ABSTRACT

In order to provide a longitudinal look at the characteristics of students earning the associate of arts degree (AA) at Los Angeles City College (LACC), selected statistics were gathered on LACC graduates over the 15-year period, 1964-1979, in terms of number of graduates, percentage of total enrollment, sex, those completing work in the spring semester, and majors at graduation by department and category. In addition, LACC was compared to other California community colleges. Study findings relative to LACC include: the maximum number of AA degrees was awarded in 1976 when 1,719 students received the degree; the number of graduates averaged between five percent and ten percent of the spring enrollment; about 33 percent of the graduates completed their work in the fall, as opposed to the spring, semester; since 1972, more females than males have received AA's; the number of degrees awarded in business and vocational areas has increased in the last 15 years; in fine arts, has remained stable; in communications, sciences, and social sciences, has decreased. Statewide comparisons reveal: in fall 1977, enrollments ranged from 558 to 31,671 (LACC ranked 15th); the ratio of graduates to fall enrollment ranged from 2.2 percent to 16.3 percent (LACC ranked 38th); the number of full-time faculty ranged from 13 to 363 (LACC ranked 5th); and the ratio of enrollment to full-time faculty ranged from 22 to 1,263 (LACC ranked 42nd from the lowest). PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

This study was initiated to provide a longitudinal look at characteristics of students earning the A.A. degree at Los Angeles City College. Although less than one in five students who enter L.A.C.C. persist to the granting of the A.A. degree, many thousands of the degrees have been awarded at L.A.C.C. in its fifty years of existence.

It is known that many students transfer or obtain a job without completing degree requirements, and other students take classes for personal development, in-service training, or other reasons and obtaining an A.A. degree is not their objective. Nevertheless, analysis of characteristics of students obtaining A.A. degrees provides an important perspective on the college's accomplishment of its mission.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

Data for the L.A.C.C. graduates were obtained from Admissions Office records. Most of the data come from statistical tabulations made by the Graduation Unit of that office. As some of the information was incomplete, student's stated major for certain years was tabulated from lists printed in graduation programs. Inasmuch as some students on the list did not subsequently graduate on schedule, some totals in the data following do not match. However, such discrepancies have little apparent effect on the overall picture.

Comparative data for 1977 for other California community colleges were obtained from the California Postsecondary Education Commission's Information Digest 1978.

FINDINGS

Table 1 presents some selected statistics on L.A.C.C. graduates over the fifteen year period 1964-1979. Included are number of graduates, percent of total enrollments, number and percent male, and number and percent completing work in the Spring semester. Figure 1 presents some of this information graphically.

Table 2 indicates students' stated majors at graduation, grouped and totaled by department.

FINDINGS (Continued)

In order to obtain an estimate of trends in broad areas of majors, department totals were grouped subjectively into the following seven categories:

Students who declined to state a major but met minimum graduation requirements are indicated as "College Transfer", providing an eighth category.

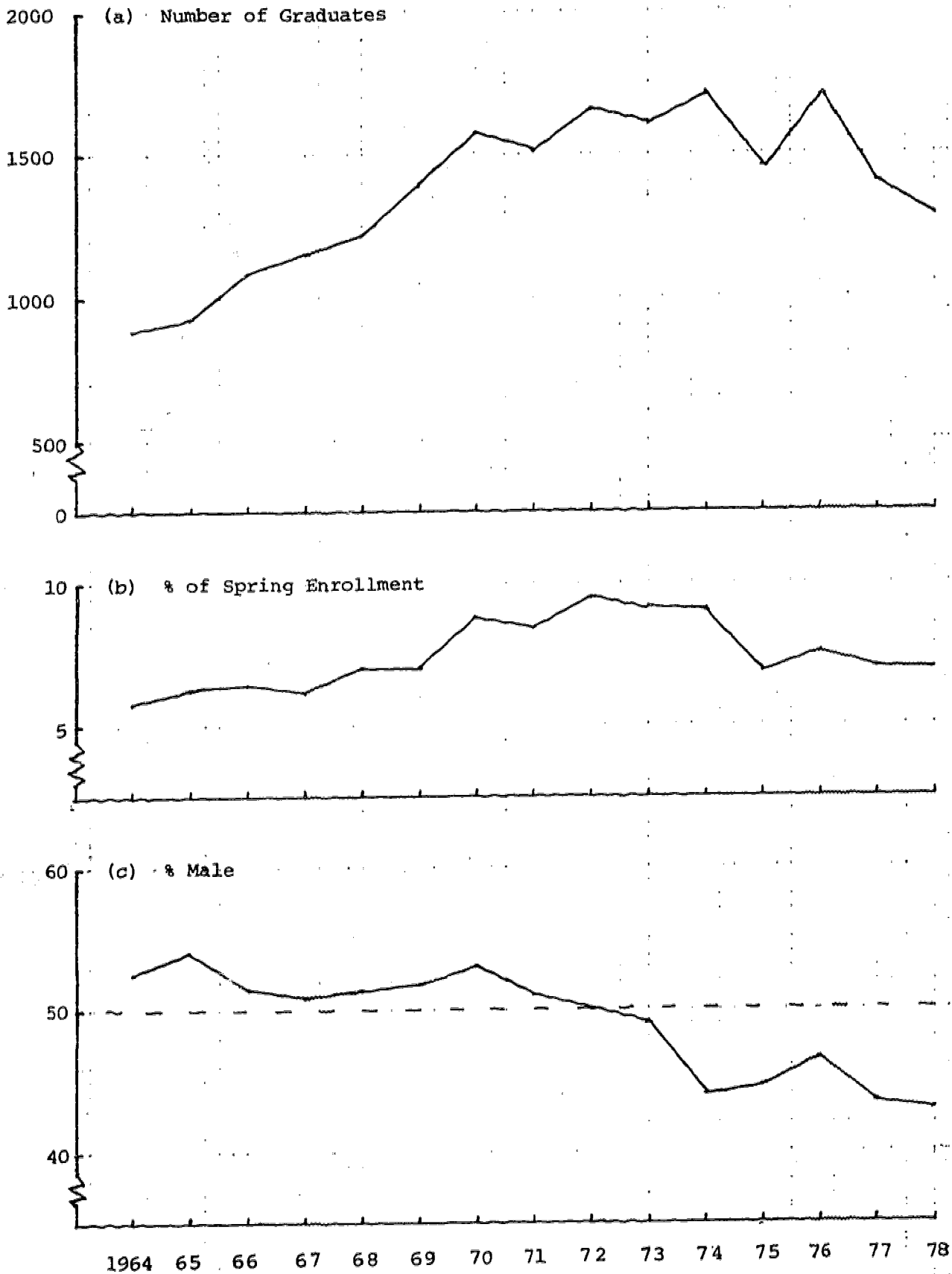


FIGURE 2 - A.A. Degrees Earned at L.A.C.C., 1964 - 1968, by Area of Stated Major (in percents)

Table 3 indicates (using percentages) the numbers of majors in each of the above eight categories over the fifteen year period. Figure 2 presents this information graphically.

Table 4 presents some 1977 statistics permitting comparison of L.A.C.C. with other California community colleges. Data presented for each California community college include number of 1976-77 graduates, Fall 1977 enrollment, graduates as a percent\* of enrollment, number of full-time faculty, and number of students per full-time faculty. Ranking of colleges on each item is also indicated.

\*Note discrepancy of L.A.C.C. figure with that indicated in Table 1 since a different semester was used for the enrollment figure.

FIGURE 1 - A.A. Degrees Earned at L.A.C.C. - 1964 - 1978

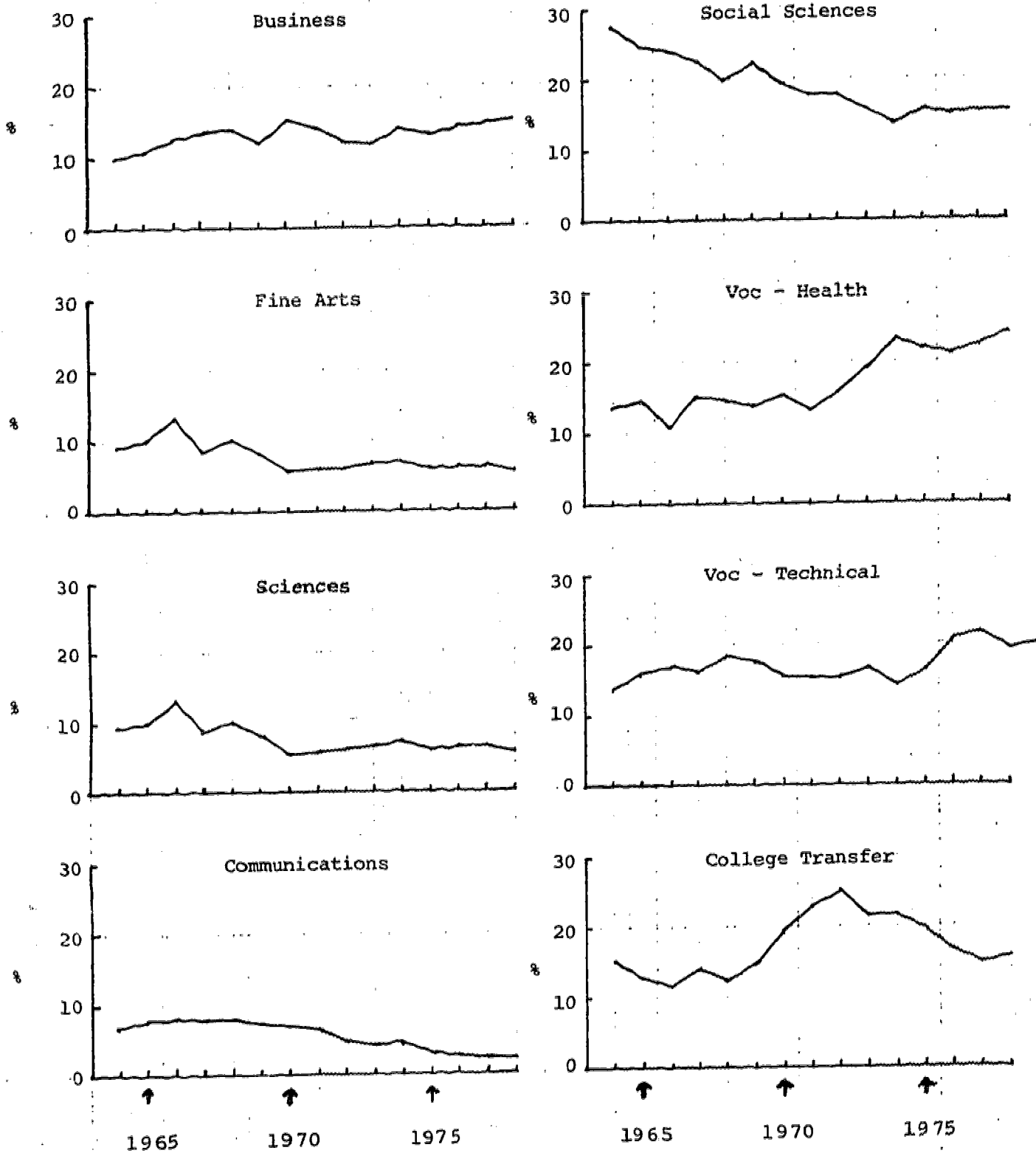

## OBSERVATIONS AND CONCLUSIONS:

This study looks at some characteristics of students who have earned the AA degree at L.A.C.C. during the past fifteen years.

Following are some observations on the findings:

- (1) Number of AA degrees awarded during an academic year reached its maximum in 1976 with 1719 students receiving the degree. In 1977 and 1978 however, the number dropped sharply with the 1288 awards in 1978 representing the lowest figure since 1968.
- (2) The number of graduates for a particular year has amounted to between 5 and 10 percent of the spring enrollment. Highest percent was 9.4 in 1972, lowest was 5.7 in 1964.
- (3) Approximately one-third of the graduates complete their work during the fall semester, two-thirds during the spring semester.
- (4) Since 1972, more females than males have received degrees. In 1978, the percent female reached 57.1, an all-time high.
- (5) A subjective clustering of majors indicates that the number of AA degrees awarded in vocational areas, especially those in health services, has increased markedly over the past fifteen years. The number receiving degrees in majors relating to business has also increased but not as markedly. Fine Arts majors have changed little over the fifteen year period. Areas showing decline in numbers are communications (slightly), sciences (although not since 1970), and social sciences (markedly from 1964 to 1975).
- (6) In Fall 1977, 102 California community college enrollments ranged from 558 to 31671, averaging 10,543. L.A.C.C. ranked fifteenth in the state with an enrollment of 19344.
- (7) In 1976-77, numbers of AA recipients in California community colleges ranged from 42 to 2406, averaging 678. L.A.C.C. ranked eleventh in the state with 1400 graduates.
- (8) Ratio of number of 1976-77 graduates to fall enrollment ranged from 2.2% to 16.3%, averaging 6.4%. L.A.C.C. ranked thirty eighth with a ratio of 7.2%.

OBSERVATIONS AND CONCLUSIONS: (Continued)

- (9) Number of full-time faculty in 1977-78 ranged from 13 to 363, averaging 146. L.A.C.C. ranked fifth with 304 full-time faculty reported.
- (10) Ratio of enrollment to full-time faculty ranged from 22 to 1263, averaging 73. L.A.C.C. ranked 42nd (from the lowest), averaging 64 students per full-time faculty.
