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ABSTRACT

This manual is divided unto six sections. Section one contains procedures for applying for a teaching certificate in the State of Delaware. Section two lists rules which apply to all certification areas and to all who are seeking certification for professional employment in the public schools. In the third section information is found regarding reciprocity among the various states and other agreements whereby applicants may meet Delaware's certification requirements by means other than meeting the "specific requirements." Seven types of credentials are defined in the fourth section. Specific requirements for all certification areas are given in the fifth section. The final section contains requirements for reassignment of personnel. (JD)

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CERTIFICATION OF PROFESSIONAL SCHOOL PERSONNEL

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AUTHORIZATION

On May 16, 1974, the State Board of Education adopted these Rules and Regulations for Certification of Professional Public School Personnel. The effective date for changed items is the period beginning May 16, 1974 and ending August 31, 1974. During the designated period persons may be certificated according to either the rules in effect prior to May 16 or those adopted on May 16, 1974.

Beginning September 1, 1974, all certification shall be according to the rules adopted on May 16, 1974 or thereafter amended except that no change shall be retroactive and that persons under agreement to complete a particular program may continue so long as the terms of the agreement are met.

HOW TO USE THIS MANUAL

Tais manual has been divided into six sections. In the first section. APPLICATION INFORMATION, procedures will be found for applying for a teaching certificate in the State of Delaware. The GENERAL REGULATIONS list rules which apply to all certification areas, and to all who are seeking certification for professional employment in the Delaware public schools. Under the heading CERTIFICATION AGREEMENTS, information is found regarding reciprocity among the various states and other agreements whereby applicants may meet Delaware's certification requirements by means other than meeting the "specific requirements." The section entitled, TYPES OF CERTIFICATES defines the seven types of credentials which may be issued. This section also describes the conditions for issuing these credentials. If the reader is looking for the requirements for a specific area, such as Elementary Education, English, Guidance, or Vocational Education, he should study the section on SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS. specific requirements for all certificated areas will be given in this section of the rules and regulations.

A section entitled <u>REASSIGNMENT OF PERSONNEL</u> has been included in these requirements to help school districts and teachers plan when the district needs to reassign personnel due to declining school population or other reasons.

APPLICATION INFORMATION

When Application Should be Made - Application for a certificate may be made as soon as all requirements for the certificate have been completed and should be made if employment is being sought or has been accepted in a Delaware public school. If an applicant is employed in a Delaware public school, credentials for certification will be collected by the school district. If unemployed or seeking first employment, the individual will submit his credentials directly to:

It is recommended that application not be made until the applicant expects to use the certificate.

Where Application for Certification May be Obtained - Application for certificate forms may be obtained from the address listed above or from any local Delaware public school district administrative office.

Instructions for Completing Application for Certificate -

- Step 1 Read carefully and follow the instructions on the Application for Certificate form.
- Step 2 Have official transcripts sent from all colleges listed on the Application for Certificate. Transcripts must be mailed directly from the college to the school district or the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction at the same address as the one to which your application is made.
- Step 3 Send application fee. A ten-dollar (\$10) fee will be charged each applicant for a certificate except:
 - An applicant who has been previously employed in the public schools of Delaware.
 - b. An applicant who is a graduate of Delaware State College or the University of Delaware.
 - c. An applicant who is a resident of Delaware and has been such a resident for at least one year.

If an out-of-state applicant is eligible for more than one certificate at the time of the initial basic evaluation, the total fee will be ten dollars (\$40). Subsequent separate evaluations will be subject to the charge of ten dollars (\$10) each. The fee is not refundable and is charged for the evaluation whether or not the applicant receives a certificate:

If employed or assigned pending certification, have application processed through the local school district administrative office.

Additional Information -

Delaware is a member of several certification agreements. They are:

NCATE (National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education);

Northeast Reciprocity Compact; NASDTEC Certification Reciprocity System;
and The Interstate Agreement on Qualification of Educational Personnel.

(See Certification Agreement) An applicant may qualify for certification in Delaware under one of the above agreements.

Processing of credentials usually takes about two weeks after all information has been received. After processing, the applicant will receive the certificate or be told what is still needed for certification in Delaware.

The Division of Certification and Personnel does not maintain files indefinitely for individuals who are not issued certificates. Those applicants who have not completed certification requirements within three years may find that their records are no longer on file. Transcripts which have not been released to the applicant are disposed of according to instruction from the college.

Transcripts and other records on which certificates have been issued will not be returned to applicant, nor can copies of transcripts be furnished by the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction.

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STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION CERTIFICATION OF PROFESSIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOL PERSONNEL

GENERAL REGULATIONS

These general regulations apply to all certificated school personnel in the Delaware Public School System or other persons making application for a certificate in Delaware.

A. State Board of Education Responsible for Rules.

1. "Every employee of a reorganized school district must meet standards for qualification as adopted by the State Board of Education, and be certified or otherwise licensed in accordance with these standards in order to be placed on the official payroll of the reorganized school district." (Delaware Code, Title I4, \$1092)

This law applies to all certificated or licensed personnel in the Delaware Public School System without regard for salary funding source--local, state, or federal.

2. All credentials for certificate must be received in the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction, <u>Division of Certification and Personnel</u>, prior to employment in a Delaware public school.

If all credentials have not been received by the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction within one month after beginning service, the applicant shall be paid on the substitute teacher's salary basis until he is properly certificated. The salary will then be determined on the basis of education, experience, military service, and certificate status and will be made retroactive to time of beginning arrivice.

3. No person who holds a position or has been working on an approved planned program under the direction of Delaware teacher-preparation institutions, or the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction prior to September 1, 1974, shall be affected by any certification modifications adopted on May 16, 1974.

B. Application for Certificate.

An applicant for a certificate shall file with the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction or a Delaware school district an application supported by all transcripts which may be necessary for evaluation for certification.

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C. Fees Required.

- 1. A ten-dollar (\$10) fee will be charged each applicant for a certificate except:
 - a. An applicant who has been previously employed in the public schools of Delaware.
 - b. An applicant who is a graduate of Delaware State College or the University of Delaware.
 - c. An applicant who is a resident of Delaware and has been such a resident for at least one year.

The check or money order made payable to the Delaware State Board of Education must be attached to the Application for Certificate for any evaluation. If an out-of-state applicant is eligible for more than one certificate at the time of the initial basic evaluation, the total fee will be ten dollars (\$10). Subsequent, separate evaluations will be subject to the charge of ten dollars (\$10) each. The fee is not refundable and is charged for the evaluation whether or not the applicant receives a certificate.

2. A two-dollar (\$2) fee will be charged for each duplicate certificate. The fee is payable to the Delaware State Board of Education. (Do not submit cash or postage stamps.)

D. Moral Character.

No certificate shall be issued to an applicant if there is legal evidence that he is not of good moral character.

E. Degrees from Accredited Institutions.

All graduate and endergraduate degrees accepted for certification must be earned from a college or institution approved by the appropriate regional or national accrediting agency; however, applicants from non-accredited colleges may validate the backelor's degree by completion of six graduate level credits from an accredited institution or through the National Teacher Examinations (NTE) (see "I" below).

F. Student Teaching.

Successful student teaching at the appropriate level under the supervision of an accredited teacher-preparation institution shall be required for all Standard certificates.

1. In lieu of student teaching, one year full time successful elementary, secondary school or appropriate college training in Delaware under supervision; and six additional credit hours of professional education in the certified area as recommended by

the local employing school district will be accepted as meeting, the requirement. The one-year experience must be at the level as that required for the certificate (K-3, Elementary 1-8, Secondary 7-12).

2. An applicant who did not attain an undergraduate index sufficient for eligibility for student teaching at the appropriate level, or who for some other reason was denied permission by the college to engage in this experience, may not be certificated to teach in Delaware until the restriction is removed by the college (except as provided for in F. 1. above).

G. Correspondence Work.

Not more than six semester hours of required courses for certification may be secured by correspondence work. This correspondence work must be successfully completed through an accredited college or in a school listed by a recommended accrediting agency, such as the National Home Study Council.

H. Refresher Work.

Refresher work for certification may be taken in an accredited institution or may be satisfied by inservice work or by a standard proficiency examination either of which has been approved by the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction. The refresher work required is to be in the certification area with three credits in the subject area of the certificate and three credits in professional education directly related to the certificate area. (See Types of Certificates - Limited/Standard 1. and 2.).

I. Proficiency Examinations.

A satisfactory score (fiftieth percentile or better) on the National Teacher Examinations (NTE) may be used:

- 1. To validate work from non-accredited colleges (see also "E") above;
- 2. To complete requirements for the major teaching field if the applicant holds a bachelor's degree but lacks six semester hours or less for full certification and has at least one year of successful teaching experience in the area required for the certificate;
- 3. As a substitute for course work for an additional teaching field. This applies to a person who is fully certificated and who has satisfactory experience in his major teaching field and who wishes to qualify for another teaching field;
- 4. By an applicant who needs only refresher credits as required under "H" above:
- 5. To complete requirements for foreign language in the areas of French, German, and Spanish. (See Specific Requirements, Foreign Language).

6. To complete requirements in the occupational vocational education area of Trade and Industry with approval of the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction (Vocational Division).

J. Date of Certificate.

The date of each certificate shall be the actual date of issuance or employment whichever is earlier.

K. Questionable Credentials..

An applicant for a standard certificate who meets all minimum requirements may in some cases be issued the certificate for one year initially. (Examples: an applicant with a low but a passing grade in student teaching or an applicant with poor references who is applying for certification based on a reciprocity agreement). The certificate would be renewed for the full term after one year of successful teaching upon the recommendation of the superintendent of the Delaware employing school district.

L. Failure to Meet Requirements.

When an employee has accepted a certificate below the level of a standard certificate on agreement that any deficiencies will be completed within an agreed period of time but fails to meet the ageement, the certificate shall not be renewed. However, an emergency certificate may be issued, at the request of a Delaware School District with appropriate salary, adjustment.

M. Renewal of Certificates.

- 1. All teachers who hold first, second, or third grade or limited provisional certificates issued by the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction or standard certificates issued by the Wilmington School District prior to 1934 (certificates which are no longer issued) who are: 1) 65-years of age; or 2) are eligible for retirement either at 60-years of age with 15 years of service, or with 30-years of service, will not be required to take any. further courses for certificate renewal.
- 2. The certificates referred to in Types of Certificate, Section B, which have lapsed since June 30, 1932, may be renewed upon the completion of a refresher course of not less than six semester hour credits previously approved by the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction, provided the most recent teaching experience was satisfactory.
- 3. "Upon the expiration of a Professional Status Certificate, it shall be renewed provided the teacher shall have been employed for at least three school years during the aforesaid five-year term in the type of position for which the certificate was issued."

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(Delaware Code, Title 14, §1203; See also Types of Certificates Section A)

- A provisional certificate is not renewable. (See "L" above, Failure to Meet Requirements)
- 5. A standard-certificate is renewable. (See Types of Certificates, Section B, and Section C, 1 and 2.)
- 6. A limited/standard certificate is not renewable. (See "L" above, Failure to Meet Requirements)
- 7. An emergency certificate is valid for one year and is not renewable. However, if an applicant was employed on the basis of an emergency certificate in the immediate prior year, a new certificate may be issued upon request and recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools of a local Delaware school district and completion of:
 - a. (academic) six semester hour credits of collegiate work leading to a degree in teacher education;
 - b. (trade and industry) six semester hour credits of approved professional education leading to standard certification in (trade and industry.

N. Revocation of Certificates.

- 1. "A professional Status Certificate may be revoked upon dismissal for immorality, misconduct in office, imcompetency, willful neglect of the or disloyalty, provided full and fair hearing and appeal shall have been allowed as set forth in this title.
 - A teacher shall not forfeit his Professional Status Certificate and his rights appertaining if he be transferred against his will to an educational position for which he is not certified."
 (Delaware Code, Title 14, §1204).
- 2. Any certificate other than that of Professional Status may be revoked by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction for the reasons of immorality, misconduct in office, incompetency, willful neglect of duty, disloyalty or falsification of credentials, provided the holder shall have the opportunity for a full and fair hearing before the Superintendent or his designee.
- 3. In accordance with the <u>Professional Employee Contract</u> adopted by the Delaware State Board of Education, there are conditions under which the State Superintendent of Public Instruction may suspend or revoke the certificate of an employee. (See <u>Professional Employee Contract</u>, State Board of Education, Current Edition, Appendix A.)

. Foreign Credentials

Applicants with study outside the United States should submit academic credentials either in the original or in legible certified reproductions. A notarized translation accompanying the original will be required. The translation will assist the Certification Office in determining the applicant's certification status. Processing of such credentials will usually require at least six weeks.

In making application for certification, the individual with foreign credentials must follow the standard procedure for all applicants. Any teaching experience claimed must be properly verified.

* If an applicant with foreign credentials is unable to provide all the required information, a certificate to teach in Delaware cannot be issued. (See also Types of Certificates, Section 8. a., b., c.)

P. Provisions for Exceptions and Changes:

- 1. An exception to the existing certification regulations may be made by the State Superintendent of Public Anstruction at the request of the local chief school officer. A request of such exception should be addressed to the State Director of Certification and Personnel who, after documentation, will refer it to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction with recommendations.
- 2. a. In the event of the consolidation of school districts where reassignment of certificated personnel is necessary, the following rules shall apply:

Personnel shall be considered to be certificated for the position to which assigned and a certificate issued.

Such certificate or certificates shall be valid in the consolidated district for the duration of the assignment or subsequent assignments resulting from consolidation.

Adopted by the State Board of Education on June 6, 1967, in reference to the Delaware Education Advancement Act, Laws of Delaware, Vol. 56, Chapter 292.)

o. In the event of consolidation of districts after July 1, 1969, and in accordance with Delaware Code, Title 14, \$1027, the provisions stated (in 2.a. above) shall apply, but for no more than two years following the date of consolidation.

STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION CERTIFICATION OF PROFESSIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOL PERSONNEL

CERTIFICATION AGREEMENTS - RECIPROCITY

The Delaware State Board of Education has entered into several certification agreements with other state education agencies and also accepts for full certification graduates of teacher education programs which have been accredited by a state or national approval agency. These agreements have been made in order to provide a greater degree of interstate reciprocity in granting certification to professional educators seeking employment in Delaware.

A. National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE)

A graduate of a teacher-education program that is on the approved list of the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) who graduated after the program was NCATE accredited and who is fully recommended, by the college will be certificated automatically.

- B. Northeast Compact States (Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Vermont)
 - 1. A graduate of a program in Elementary Education in any one of the above Northeast Compact states who graduated after June 1, 1955, is eligible for standard certification in Delaware provided the program is approved by the State Education Agency in the state in which the institution is located and the institution is accredited by the regional or national accrediting agency and the applicant is recommended for teaching by the institution.
 - 2. An applicant for a secondary classroom certificate with a bachelor's degree who holds a valid initial regular certificate for classroom teaching from any one of the Northeast Compact states will be issued a Delaware limited/standard certificate for the same teaching area. A standard certificate may be issued after three years of successful teaching in a Delaware public school in the certificated area.
- C. NASDTEC Certification Reciprocity System
 (National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification)

A graduate of a teacher-education program approved by a State Education Agency on the basis of the standards and procedures as specified in the Standards for State Approval of Teacher Education (revision of U.S.O.E. Circular 351) and who is fully recommended by the institution, will be certificated automatically in Delaware for the major teaching area.



- D. Interstate Agreement on Qualifications of Education Personnel
 - 1. Classroom Teacher
 - a. An applicant with a bachelor's degree granted after January 1, 1964 in teacher education whose program is on the list of approved programs for the <u>Interstate Agreement</u> will be automatically certificated to teach in Delaware in his major area if he is fully recommended for teaching by the degree granting institution.
 - b. An applicant with a bachelor's degree who holds a valid initial regular certificate from one of the states in the <u>Interstate Agreement</u> and who has at least 27 months of successful teaching experience within the immediate past seven years with at least 18 months of that teaching under the certificate now offered is eligible for a Delaware certificate in the same area. (A copy of the certificate and verification of experience is required.)
 - 2. All other ceftificated education personnel (Except Chief School Officers and Assistant Superintendents)

An applicant from one of the states in the <u>Interstate Agreement</u> who holds a valid initial regular certificate from the state and who has a minimum of 27 months of successful performance of professional school services under the certificate is eligible for a Delaware certificate in the same area if he has attained the same degree level of education required by Delaware. (A copy of the certificate and verification of experience is required.)

Certificated Educational Personnel from Other States
(Except local District Superintendent)

An applicant with a bachelor's degree who is fully certificated in another state and who has a minimum of three years of satisfactory experience within the immediate past ten years in the specific teaching area covered by that certificate will be certified in that area if he meets the total number of credits required by Delaware in professional education and the specific field, but not necessarily the specific courses required in Delaware if he has attained the same degree level of education required by Delaware.

STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION CERTIFICATION OF PROFESSIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOL PERSONNEL

TYPES OF CERTIFICATES

Delaware issues seven types of credentials for educational personnel which are described below.

A. Professional Status

"Teachers who fully meet the initial requirements for certification by the certifying board to which this chapter applies, and who have served for a period of three years under the authority of the certifying board in the type of position for which the certificate is appropriate, shall be issued a 'Professional Status' certificate. Such Professional Status certificate shall be issued to cover a term of five years." (Delaware Code, Title 14, \$1202)

The Professional Status certificate is issued only to classroom teachers as indicated in the Delaware Code, Title 14, \$1202.

The Attorney General has ruled that the three years' service must be immediately prior to the issuance of the initial Professional Status Certificate; otherwise, the teacher must meet requirements for issuance and/or renewal of an initial certificate. (Opinion dated July 1, 1955.)

B. Regular Standard

An initial Standard Certificate is issued normally for a period of ten years to an applicant who has met all the requirements of the General Regulations and the specific requirements for the certificate.

(Exception: Intern Certificate which is issued for one year. See Specific Requirements; see also General Regulations K.)

Limited/Standard

May be issued to:

1. An applicant who meets all course requirements for the Standard Certificate but who has been out of college ten years or more. Six semester hours of refresher credits will be required of such an applicant for the issuance of the Standard Certificate.

or

2. An applicant who holds a Delaware Standard Certificate but who has not taught on that certificate for at least three years during the last ten years. Six semester hours of refresher credits will be required of such an applicant for renewal of the Standard Certificate.

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3. An applicant who meets the requirements for the Limited/Standard as set forth in the <u>Specific Requirements</u> for any particular certificate. (See <u>Specific Requirements</u>)

or

Certificate—Industrial, who is within nine semester hours of meeting the stated requirements for his certificate as outlined herein and who agrees to remove the deficiencies within the time limit provided he has satisfactorily completed student teaching or one year teaching experience at the appropriate level. The applicant who has been issued a certificate below the limited standard may be issued a limited standard when he has met the conditions of this regulation. In the case of the latter applicant, the total time limitation for meeting the standard requirements is that originally prescribed when the certificate below the limited standard was issued. (This rule does not apply to all certificates, see 3 above and Specific Requirements.)

or

Ah applicant who meets all other requirments but who has not successfully completed clinical and/or field experience including student teaching at the appropriate level. (K-3; Elem. 1-8; Secondary 7-12)

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6. An applicant who is a graduate in an approved secondary education program or who holds a valid initial regular certificate in one of the Northeast Compact States. (See Certification Agreement)

or

- 7. An applicant who is:
 - a. an exchange teacher from a foreign country;

or

b. a teacher in an exchange program organized between states and/or schools and/or institutions of higher education and/or state education agencies within the United States;

or.

c. a teacher from a foreign country who holds a valid certificate from that country and a degree equivalent to a Bachelor's degree



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8. An applicant for a specialized assignment for which no certificate is defined, who possesses the competencies and skills required for the special assignment needed in the Delaware Public School System (example: museum curator, laboratory technician, professional). The applicant's credentials, including evidence of the skills and competencies, will be collected by the employing district and sent to the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction along with a job description of the special assignment. A determination regarding certification will be made by the Delaware State Department of 'Public Instruction.

All Limited/Standard certificates shall be issued with a time limitation of three years to allow for the completion of the requirements prescribed at the time of the issuance of the certificate.

A Limited/Standard certificate carries the same salary as a Standard certificate.

A Limited/Standard certificate is issued only at the request of the employing district.

The Standard certificate may be issued to replace the Limited/Standard when all requirements have been met and the applicant is recommended by the Chief School Officer in the local school district where employed. (See General Regulations, Section "0")

D. Provisional (Substandard)

May be issued to:

1. Academic Classroom teachers

An applicant for a Standard teaching certificate who holds a bachelor's degree but who is not fully certified and who is working on a planned program toward full certification.

Provisional academic certificate are not issued for all positions. (See Specific Requirements)

All academic Provisional certificates shall be issued for a period limited to three years in order to allow for the completion of the requirements as prescribed at the time of issuance of the certificate.

* Salary for the academic Provisional certificated person shall be ten percent (10%) less that the salary for the Standard certificated person.

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2. Trade and Industry Classroom Teachers

An applicant for a standard trade and industry certificate who has a high school education and six years of work experience or two years beyond the learning period in a trade or industrial occupation in the trade to be taught and who agrees to complete sixty semester hours of approved professional education leading to full certification.

All trade and industry Provisional certificates shall be issued for a period limited to six years in order to allow for the completion of the requirements as prescribed at the time of the issuance of the certificate.

*Salary for the trade and industry Provisional certificated person shall be \$200 less than the salary for the Standard T&I certificated person.

E. Emergepey (Temporary) (Substandard)

When written notice is received from the local chief school officer at the direction of the local board of education that a fully certificated person cannot be found for a particular position, an Emergency certificate may be issued after August 15 for a period of no longer than one school year if the applicant meets the following minimum requirements:

1. Academic

a. A non-degree applicant for a regular teaching position who is currently engaged in pursuing a bachelor's degree and who has completed all professional education requirements including student teaching but who lacks no more than six semester hours of credits for completion of degree requirements;

or

b. A non-degree applicant for a regular teaching position who has completed no less than two years of college training and who has no less than three years of successful teaching experience;

or

An applicant who is a graduate of a non-accredited college. No higher level certificate may be issued until the degree is validated by a means listed in the General Regulations, section "I" or "E".

*Salary for the academic Emergency certificated person shall be twenty percent (20%) less than the salary for the Standard certificated person.

"If a teacher holding a Temporary certificate who has been in the employ of the terminating board for ten consecutive years immediately preceding any action commenced under this Chapter, the provisions of Section 1410, 1411, 1412, 1413, and 1414 of this Title shall apply. This subsection shall not apply after June 30, 1975." (Delaware Code, Title 14, \$1403 (b).

2. Trade and Industry

A non-degree applicant for a teaching position who has six years of work experience or two years beyond the learning period in a trade or industrial occupation in the trade to be taught.

*Salary for the trade and industry Emergency person shall be \$400 less than the salary for the Standard T & I certificated person.

F. Partial Teaching Assignment

When a written request is received from the local chief school officer, a partial teaching assignment of no more than two (2), classes or periods may be authorized for one (1) year if the person assigned the partial meets the following requirements:

- 1. Holds a currently valid Delaware standard teaching certificate in a field other than that in which the partial assignment is to be made, and
- 2. Has at least fifteen (15) semester hours in the partial area of assignment.

G. Permit, Aides

A permit shall be required for all persons employed either full time or part time as school or classroom aides with local, state, federal or other funds.

H. Permit, Substitute Teacher (Delaware Code, Title 14, \$1230)

- Class A. May be issued to an applicant who holds, or is eligible to hold a valid Standard Delaware teacher's certificate or such a certificate that has expired.
- Class B May be issued to an applicant with or without a bachelor's degree who meets at least the requirements for an Emergency certificate (See Types of Certificates, Section "E" above).
- Class C A Class C certificate may be issued to an applicant who is not eligible for either Class A or Class B certification but who is recommended to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction by the chief school officer of a Delaware school district.

5/74 8/76 Class D - In further compliance with Title 14, \$1230, the State Board of Education hereby established a Class D substitute teacher certificate as follows:

Class D - A Class D certificate may be issued to an applicant who is eligible for or holds a Class A, B, or C certificate, but who prefers on a given date to perform substitute teaching assignments as a volunteer worker, or at a wage rate to be determined by the Board of Education of the employing school district.

Note: Your attention is called to the fact that there must be local Board action to implement this classification. (Class D Substitute - Approved by the State Board of Education, December 16, 1971.)

DELAWARE STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION CERTIFICATION OF PROFESSIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOL PERSONNEL.

REASSIGNMENT OF PERSONNEL CHANGE OF CERTIFICATE LEVEL OR CONTENT AREA

The purpose of this section is to give a quick guide to the school district facing a declining enrollment and thus may need to reassign a teacher to an area for which he is not fully certificated. The following possibilities exist in these rules and regulations:

- 1. Reassignment with a provisional certificate to the new area. See Types of Certificates Provisional and Specific Requirements for the new area of assignment.
- Reassignment with a limited/standard certificate to the new area.

 See Types of Certificates limited/standard 4 and 5 and Specific Requirements for the new area of assignment.
- 3. Reassignment with a standard certificate to the new area. See <u>General</u> <u>Regulations</u>, Section I, <u>Proficiency Examinations</u> 2 and 3.

Note: All of the information in this section is taken from the text of this manual. The following pages of this section summarize the conversion policies.

Approximate course requirements are given for various conversion possibilities. Exact requirements will need to be determined for the new area by consulting the section - Specific Requirements.

- I. Secondary Level (7-12) to Early Childhood Level
 - A. General Education

No course work required if the bachelor's degree includes at least one course in social studies, English, mathematics, and science. (Most bachelor degree programs do include course work in all four areas.)

- B. Professional Education (usually would need 27 semester hours)
 - 6 sem hrs. Teaching of reading
 - 6 sem hrs. Child development
 - 3 sem hrs. Kindergarten methods
 - Elementary methods including mathematics, science, social studies, and language arts
- C. Experience

One year successful experience in teaching Kindergarten-Primary (K-3)

During the transition period the teacher could be issued a provisional certificate and would have three years to complete the course work needed. (See Types of Certificate-Provisional)

- II. From Secondary Level (7-12) to Elementary Level (1-8)
 - A. General Education

No course work required if the bachelor's degree includes at least one course in social studies, English, mathematics, and science,

- B. Professional Education (usually need 21 24 semester hours)
 - 6 sem hrs. Teaching of reading
 - 3 sem hrs. Child development
 - 3 sem brs. Sociology (may not need)
 - 12 sem hrs. Elementary methods including mathematics, science, social studies, and language arts
- C. Experience

One year successful experience in teaching elementary (1-8)

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During the transition period the teacher could be issued a provisional certificate and would have three years to complete t' course work needed. (See Types of Certificates-Provisional)

- From Secondary Level (7-12) to a specific area of Special Education
 - General Education Satisfied by a Bachelor's degree.
 - Professional Education (usually need 28 semester hours)
 - 3 sem. hrs. Methods of teaching reading
 - 3 sem. hrs. , Methods of teaching mathematics ,
 - Introduction to exceptional children 3 sem. hrs.
 - Behavior problems and/or behavior 3 sem. hrs. management
 - Review and research in the specific 3 sem. hrs.
 - area of special education
 - 3 sem. hrs. Methods of teaching in the specific
 - area of special education
 - Identification diagnosis and assessment 3 sem. hrs.
 - of exceptional children in the specific
 - area of special education
 - Electives in the specific area of 6 sem. hrs.
 - special education
 - Experience

One year successful experience in teaching in the specific area of special education

The teacher would need at least six semester hours as listed under Limited/Standard - Exceptional Children before a limited/ standard certificate could be issued. No provisional certificates (See Specific Requirements - Exceptional Children) are issued.

This teacher would have three years to complete the requirements for the standard special education certificate.

- IV. From Elementary Level (1-8) or Early Childhood Level (K-3) to an area of Special Education
 - A., General Education Satisfied by a hachelor's degree.
 - Professional Education (usually need 21 semester hours)
 - Introduction to exceptional children 3 sem. hrs.
 - Behavior problem and/or behavior 3 sem. hrs.
 - management ,
 - Review and research or survey course 3 sem. hrs. in the specific area of special educa-

- 3 sem. hrs. Methods in the specific area of special education
- 3 sem. hrs. Identification diagnosis and assessment of exceptional children in the specific area of special education
- 6 sem. hrs. Electives in the specific area of special education

C. Experience

One year successful experience in teaching in the specific area of special education

The teacher would need at least six semester hours as listed under Limited/Standard - Exceptional Children before a limited/standard certificate could be issued. No provisional certificates are issued. (See Specific Requirements - Exceptional Children)

This teacher would have three years to complete the requirements for the standard special education certificate.

- V. From Elementary Level (1-8) to Secondary Level (7-12)
 - A. General Education Satisfied by a . bachelor's degree.
 - B. Professional Education
 - 3 sem. hrs. Methods at secondary level (7-12)
 - C. Specific Teaching Field (Science, Mathematics, Social Studies, etc.)

Usually the elementary teacher has completed a minor in a specific subject field of approximately 18 - 24 semester hours. When the elementary teacher does have a minor subject field, he would usually need an additional 12-18 semester hours in order to complete the requirements for a secondary teaching field. Therefore, the usual elementary teacher converting to a secondary field would need 15-21 semester hours.

D. Experience

One year successful experience teaching secondary level (7-12)

During the transition period the teacher could be issued a provisional certificate and would have three years to complete the course work needed. (see Types of Certificates - Provisional)

- VI. Change in Certificate through Proficiency Examinations
 - A. The National Teacher Examinations may be taken to complete six semester hours of course work required for a certificate if the

- applicant has one year of successful teaching experience in the area of certification. (See General Regulations, Section I-2)
- B. The National Teacher Examination may be taken as a substitute for course work for an additional teaching field. This applies to a person who is fully certificated and who has satisfactory experience in his major teaching field and who wishes to qualify for another teaching field. (See General Regulations, Section I-3).

DELAWARE

STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION CERTIFICATION OF PROFESSIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOL PERSONNEL

SPECIFIC STATE REQUIREMENTS.

This section applies only to those applicants who have not completed an approved teacher education program or who are not eligible for a standard certificate under the reciprocity agreements. (See <u>Certification Agreements</u>-Reciprocity)

Each specific area lists the minimum requirements for the standard certificate. Several alternatives are open to the applicant. Standard certificates are issued to all eligible applicants.

Certificates below the Standard are issued only to applicants who are employed in Delaware Public Schools and at the request of the employing school district and in accordance with the General or Specific Requirements for the particular substandard certificates.

The Specific Requirements also indicate the certificates below the Standard which may be issued in any particular teaching area at the request of a Delaware Public school.

School districts are requested to assign titles to positions which are recognized in these regulations. If use of very specific but unrecognized titles are necessary, a ob description should be formulated and submitted in advance of the appointment thus enabling the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction to determine the appropriate certificate for the position.

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PROFESSIONAL GROWTH GRADUATE PROGRAMS

(*B+15, B+30, M+15, M+30, and M+45)

Rationale and Philosophy

An Act to amend Chapter 13, Title 14, Delaware Code entitled "State Supported Salary Schedules for School Employees" and to provide appropriations therefor was passed by the legislature and signed into law by the Governor in 1956. This law authorized the State Board of Education to define and set policies for the Plus 30 graduate credits as it applied to the state supported salary schedules (50 Delaware Laws, Chapter 602).

House Bill 1274 signed by the Governor on July 1, 1976 provided for additional state supported salary increments for school employees as follows: Master's degree plus 45 credits effective July 1, 1976; Master's degree plus 15 credits effective July 1, 1977; and a Bachelor's degree plus 15 credits effective July 1, 1978 (60 Delaware Laws, Chapter 511, H.B. 1274, approved July 1, 1976).

In order to draw all the policies for the plus programs under one comprehensive, consistent policy it is recommended that the old Plus 30 policies be revised; and, the revision, henceforth, be known as Rules and Regulations for Professional Growth Graduate Programs (B+15, B+30, M+15, M+30, M+45).

The policy for the Professional Growth Graduate Programs was recommended by a committee composed of certification and personnel staff and representatives from the field and the institutions of higher education. This proposal is divided into the following areas: Rationale and Philosophy, Rules and Regulations, Defintions and Explanation of Terms Used in This Program, and Applications Procedures.

Professional Growth Graduate Programs (B+15, B+30, M+15, M+30, and M+45) have been developed and funded for the express purpose of improving the quality of the instructional program provided children and youth attending the elementary and secondary schools of Delaware. To achieve this objective, these programs seek to encourage educators or professional staff members to engage in a continuous, career-long process of professional development. Through graduate studies, undergraduate studies, inservice credits, and professional-growth credits educators or professional staff members are encouraged to develop new and expanded skills, attitudes, and understandings designed to enhance educational practices and provide additional strategies and tactics for achieving educational objectives. Thus, Professional Growth Graduate Programs should be ongoing, changing, responsive programs with the purpose of assisting and encouraging inservice school personnel to engage in a process of professional self-renewal.

*Effective date - July 1, 1978 (B+15)

I. RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Acceptable Grades

All grades for credit submitted for a Professional Growth Graduate Program must be a grade that earns graduate credit and quality points in the granting institution. In the case of credits earned on a "pass-fail" basis, a grade of "pass" will be accepted.

2. Acceptable Credits

Credits for the Professional Growth Graduate Programs (B+15, B+30, M+15, M+30, and M+45) must be earned after the Bachelor's degree. They may be graduate, undergraduate, or inservice. Up to nine (9) professional growth credits may also be counted. Undergraduate and graduate credits must be earned at a regionally accredited institution of higher learning. Any credits not counted toward a degree shall be counted in the B+15; B+30, M+15, M+30, or M+45 programs. Undergraduate, inservice, and professional growth credits shall have the prior approval (before submission to IPI Certification) of the employing school district superintendent, or his designee. These credits shall be relevant and usable by the applying employee.

Credits not cumulative are those earned prior to, and counted toward, the awarding of a Bachelor's degree. Credits earned after the Bachelor's degree and not counted in a Master's degree will be counted toward the Professional Growth Graduate Programs (B+15, B+30, M+15, M+30) and/or M+45).

For Trade and Industry teachers, a Bachelor's degree equivalent is two years of college and six years of work experience, Delaware Code \$1301.

3. Salary Increment

A Delaware standard or limited/standard certificate must be held by the applicant before a Professional Growth Graduate Program salary increment will be approved.

4. Admittance to Graduate School

Applicants for a Professional Growth Graduate Program need not be admitted to a graduate school in order to have graduate level courses accepted for these programs.

5. Acceptable Professional Degrees

Professional degrees earned in areas other than professional education will not be accepted for the Professional Growth Graduate Program. Individual courses in these areas will be considered for acceptance in the Professional Growth Graduate Program upon receipt of a written rationale from the applicant with an endorsement by his/her local employing school district superintendent.

6. Usable Credits

All credits and programs to be accepted for Professional Growth Graduate Program state supported salary increments must be relevant and usable to the professional school employee and may be approved or disapproved by the local employing school district superintendent.

7. Excess Graduate Level Credits

Graduate level credits earned after a Bachelor's degree or before earning a Master's degree can be used in the B+15 and the B+30 Professional Growth Graduate Programs so long as the same credit is used only one time.

Credits earned in excess of those required for the Master's degree by the granting institution can be used in a M+15, M+30, and M+45 Professional Growth Graduate Program.

8. Effective Date of Salary Adjustment

The salary adjustment will be made after the evaluation and approval of the candidate's application by the Division of Cértification and Personnel, State Department of Public Instruction. The adjustment will be authorized to be made retroactive to the first of the month following the date certified by the institution of higher education as to when the program or credit was completed.

Retroactive salary adjustment may be by a single payment or by payments divided equally among all the pay periods remaining in a current fiscal year as may be determined by the district or state fiscal officers. No salary credit may be retroactive into a prior fiscal year.

Appeals Committee

A committee will be called to review and make recommendations regarding an appeal which may result as these rules are administered. The committee members to be called will be composed of the following:

- one representative from the professional organization which represents the applicant
- one staff member from the Delaware Department of Public Instruction
- one representative from the Delaware Chief School. Officers organization.

When needed, the committee will be convened by the Director of Certification and Personnel.

II. DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATION OF TERMS USED IN THIS PROGRAM

Graduate Level Course

Any course to be used herein which is offered at a regionally accredited college or university which is considered graduate level at that institution.

Undergraduate Course

Any course to be used herein which is offered by a regionally accredited college or university which carries college credit for an Associate or Bachelor's degree.

Inservice Project Credits

Any project course offered by a Delaware local school district which has the approval of the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction or any course offered by the Delaware State Department. of Public Instruction. (To be used in a Professional Growth Graduate Program these courses must have the prior approval of the local employing school district superintendent.)

Inservice courses which are sponsored and approved by another state education agency will also be accepted provided they have the approval of the superintendent of the local employing school district. (These courses need not carry college credit.)

Professional-Growth Gredits

Individual activities, i.e., projects, travel, and work experience, which contribute to the professional growth of the school employee in his/her assignment. Professional-growth credits must have the prior approval of the Delaware State Department of Public Instruction and the local employing school district superintendent. A written evaluation report by the individual earning the credit will be required at the conclusion of the activity.

5. Credit Calculation

All credits must be expressed in terms of semester hours. College or university credits expressed in quarter hours will be converted to semester hours by multiplying the number of quarter hours by two-thirds. In the case of inservice credits, 15 clock hours of class time is considered the equivalent of one credit. Credits earned for professional growth activities will be calculated in the same manner as inservice credits.

III. - APPLICATION PROCEDURES

- 1. It is the responsibility of the applicant to secure the proper form from his local school district office, to complete the form, and to return it to his/her school district office for transmittal to the Office of Certification and Personnel, State Department of Public Instruction, Townsend Building, Dover, Delaware 19901.
- 2. It is the responsibility of the applicant to arrange for the appropriate authority or institution to provide verification, if needed, regarding graduate level of courses or any other information that might be needed to support his/her application for Professional Growth Graduate Program.
- 3. Application for evaluation should not be submitted prior to the completion of a Professional Growth Graduate Program.
- 4. Specific questions and concerns which an applicant may have concerning his/her Professional Growth Graduate Program must be submitted in writing to the Certification and Personnel Office via his/her local school district office.

Eligibility for certification is now set at four levels of educational background which allow for flexibility in recruitment and assignment.

Certificates shall be issued according to four categories:

- Class A A Class A certificate may be issued to an applicant who holds or is eligible to hold a valid Standard Delaware teacher's certificate or such a certificate that has expired. In the case of a certificate that has expired, the applicant for the substitute certificate shall not be required to present refresher courses for issuance of the substitute's certificate.
 - Class B A Class B certificate may be issued to an applicant with or without a Bachelor's degree who meets at least the requirements for a temporary emergency certificate as set forth in Types of Certificates Section E.
 - Class C A Class C certificate may be issued to an applicant who is not eligible for either Class A or Class B certification but who is recommended to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction by the chief school officer of a Delaware Public School District.

A student currently enrolled in a four-year degree granting institution who desires to serve as a substitute teacher may be employed as a Class "C" substitute without the formality of submitting a transcript or health certificate. (State Board of Education November 12, 1970)

Class D - A Class D certificate may be issued to an applicant who is eligible for or holds a Class A, B, or C certificate, but who prefers on a given date to perform substitute teaching assignments as a volunteer worker, or at a wage rate to be determined by the Board of Education of the employing school district.

Title 14. Section 1305 - Basic salary schedule for teachers, principals, superintendents, and other administrative and supervisory employees

- (a) "All employees who hold appropriate certificates and whose salaries are paid for 10 months per year, shall receive annual salaries in accordance with the following schedule." (See salary schedule under 1305)
- (b) "All who are employed under subsection (a) of this section for more than 10 months per year and paid accordingly shall receive a payment of one-tenth of the amount designated in the schedule set forth in said subsection for such employee for each additional month of employment per year."
- (c) "Salary derived (1001) subsection (a) of this section for ten (10) months employment shall mean a total of 185 days. The 185 days shall be full work days with 180 days devoted to actual school sessions for pupils and five (5) days devoted to attendance in inservice education programs or other programs approved by the State Board of Education, except that the State Board of Education may reduce the number of days devoted to school sessions or inservice education programs on just cause or upon showing of undsual circumstances. Full work days shall be defined by the State Board of Education."

Title 14, Section 1317 - Method of salary payments

Teachers and principals and other employees who are employed for ten months per year shall have the option of being paid in 20 or 24 equal payments, provided that such employees shall indicate their preference at the time of signing their contract for the ensuing school year, and that the method of salary payment so designated shall not be changed during the period of the aforementioned contract.

Title 14, Section 1320 - Deduction for unexcused absence

For each day's absence for reasons other than those permitted under Section 1318 of this 1:tle, there shall be deducted 1/185th of the annual salary of the employee who is employed for 10 months; 1/204th for the employee who is employed for 11 months; and 1/222nd, for the employee who is employed for 12 months, for each day of unexcused absence.

Title 14, Section 1329 + Employment contracts

- (a) "The State Board of Education and the Boards of Education of the reorganized school districts may sign individual employment contracts involving state funds only with those professional employees whose base salary is that provided for in Title 14, Delaware Code, Section (30). The salary amounts in the contracts so authorized shall be for one fiscal year, provided that contracts for administrative personnel covered in paragraph (b) of this section shall not be so limited."
- (b) Nothing in this Title shall be construed as prohibiting the Board and any assistant principal, principal, supervisor, administrative assistant, director, assistant superintendent, or-superintendent from entering into an employment contract for a period of up to five years.
- (c) "Salary amounts in individual employment contracts provided for in paragraph (a) of this section shall not be contracted for, agreed upon or effective prior to May 1 of the fiscal year immediately preceding the beginning of the fiscal year during which the salary amount is to be received, except that for recruitment of new teachers to a reorganized school district contracts may be entered into at any time at the current year's state supported salary level for such teachers, provided that in the contracts experience is to be computed at the same level as teachers within the state equally qualified. As of May first of any year, salary schedules shall be based on state supported salary schedules in existence at that time for the contracted year."

Title 10, Chapter 35. ATTACHMENTS

Section 3509 - Proceedings against garnishees

"If any garnishee, duly summoned shall not appear as required, he may be compelled, by attachment, to appear and answer or plead. The plaintiff may be compelled to pay a fee to the garnishee in such amount as may be fixed from time to time by rule of the Superior Court.

An employer shall not dismiss an employee because the employer was summoned as garnishee for the employee."

Tide 29, Chapter 51. PUBLIC OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES

Section 5103 - Payment of debts as condition of employment

"No agency of the State shall employ, or retain upon its payroll, any person who refuses or neglects to make an effort to pay, by making regular partial payments on, any unsecured debt, duly contracted for by such person, while in the employ of the State. Whoever refuses or neglects to comply with, or violates, any of the provisions of this section, shall thereafter be disquirified for membership or employment on any such agency."

(Attorney General Opinion - 7/2/69 — A tracher naving tenure status cannot be discharged for non-payment of debts, but there are sufficient grounds under Section 1411, of Title 14 to terminate his employment.)


