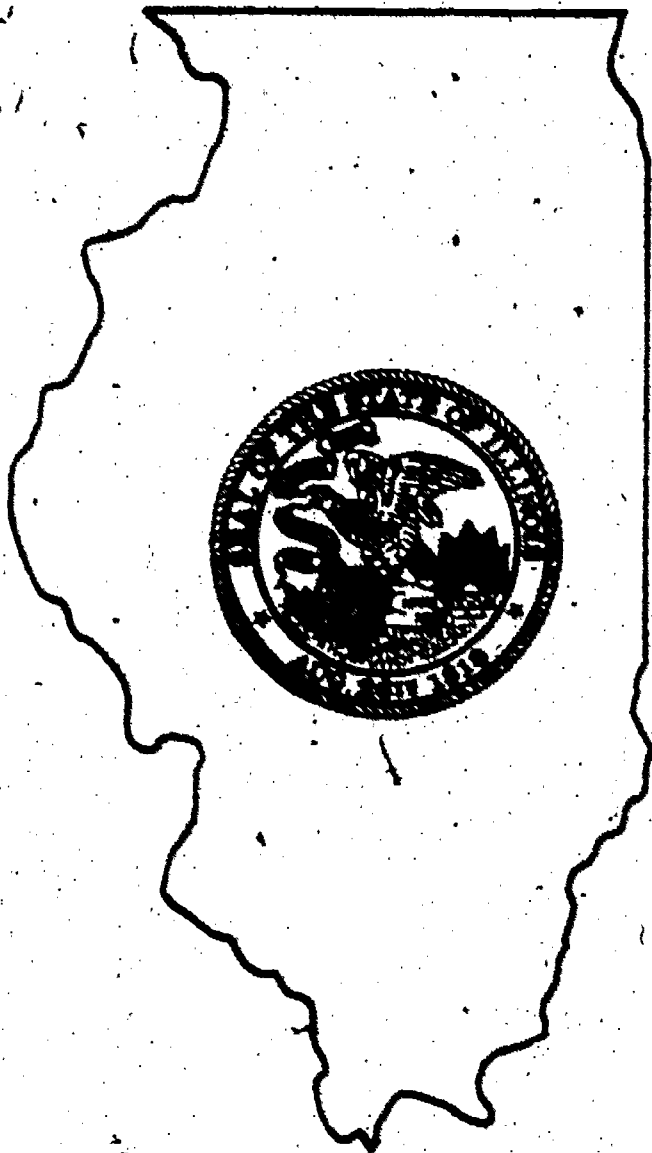

ABSTRACT

This report analyzes 1979 spring term enrollment data for all 39 Illinois Community College Districts (whether on the quarter or semester system) and winter quarter enrollments for the five districts on the quarter system and compares these data with similar figures for 1974 through 1978. Information is organized in 14 data tables in terms of headcount and full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollments. Highlights of the analysis include: (1) during spring 1979, headcount enrollment totaled 288,427, representing a 3% decrease from spring 1978 and a 11% decrease from fall 1978; (2) FTE enrollment totaled 129,801 for spring 1979, representing a 6% decrease from the previous year; (3) of the five districts on a quarter system, three showed increases in student headcount; (4) during spring 1979, the Baccalaureate/General Academic category had the largest FTE enrollment (51%); Business and Public Service Technology had 15.6%, Natural Science and Industrial Technology had 10.1%, and Remedial/Developmental had 7.5%; (5) in-district students comprised 95.0% of the total student enrollment; only 0.4% of the students were from out-of-state; (6) enrollment at on-campus locations accounted for 83.2% of the total spring 1979 term enrollment, with enrollment at in-district off-campus locations accounting for 15.6% of the total. Report on FY 1979 Winter and Spring Enrollments

HIGHLIGHTS

1. The community colleges of Illinois had a headcount enrollment of 288,427 students during spring 1979, a 3% decrease from a year ago and a decrease of 11% from the fall 1978 term. (For details, see pages 2 and 3.)
2. FTE student enrollment totaled 129,801 for the spring 1979 term, a decrease of 6% from the spring 1978 term and a decrease of 11% from the fall 1978 term. (For details, see page 4.)
3. Of the five community college districts having a quarter calendar system, three of these districts showed increases in their student headcount enrollment for the 1979 winter term from a year earlier while only two districts showed increases in FTE enrollments for the winter term. (See pages 6 and 7 for details.)
4. During spring 1979 term, the Baccalaureate/General Academic category had the largest FTE enrollment (66,137 - 51.0% of the total). The enrollments by the other categories were as follows: Business and Public Service Tech. (20,237 - 15.6%); Data Processing and Commerce Tech. (6,085 - 4.7%); Natural Science and Industrial Tech. (13,053 - 10.1%); Health Tech. (7,269 - 5.6%); Vocational Skills (2,493 - 1.9%); Remedial/Developmental (9,731 - 7.5%); and General Studies (4,714 - 3.6%). (For details see page 8.)
5. In-district students comprised 95.0% of the total student enrollment in the community colleges of Illinois with 4.6% of the students being from Illinois but out-of-district and only 0.4% of the students enrolled are from out-of-state. (See page 10 for details.)
6. Enrollment at on-campus locations accounted for 83.2% of the total spring 1979 term enrollment with enrollment at in-district off-campus location accounting for 15.6% of the total, and out-of-district locations accounting for only 1.2% of the total enrollment. (See page 12 for details.)

INTRODUCTION

This report contains an analysis of spring term enrollments (spring term for all 39 districts) and winter quarter enrollment for the five community college districts on the quarter system. In previous years, the winter and spring term enrollment report consisted of second term enrollments, (winter quarter for those colleges on the quarter system, and spring semester for those on the semester system).

It is always difficult to report winter and spring term enrollments in the community colleges of Illinois because of the many different types of calendar systems being used by the 51 community colleges and the great variety of starting dates. In addition to the quarter and semester systems, some colleges have a one month session between their two semester terms, one college uses a monthly module system, a number of colleges have half-semester modules as well as a regular semester module, and almost all colleges have courses that start and stop throughout the term.

Student enrollment data for the Winter Quarter and Spring Term 1979 are based on 10th day (end of registration) counts. This type of enrollment data is considered to be "snapshot" enrollment. Snapshot enrollment counts reflect the number of students attending a given institution on a particular date. Usually, the winter and spring term enrollment at institutions of higher education are somewhat lower than the fall term enrollment for the same year. This has generally been the case in Illinois public community colleges as well.

The winter and spring term enrollments are very important because when combined with the fall term enrollments, they provide a very good indication of the total enrollments generated by each college for the entire year. These data are significant to each college as well as to the ICCB because the annual enrollments determine the amount of state funding that public community colleges receive.

It should be noted that in several cases the two full-term equivalent (FTE) course enrollment tables which each college submitted in addition to the E-1 cards sometimes showed slightly different figures from those which were obtained from the E-1 card reports. This difference, although very slight, is due to a variance between the college produced computer run based on course enrollments and the ICCB report from the generated student data (E-1 cards).

COMPARISON OF 1979 SPRING TERM ENROLLMENTS
WITH FALL TERM 1978 AND SPRING TERM 1978
ENROLLMENTS

Table 2 on the following page shows a comparison of spring term 1979 headcount enrollment with fall 1978 and spring 1978 terms. Of the fifty-one community colleges, six colleges experienced an increase in enrollment from fall 1978 to spring 1979 term, while forty-five had decreases in enrollment. Twenty-two of the fifty-one colleges showed increases from spring 1978 term to spring 1979 term and twenty-nine decreased in enrollment. The total spring 1979 headcount enrollment (288,427) has decreased 11% from fall 1978 and 3% from the spring 1978 term.

Table 3 on page 4 shows the FTE student enrollment for spring 1978, fall 1978, and spring 1979 terms for each of the public community colleges of Illinois. Only three community colleges experienced increases in FTE enrollment from fall 1978 to spring 1979 term while forty-eight colleges showed a decrease. Of the fifty-one colleges, twelve had an FTE enrollment increase from spring 1978 to spring 1979 term, and thirty-nine experienced decreases. The total FTE enrollment (129,801) has decreased 11% from fall 1978 term and 6% from spring 1978 term.

Table 1 below shows a summary of the statewide headcount and FTE enrollment reported for spring 1979 term compared with fall 1978 and spring 1978 term.

COMPARISON OF SECOND TERM AND FALL TERM ENROLLMENTS WITH PREVIOUS YEARS

Since this report utilized second term (winter quarter and spring semester) enrollments in past years, this year's data can be analyzed in a similar format to provide a comparison with past years. Table 4 below shows a comparison of the second term student headcount and FTE enrollments with fall term enrollments for the public community colleges of Illinois since FY1974. This analysis shows that although the headcount enrollment for second term has been increasing prior to FY1978, the rate of increase has been declining. The second term FTE enrollment has been decreasing for the past three years. During second term FY1978 and FY1979, both Headcount and FTE student enrollments decreased. When comparing second term and fall term enrollments, both headcount and FTE enrollments have been decreasing steadily since FY1975.

COMPARISON OF WINTER QUARTER 1979 HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT
WITH WINTER QUARTER 1978 HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT

Table 5 below shows a comparison of the headcount enrollment data for winter quarter 1979 with headcount enrollment data for winter quarter 1978 for each Illinois public community college on the quarter system. An increase was experienced in total headcount enrollment (3.7%) during winter term 1979. A total of 27,212 headcount students were enrolled during winter quarter 1979.

Table 6 below shows a comparison of headcount enrollments for fall 1978, winter 1979, and spring 1979 terms for those colleges on the quarter system. For most colleges the winter quarter enrollments are much lower than either fall or spring quarter.

COMPARISON OF WINTER QUARTER 1979 FTE ENROLLMENT WITH
WINTER QUARTER 1978 FTE ENROLLMENT

Table 7 below shows a comparison of the FTE enrollment data for winter quarter 1979 with FTE enrollment data for winter quarter 1978 for those community colleges on the quarter system. A total of 15,168 FTE students were enrolled during winter quarter 1979. This is a 1.2% increase from the 14,986 FTE students reported for winter quarter 1978.

Table 8 shows the comparison of FTE enrollments for fall 1978, winter 1979, and spring 1979 terms for those colleges on the quarter system. In most instances, the winter quarter enrollment is usually somewhat lower than fall and spring quarters.

SPRING TERM 1979 10TH DAY FTE BY TYPE OF COURSE

Table 10 on the next page shows the spring term 1979 10th day FTE enrollment by the eight funding categories for each of the public community colleges in Illinois. The distribution into the various categories was based on type of course. Of the 129,719 FTE students reported, the baccalaureate and general academic category generated the greatest enrollment (66,137 FTE - 51.0% of the total).

Table 9 below shows a comparison of the actual spring term 1979 10th day FTE enrollment with spring term 1978 10th day FTE enrollment by type of course.

SPRING TERM 1979 ENROLLMENTS IN INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM AREA
BY RESIDENCY OF STUDENT

Table 12 on the opposite page shows the headcount and FTE enrollment in the instructional program areas by type of residency for each of the public community colleges of Illinois. Out-of-district enrollment includes both students from other community college districts and students from high school districts that are not a part of a community college district. Out-of-district students attend on either a chargeback basis or else pay their own additional out-of-district tuition. Both in-district students and out-of-district students are from Illinois. Less than one percent (0.4%) of the students enrolled in Illinois public community colleges are from out-of-state. The large majority of students (95.0%) are residents of the community college district that they attend.

Table 11 below shows a comparison of spring term 1978 and spring term 1979 enrollment data by residency.

SPRING TERM 1979 FTE ENROLLMENT IN INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM AREAS BY LOCATION

Table 14 on the opposite page shows the FTE enrollment in instructional program areas distributed by location of attendance for each of the public community colleges of Illinois. On-campus attendance represents courses being offered in facilities which are a part of the college campus. Off-campus attendance is enrollment in courses which are offered at the various high schools and other extension centers within the district. Extension attendance is in courses which are offered at locations outside the college districts.

Table 13 below shows a comparison of spring term 1978 and spring term 1979 student FTE enrollment in instructional program areas by location.
