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ABSTRACT

Fall 1979 student registration data for the seven Hawaii community colleges were examined to determine faculty teaching load as measured by average semester hours taught, average hours in contact with students, and average class size. The study revealed that Fall 1979 enrollment was slightly higher than the previous Fall's; that there were numerically and proportionately more part-time students than in previous years; and that students were generally carrying lighter credit loads. The data showed that while slightly more courses were offered, fewer classes were scheduled. Instructor semester hours increased by 105 semester hours and instructor contact hours increased by 126 contact hours. On the other hand, student registrations and student semester and contact hours were the lowest in five years. With regard to class size, the study revealed that the number and proportion of classes with less than 11 students had decreased and that the average class size (24 students) was the lowest in five years. Teaching loads remained at about the same level as in 1978; the average semester hours per full-time equivalent (FTE) instructor was 13.3, the average contact hours was 16.1, and the productivity ratio was 308. The faculty-student ratio of one to 20 was the lowest in five years. The report provides tables illustrating faculty load data by college and course. (JP)

Introduction

The total workload of the faculty involves a variety of professional activities over and above teaching in the classroom: engaging in departmental research, advising students, attending faculty committee meetings, and responding to community requests. This report, however, provides data only on one aspect of the faculty's workload: teaching load: i.e., the actual classroom situation as measured in terms of average semester hours taught, average hours in contact with students, average class size, etc.

Sources of Data

SIS Computer Reports 3010 and 3011 (Course Registration Reports), which provide detailed and summary data on faculty-student "workload" based on student semester hours, were used as the primary documents for this report. (Data for these reports were abstracted from students' class registration data.) Computer Reports 3030 (Schedule of Classes) and the Faculty-Staff Information System (FSIS) reports were used as reference points. The deans of instruction were also consulted for certain information regarding their schedules of classes and lecturers and instructors on overload.

Population Included

The information for this report is based on registration data for the following groups of students registered in the regular credit programs in seven community colleges: classified and unclassified students, early admittees, concurrent registrants, and other special students whose registration records are processed through the SIS. All computer reports are as of mid-October. The data have been reviewed by the deans of instruction.

Adjustments

Equivalent credits were established for classes with variable credits. The methodology differed, however, depending upon the kind of classes under consideration, e.g., directed studies, cooperative education, etc. (See Appendix A, Definitions.)

## Highlights

- I. Several factors affected the teaching load of community college faculty this fall.
  - A. Fall 1979 enrollment is slightly higher than last year's. (Enrollment has generally stabilized since Fall 1975.) Furthermore, there are numerically and proportionately more part-time students this fall (10,199 students, 49%) compared to Fall 1978 (9,764 students, 47%) and Fall 1975 (8,454 students, 41%). Additionally, all students are generally carrying lighter credit loads compared to previous years. This is reflected in lower student registrations (in classes) and total SSHs.
  - B. The FTE count of faculty is higher than in previous years. This is probably because more released time is being granted to enable instructors to engage in various curriculum related activities. (In most instances, the expenses related to released time are funded externally through grants such as the AIDP and the Humanities grants.)
- II. Courses, Classes, Semester and Contact Hours (Table 1).
  - A. The data show that while slightly more courses are offered, fewer classes are scheduled. Instructor semester and contact hours are slightly higher. This fall there are 11 more courses (1,747 compared to 1,736) and 51 fewer classes (3,070 compared to 3,121). Instructor semester hours increased by 105 semester hours (from 8,973 to 9,078); instructor contact by 126 contact hours (from 10,919 to 11,045).
  - B. However, student registrations and student semester and contact hours are the lowest in five years. (See paragraph IA above.) Student registrations number 74,191 (2,466 less than the figure reported last fall). Student semester and contact hours number 211,256 and 250,736 respectively, this fall. Corresponding figures last fall were higher by 2% for each category.
- III. Classes with Ten or Fewer Students (Table 2).
  - A. The number and proportion of classes with ten or fewer students decreased for the system and at several colleges.
  - B. Many of these "low enrollment" classes are held for a variety of reasons: graduation requirements, facility limitations, accreditation requirements (especially in the health services courses). Further, a few courses are taught by non-instructional staff (deans, counselors, and media coordinators) who receive no additional compensation.

IV. Average Class Size, by Program (Table 3).

- A. Average class sizes are the lowest in five years: 24 for the system; 19-28, by campus. (Last fall: 25 for the total).
- B. As in past years, average class size in general education courses (25 students) is larger than that in vocational education courses (22 students).

V. Average Semester and Contact Hours Taught (Table 4).

- A. Teaching loads, in terms of semester and contact hours, productivity ratios, remained at about the same level as last fall:
  - (1) Average semester hours, per FTE instructor, 13.3; average contact hours, 16.1; productivity ratio, 308.
  - (2) As expected, campuses varied: from 12.6-13.9 semester hours per FTE instructor; from 13.9-18.3 weekly contact hours and from 242-339 productivity ratios.
- B. The faculty-student ratio of 1:20 is the lowest in five years. The ratios ranged from 1:16-1:23, by campus.

VI. Headcount of Instructors and Lecturers; FTE Count, Other Faculty Engaged in Teaching (Table 5).

- A. Both head and FTE counts of instructors are higher this fall compared to last fall:
  - (1) Headcount, 956, an increase of 31, 3%.
  - (2) FTE count, 685.0, an increase of 8.3, 1%.
- B. The FTE count of instructors increased at four campuses and decreased at the remaining three.

Summary

The teaching load this fall is about the same as last fall, generally, for the community college totals. However, an examination of campus data shows fluctuations. Affecting the teaching load are such factors as: (1) proportionately more part-time students; (2) students generally carrying lighter credit loads; and (3) more resources being directed toward curriculum planning activities made possible largely through external funding.

APPENDIX A  
DEFINITIONS

1. COURSE: A unit of instruction consisting of recitations, lectures, laboratory sessions, etc., in a particular subject.  
Example: English 100
2. CLASS: A lecture section of one or more students meeting regularly for instruction in a lecture or seminar course.  
Example: Lecture section 39 of English 100
3. SEMESTER HOURS: Semester or semester hour value assigned to each lecture section of each fixed credit course. (Also known as credit hours.)  
Example: Three semester hours for lecture section 39 of English 100
4. STUDENT REGISTRATIONS: Number of students registered in each class, excluding students auditing the class.  
Example: 25 student registrations in lecture section 39 of English 100
5. STUDENT SEMESTER HOURS: Sum of semester hours taken by all students registered in all classes, excluding auditors (SSH).  
Example: 75 student semester hours taken by 25 students in lecture section 39 of English 100 which is a three credit course
6. AVERAGE CLASS SIZE: Student registrations divided by number of classes. (Excludes classes and student registrations in classes such as directed studies, cooperative education.)
7. FTE FACULTY: A count of instructors which is the sum of the following:  
(a) headcount of all regular full-time instructors (C-scale appointees) assigned to instruction except those designated as division chairmen/ coordinators; (b) a count of division chairmen/coordinators based on the equation, one division chairman = 0.7 FTE instructor; (c) a count of part-time instructors based on FTE indicated in SF5B, i.e., 0.50 = .5 FTE; (d) a converted count of lecturers, instructors on overload, non-instructional staff teaching a course, instructors teaching in level 5 subject area other than that designated in SF5B. (See Definition 8.
8. FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT OF: (1) "LECTURERS"; (2) INSTRUCTORS ON "OVERLOAD"; (3) "NON-INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF TEACHING CERTAIN COURSES"; (4) INSTRUCTORS TEACHING IN A LEVEL 5 SUBJECT AREA OTHER THAN THAT DESIGNATED IN SF5B:  
Number of semester hours taught by these four groups divided by 15 credits. (Based on credits instructor is compensated for in the case of "overloads" and lecturers.)



9. FTE STUDENTS: The conversion of full- and part-time students into full-time equivalent by dividing total SSH taken by 15 credits. Includes regular students, only.
10. EQUIVALENT CREDITS for classes with variable credits:
- (a) Regular subject, self-paced classes: average SH (derived by dividing SSH by number of students).
  - (b) Classes with catalog numbers 099, 199, 299: Total SSH divided by 10 credit hours.
  - (c) Cooperative vocational and cooperative arts and sciences courses: 50 students = 15 credit hours.
11. TEACHING LOAD MEASUREMENTS:
- (a) Average semester hours taught: the quotient obtained by dividing semester hours taught by FTE faculty,  
e.g.  $\frac{8,473 \text{ credits taught}}{647.5 \text{ faculty}} = 13.1$
  - (b) Productivity ratio: the quotient obtained by dividing student semester hours (SSH) by FTE faculty,  
e.g.  $\frac{229,573}{647.5} = 355$

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
