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ABSTRACT

This annotated bibliography, from the Materials Review and Evaluation Services lists reviewed and evaluated instructional media appropriate for school media centers in the area of career education. Educators should bear in mind that materials included in this list were selected from those which publishers chose to submit for evaluation and may assume that materials for purchase not appearing on the list either were not submitted for evaluation or received unfavorable reviews. At the end of this bibliography may be found an unannotated list of materials which have had favorable reviews in reliable reviewing sources. Items are listed by type of media--books, workbooks, 16mm films, and sound filmstrips. Information provided for each item includes author, title, publisher or producer, date of production, cost, and grade level.

Dozens of ways to transform ordinary bedrooms into bright, attractive, functional areas, using such at-hand items as discarded furniture, corrugated cardboard boxes, contact paper, foam rubber, fabric remnants, paint; explains techniques for renovating old furniture and making your own, improving closets and storage areas, dressing up wardrobes, walls, floors, and fashioning accessories; familiar ideas gathered under one cover with abundant illustrations, all made to sound like fun; indexed

Berger, Melvin. AUTOMOBILE FACTORY. Watts, 1977. 65 p. \$4.90. Grades 5-8

Good career information on the automobile industry, steps involved in manufacturing an automobile from design to final assembly, the responsibility, training, and education needed for various levels of employment within the industry; no race or sex stereotyping--women encouraged to seek employment; good black-and-white photos of on-the-job scenes; clean format; dark, clear print; fine for career awareness; useful remedial reading for older secondary students entering the work force

Berger, Melvin. FOOD PROCESSING. Watts, 1977. 65 p. \$4.90. Grades 6-9

Describes several methods of food processing in industries such as canning, frozen foods, baking, dairy, candy; falls short of its purpose as a career awareness book but offers interesting material in easy-to-understand vocabulary; numerous photos, large dark type, generous margins, short paragraphs might appeal to reluctant readers

BETTY CROCKER'S MICROWAVE COOKING. Golden, 1977. 64 p. \$5.95. Grades 7-12

Recipes for microwave oven cooking in attractive, easy format; old favorites converted to microwave requirements--e.g., baked apples, corn on the cob, meatloaf, blueberry pie, spaghetti; indexed by main dishes, breads and vegetables, desserts, and soups, sandwiches, and snacks; succinct preface covers important points in microwave cooking; helpful tips interspersed throughout; all recipes developed and tested in countertop microwaves with wattage output ratings of 600-700 watts

BETTY CROCKER'S SALADS. Golden, 1977. 72 p. \$4.95. Grades 7-12

Salads for all occasions in pleasing, colorful format, good print, clear directions, and four categories: tossed green salads, fruit salads, vegetable salads, main-dish salads; tips on salad making interspersed throughout--e.g., how to unmold gelating salads, how to select unusual fruits, how to wash and store vegetables; indexed, excellent photos

Bradshaw-Smith, Gillian. ADVENTURES IN TOY-MAKING. Taplinger, 1976. 128 p. \$9.95. Grades 9-11

Instructions for making 23 soft, cuddly animals of various fabrics and colors--elephants, beagles, mice, dolphins, monkeys, rabbits, etc.--with clearly diagrammed patterns, step-by-step directions, black-and-white photos of the completed products, 13 color photos; advice on fabric selection, imaginative

touches, art of stuffing, how-to's of finishing touches--eyes, mouth, whiskers, nose; challenging to creative students with time and talent

Brown, Elizabeth Burton. GRAINS: AN ILLUSTRATED HISTORY WITH RECIPES. Prentice, 1977. 261 p. \$8.95. Grades 6-8

Traces history of grain in the world from beginning of time to present and offers over 100 recipes featuring a particular grain from a particular area; lively, interesting, informative text, easily understood recipes; photos and reproductions illustrate cultural importance of grain throughout history; large type, ample margins enhance readability; appendix indicates world grain yield, U.S.A. grain yield, quantity of specific grain in each state; metric conversion chart, glossary of recipe terms, bibliography, index; guaranteed reinforced binding

CONSUMER GUIDE Editors. ENERGY SAVERS CATALOG. Putnam, 1977. 160 p. \$14.95. \$6.95 paper. Grades 10-12

Well-written consumer handbook on energy conservation, specifically conserving gas, oil, electricity; covers insulation, weatherstripping, caulking, storm windows and doors, thermal panes, shades, blinds, shutters, drapes, awnings, air conditioning and heating systems, much more; many good diagrams (cut-aways) and photos; step-by-step directions; name-brand products discussed; also includes information on automotive energy-saving and applications of solar energy

Corrigan, Barbara. HOW TO MAKE PANTS AND JEANS THAT REALLY FIT. Doubleday, 1978. 166 p. \$6.95. Grades 9-12

Very practical guide for cutting, sewing, and fitting pants and jeans; besides information on constructing different types of pants, author discusses various fabrics, alterations, remodeling, accessories; simple black-and-white drawings clarify written instructions; best used by experienced seamstress but effective with advanced home economics class; teacher can adapt procedures for less apt students

Curtis, Patricia. ANIMAL DOCTORS: WHAT IT'S LIKE TO BE A VETERINARIAN AND HOW TO BECOME ONE. Delacorte, 1977. 167 p. \$7.95. Grades 7-12

A "must" purchase if North Carolina establishes a veterinary school and a joy for animal lovers regardless of that issue; every aspect of veterinary medicine--marine mammal, large animal, small animal, zoo, wildlife, etc -- covered in chapters structured like interviews with men and women vets; informal, engaging style enhances content on each job, college training, case histories, controversial issues--e.g., using animals for medical research; good information on how to apply to veterinary school, what to expect, addresses of schools; black-and-white photos; outstanding

Daniels, George. HOW TO BE YOUR OWN HOME ELECTRICIAN. 2nd ed. Harper, 1976. 144 p. \$3.50 paper. Grades 9-12

A recently revised handbook for do-it-yourself electricians on wiring a new house or an old house, making repairs and improvements, installing outdoor lighting and wiring, selecting tools, do's and don'ts, wire testing, fluorescent lighting, doorbells, chimes, fuses, electric motors, more; technically accurate,

well written and illustrated, with appropriate coverage of safety and electrical codes; not an electrician's textbook but good source for trade students seeking information on electrical trades

Duquette, Susan. SUNBURST FARM FAMILY COOKBOOK: GOOD HOME COOKIN' THE NATURAL WAY. Woodbridge, 1976. 303 p. \$4.95 paper. Grades 10-12

Over 400 meatless recipes emphasizing homegrown organic foods, each recipe tested by a community of 300 persons in California known as the Brotherhood of the Sun; well organized in basic meal courses of soups, salads, vegetarian dishes, fish, breads, desserts; special chapters on canning, drying, general hints, and an equivalent chart; glossary and index; print, drawings, and photos in attractive sepia on cream; slightly religious overtones in opening and closing pages; author's warm, enthusiastic style indicates genuine respect for cooking; good selection for persons in food services, advanced foods courses

Dworkin, Floss and Stan. FLOSS AND STAN'S "WHY ARE MY LEAVES TURNING YELLOW AND FALLING OFF?" ANSWER BOOK. Dutton, 1978. 304 p. \$9.95. Grades 9-12

Question-and-answer format offers help for novice and professional; three main divisions treat 1) kinds of plants (giving scientific and common names), 2) methods of and problems encountered in growing plants--e.g., bugs, composting, feeding, light, 3) specialties, such as unique species and places to grow plants; appendix includes names and addresses of plant societies, mail order sources; although questions and answers are in no particular order under a given topic (a slight drawback), the index serves to locate information easily; useful reference for appropriate vocational education classes

Ehrlich, Jeffrey, and Marc Mannheimer. THE CARPENTER'S MANIFESTO. Holt, 1977. 317 p. \$12.95. \$7.95 paper. Grades 8-12

Here's the book for those who know little or nothing about the art and science of carpentry; discusses how to design what is to be built, secrets of having the structure stand up, common building materials, hardware, tools, and various construction projects, ranging from bookcases to room remodeling; special attention given to safety without sacrificing common sense; direct, straightforward, readable; clear, concise diagrams; excellent for beginners, with helpful hints for advanced hobbyists

Gaeddert, Louann. YOUR NIGHT TO MAKE DINNER. Watts, 1977. 116 p. \$5.90. Grades 7-12

Highly useful cookbook for teens who must help with meal preparations or who just enjoy cooking; good information on planning meals, grocery shopping, safety tips, nutrition, excellent recipes; consideration of time and money typify time-saving, budget-wise recipes; metric and conventional measurements for each recipe; cheerful, confident tone and many helpful hints will please beginning cooks

Glovach, Linda. POTIONS, LOTIONS, TONICS AND TEAS. Described on Science Advisory List

Harris, Robie H., and Elizabeth Levy. BEFORE YOU WERE THREE: HOW YOU BEGAN TO WALK, TALK, EXPLORE AND HAVE FEELINGS. Delacorte, 1977. 142 p. \$7.45. Grades 10-12

Records the development of a boy and a girl from birth to age three, their progress in walking, talking, exploring, experiencing feelings, then applies each stage of development to reader's own growth patterns; sensitive, reverent portrayal of wonder, excitement, of infant's rapid advancement before age three; black-and-white photos of mothers and fathers representing several ethnic groups illustrate each stage of accomplishment from moment of birth, including first eye focus, feeding through motor-skill mastery, talking, expressing emotions; fascinating for children and adults, enlightening for students in child-care courses; indexed

Horn, Yvonne Michie. DOZENS OF WAYS TO MAKE MONEY. Harcourt, 1977. 83 p. \$2.95 paper. Grades 7-12

Clever suggestions for the ambitious student; includes lucrative services such as party clean-up, car oil and filter changing, animal sitting and obedience training, umpiring, window washing; describes product sales, such as candles, newspaper logs, weed bouquets, sandwiches; lists start-up costs and materials, profit; some tips on sales; attractive format, easy to read; for media collection if comparable material not available

Hutchison, Chester S. YOUR FUTURE IN AGRIBUSINESS. Rosen, 1977. 192 p. \$4.80. Grades 10-12

Close look at a variety of vocations in agribusiness, qualifications, education, and a brief chapter on women in agribusiness; good information on agricultural chemical industry, agricultural engineering, science, and research, animal industries, business (communications, public relations), conservation, farming, ranching, government careers, plant sciences, much more; very dull, unappealing format and almost no illustrations--no visual appeal, but thorough; solid content; useful reference for career education

Lehrman, Steve. YOUR CAREER IN HARNESS RACING. Atheneum, 1976. 148 p. \$6.95. Grades 7-12

Accurate reference book on careers in harness racing from groom to driver-trainer; actual raceways, horses, racing personalities lend authenticity; detailed sections on necessary equipment; chapter on United States Trotting Association Rules and Regulations; informative illustrations; student interest in subject imperative for benefit or enjoyment

McHugh, Mary. PSYCHOLOGY AND THE NEW WOMAN. Watts, 1976. 114 p. \$5.90. Grades 10-12

Described on September 1977 Reduction of Sex Bias Advisory List

Mintz, Loulie Miller. VEGETABLES IN PATCHES AND POTS: A CHILD'S GUIDE TO ORGANIC VEGETABLE GARDENING. Farrar, 1976. 116 p. \$6.95. Grades 4-9

Sensible information succinctly presented in guide for elementary/junior high boys and girls interested in cultivating their own vegetable gardens on a limited scale; each step explained, from tool selection and soil preparation to harvest; alphabetical growing guide for 26 vegetables concludes practical, informal little handbook

Molloy, John T. THE WOMAN'S DRESS FOR SUCCESS BOOK. Follett, 1977. 189 p.
\$9.95. Grades 9-12

Addressed to women executives and those who desire to be, outlining appropriate wardrobes for specific occasions; numerous examples of wardrobe importance in successes and failures drawn from author's experiences as clothing consultant to professional groups; sound suggestions for buying wisely, saving money, avoiding pitfalls in clothes selection, though dress code might be considered rather conservative; emphasis on how women can impress men with their business acumen through their dress may seem sexist to some, but author argues it is realism; helpful reference for students in business courses; excellent discussion resource for girls just entering business world; several line and charcoal drawings illustrate specific clothing items

The Mother Earth News Staff. THE MOTHER EARTH NEWS HANDBOOK OF HOME BUSINESS IDEAS AND PLANS. Bantam, 1976. 372 p. \$2.25 paper. Grades 10-12

Offbeat part-time and full-time money making possibilities for unemployed or new high school graduates interested in being a stringer for local news media, opening a coffeehouse, operating underground moving service, as well as odd-jobbing for free rent, getting paid for a vacation, working on a freighter, more; practical advice for reader but also teaser for vocation/life-style class discussion

Olney, Ross. SIMPLE APPLIANCE REPAIR. Doubleday, 1976. 105 p. \$2.95 paper.
Grades 9-12

Practical little guide for correcting simple malfunctions in about 20 typical household appliances--toasters, electric coffee makers, space heaters, dishwashers, clothes dryers, refrigerators, other; nontechnical but enough information for the consumer to repair an item or assist repairman in identifying problem; clarifying pictures and diagrams; useful for students in appliance repair courses

Pelta, Kathy. WHAT DOES A PARAMEDIC DO? Dodd, 1978. 63 p. \$5.25. Grades 4-6

Explores paramedic's duties, necessary training, employment areas; traces evolution of paramedic field to prominence in last 10 years through portable medical and communication instruments; follows a paramedic associated with fire department in on-the-job activities; relates career to other emergency service careers, but fails to relate paramedic career to other medical service careers; rambling narrative often includes extraneous comments, information; purchase if collection lacks title on this increasingly popular career

Purdy, Susan. HALLOWEEN COOKBOOK. Watts, 1977. 96 p. \$6.90. \$2.95 paper.
Grades 5-12

Approximately 30 Halloween recipes from shortbread place cards, through salads and main courses, to desserts delightful to eye and palate; four helpful sections precede recipes offering advice, explaining standard and metric measurements, describing basic skills, listing general equipment; clear directions easily read in black and orange type, list needed equipment, ingredients, how-to steps; pen-and-ink drawings accented in orange, brown, gray, and black; library binding; generous margins; indexed; will delight all ages and challenge them to creative cooking

Rinzler, Carol Ann. COSMETICS: WHAT THE ADS DON'T TELL YOU. Crowell, 1977.
212 p. \$9.95. Grades 9-12

Consumers' guide for selecting cosmetics knowledgeably for health, safety, satisfaction; organized in two parts, first featuring cosmetic categories and their possible side effects, with suggested economical or natural-ingredient substitutes; second part lists cosmetic ingredients with their possible side effects; valuable reference for cosmetics users; includes annotated bibliography

Searight, Mary W. YOUR CAREER IN NURSING. Rev. ed. Messner, 1977. 191 p.
\$7.29. Grades 9-12

Describes varied career opportunities in modern nursing, academic training and personal qualities required, special case histories that help guide interested readers toward a career choice; lists scholarship funds, nursing organizations; black-and-white photos; highly readable; free of sex stereotyping (men depicted in nursing roles, plus a chapter devoted to need for male nurses); indexed; comprehensive

Sitzmann, Marion, and Rejoy Garcia. SUCCESSFUL INTERVIEWING: A PRACTICAL GUIDE FOR THE APPLICANT AND INTERVIEWER. NTC, 1977. 52 p. \$2.50 paper. Grades 10-12

Succinct handbook on skillful interviewing and properly preparing resumes; includes good role-playing situations enabling students to take part of interviews as well as applicants; covers initial inquiries (letter, telephone), preparing for interview (researching the company, fitting your credentials to job, anticipating questions), interview itself (dress, attitude), practice situations (professional, nonprofessional, part-time), specialized interview (college entrance, scholarship interviews, handicapped interviews), many sample letters and resumes; excellent information, compactly presented

Smith, Helen Wheeler. SURVIVAL HANDBOOK FOR PRESCHOOL MOTHERS, FATHERS, GRAND-MOTHERS, TEACHERS, NURSERY SCHOOL AND DAY-CARE WORKERS. Follett, 1977. 140 p.
\$2.95 paper. Grades 10-12

Basic principles of early childhood education discussed briefly, simply, in light, chatty style; helpful chapters on development of language, conceptual thinking, and cognitive learning organized according to specific skills and activities to sharpen each skill; follows traditional role expectations--mother stays home with child, father pays bills; consistent use of "he" justified by author "for brevity"; practical material though not developed in any depth; particularly suitable for students with realized difficulties in beginning child-care courses; bibliography of picture books for young children; list of do-it-yourself toys

Sweeney, Karen O'Connor. ENTERTAINING. Watts, 1978. 61 p. \$4.90. Grades 6-12

Suggestions for teen-agers on successful party giving, tips on economical decorations and food, how-to's of planning and organizing; covers indoor parties, outdoor parties, special event celebrations, apartment entertaining; easy reading, accessible format (many lists, charts, etc.); good advice on special problems--party crashers, cancellations, preventing undesirable conduct; not a recipe book

Grades 4-6

Strictly metric cookbook for middle graders putting their metric lessons to practical use; favorite recipes converted to metric measurement include chocolate chip cookies, brownies, date bars, rolled sugar cookies, hot cocoa, blueberry muffins; thorough introduction covers needed equipment, how to measure dry and liquid ingredients, how to use a scale marked in grams, and metric terms associated with cooking; no conventional measures appear except oven temperatures, which are given in both degrees Celsius and degrees Fahrenheit

Cincinnati Public Schools Home Economics Department. EXPLORING FABRICS. 4th ed. McKnight, 1977. 367 p. \$7.98. Grades 7-9
