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ABSTRACT

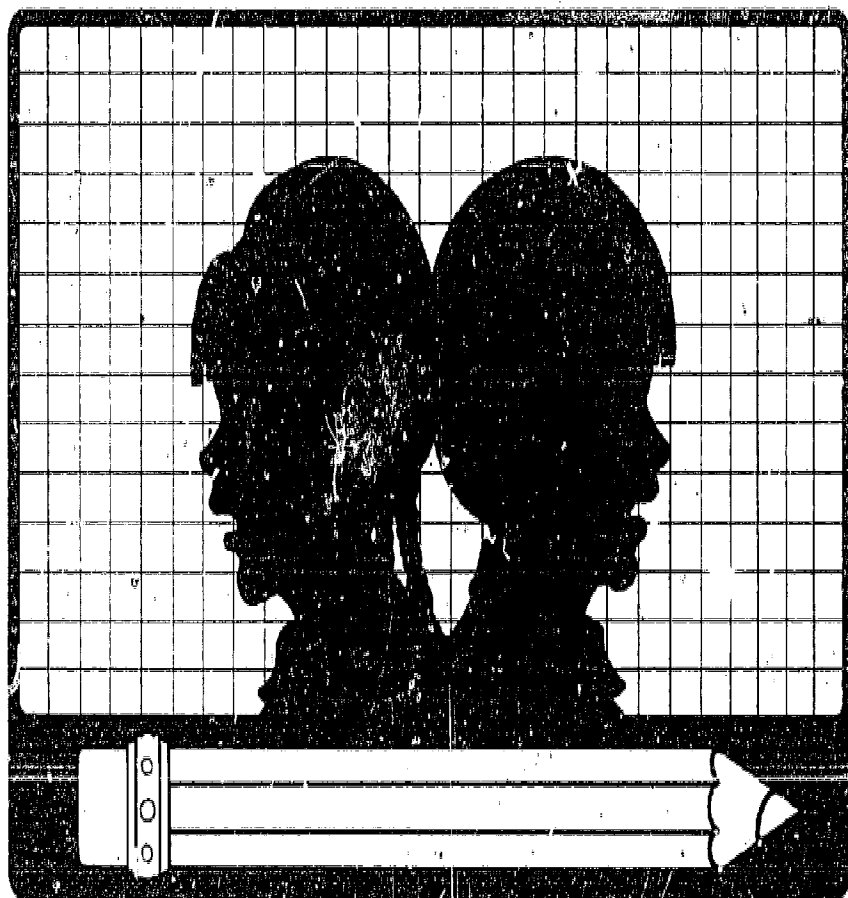
This catalog describes 342 tests appropriate for identifying the needs of bilingual students, for diagnosing their ability, and for assessing programs. The tests are appropriate for ages kindergarten through adult, and are written in the following languages: English, Spanish, Arabic, Cambodian, Cantonese, Chinese, Cherokee, Chamorro, Crow, Choctaw, Cheyenne, Dutch, French, German, Hebrew, Ilocano, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Mandarin, Mohawk, Navaho, Nukuran, Native Alaskan, Portuguese, Filipino, Polish, Ponapean, Pueblo, Russian, Tagalog, Tlithian, Vietnamese, Yapese, Wolof, Yiddish, and Yupik. The majority are written in English or Spanish or in both languages. The tests cover the following categories: (1) language proficiency; (2) language dominance; (3) self concept and personality; (4) sociocultural and attitudes; (5) reading and reading readiness; (6) academic achievement; (7) aptitude and interests; and (8) miscellaneous--including school readiness, psychomotor performance, learning problems, and individual development. Descriptions of each test provide, whenever possible: test name; developer (commercial vs. local publisher); source of availability; copyright date; language; purpose and content; age level; administration; written vs. oral response; scoring; types of available scores; cost, and a sample item. 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Preface

Recent estimates indicate that 13% of children aged 4 to 18 live in households in the United States in which languages other than English are spoken. There are 7.7 million children in these households. School districts are faced with the need to provide quality educational programs for these students. To partially meet this need, there are currently over 400 federally-funded bilingual education programs attempting to provide assistance to students who speak a primary language other than English. Additionally, there are more than twice that number of bilingual or other language programs funded by state and local educational agencies which also provide services to bilingual students and adults.

One critical concern of these programs at all levels is adequate instrumentation for identifying student needs, diagnosing student abilities and evaluating student and program progress. This publication, Assessment Instruments in Bilingual Education: A Descriptive Catalog of 342 Oral and Written Tests, has been produced to meet the need to develop and disseminate assessment instruments and procedures that are useful in bilingual settings. It proposes to supply school administrators and teachers, as well as directors and coordinators of bilingual programs, with a systematic compilation of currently available instruments in order to assist them in their program planning efforts. The catalog contains descriptions of 342 different tests covering 38 languages appropriate for bilingual education programs that span the entire range of schooling from pre-kindergarten to adult education.

It is not the purpose of the catalog to recommend a specific test or technique for assessing bilingual students or programs. Rather, its intent is to provide a starting point for those people concerned with providing educational services to bilingual students and adults. A list of currently available instruments and descriptions of many of the important characteristics of each of the instruments are included. With the information presented in this publication, individuals should be able to screen tests on the basis of their own program needs and know generally what tests are available that they might use. Specific tests should then be selected for use only after thorough analysis.

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User's Guide

In developing the format for the book, every attempt was made to organize the 342 tests into categories and sections which would facilitate their easy access and retrieval by the reader. While a number of alternative formats were considered, the one finally selected organized the tests first by content area. For example, all tests dealing with the language proficiency of students are grouped together in one chapter. Second, within each content area tests are organized into three language groupings: English, Spanish and Other Languages. Thus, all the English language proficiency tests are grouped together in one section. Third, within each language grouping, three kinds of information are presented: a test index which lists the tests included in that section, test descriptions which describe important characteristics of each test in the section, and test descriptions (abbreviated form) which describe the information available for some of the tests. Each of the components of the book are described in greater detail in the remainder of this section. The purpose of this section is to provide readers with an in-depth view of what is included in each chapter so they can use the information in the book efficiently and effectively. In the final analysis, it was determined that approximately 196 of the 342 tests are commercially developed and 146 are locally developed.

Organization of Book

The book is organized into eight chapters and one appendix. The chapters represent major categories of tests.

- I. Language Proficiency: This section lists and describes tests which can be used to assess the language proficiency of students. Included in this

listing are tests which are referred to as English As a Second Language (ESL) tests.

- II. Language Dominance: This section includes two kinds of tests. First, tests which assess the language used by students and parents of students in the home setting are included. Second, tests which assess the relative language proficiency by concurrently assessing the student in two or more languages also are included.
- III. Self-Concept and Personality: This section lists and describes tests which are designed to measure students' feelings about themselves and tests which measure an aspect(s) of personality.
- IV. Socio-Cultural: This section lists and describes tests which measure students' attitudes toward their environment and tests which measure characteristics of the environment itself. Parent attitudinal measures are also included in this section.
- V. Reading and Reading Readiness: Tests which measure reading potential and performance of students are listed and described in this section.
- VI. General Achievement: Tests which measure students' performance in curriculum areas other than reading are listed and described in this section. Mathematics, science, and social studies tests are examples of the kinds of tests that are included.

VII. Aptitude and Interests: Included in this section are tests which measure students' intelligence and tests which measure areas of potential interest to the student.

VIII. Miscellaneous: This section includes tests which measure school readiness of students, tests which measure the psychomotor performance of students, tests which can be used to diagnose individual learning problems of students and tests which measure developmental progress of students.

IX. Appendix: This section includes an alphabetical listing of all the tests included in this book, a list of commercial publishers who have produced tests, and a list of local programs, by state, which have developed tests.

Organization of Chapters

In addition to organizing the tests into chapters which represent major categories of tests, each specific chapter has been organized into three components corresponding to the major language groups of English, Spanish and Other Languages. For each language group three types of information are presented.

- Test Index: For easy access and retrieval of information, an index to the section is provided. This index lists the name of the test, the languages of the test, grade coverage or whether the test can be used for college students or adults, and the page number where the test description is

located. Additionally, because some tests logically fall in more than one section and apply to more than one language group, this index also serves as a cross reference. Each test is described only once in the section in which it first appears, but the index identifies for the reader all the tests which fall within each category and the appropriate page reference where the test description can be found. This procedure has been used to reduce the unnecessary duplication of test descriptions throughout the book. Thus, each section is to a great extent self-contained with all the tests that apply to a specific content area and language group identified in the index.

- Test Descriptions: Full descriptions for each test are provided. The information included in these descriptions is discussed below.
- Test Descriptions (Abbreviated Form): For those tests for which the authors were not able to gather complete information, either because of the time or other resource constraints, test descriptions in an abbreviated format are provided. At a minimum, this information includes the name of the test, where the test can be obtained, and the purpose of the test.

Test Description

Each test has been described using the same format. When information was unavailable to the authors at the time the book was produced or resources did not permit the obtaining of

specimen copies which resulted in some incomplete information, items were left blank on the descriptive form. When little information other than the name of the test and its purpose were available, these tests were listed in the sections entitled "Test Descriptions (Abbreviated Form)" which follow each subchapter.

Information resources used to describe the tests included the tests themselves, catalogs, technical papers, other bibliographic references, Title VII programs, and State Departments of Education. Each section of the descriptive format is discussed below.

- Test Name: Whenever possible, the name used in the description is the one provided by the developer of the instrument. When no title was offered, the name of the developer or developing agency has been incorporated into the title.
- Developed By: Either the individual author, developer or the group responsible for the development of the test is identified here.
- Commercial: This space is checked when the test is published for profit by the publisher or developer.
- Locally Developed: This space is checked when the test primarily has been developed for use in a single school district or is not yet being marketed.
- Available From: The source supplying the test is identified here.
- Copyright and/or Development: The copyright date is indicated for commercially available tests. If the test has

not been copyrighted, the date indicates how recently the materials have been developed. When no dates were provided, reasonable estimates have been made.

- Language of Test: This indicates the language in which the test items, questions, or instructions are written.
- Description: Purpose--the intent of what is to be measured is described here. Content--the general content of the test is described.
- Age and/or Grade Level: The age and/or grade level for which the instrument is most effective are cited here.
- Time to Administer: The total time necessary for administering the test, including initial instructions, is indicated.
- Group/individual: This section indicates whether the test is administered to individuals, to groups or some combination of each.
- Written/Oral: The type of response required of individuals is indicated.
- Scoring: Machine--this is a service provided by the publisher of the test. Hand--scoring is done item-by-item by the test administrator. Key--a template provided by the publisher to check off correct or incorrect answers.
- Scores Available: The kinds of interpretable scores available are indicated here. These scores are raw scores, standard scores, percentile scores and grade equivalents.

- Cost: An approximate cost per student is identified here. If there is an initial cost for test materials which does not have to be repeated, it also is identified. When it was not possible to compute a cost per student, either the cost of the manual, specimen sets has been identified.
- Sample Item: Whenever possible, an item from the test is presented to give the reader some idea of the format in which the test is presented.
- Additional Comments: If special equipment is needed to conduct the testing the type of equipment is indicated. If alternate forms or normative data are available, they are indicated. Also, any special training or qualifications needed by the test administrator is indicated. Finally, any other additional information which more fully describes the test is included in this section.

Introduction

Included in this chapter are 139 different instruments which measure the language proficiency of students and adults. The instruments have been organized into three major sections: English, Spanish and Other Languages. The 103 instruments in the English section fall generally into two major categories. First, 46 instruments have a bilingual component; they assess the language proficiency of students in more than one language. Most of these bilingual measures are in Spanish and English. Second, the other 57 instruments test language proficiency only in English; they have been designed to identify and diagnose the English language patterns of students and adults and often have been referred to as English as a Second Language (ESL) tests. All of the tests listed in the index are described in this section. Ninety-two are described in detail and 11 are described in abbreviated form.

There are 58 instruments in the Spanish Language Proficiency section. Thirty-nine have a bilingual component and 19 are in Spanish only. Twenty of the instruments are described for the first time in this section; the other 38 are described in the English Language Proficiency section.

Of the 30 instruments in the Other Languages Proficiency section, 11 have a bilingual component and 19 are in one language only. Sixteen of the instruments are described for the first time in this section; the other 14 are described in the English or Spanish Language Proficiency section. The language occurring most frequently in this section is Chinese.

Within each language section three kinds of information are presented. First, an index listing tests which fall within each section is provided. This index includes the name of the test, the language of the test, its grade range and the page where the test description can be found. If the instrument has been described in a previous section, the index refers the reader to the page in that section where the description appears. Second, the tests within each section are described. Third, for those tests with limited information, abbreviated test descriptions are provided.

Introduction

The instruments in this chapter are organized into two major sections: 1) English and Spanish and 2) English and Other Languages. Twenty-five of these tests are new listings, 10 are described in an earlier chapter. In this chapter tests are organized into pairs of languages because of the implicit comparative feature underlying the concept of language dominance. Within these sections the reader will find two types of instruments. First, language dominance has been defined by some to be a comparison of a student's language skills in two or more languages, and second, language dominance also has been defined as the language used most often in the home setting. Both types of instruments are included.

Thirty-three tests are listed in the English and Spanish section. Seven of these tests also have an Other Language component and are listed in the English and Other Language section as well. A total of 9 tests are included in the English and Other Languages section.

Within each language section two kinds of information are presented. First, an index listing the instruments in the section is provided. Second, each test is described.

Introduction

This chapter is comprised of 41 instruments which measure aspects of students' environment and the attitude of students toward their environment, including toward school. Parental attitudinal measures also are included in this chapter.

Because the assessment of reading skills is an essential component of bilingual and other language programs, reading and reading readiness instruments have been listed and described in this chapter rather than grouping them with other kinds of achievement measures. A total of 57 instruments is included. The reading tests either measure the student's or adult's global reading ability or provide diagnostic information regarding specific aspects of their reading performance. The reading readiness instruments provide predictive diagnostic information regarding a student's preparedness to learn to read. These instruments are targeted for early primary school students; the reading tests span the entire range of pre-kindergarten to adult students.

Twenty-five of the instruments are listed in the English section. There are new listings and are described within this section. Ten of the instruments have a bilingual component in Spanish; the other ten are in English only. Twenty-two instruments are listed in the Spanish section. Ten of these are described in the English section; the other twelve are in Spanish only and are described in this section. Ten instruments are described in the Other Language section. Nine of these are new listings and are described in this section; the other test is described in the English section. Three of the tests are in French, two are in Italian, and one each in Portuguese, Choctaw, Chinese, Korean and Navajo.

Within each language section, three kinds of information are presented. First, an index listing tests which fall within each

section is provided. This index includes the name of the test, the language of the test, its grade range and the page where the test description can be found. If the instrument has been described in a previous section, the index refers the reader to the page in that section where the description appears. Second, the tests within each section are described. Third, for those tests with limited information, abbreviated test descriptions are provided.

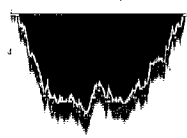

Introduction

Fifty-two instruments are included in this chapter. These instruments measure either general student achievement or are objective-referenced measures keyed into specific curricula. The instruments have been organized into three major sections: English, Spanish, and Other Languages. Fourteen of the 20 tests in the English section are new listings and are described in this section. All but one test has a bilingual component with Spanish being the most frequent counterpart. Twenty-four tests are listed in the Spanish section. Ten are new listings; 14 are described in earlier sections. Eight tests are indexed in the Other Language Section. Four are new listings and four are described in earlier sections. Four instruments are in French, three are in Chinese and one is in Navajo.

For each language section, three kinds of information are presented. First, an index listing the name, language(s), grade range, and page reference for each test is provided. Introduction

Forty-nine tests are included in this chapter. The aptitude instruments are usually referred to as measures of intelligence. They generally are designed to derive an overall functioning level of the student and adult. The interest instruments assess areas of student interest, the results of which can be used for counseling students and planning academic and career-oriented programs.

The instruments have been organized into three major sections: English, Spanish and Other Languages. Twenty are listed in the English section. All but one of these instruments are described in this section. Twenty-two are listed in the Spanish section.
