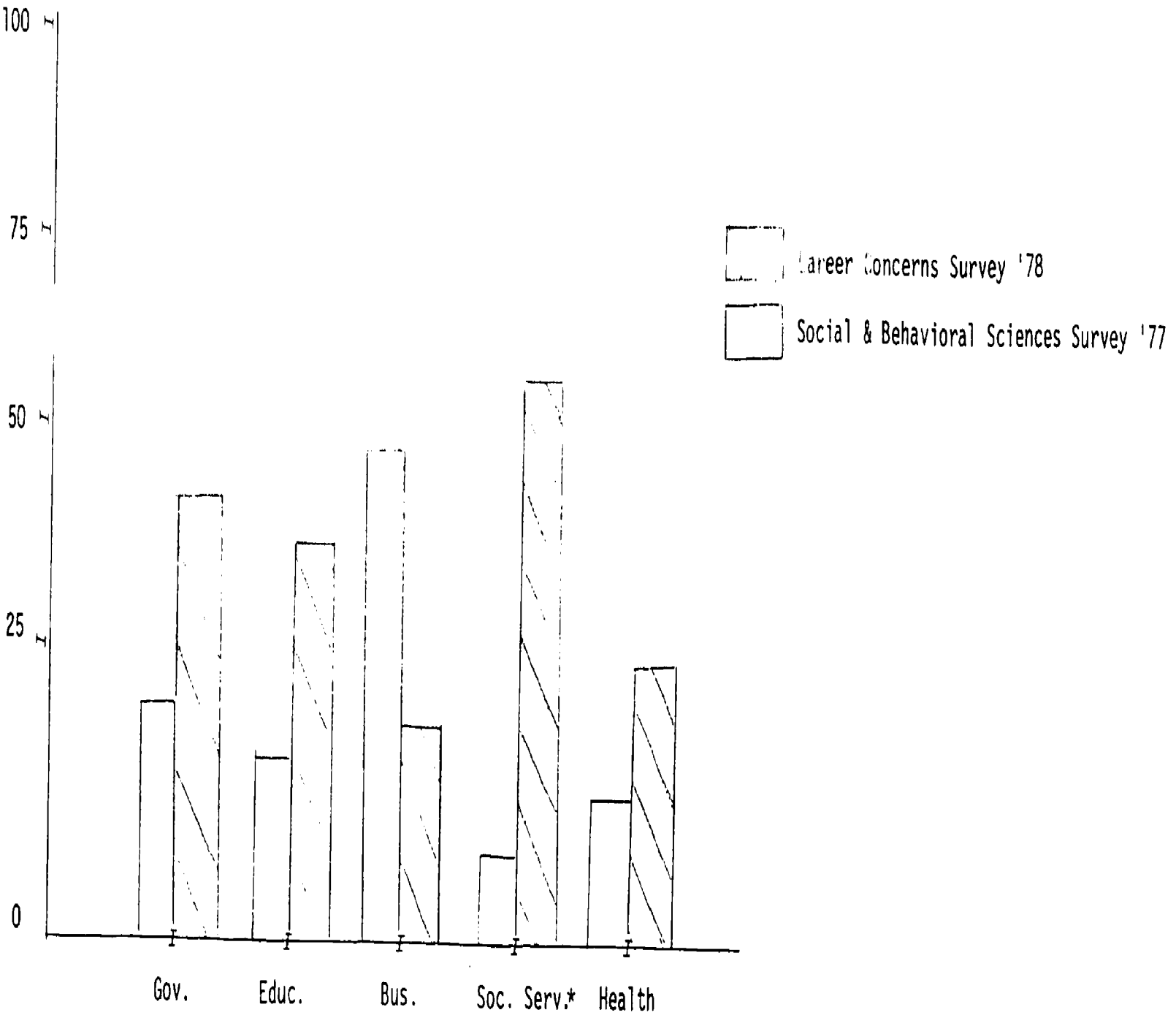

followed by 19% employed by a government agency, 13% by an educational institution. In contrast, the 3 most popular career areas of Social and Behavioral Sciences seniors in the Career Concerns Survey were: Social Sciences, Government, and Education.

What process occurs between the time of stated career interests and first-time employment? If students attain their first job in fields different than their areas of interest (as the comparative data from these two surveys suggest), is this done by choice and is it affected by availability of jobs? There are programmatic implications for assisting students in making this transition in a more knowledgeable and satisfying way. (See Appendix B for Tables.)

#### Post-Graduation Plans Questions:

Eighty-five percent of the seniors in this sample indicated that they had not yet secured a job, post-graduation. (See Table 8.) This finding is not surprising, since these data were collected in December, five months before most students graduate. However, these results do suggest that many students could benefit from interventions aimed at increasing their job-hunting skills and their contacts with employers. Thus, the effort involved in organizing the career symposium appears to be justified, in terms of the needs of the potential target audience.

Two-thirds of the seniors reported that they were considering graduate school. (See Table 9.) This percentage varied by college, from a low of 56% in Natural Sciences to a high of 81% in Social and Behavioral Sciences. It is interesting to note that the percentage considering graduate school is roughly similar across classification levels: 69% of the Freshmen, 66% of the Sophomores, 69% of the Juniors and 68% of the Seniors. Apparently an interest in graduate school is not something which develops toward the end of undergraduate years, but exists throughout college.

Although 81% of the seniors in Social and Behavioral Sciences marked a graduate school interest in this survey, only 36% of those surveyed in the Social and Behavioral Sciences follow-up report (see page 10)

gave their status as a student in graduate, law and health-related graduate institutions. The graduate school application process usually begins a year in advance, so the December Career Concerns Survey timing probably reflects a serious interest in graduate school by the seniors in the sample. If it can be assumed that '78 graduates are similar to '77 graduates in this regard, then it appears that many Social and Behavioral Sciences seniors who are considering graduate school do not attend.

These comparative data suggest further consideration of students' graduate school planning. Programs on application process or the contingency plans may be particularly helpful. (See Appendix C for Tables.)

Need for Career Planning/Job-Hunting Assistance:

Students were asked if they needed help in choosing a career, finding information about career areas, or developing job-hunting skills. As expected, there was considerable variance in response to this question by class. One third of the Freshmen, but only 21% of the Seniors indicated they needed career planning assistance. In contrast, 35% of the Freshmen, compared with 48% of the Seniors, checked job-hunting assistance. Among those citing a specific area of job-hunting, how to contact potential employers was cited more frequently than how to write a resume or how to interview. Career information was of interest to over half the students at all classification levels. This emphasis on career information may reflect the common belief that career decisions should be based largely on external factors, like the job market.

There were also interesting differences in response to these questions by college. (See Table 10.) Social and Behavioral Science students indicated the greatest interest in career planning information, particularly in the area of job outlook. Students in Fine Arts and Natural Sciences were least interested in career-planning assistance. However, Fine Arts students checked a need for job-hunting assistance more frequently than students in any other college. Looking only at Seniors, 63% of the Fine Arts students checked need for job-hunting

assistance, compared with 50% of the Humanities students, 49% of the Social and Behavioral Science students, 47% of the Natural Science students, and 45% of General and Comparative Studies students. (See Appendix D for Tables.)

#### Analysis by Selected Majors:

The distribution of responses was also analyzed for 12 of the largest Liberal Arts majors: Biology, Computer Science, English, Geology, Government, History, Interior Design, Mathematics, Plan II, Psychology, Spanish, and Studio Art. There was considerable variance in post-graduation plans across majors. For example, 89% of Plan II students, compared with 24% of Interior Design students, were considering graduate school. Over 90% of students in Biology, English, Plan II, Psychology, Spanish, and Studio Art did not have a job lined up after graduation, compared with 76% in Geology and 78% in Computer Science.

The diversity of career interests across majors is generally what would be expected. Over 90% of the students in Computer Science and Geology indicated that Business or Industry were areas of interest. Close to three-fourths of the Psychology students were interested in the Social Service area, while over three-fourths of students in Biology expressed interest in health professions. The overwhelming area of interest for Government majors was careers in Government, particularly the Federal government. About half the English majors were interested in education and another half in Communications, primarily publishing. Half the students in History and Mathematics were also interested in education careers.

Responses to the items concerning career planning/job-hunting interventions also differed from college to college. Students in English, History, Plan II, and Psychology reported the greatest need for assistance in choosing a career. At least half the students in all majors wanted career information, but the greatest interest was expressed by students in Psychology and Spanish. Job-hunting assistance was cited most frequently by students in Computer Science, Interior Design, and Spanish. (See Tables Index for Appropriate Tables.)

## SUMMARY

As the basis for planning the University of Texas Liberal Arts Career Symposium, the Overall Coordination Committee assessed students' self-reported post-graduate plans, career interests, and need for job-hunting/career planning services. A questionnaire was completed by 3,735 students in the Liberal Arts (Colleges of Social & Behavioral Sciences, Natural Sciences, Humanities, General & Comparative Studies) and Fine Arts colleges during the Spring 1978 fee payment process for Preregistration. The sample included freshmen through seniors. Major findings of the survey include:

- Two-thirds of the seniors reported that they were considering graduate school, with the percentages by college ranging from a low of 56% in Natural Sciences to a high of 81% in Social and Behavioral Sciences.
- Eighty-five percent of the seniors indicated that they did not have a job lined up after graduation. This percentage varied from 78% in General and Comparative Studies to 89% in Fine Arts.
- Interest in the nine career fields listed in this survey differed from college to college. The areas of greatest interest for the total sample were Education, Health and Social Services related careers.
- Students in General and Comparative Studies appeared to be considering the broadest range of possible career fields. Each of the nine career fields listed here was cited as an area of interest by at least one-fifth of students in this concentration. By contrast, Fine Arts students seemed more narrowly focused. Only three career fields (Arts, Communications, and Education) were of interest to more than 10% of Fine Arts students.
- Sixty percent of the total sample wanted *career/job information* particularly in the area of *employment outlook*. Twenty-eight percent requested *help in choosing a career*.



- Nearly half the seniors (48%) indicated a need for job-hunting assistance. Among those marking a specific area of assistance, *determining specific places you might be hired* was cited more frequently than *how to write a resume* and *how to make the most of your interview*.
- The responses were analyzed separately for twelve of the largest majors. Post-graduation plans and indicated needs for career planning assistance varied by major. The career interests across majors was often a typical extension of their academic majors. For example, nearly three-fourths of the Psychology majors were interested in the Social Service area, while over three-fourths of the Biology majors expressed interest in the Health Professions.
