ABSTRACT The document lists approximately 290 ethnic heritage-related materials. Bibliographic citations for anthologies, plays, speeches, autobiographies, films, filmstrips, study guides, curriculum outlines, learning activities, and critical and historical studies for works published from 1950 through 1976 are annotated. The materials consider cultural conflicts, chronicle the history of cultural groups in the United States, and present the art, music, dance, literature, and religion of ethnic groups. The general bibliography categories are American Indian, Asian, Australian, Black American, Caribbean, Chinese, French, German, Greek, Irish, Italian, Japanese, Jewish, Latin American, Polish, Puerto Rican, Russian, Spanish/Portugese, General, and Professional. Entries are organized alphabetically by author according to type of material. (DB)
