ABSTRACT

This report contains statistical data for 24 member institutions of the Association of Jesuit Colleges and Universities in the areas of collections, facilities, services, staffing, and expenditures, based on the 1977-78 fiscal year. Responses to a survey were received from 24 member libraries; however, only 17 respondents reported complete or partial personnel and salary information. A directory of member libraries is included. INTRODUCTION

The libraries which serve the 28 member institutions of the Association of Jesuit Colleges and Universities represent a significant library resource.

The collections, facilities, services, staffing, and expenditures were surveyed in early 1979, in an attempt to assess both the magnitude and variety of this resource. Data collected is based on the 1977-78 fiscal year, with 24 of the 28 libraries reporting; it is anticipated that a modified form of this survey will be repeated annually.

The combined holdings of the 28 libraries total more than nine million bound volumes. Collections range from less than 100,000 volumes to more than one million volumes. Similarly, expenditures range from \$126,000 to nearly \$2 million annually, and enrollments vary in close to the same proportion, from fewer than 1,000 students to more than 15,000.

Only 17 libraries were willing to report complete or partial personnel and salary information. The salary summaries are representative of that two thirds of the respondents only.
