Designed for intermediate student who can work independently; subject areas include math, art, creative writing, social studies, poetry and book reports, science; offer varied projects and problems for students to solve such as creative writing (student writes story about living in the year 3,000), art (student is instructed to create sculpture from "junk"), science (student is instructed to create a model ofl field); useful as enrichment activities for individuals or small groups; teacher could use cards for introducing activities to entire class; some activities need more explicit instruction; teacher would need to provide materials for projects to be created; good material for a center or supplementary activities when other work is completed

A tightly structured total reading program which divides instruction into five 30-minute modules; each module treats a specific phase of reading or writing: phonics/spelling, language experience (creative writing), academic reading, patterning, and recreational reading; first third of book explains objectives, content, procedure for each-module; second part contains lesson plans--some completely detailed, others outlined; program designed to be followed exactly, requiring thorough teacher preparation (Clinton City)

Criscuolo, Nicholas P. 125 MOTIVATORS FOR READING. Fearon, 1977. 57 p. \$2.25 paper

Great book of suggestions for motivating children to read; includes activities which permit children to share books with each other, arts and crafts ideas to be integrated with books, games and creative writing, long-term class projects; list of fifty books recommended for children (Clinton City)

Estes, Thomas H., and Joseph L. Vaughan, Jr. READING AND LEARNING IN THE CONTENT CLASSROOM: DIAGNOSTIC AND INSTRUCTIONAL STRATEGIES. Allyn, 1978. 463 p. \$16.95

Reading resource text for content area teacher describes readability formulas and their application, how to administer informal inventories, how to interpret standardized tests; classroom materials and changing attitudes also covered; authors have included, but not discussed, complete lesson plans for units of study in various content areas, grades 4-12 (Brunswick County)

Forgan, Harry W. PHORGAN'S PHONICS. Goodyear, 1978. 323 p. \$8.95 paper

Practical workbook for primary children introduces, reinforces, extends the knowledge of phonetics; clever preprimer section for teachers increases understanding of a beginning reader's feelings and reactions to reading; workbook includes 48 lesson plans—each having introductory activities (e.g., games, songs, riddles), a ready list of objects naming the same sound as that being taught, 6 to 12 words and pictures for each sound, a hidden word

picture (to be duplicated), reinforcement activities; also includes tests, record-keeping forms, index, glossary of terms; well-organized, easy-to-use program for primary teachers (K-1)

Folgan, Harry W. THE READING CORNER: IDEAS, GAMES, AND ACTIVITIES FOR INDIVIDUAL-IZING READING. Goodyear, 1977. 73 p. \$9.50 paper

Clear, concise, well-organized resource book for developing a systematic classroom management plan to provide greater individualization in reading instruction; chapters devoted to an explanation of prereading, word recognition, comprehension, study skills; large appendix supplies materials to duplicate with author's permission, including several varieties of recordkeeping charts, letters to parents which may or may not be used in entirety, screening tests for each skill area, games and center activities to reinforce each skill; diagrams and sketches illustrate the text, provide a wealth of coordinating bulletin board ideas (Wake County)

Granowsky, Alvin, et al. A GUIDE FOR BETTER READING: FOR PARENTS AND CHILDREN. Tarmac, 1977. 68 p. \$2.95 paper

Written to give parents concrete ways to help and interest their children in reading; demonstrates how parents and teachers can work together; divided into four sections (Getting Ready to Read, Building Skills in Phonics and Sight Vocabulary, Building Skills In Comprehension, Determining Reading Levels), gives numerous learning activities, tests, and progress records

Judy, Tom A., and Davidson D. Steely. USING LEARNING CENTERS WITH NOT-YET READERS: AN AID FOR ABECEDARIANS. Goodyear, 1978. 122 p. \$8.95 paper

Excellent resource book for primary level educators, especially in the area of learning center management; offers many practical ways to utilize learning centers in a classroom; illustrations are most helpful in that they depict exactly what the narrative has explained

Polon, Linda, and Aileen Cantwell. MAKING KIDS CLICK: INDEPENDENT ACTIVITIES
IN READING AND THE LANGUAGE ARTS. Goodyear, 1979. 208 p. \$8.95 paper

Comprehensive idea book for setting up reading centers; many original suggestions (with permission to thermofax) for teaching word skills, paragraph development, gramman, punctuation, figurative language; numerous activities of varying levels of difficulty provide stimulating possibilities for individuals, small groups, or classes; for teachers of grades 3-7

Raskin, Bruce, ed. THE READING IDEA BOOK. Ed. Today, 1978. 192 p. \$9.95 paper

Excellent book of ideas for enlivening classroom reading; presents activities for beginning reading, decoding, reading for meaning, vocabulary building, motivating the unmotivated, enjoyment reading, reading in content areas; text includes strategies, activities, description of materials needed; encompasses reading, language, social studies, science skills; informative, motivating resource for teachers in grades K-6 (Clinton City)

Stewig, John Warren, and Sam L. Sebasta, eds. USING LITERATURE IN THE ELEMENTARY CLASSROOM. N.C.T.E., 1978. 73 p. \$3.95 paper

Articles by various experts in reading and language arts show how literature can be used to teach the use of language—e.g., vocabulary development, literature appreciation, creative writing; each chapter contains specific a

examples of activities, a list of books which are good examples of literature and have skills-teaching possibilities; although most of the ideas would be used in a classroom, there are some activities that a media coordinator could use; it is certainly an approach to the use of library books that the media coordinator would want to be familiar with and encourage in an enrichment program

Concentrates on refining reading skills for the average and above-average student; emphasis on vocabulary (contextual analysis, atructural analysis), comprehension (analyzing a paragraph, recognizing patterns of paragraphs), study skills (skimming and scanning, note-taking, reading critically), improving daily reading (using the library, reading newspapers and magazines, using reference books), speed reading, and reading for relaxation (recognizing the basic elements of a short story, enjoying the style, emotion, and imagery in a poem); appendix includes reading speed, comprehension and vocabulary progress charts, answer keys for chapter tests (Wake County)

Norman Jack. STORIES TO TEACH AND DELIGHT. Amsco, 1977. 232 p. \$2,60 paper. Grades 6-9

High interest short stories featuring young people from many backgrounds; many famous writers and tales—Sherwood Anderson, Edgar Allan Poe, "The Monkey's Paw"—centering on suspenseful or dramatic event; stories are not difficult, even Poe's, and are facilitated by having less familiar words appear in boldface and defined at bottom of page (no phonetic spellings, however); exciting content makes fast reading; vocabulary and comprehension exercises follow each story; weak binding; remedial reading for "reluctant" (not genuinely deficient) senior high readers

Potter, Robert R., ed. BEYOND TIME AND SPACE. Globe, 1978. 216 p. \$4 paper. guide. Grades 9-12

Mind-expanding collection of very short science fiction stories and stories of the supernatural by popular authors Ray Bradbury, Isaac Asimov, R. At Lafferty, Poe; others; most stories have been modified considerably to elmit tate problems poor readers would face with style and vocabulary in the originals; followup exercises develop vocabulary, comprehension, and inference; some illustrations, uncluttered pages; adequate teacher's guide; useful to supplement science fiction units or for individual reading, reinforcing pleasure reading activities

THE SPORTS ILLUSTRATED LEARNING PROGRAM: AN INTERDISCIPLINARY APPROACH TO EDUCATION. Modulearn. 5 copies SPORTS ILLUSTRATED magazine, 5 pupil strategy booklets each week; 5 SPORTS ILLUSTRATED action posters, 4 laminated storage cases 30 weekly modules \$225. Grades 9-12

SPORTS ILLUSTRATED, weekly sports magazine, may stimulate creative thinking, enliven learning experiences, provide opportunities for communication, expand knowledge; strategy booklet provides variety of learning experiences, questions in appealing format, answer sheet; appealing to sports-minded high school students; useful classroom supplement for individuals or class

euphemisms, menus, map reading; somewhat tedious format and exercises, but program does have merit

Mystery and adventure paperbacks with read-along cassettes designed to motivate the reluctant reader (books alone will entertain the more capable); simple stories use same cast of characters and setting; many lackluster illustrations; good male narrator reads very slowly; teacher's guide has story summaries, comprehension and vocabulary checks (reproducible), creative activity suggestions which would be time consuming to prepare (Wilkes County)

TIMBERWOOD TALES, SET II. United Learning, 1977. 5 books, 5 cassette tapes, guide \$45. Grades K-3

Introduction to reading in the science area via scientifically accurate readalong story cassettes and durable hardcover books, each presenting Tena's
adventure with an animal and a final page of useful, related scientific data
for the teacher; excellent audio provides introduction and guided narration to
first person dialogue of book which reinforces listening skills, following
directions, independent reading; teacher's guide presents vocabulary lists,
comprehension questions, suggested activities; cartoon-like artwork and
exclusion of other children do detract from overall quality of program
