ABSTRACT

Approximately 400 references regarding working with parents of handicapped children are noted on the resource list and annotated pibliograph. In the resource list, books are grouped by subject headings including types of handicapping conditions (11 conditions including hearing impairments, severe handicaps, physical/health impairments, social/emotional problems, speech/language impairments, visual impairments, learning disabilities, and mental retardation). Citations are arranged alphabetically by author and include title, publisher, and date. The bibliography provides information for ordering materials in the resource list, including 1979 prices. Also indicated is the approximate reading level of each item. (CL)

This Resource List and Annotated Bibliography has been prepared by the staff of the Special Projects Division of Southwest Educational Development Laboratory in response to numerous requests from teachers, trainers and caregivers who work with parents of handicapped children as well as parents themselves.

In the Resource List books are grouped by subject headings including types of handicapping conditions. You will find that some books or pamphlets, applicable to more than one type of disability, are found in more than one section. The categories are listed below, together with the abbreviations used in the Annotated Bibliography.

The Annotated Bibliography, arranged alphabetically, provides information necessary for ordering the materials in the Resource List, including prices current as of Spring, 1979. If the title is not self-explanatory, a brief annotation is provided. In addition, each item is coded to indicate whether it is most suitable for parents (P), teachers (T), or for other child care providers (C), such as day home mothers or after school caregivers. Thus the code T-P-C means that the item is appropriate for Teachers, Parents, and other child Caregivers. Items are also coded in relation to the subject headings used in the Resource List. The approximate reading level of each item is also estimated according to high (contains technical information and terminology and probably requires prior knowledge of special education), moderate, or low.

Below is a table giving the subject headings and their abbreviations as used in the Resource List and Annotated Bibliography.
